


Master City Cloggers

The headline reads "Augusta Girls' Group Stomps Its Way to a National Championship". The Master City Cloggers, under the direction of the 3 generation Carter family, won the 1984 Overall National Clogging and Hoedown Championship. The nine girl team, ranging in age from 11 to 16 years, travelled to clogging competitions sanctioned by "The National Clogging and Hoedown Council" from September 1983 through August 1984, amassing 700 points to become the highest scoring group in the open precision category. Four other groups challenged them in the dance off. Categories included:

Four-Couple Precision Eight-Couple Precision Kentucky Running Set

Hoedown and Traditional Clog Dances
Their "winning streak" year netted a mantel
load of trophies and titles: 1984-1985 American
Clogging Hall of Fame Grandchampions; first
place in the junior and overall open precision

Barbara and Richard Whipple, and daughters Laura, 10 and Heather, 9, were captivated by the "Buckwheat" Cloggers from Atlanta, Georgia, who performed at a Marty Robbins Concert at the Cheyenne Saloon in Orlando, Florida. Barbara has a strong dance background and was delighted when Richard suggested they all learn to clog. Their first classes were under the tutelage of Truitt and Debbie Parker, Orlando Cloggers, and Kathy and Tim Register, Buckles and Bows. They attended many clogging workshops and conventions, and the girls performed with the Buckles and Bows Exhibition Team. In March 1983 they began to perform as a family group, (Barbara doesn't say why Richard prefers to run their sound system: their technical Engineer if you will!)

Buck Dancin'

This month I will try to help those who have already learned the fundamentals. Learning the basic steps takes determination and lots of hard work, and once you have mastered them, it is time to move on. But, before you move on make sure that you are comfortable doing the basics. (You will find that most of the advanced steps taught, will contain, in some part, a basic step.)

Here are some tips that can prepare you for learning advance level Buck Dance steps:

- 1. In an ordinary line dance routine, that you feel comfortable doing at any speed, replace the single basics in the routine with Buck basics or Sway basics. Also, try and replace a Chain Stomp or Rock Steps with a Pitter Patter. If you can do this without difficulty, you are on your way!
- 2. Try to spice up the ways you do the basic steps. For example: Try 4 basic Bucks travelling as far as you can across the floor or doing your Pitter Patter in a circle, or moving left or right.
- Watch the way that the Instructor does the step. (Especially the styling.)
- 4. Once you learn it slow, go home and practice. Then practice some more!
- Don't learn too many at one time. You will become confused and your brain will not retain anything.

I hope that these tips are helpful to most of you, however, if you should have a difference of opinion or other methods, please contact me, so that we can discuss it.

Remember, Buck Dancin' is just a style of clogging that provides a challenge for those who want to do more than conventional clogging steps.

Next month I will give you some tips on individual freestyle competition.




Oldies Aren't Always Goodies



One of the necessary factors in widespread acceptance would certainly be a record that any sound shop or record bar would or could have in stock. This is a plea to all choreographers — Please consider other Instructors in your choice of recorded music. We'll give you the credit you deserve, just give us music we can get our hands on.

grand champions in the Georgia State Clogging Championship; first place and overall grand champions in open precision in the United States Clogging Championship; first place junior line, first place junior open and overall precision grand champions in the East Coast Clogging Championship; Overall Grandchampionship in the Southeastern Clogging Championship in Raleigh, North Carolina in 1984.

Sixteen year old Donna Carter is the group's Instructor and Grandmother Aileene said that she is a perfectionist, which in turn causes the other youngsters to put their "best foot forward". Donna began her clogging recreationally with the YWCA, and has received more Advanced Instruction from Pam Collins, of HEE HAW and Grand Ole Opry fame. The Carter women — Grandmother Aileene, Mother Sandy, Donna 16, Linda 11½ and Christy Wiggins 14, teach beginner clogging classes, but "It's the children working with children. That's all it is," Aileene Carter said.

The girls have numerous fund raisers throughout the year in order to Charter buses to Competitions. They have already put in a strong bid for the 1985 Championship by winning the Grand Championship in line and open, and the Overall Grandchampionship at the SPIFFS Competition held November 23-24 in St. Petersburg, Florida.

For the fourth year, The Master City Clogging Championship sponsored by this group, will be held in Augusta, Georgia, March 29-30, 1985. This will be the first competition sanctioned by two Clogging councils: The National Clogging and Hoedown Council, and America's Clogging Hall of Fame. (See their ad in this issue.)

DANCIN' USA COMES TO CRACKER BOYS

Kissimmee, Florida. . . . Central Florida dancers can two-step and swing on the nationally-televised show, broadcast to more than 22 million homes across the United States and Canada.

Taping of the dancing will get started at 7:00 pm each night, Wednesday, March 20th through Sunday, March 24th. The taping will last about four hours each night, during which two 30-minute segments will be filmed.

Dancin' USA is seen locally on cable's Nashville Network, Monday through Friday at 2:30 pm and 7:30 pm, EST. The shows filmed in Kissimmee are scheduled to run in late April and early May, with reruns in June.

Competition

8-COUPLE PRECISION

The N.C.H.C. rules for this category seem to be standard for most Competitions, therefore they are the ones used for this article. Always check the rules for any competition however, as some ARE different.

There are usually 5 judges for every event.

Each Judge will be assigned a specific portion to assess, in addition to his own general score sheet.

1) Count the figures — two big circle, and four circle-4 figures. 2) Legal figures — Authentic old mountain figures, no "made up" figures, figure historically correct. 3) Precision — clean, all together, variety of steps, matches music. 4) Watch cuer/caller — do dancers anticipate? 5) Overall flow of routine, do figures fit the music?

RULES 8-Couple Precision

- 1. 8 Couples 8 males, 8 females.
- 2. Minimum of two big circle figures. (Explanation: Grand March, Wind the Ball of Yarn, London Bridge, Dip and Dive, Shoo Fly Swing, Weave the Basket, Swing the Girl Behind Your Back, Grand Allemande, Grand Sashay, Thread the Needle.)
- 3. Minimum of four circle-4 figures.
 (Explanation: Dive for the Oyster,
 Dig for the Clam, Birdie in the
 Cage, Georgia Rang Tang, Shoot
 the Moon, The Old Side Door,
 Turn the Ring, Sweep the Floor,
 Right Hand Across, Four Leaf
 Clover, Mountaineer Loop, Down
 in Georgia, Butterfly Twirl, Swing
 to the Wall, The Garden Gate.)
- 4. Dancers in step with each other at all times. A progressive step change allowed. (Explanation: Lead or Caller Couple initiates step change, to be followed by each successive couple.)
- figure. If two or more circle-4
 figures are performed without
 progression in between it will be
 counted as one circle-4 figure.
 (Explanation: After every circle4 figure, all odd couples MUST
 move counter clockwise to the
 next even couple on the inside
 of the set. Sample call: "Circle

- left and odds move on to the next.")
- 6. Counter clockwise movement in dance progression.
- 7. Different circle-4 figure after each progression.
- 8 Couples may cross the center of the set.
- 9. May have more than 1 active couple.
- No acrobatics or gymnastics.
- 11. Music break allowed. (Explanation: A break in the recorded music to allow for tap sounds a capella to be interjected as part of the routine. Must be very short.)
- 12. Traditional music. (Explanation:
 Only traditional Bluegrass music
 allowed: fiddle, banjo, bass,
 guitar. No modern Country with
 acoustically amplified instruments,
 or Country Rock.)
- 13. If live band is provided, team must dance to it.
- 14. Teams or dancers dancing in this category cannot enter Open Precision.

The time length for each team performance is 8 minutes. Some good practice records are N.C.H.C. Clogging Record - an LP with two long recordings on each side. Ralph Pierce, Knoxville, Tennessee and Bob Johnson, Chesapeake, Virginia also have some good bluegrass recordings used by Cloggers.



(1 beaten egg + 1 Tablespoon milk)



Tips For New Callers Cloggers Special

BY: Les Gotcher

In days gone by, not ancient but back in the early 50's, clogging was being danced in the square dance routines. There were no routines as we have them today, just each person doing their own thing. Later, when many people wanted to learn to do clogging, the instructors had to have a way to instruct, so



they started working on routines for cloggers, and this would enable them to teach groups, not individuals.

When I moved to Arizona, I found that clogging is as popular here as it is down in Florida, or anywhere else. In fact, there are clogging groups in almost any area in the U. S. A. and they are very good because they have good instructors, and they are as popular here as they are in other areas. I visited one of these groups, and they asked me about clogging "in the old days", as they termed it. Most of the cloggers are teen-age and in their early 20's. They wanted some history on clogging, and this I could give them.

I explained that in the earlier days, clogging was simply a part of square dancing, just an addition. They asked if I could show them how it worked in the old days, so I explained to them that I would first have to teach them some routines that were used at that time, then they could add the clogging, if this was what they wanted.

I also explained that there would be no clogging routines, they would do free-style clogging just let their imagination go wild and do whatever they felt like doing. It proved to be worthwhile. They loved it because they could do whatever they felt like doing, as long as they did not break the timing. I tried using the "oldies" that had been proven over the years. One of their favorites was one called "Ring and a Star" which went like this:

Four little sisters form a ring
Circle to the left and hear me sing
Gents step in, in front of your girl
Make a right hand star across the world
Gents keep turning that star around
A ring and a star, go around the town
Girls roll out, around one man
Come back in and circle again
Girls roll out one more time
Circle again, you're doing fine

Girls roll out and here we go Circle again but not too slow Now the girls roll out, Left Allemande And weave the ring, go around the land.

You can pick it up here and promenade them home, or whatever. This call is directional — that's why it is so easy to teach to your clogging groups. Anyone can call it. Just use any hoedown record with a good four count beat. Each line of the call has four counts to it. The dancers have no trouble staying on the beat because that's one thing Cloggers do well — stay on the beat.

For you newer callers, this is quite an experience. If you have never tried calling to a group of cloggers, ask a group to allow you to call a routine for them and see what I mean. The music is not any slower for cloggers, but the cloggers are putting more into it and are not moving around the square as fast as dancers that are not clogging, so you will have to adjust to that.






