

There were just over 20,000 people registered in total, but the Texas-sized AstroDomain never seemed even the least bit crowded, at least not where we were. Both clogging halls provided more than ample space to handle the crowd and the clogging program went off without a hitch.


Clogging Champions Tape Performances on 'Hee Haw'





Banjos, Fiddles and Feet Cloggers hosted their 4th Annual Summertime Stomp June 27 & 28, 1987. Held in the Charlotte County Memorial Auditorium in Port Charlotte, Florida, attendance greatly increased this year for both dancers and spectators and Saturday evening exhibitions were performed before a packed house.

The fiercely competitive annual Bloomer Relay was great fun to watch. Three clubs spoofed Jan & Phil Bohley by dancing to Jan's choreography of "The House won't Rock" while on stage two dancing - rocking Outhouses, bobbled back and forth, and Jan and Phil were royally mummied!


Sponsored by the four-county Banjos, Fiddles and Feet clogging group, the event had a dual purpose: bringing together clogging fans for lessons and intertainment and raising money for local drug-abuse programs. Banjos, Fiddles and Feet is a clogging exhibition group made up of participants from Charlotte, Desoto, Sarasota and Lee counties in Florida.



Proceeds from the Stomp were divided between the Outreach Program in Fort Myers and the drugfighting division of the Charlotte County Junior Deputy League.

The Bohley's 19-year-old son, Richard, died in 1978 as a result of a drug-alcohol mixture. Jan and Phil vowed that if they were ever in a position to financially assist in a rehabilitative or preventative drug program they would do so. The 3rd Annual Summertime Stomp netted over \$2,000, which was divided between the two organizations.

The Bohleys, Bud & Loretta Berwick and all the Banjos, Fiddles and Feet Cloggers are gracious hosts and made us feel welcome!

THE FICKLE FINGER OF FATE





Fickle would love to engage some of these folks in a battle of wits, but they are unarmed.



gram Chairman. Not only did she spend considerable time helping to round up the 36 instructors who volunteered their time, but she also did a super job of scheduling the 80 sessions offered over the the three day event. Last but not least, Ron and Rita Hodge of Houston not only inherited corrdination of all the clinics when Mary Anne Woodrom moved to California last year, but they were also the On-Site Coordinators. This couple, along with all the members of their group, the Yellow Rose Cloggers, were perfect hosts. They opened their homes to many instructors, brought water jugs, coolers to ice, TV sets for the videos and stayed in the halls from can 'til can't to help out however they were needed. We owe all these people a tremendous debt of thanks for making our clogging program the best ever.

The clogging activities began on Wednesday night with a pre-convention dance hosted by the Texas Clogging Council. (Is the opening dance called "Trail-In" or "Trail-End"? Does anyone know for sure? Does anyone care?) The highlight of this event was the appearance of a colorful character named Yogi Baird, a singing, fiddling, clogging contortionist, who amazed the crowd with some truly incredible stunts. When I saw him kick his feet above his head then put one foot behind his neck and never miss a stroke of the bow I thought to myself, "Gean Dentino needs to see this man". Then I looked across the room and there she sat, just as amazed as the rest of us. At 71 years young this was Gean's eighth National Square Dance Convention and, of course, she hasn't missed one CLOG National yet and already has her ticket for Fort Worth.

The program began at 9 AM on Thursday as scheduled and from that point forward there was never a glitch. There was not one single "no-show", nor was any instructor even so much as late to a session. (Not even Carolyn Kell from Seymour, Indiana who almost missed her plane because the airline changed the departure time and failed to notify her then sent her luggage to Chicago instead of Houston. The plane was still refueling when they arrived at the airpost in Indianapolis and they were told that if they hurried they might still make it. As they walked briskly down the concourse the ticket man yelled after them, "Ladies, you need to run". They made the plane and the luggage got to Houston, eventually.) The after-party on Thursday night was hosted by the T Bar K Clogging Network but tired feet and weary travlers ended it earlier than we had expected.

The highlight of the Friday sessions was a step workshop with Dr. Jerry Duke of San Francisco, California in which he taught a variety of authentic steps he has collected over the past 20 years. (We have already replaced the "King Louie" in one dance with one of his particularly good steps.) In keeping with tradition the Friday night after-party was hosted by the coordinators of next year's convention, Lucy Johnson and the California contingent. Not everyone attended this party since a bug of some kind caught up with 5 or 6 of us, all from different states and different hotels, and we spent that everyage 12

ning in our rooms upchucking. We never did decide what made us sick, but suffice to say that I will never eat another Broccoli/Cheese Puff as long as I live. (My kids have been telling me for years that Broccoli is poison.)

Saturday brought another full day including a two-hour clinic with Dr. Duke on "Our Clogging Heritage". He began by explaining the "cosmology" of ancient societies and their need to celebrate the earth (the center of life) in dance, and ended with some old video tapes of clogging competitions and festivals in the Appalachians which he had attended during the course of his studies. It was a very interesting and enjoyable two hours for those of us interested in our clogging roots.

The only legitimate complaint I heard was the poor quality of the sound systems throughout the halls. But what convention center architect ever asked a clogger for advice on such matters. Unfortunately, this is an all too familiar problem wherever we go. (I nominate Tom Toor for technical advisor next time.) There was a great variety of levels, materials and instructors, and Violet Marsh, transplanted Georgian and clogging purist who learned her first step from Big John Walters and learned to teach from Bill Nichols at Fontana Village, even noticed that over 10% of the program was traditional material and a good bit of the music used in the line dances was traditional as opposed to disco.

But Deloris Breske, another Bill Nichols product who came to San Antonio while husband Ted was in the service and decided to stay, expressed the feelings of many of us when she said that the best part was meeting up with some old friends she had not seen in a long time. And isn't that just your favorite part of this whole thing? I also saw some people that I had not seen in a while, but more importantly, I made some new friends, like Teresa Lovig from Iowa and Janice Hanzel from California, Carolyn Kell and Donna Painter from Indiana and Sallie Adkins and Bud and Sue Keller from Ohio. Don't you meet the nicest folks having fun?



Comments on the syllabus were appreciated and were extremely favorable. LaVonne Miller was responsible for all of the excellent drawings included in the book.



Let's Dance The Big Set

"Big foot up and little foot down, make both feet jar the ground, and promenade!" Into one big circle, as we are getting ready again to present the 'how to' for two more Appalachian square dance figures. These patterns can be learned in only a few minutes. This month, we feature and explain Birdie In The Cage and Butterfly Flip.

BIRDIE IN THE CAGE

Formation: Active couples (with their back toward the center of the big circle) facing the 'home' couple (couples that are facing the center of the big circle).

CIRCLE FOUR HANDS AROUND.

(Both couples join hands and circle to their left)
BIRD IN THE CAGE and THREE HANDS AROUND!
The active lady moves into the middle while
the other three join hands and circle left.

BIRD HOP OUT AND THE CROW HOP IN,
The active gent exchanges place with his pardner,

CROW BOYS CROW! CROW HOP OUT AND GONE AGAIN!

The gent moves back to his place in the fourperson circle.

CIRCLE FOUR IN THE MIDDLE OF THE FLOOR. WE'LL DANCE ALL NIGHT AND THEN SOME MORE.

SWING CORNER, SWING PARDNER.
ACTIVE COUPLE MOVE ON TO THE NEXT.

Active or lead couple move on in a counter clockwise direction to the next side couple.

Note: Some callers often ask the lady to chirp, and the gents crow, when they are inside the three-person circle.

BUTTERFLY FLIP

CIRCLE FOUR HANDS AROUND

Both Couples join hands and circle left.

LADIES FLIP!

Ladies make a clockwise turn in place while the gents mark time in place.

CIRCLE LEFT, GENTS FLIP!

All four dancers in the set make the clockwise turn simultaneously.

CIRCLE LEFT, SWING CORNER,

SWING PARDNER

ACTIVE COUPLE MOVE ON TO THE NEXT.

Next month's featured figures (2): SWING TO THE WALL and DOUBLE BOW KNOT.

Illinois Cloggers Invitational 1987 Happens in Bloomington

Considering all the people in Illinois, I suppose 18 clogging clubs averaging less than 40 members does not sound like much. But when 15 of those 18 groups showed up in Bloomington June 12 and 13, they convinced central Illinois that folks in this state that they are really into clogging. The Sugar Creek Cloggers put on a well organized event, alternating hour-long workshops with hour-long shows consisting of 3 fifteen minute team performances and 3 three minute duet routines. At night every club and duet did a one song encore to an almost capacity crowd of 400+, followed by a rise and shine solo competition and guest demonstrations by workshop instructors Matt and Missy Pearson, Kansas City, Missouri and the Kick 'n Click Cloggers, Madison, Wisconsin.

There were big city and small town cloggers, young children and grandparent cloggers, modern and traditional styles, teams in competition and others doing exhibitions. they sure can dance.


