CONFESSIONS OF A WATCHER

Those who only know me by phone or the written word, are always a little startled when I confess I do not CLOG. My pat reason is that I have a bum foot. It is a little difficult to clog on one foot!! (I am also fat, gray, and I wheeze from too many years of cigarettes.) I just saw an old Clark Gable/Doris Day movie wherein Clark was the City Editor for a major metropolitan newspaper complete with the cigarette dangling from the corner of his mouth, as he two-fingered out a story on his non-electronic typewriter. My lap is full of ashes as I type this.

I am an educated watcher of clogging, an enthusiastic clapper; I smile at all of you until my cheeks ache, hoping you will look up and smile back; I sometimes sit in the very front row, and other times deliberately stand in the back and initiate clapping in time to the music, or applause. 



We wholeheartedly support your editorial opinion in favor of private videotaping at clogging events. In the last three weeks we have attended two clogging weekend events, one of which did not allow private videotaping. We thoroughly enjoyed ourselves and many fine clogging routines were taught at both events. But typically, we learn a lot from the workshops but retain very little. It is only afterwards, following much work and repetition that we actually learn and retain a clogging routine, be it a dance or just steps. So, we can tell you right now that we have forgotten probably 90% of each workshop routine we were taught. Where we have videos of routines, however, our collective memory is helped tremendously. Guess which routines will get learned first?

In our experience, interpreting a clogging routine cue sheet is much, much easier when accompanied by a video demonstration of what the dance looks like and how it is coordinated with the music. Also, cue sheet errors, which occur quite frequently can be caught and corrected; and styling, such as arm motions, which is difficult to put on cue sheets, can be seen. And, as we freely do, videos are easily shared with others to help them learn faster.

Surely much of the enjoyment of choreographing a clogging routine is in seeing it danced by others. Anything that helps the learning process such as videos should not be suppressed but encouraged.

So, you choreographers and instructors out there, please urge directors of clogging events to allow private videotaping. Remember, if you don't get learned, you don't get danced!!!

non-dancers, so, if somebody couldn't find something to their ability, they just didn't look.

I spent the majority of my time in seminars and classes on mountain style dancing, but I did manage to pick up a few new steps and some line routines. As far as I am concerned, my time was well spent.

Instructors appear to be getting younger and younger. The youngest there was somewhere in the neighborhood of eight years old. I have heard comments, particularly in Florida, that if you let any one under 18 become an instructor, the entire clogging world will soon be run by kids. Well, by George, if they know the material and can command the respect and attention of the floor, let them have it.

Everyone is always curious about numbers. I've forgotten the exact count, but it was something like 830 dancers, down by more than 1/3 from last year's number. This was by choice of the director. Registration was limited, the result being that there was enough room on the floor for everyone to dance, and enough seating around the walls for spectators. Word is that next year, registration will be limited even further. Keep it in mind.

Instructors, in addition to being young, were for the most part personable and entertaining. It used to be that a limited number of instructors, knew a limited number of routines, which they taught an eager and less than knowledgeable floor full of people. Times have changed. Cloggers are now so knowledgeable that if an instructor can't present challenging material in a fast, smooth, and entertaining manner, they will lose their students attention and their desire to attend that instructors teaching sessions again.

The parade of states on Saturday night presented cloggers from thirty states and Canada. Exhibitions ranged from The Clogging Machine's King Tut comedy routine to the absolutely incredible Canadian Step Dancers who made even the most accomplished clogger feel like a beginner. Mountain style, line routines, and free-style clogging rounded out the final evening and made it enjoyable, but very tiring.



MINUTEMAN CLOGGERS



CLOGGING AND THE SOUTHERN APPALACHIAN SQUARE DANCE

BY: Frank X. Bonner

Editors Note: Cloggers who have a thirst to know more about the past and present of Clog dancing would do well to order this book at once! Frank has given The Double Toe Times his generous permission to re-print excerpts from this well researched volume.

The dance has been shaped by all who have danced it. It is still being shaped. And being the amalgam that it is, it can not be traced to any one individual or any one area. It is everybody's dance because it has been danced by so many. In fifty to one hundred years it will look different from the present and the past. It is the very nature of the dance to change with facets of life that effect it.

In our continuing research on Competition, Frank has this to say. . . . Judging the performance of a dance that is by its very nature localized, individualistic and free can be very disconcerting for both the dancer and the judge. American solo clogging is a free-style soniferous stepdance. It was originally done only by individuals, but now spans the whole gamut from solo to "for as many as will". Lately, the term has become almost synonymous with stepdancing in a routine whether it be choreographed or called, precision or free-style in nature. However, solo free-style clogging is still very popular.

The comments offered here are for those who wish to improve their showing in competition clogging. If you don't do well in your first competition that shouldn't bother you. Try a few more. If you do well fine, if not then study the team or individual that wins and copy their style, then improve on it. Notice style is underlined. You don't necessarily have to do all the same steps to be a winner.

One of the most difficult contests to judge fairly would be pitting a rhythm clogger (like Beverly Cotton) against a stylistic shuffle clogger (like Burton Edwards). The difference in style and motif is so drastic it seems two separate categories would be required for judging. For example, Burton's flatfoot shuffle style is quiet and flashy, whereas Beverly's rhythm style is purposely noisey and less ostentatious. Judges personal style preference would likely determine the winner and not the individuals clogging ability.

These are the opinions of one person who has judged and danced competition and not necessarily those of all judges. Each judge will be as different as each dancer. This is even more evident as one travels from state to state where styles and what is or is not considered clogging varies drastically. To make things even more complicated the rules set by the competition director supercede the personal opinions of the judges. Judges must adapt their thinking to the rules set by each competition. Dancers must adapt their styles to fit the judges opinions, an almost impossible feat.

Summary of Common Judging Criteria for American Team Clogging Competition

1,	Appearance	Costume coordination; symmetry or team as to age and size; posture; general appearance.
2.	Showmanship	Enthusiasm; ability to project to the audience (audience, not just friends, interested in your dance).
3.	Versatility	Use of different figures and steps.
4.	Co-ordination	Timing; skill in movement and interaction; proper execution of figures.
5.	Creativity	Style with which traditional elements are used.
6.	Complexity	Use of different figures and steps.
Note	: Team includes	all categories from duets to

big set. Solo competition is judged almost entirely on footwork, rhythm and appearance.
