The Many Hats of a Clogging Instructor



In every group or class of Cloggers there seem to emerge a few to whom Clogging "comes easy". We have often suspected that they probably practice more than others, but nonetheless, on class night they seem to stand out. Their double-toes are sharp and clear and they are among the first to add fancy steps, or try their feet at free-style. It does not always follow that these stand-out dancers will ultimately become Clogging Instructors, but inevitably some do. Perhaps they begin by teaching a couple of friends on their back porch, or a few in their current group break away to form their own group with a natural leader emerging. (This sometimes causes dissention

between the groups for a while, but if viewed logically is a tremendous compliment to the original instructor!) In some cases an instructor moves away, and one of the dancers is pushed into being the new leader. One unique Instructor saw Clogging while on vacation many hundreds of miles from home, and thru correspondence, and The Flop Eared Mule, learned to clog via the mail!!

And so it begins — this strange metamorphosis that turns a dancer into an Instructor! The process of just learning a routine or step combination changes to that of learning how to best break down that routine so that students can understand. A new Instructor must also learn to teach to the median level of any class, gently pulling along the slower students and attempting to keep it exciting for the faster ones. Each new Beginner Class is, or should be, exciting. Very few Instructors can have an Exhibition Team without teaching new people to clog. In the long run it is those loyal dancers from an Instructors own classes who build a solid Club.

There are those who belong to many Clubs, those who find another group that specializes in, let's say, Square Dance Clogging, those who have no wish to perform, or those who want to perform and their current Club doesn't, and on and on. In our locale there are 35 to 40 Clogging Clubs, each with its own unique concept, and there are bound to be some who change Clubs now and then. Or start their own!!

It is up to us, as Dancers, to automatically become members of T.S. P. P. C. I. — The Society for the Preservation and Perpetuation of Clogging Instructors!!!

In an effort to help all Clogging Instructors across the nation, let us take a few minutes to review several of the Ten Commandments of Clogging.

"Thou shalt find happiness by thy endeavors to help others have a good time and while rejoicing in the company of thy friends, neglect not to draw into thy merriment that lesser-known on the sidelines."

"Thou shalt refrain from freely offering up criticism until thou has considered carefully and may offer up solutions as well."

"Thou shalt listen attentively to the words of thy instructor and shalt not interfere with others' listening."

"Thou shalt honor thy instructor's work by joining promptly and enthusiastically in the dance when he inviteth."

Florida State and O Dance Convention May 25-28, 1984

The Florida Cloggers are fast approaching their last FCC sanctioned Clogging Convention at this years Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention, May 25 - 28, 1984. In 1985, on the same Memorial Day Weekend, the FCC will hold its First State Clogging Convention at Curtis Hixson Hall in Tampa, Florida. Across the nation, Cloggers are just beginning to have workshops and Clogging within the State Square and Round Dance annual conventions, and depending upon the current Chairman, at the National Square and Round Dance Conventions. It appears as though Clogging will be limited in Baltimore, Maryland in June 1984, but Alabama in 1985 is actively soliciting Cloggers and Instructors.

A special thanks is due all Square and Round Dancers and Chairmen of their Conventions for having included us these last 6 years. Who would have thought that Florida Cloggers would grow from a few hundred to several thousand in such a short time? The Florida Square and Round Dance Council has stated that there will always be Clogging at the Florida State Convention. There are many who both square dance and clog and it is understandable that the Committee will continue their Clogging Program. Clogging is growing so rapidly that by Memorial Day 1985 both conventions will probably be filled to capacity!! (Might be fun to coax some of those fine Square Dance Callers into the Square and Round Dance Convention Clogging Halls to periodically call a tip or two for Cloggers! We're sure some of them teethed on Big Circle figures!)

A Florida State Clogging Convention is a big undertaking for the FCC. There are currently 4 FCC sanctioned events during the calendar year; three put on by individual Clubs. 1985 will be the first totally FCC run event. They will need the input and assistance of all Cloggers and FCC members. Election of Officers for FCC takes place at the May Convention Meeting. 1985 State Clogging Convention Chairman will be published in the Double Toe Times as soon as that name is made available to us.



STEPWORK Mountain Dancing

What Florida lacks in mountains it more than makes up for with "mountain dancers". The joy of clogging seems to be spreading to every nook and cranny in our state. However, the clogging that most of us experience is of the line dance or free-style/steps variety. There appears to be very little of the traditional type, what purists might call the hoedown, or Appalachian mountain dancing, actually being practiced. Even at our large state clogging conventions, relatively small amounts of time are allotted to the teaching of traditional figures. In this light, it is not hard to understand that mountain callers get frustrated at the idea of having to reteach the same figures over and over to a new set of interested cloggers each time there is a convention. As yet, no one has attempted to call a mountain dance directly to the floor at a major clogging convention without first workshopping the figures; most dancers seem not to have experience with the mountain figures at their Club level but seem to be eager to learn.

While there are those who refuse to do anything but mountain style dancing and others who contend that the line dance is the modern way to clog, the number of so-called "line dancers" who swamp the floor when a mountain dance workshop is announced tends to support the belief that most cloggers enjoy doing a variety of

dancing styles.

Over the past few years, the instructor members of the Florida Clogging Council (FCC) have expressed the desire among themselves to learn more about mountain style dancing so they can pass it on to their students. As part of this effort, Sally Thompson and the J'Ville Cloggers published in their 1983 Jacksonville Clogging Jamboree syllabus a set of calls, with directions for their execution, which will be called directly to the floor, without being workshopped, at their next convention in October of this year. It was hoped that instructors would use these figures to prepare their dancers for the experience of dancing to a real mountain caller. Bill McMahon of Fort Myers. At the Springtime Tallahassee Clogging Festival, Don Shrum held a lengthy "how to" clinic for instructors and interested dancers on the basics of mountain dancing; Bill McMahon also workshopped some traditional figures.

As Don pointed out to his group, "You can't be afraid to make a fool of yourself. If you want to call a mountain dance, you just have to go ahead and do it". While this fear may put an uncontrollable warble in your voice at first, you can always say you are learning to yode! Mountain calls are full of homey humor; adding a hearty laugh and a comfortable smile can set everyone

at ease, particularly the first-time caller.

Instructions for mountain figures appear in almost every syllabus from the major FCC sanctioned conventions over the past few years. In addition there have been some private workshops which have produced manuals, such as those taught by Truitt and Debbie Parker. The most current book published about this style of dancing is The Clogger's Book of Appalachian Square Dance Figures by Shelia Popwell.

Several time slots are being devoted to a variety of mountain figures at the Florida State Clogging Convention over the Memorial Day weekend in Lakeland at Mirror Lake Hall. The Friends, Fools and Family group will

also have mountain style and western square dance figures as a regular feature of their get-togethers. So the problem now really is not a lack of information; it is out there for those who care to find it. The "proof of the pudding", as the saying goes, will be in how many dancers successfully make it through a set of Bill McMahon's calling in October.

The following is a list of those calls which were published in the J'Ville syllabus last year. For directions, consult your syllabus or your nearest mountain-style

square dance enthusiast.

Cotton-Eyed Joe

"The hottest hit of the 1980's is actually older than the hills!!! As early as 1925, folk-song collector Dorothy Scarborough interviewed several oldsters who recalled hearing this perennial rhythmic dance number performed by antebellum plantation slaves. Prior to that, folklorists John and Alan Lomax collected various versions of the song throughout the south, usually in the form of square dance and break-downs.

From such sources we gather that originally "Joe" was a slave and champion cotton-picker who stole away the singer's girl with the aid of hoodoo. The "eye" of the title refers to the Evil Eye which was so common in black magic. Today, this supercharged tune is available in a variety of lively lyrics and exciting arrangements. "Joe" has survived to become America's unofficial, most preferred folk dance."

Marti Graveley, in her research of Appalachian Mountain Style Clogging, found that old timey clogging was done to a fiddlers tempo whereas contemporary clogging picks up the beat from the bass fiddle. The Sunshine Cloggers had a choice of harp or kettle drums at Sundays performance, with a full 70 piece orchestra for good measure!

Mr. Savia relinquished his customary tuxedo and wore a black western outfit complete with cowboy boots and leather holster and six-shooter. Though the tent


