
We're scheduled already for next year, August 8th, 9th, and 10th, 1986. Hope to see you all again!







Whereas the American people value the display of etiquette among men and women which is a major element of square dancing:

Whereas square dancing is a traditional form of family recreation which symbolizes a basic strength of this country, namely, the unity of the family;

Whereas square dancing epitomizes democracy because it dissolves arbitrary social distinctions;

Whereas square dancing is the American Folk Dance that is called, cued or prompted to the dancers, and includes squares, rounds, contras, clogging, line and heritage dances;

Whereas it is fitting that the square dance be added to the array of symbols of our national character and pride: Now, therefore be it

Resolved be the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. That the square dance is designated the national folk dance of the United States of America for 1985 and 1986.





## Buck Dancin'

I would like to begin by saying that I hope everyone gains a little knowledge from these articles, whether they are a dancer and/or an instructor.

Last month I went over how to start your dancers into Buck Dancin'. I explained the really basic steps, and now I am going to proceed on.

Buck Dancin' takes a lot of work and if your dancers start to complain or look uninterested, try to keep it slow and repeat a lot. Try to help them out individually.

Now you can add to that single "buck" basic.

DB Heel-Ball Heel-Steep L R L

DOUBLE BUCK BASIC

DB DB Heel-Ball Heel-Step L R L R

## TRIPLE BUCK BASIC

DB DB DB Heel-Ball Heel-Step L R L R L

Now let's teach them a HEEL - TOE - STEP. (NOTE: The Hyphen ( - ) between the 3 words, indicates that the movement is done on the same foot.)

Ex: Heel-Ball Heel-Step

A Heel-Toe-Step is executed in one count.

+ a 1 (and a one)

After they have this down proceed to a Tennessee Walkin' Step:

Lift (Toe) Heel-Toe-Step

Practice on both feet then drill them on everything you have taught.

Before moving on to intermediate steps, teach them a basic buck using a Heel-Toe-Step.

Heel-Toe-Step Heel-Ball Heel-Step
L R L
+ a 1 e + a 2

After this, add Heel-Toe-Steps to it, and you have a double or a triple. That's all for now, see you next month.

## COMPUWRITER

Talk about an "editor's dream"!! I have it. It goes like this. There is a computer being developed that is a combination copy machine and word processor. To make it work you place a typed page (or even a legibly hand-printed page) into the viewer which then "reads" the material, and transfers it to the computer screen. No typing needed. It can then be edited as necessary.

For example, suppose you placed a copy of a routine in the viewer. After a few moments of scanning,
the routine appears on the video screen, where you
may add steps, remove steps, or make other corrections as necessary. The corrected routine is then
transferred to hard copy (that's computer talk. It
means paper.) You don't have to spend hours retyping.

Advanced plug-in modules (available at extra cost, of course) contain a complete dictionary and English language composition rules. The computer brings the material to the screen, reviews it, corrects spelling Page 8

and grammatical errors, then prints the corrected document. (college fraternities will be buying these by the dozens.) There is nothing for the writer to do but proof read the article and collect a paycheck (or an "A" for students).

Additional modules containing complete book outlines are even able to compose short articles. Think of the advantages to a clogging instructor, who only has to "scan" copies of <u>all</u> the typed routines into the machines memory, classify step sequences as to difficulty, then in order to write a routine you simply type in the song's beat sequence and the routine difficulty level. The machine randomly picks step sequences and puts them together to form a new routine. You could have 4,000 different routines to the same song. (You can also blame errors on the computer).


There are bound to be problems, of course, but I'm sure they can be worked out. The cost will be the main one, especially with a limited budget. And, I'll bet with all its sophistication, it still will not be able to correctly write out the sentence, "There are three to's (two's) (too's) in the English language," without getting confused. Oh well, it was only a dream anyway.







## NORTHERN CALIFORNIA WORKSHOP

July 27, 1985 was the date of CLOG AFFAIR 2, a workshop/dance hosted by HILLBILLY CLOGGERS of Dublin, California. The feature guest instructor was a young man from Soldiers Creek, FL named Scotty Bilz.

While attending a Possom Trot Workshop in Victorville, CA earlier this year, this young man impressed Janice Hanzel, instructor/director of HILL-BILLY CLOGGERS with his ability to handle a crowd of all ages. An invitation was made then and there to bring Scotty to Northern California. Scotty is the choreographer of the dance to Sawyer Brown's smash hit "Step That Step", which was a huge success at that March workshop/dance.

80+ dancers from all over the state of California started that warm Saturday with a beginning buck dance workshop followed immediately by an intermediate buck step workshop. Scotty kept the audience on their toes (no pun intended) with his wit and humor. Scotty wrote a dance to the tune "It'll Be Me" on Lamon Records (yes folks, a square dance label!) that is designed for practicing buck steps. After two hours of Buck Dancing, we all were tired and hungry and it was lunch time. After lunch, Scotty began the afternoon session by "Walking On Sunshine" with Katrina and the Waves; choreography by Scotty. What was geared as an advanced buck dance did not keep many people on the side lines as

he taught "Shoot Out" by Harold Faltermeyer; choreography by Scotty. The last workshop before dinner break was to "High Horse" by the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band; choreographed by Steve Smith, Lexington, KY. That really got the audience going. Most everyone stayed upright for that dance! When we were through, everyone was ready to go have dinner and relax before the evening dance.

That evening Scotty freestyled for the crowd and managed to get some of the other "showoffs" up with him. It is such a delight to see dancers out on the dance floor appreciating other dancers and complimenting other dancers for their accomplishments. Also performing for the cheering crowd was a favorite duo from Hillbilly Cloggers and the Bay Area Tap Busters called M & M Cloggers. The days of isolated clogging groups are passing. Through the mediums of print, and through conventions, one-day workshops or Jamborees, isolated cloggers are becoming aware that there are opportunities to broaden their friendships and knowledge of clogging as never before!

Let's be honest. One clogging group in a given area may have a hard time handling a newly formed "rival" group. Or an Instructor may be so insecure that he/she attempts to control the dancer's clogging activities by threatening to remove a dancer from a performance team if they ever dance with another group; by deliberately scheduling performances or rehearsals to conflict with area conventions; or teaching no other routines or terminology than his/her own; or absolutely refusing to allow a certain type of music or style in his/her hall; or speaking in a derogatory manner about ALL other groups. This way leads to disaster.

If an Instructor believes he/she will keep all his/ her dancers by binding them tightly, that Instructor is doomed. In actuality the more freedom and variety offered to a group, the more the Instructor will be respected and loved.

As clogging spreads it is hoped that "caring and sharing" will become a watchword. Start the ball rolling in your area. Invite another Club and Instructor to your Club as guests one evening. By pre-arrangement ask their Instructor to teach a favorite routine, or ask their Club to perform for yours. Make them welcome. We think you will be pleasantly surprised! And by all means if you are invited to visit to another Club — GO! Friendship doesn't just happen —




