



Theatre of Performing Arts

It all began when a group of cloggers outgrew their facility and their instructor was faced with no where to go. Everything rentable was already leased, except one building - the old theater! The "Cozy", as it was called, was closed nearly four years prior and still contained the old cushioned theater seats, somewhat intact. At one end, it had an old stage of hardwood flooring.

Well, it so happened that the instructor pursued the idea, talking with the owners and touring the building. The same week, a new student came, who also had heard through some of the cloggers about the possibility of the cloggers moving to the theater. This student wanted to be a part of it!

Instructor and student became full-fledged partners. The Lockwood Cloggers now called the Theatre of Performing Arts their new home. Pat Hughes, the director, and May Probert, her partner, have set out to not only provide a place for cloggers, but also provide live family entertainment for the community as well!

The theatre was built in 1908 and housed an I.O.O.F. hall upstairs. In it's early days, it held graduation, high school plays, etc., and in later years it became a movie theater. Older citizens have been sending pictures and programs of the theatre, from the early 1900's for a scrapbook that's being composed.

The town of Lockwood is very excited about the theatre, not only because of all the memories they have of the old "Cozy", but because of the entertainment it will bring to the town. There will be a wide range of types of shows such as: drama, barbershop singing, storytelling, old-time fiddling, puppet shows, country music, tap and ballet, gospel music, magic shows, stage bands, bluegrass, a bell choir, and of course - clogging! Eventually we will have community theatre and a community choir.

Shows will be held one or two times monthly. This is a project that requires a lot of planning and hard work, but is also a challenge that's a lot of fun! Not only will cloggers benefit, but also the community and the performers.

To get started, the theatre had to be rewired, the stage had to be extended, and days and days of cleaning had to be done. Insurance was the biggest hurdle! In our area, clogging is dancing, which is then, in turn, associated with drinking. We have just about destroyed that rumor locally, by having several years of family-oriented get-togethers and "parties" were definitely no alcohol is allowed. Well, the underwriters of our insurance company didn't know that! We received a letter from our insurance company, after six weeks of being insured, that said our insurance had been cancelled! Wow! What a shock! After all the time and money spent, we knew automatically no show could go on without insurance. After ques-Page 6

tioning the company, they said it somehow got called a "dance hall", and they said, "No way!" At first I laughed, envisioning me, a "teetotaler", running the Long Branch Saloon! Then I cried!

Well, we did get it straightened out, and the shows will go on, and clogging students are getting practice - on stage, weekly, during their class time.

Think about it, maybe there's an old theater in your town that nobody else has a use for. It doesn't even have to be an old theater, perhaps a mill, barn, etc. Look around! The best dance floors are often found in old buildings. These old buildings need to be saved, just like the art of clogging. Today's metal, prefab buildings are quick to build and somewhat affordable, but just don't have the class, as our older structures. The question is, will they be around as long as old theaters, barns, etc.?

What better way to promote our heritage - clogging - than in a facility that has been and still is, a storehouse of our heritage?







Are you an Angel?

Reprinted from Teaching Clogging by Lois Elling
TIPS FOR ANGELS

"... it's a good time to be reminded of certain things. We do need 'angels', those experienced dancers who come to dance with and help the beginners, but there are several guidelines that those angels should be aware of:

- 1. Be friendly towards all beginners regardless of sex, age, ability, etc.
- 2. Don't talk or clog while the instructor is talking, even off on the sidelines.
- 3. While the beginners are working on their steps, either work with them or stay quietly on the sidelines. You need not go through every DT-Step-Rock-Step at 33 rpm with them but please do not practice your own fancy steps at the same time (even if you are off on the sidelines or a corner). The instructor will give you chances to show off and practice while the beginners are resting.
- 4. Occasionally someone will need individual attention or help. If you really know what you're doing you can taken them aside and go over the step slowly with them. Don't keep them out of the circle too long though, or they may miss the next step workshopped. The instructor watches everyone's feet and is usually aware of a problem but can't always give the individual attention when it is needed.
- Don't ever show impatience with a beginner; that would chase them away quicker than anything.
- 6. Share your enthusiasm for clogging and let them know how much fun it is.
- 7. Don't keep together with other intermediates when practicing steps. Spread yourselves out so all the beginners get a chance to see some experienced feet. Sometimes a few experienced dancers can get out in the center so everyone can see them, but not while the instructor is there, please.

- 8. When you are not participating in dancing with the beginners and want to talk with other club members also sitting out, please either keep it very quiet or go outside where you won't disturb the class. Even when people are dancing, someone else talking can be distracting and rude.
- Please remember that many of these beginners will soon be your fellow club members. Mingle with them and don't show up every week at the end of their class period.
- 10. Gladly offer help if you think someone needs it but remember that some people do prefer not to be singled out and would rather figure it out on their own.
- 11. Don't ask the instructor to speed up the music when the beginners are dancing. She/he is playing it for them, not you.
- 12. You are not expected to dance with the beginners at their pace the whole time. But everyone should join in with them for a part of the evening. They need some good example to follow and it looks like the club isn't really interested in them if no one dances with them.
- 13. When the instructor is having the beginners do something very simple, please do it exactly as the instructor says. Don't add your fancy styles or embellishments. One example is to do a Drag-Step when the instructor is working on (straighten)-Step. Sometimes that's hard not to do, but think about it and make the effort."

Editor's Note: If indeed you volunteer to be an 'angel', remember that you too were once a beginner. Someone probably 'angelled' you. If there are routines or steps that you don't like, do not let this show in a beginner class. T'would be far better NOT to be an 'angel'. When a dancer decides he or she is too 'good' to help with the new class, something is lost from the whole club. Some of the most delightful commentaries about our clogging clubs will have little to do with snappy costumes or precision routines: "my whole family can participate"; "new friends", "singles are welcomed!".

Bluegrass Music by Raymond K. McLain

by Raymond K. McLain McLain Family Band

Bill Monroe, direct descendent of the U.S. President James Monroe, is acknowledged as "Father of Bluegrass" and began his influence as recently as the late 1930's in Kentucky, "The Bluegrass State", hence the name. Drawing the body and spirit of his music from tradition and his supporting musicians mostly from the Appalachians, Monroe captured the fancy of the country public. As members of his original band left and formed groups of their own, he brought on others. This process continued and bluegrass music quickly re-emerged as a fluid folk expression demonstrating traditional principles of folklore even in our contemporary commercial society. Bluegrass had all the credentials to be caught up in the urban folk music revival of the early 1960's and has since been furthered by the Bluegrass Festival, quite a vigorous institution in its own right.





Mountain Style Square Dance Figure Key




Odds Lead Right Figure 1

From a big circle the odd couple move to right and stand in front of the couple next door. Remember this is a big circle dance and the odd couple must set with their backs to the middle of the circle.




Circle Fours

Circle to the left just halfway around. Be careful to go only halfway around.




Other way Back Figure 3

The circle fours circle back to the right to the very same place with their back to the center.




Set #1 Figure 4

Again the active couple always have their back to the center of the circle. Working the figure to the outside of the circle.




Do Si Do Figure 5


Set #2 Figure 6

DO SI DO means back to back in all styles of square dances.




Little More DO Figure 7


Set #3 Figure 8

The girls are in a DO SI DO or back to back.




Pull your Partner Figure 9

Pull your partner by and face right, you will be looking at your corner.




Swing the Corner Figure 10

Notice this swing makes a big round circle with all couples.




Set #4 Figure 11

After you swing a girl, you always put her on your right. You will find this is best done by everyone swinging two and one-half times around. Always be careful to keep the big circle round.




Swing your Partner Figure 12

Notice the even couples are now on the inside of the circle and the odds are on the outside making an 'X' pattern across the set.




Set #5 Figure 13

After you swing any girl you always put her on your right.




Odds Move Figure 14

Many of the McLain family have participated in the Berea Christmas Dance School, Berea, KY, almost since it's inception in 1938. Their nineteen year old family band played for many of the dance classes and evening functions at this year's Christmas school. A brochure of their concert schedule showed two spring 1988 dates in Florida so with Select-a-Seat tickets in hand Sunday, January 17th, my daughter, Sue Toor, and I drove to Jacksonville, FL to the beautifully renovated downtown Florida Theatre Performing Arts Center.

The performance was made possible by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. The following is reprinted from the program.

"The McLain Family Band is composed of family members. Raymond K. McLain, the father or the group, performs on guitar. He is a musicologist educated at Denison, Harvard and the University of North Carolina, and is an arranger of, as well as lecturer on, folk music of the Appalachian Mountains. For 15 years he was director of the Hindman Settlement School in the Eastern Kentucky Mountains, where his avocation was playing music for folk and country dancing in the area. He also holds an Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts Degree from his Alma Mater Denison University in Granville, Ohio, for his work in folk music. He and Betty McLain, who is band manager, have five grown children, all of whom have performed in the McLain Family Band.

Raymond W. plays fiddle, banjo, mandolin and guitar. A graduate of Berea College in communications, Raymond hosts Kentucky Blue, a syndicated weekly radio show now in its 15th year. He was host to 10 segments of 'By-Words', a talk show produced by Kentucky Educational Television in which

Raymond interviewed, among others, Ricky Scaggs, Skeeter Davis and Sonny Osborne. He developed, produced and hosted a 13-week series of fiddle lessons, with accompanying manual, for KET: Fiddle a Little. When asked for a hobby or outside interest, he is somewhat at a loss; for music is his life, along with his family, who will offer 'talking with people' as a second compulsion. Raymond and his wife Connie reside in Berea, Kentucky. They have three boys.

Ruth McLain Riopel plays bass and mandolin. She majored in art at Berea College, does much of the band's graphic art work and album design. She writes some of the band's music as do Raymond K. McLain, Raymond W. McLain, Al White and Aunt Rosemary McLain-Ware. Ruth sings lead as well as harmony. She and her husband Michael have two young children.

Al White plays mandolin and guitar. He grew up in Texas and New Mexico, studied classical guitar, became interested in bluegrass music and joined the Big River Boys in Albuquerque. He came east to play with James Monroe, then with the Bluegrass Alliance before marrying Alice and performing with the McLain Family Band for awhile. Alice and Al took a break from the band to join the Bluebird Special, which toured Alaska in 1981. Alice and Al rejoined the McLain Family Band in the summer of 1985.

Alice McLain White, who played with Al in the Bluebird Special and Bluegrass Overdrive, plays mandolin and bass, often sings lead. She is a charter member of the McLain Family Band, spearheaded the group's tour around the world in 1975. She and Al have two children.

Michael McLain plays banjo and guitar. He and his brother Raymond play several banjo duet numbers leading one reviewer to comment that they 'showed the tightness of the band, like two thoroughbreds trotting in time'. Michael's specialty is sound engineering; and he and Raymond are also the family's sound technicians.

In its 19-year career, the McLain Family Band has become internationally known as one of the most spontaneous, creative and spirited groups performing contemporary Appalachian Bluegrass music. The band hails from Eastern Kentucky's Appalachian Mountains, where they host their own annual McLain Family Band Festival, which has been carried on NPR's Folk Festival USA and filmed by Kentucky Educational TV for national distribution. Other television appearances include NBC's Today Show, the CBS Morning News, the Pearl Bailey ETV Special, the BBC, TNN's Nashville Now and the Johnny Cash Christmas Special.


The McLains have performed in 62 foreign countries as musical ambassadors of the US State Department, and in 49 of the 50 states. They have appeared at Carnegie Hall, the Metropolitan Museum, the Kentucky Center, Chicago's Orchestra Hall and the Grand Ole Opry as well as throughout the country in over 180 concerts with symphony orchestras."







The Printing Press

Bob Feingold and Rich Flory, members of the Rhythm Cloggers, Houston, Tx, have begun operations of what is believed the first computer RBBS dedicated to the sharing of clogging via computer. The Printing Press, is an IBM compatible RBBS operating at 2400 baud on a 640K Turbo IBM Clone with a 40mb hard disk for uploading. The bulletin board will operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week; however, the sysops, Bob and Rick, can be reached most days afer 4 PM.

The Printing Press will be shared by other computer enthusiasts in the hopes that clogging may enter the lives of people who have never tried it. On the board will be schedules of competitions and workshops, Texas and National routines, bulletins of folk life festivals, contacts for exhibitions, Texas Clogging Council information and application form, C.L.O.G. application form, and general, new and upcoming events and knowledge concerning the increasingly popular dance form know as clogging.

A note on uploading routines, application forms, workshop notices, and general text files: To keep the cue sheets and text files uniform, please save your routines in ASCII format as a .txt file and utilizing a program called TXT2COM, transform the routine into its own program. TXT2COM is available on The Printing Press under the name of T2COM23 (the latest version) under the File Menu Category, Archiving Utilities. After downloading a routine from The Printing Press, simply type the file at the A:> and the routine will write itself to the screen of your computer. At the bottom of the screen, you are given the option to page thru the routine and to print a hard copy on your printer. Complete instructions are available on the bulletin board.


