STEPHEN FOSTER STATE FOLK CULTURE CENTER WHITE SPRINGS, FLORIDA

Now in it's thirty-sixth year, the Florida Folk Festival will attract an estimated 20,000 people. This year its focus will be Southwest Florida Traditions in the Folklife area and on Stage. The overall presentations feature aspects of all Florida's cultural heritage rarely seen by the public. The Florida Folklife office (Pat Stafford) was kind enough to send the list of participants and their presentations - 214 of them! Here are just a few of the areas covered:

Craft Presentations & Sales: Crafts, textiles, leather works, basketry (palm, pine needle, sweet-grass, white oak, and more), jewelry, brooms, pottery, Indian crafts, chair bottoming, seeds/grains, metal work, and milling.

Food Vendors: Seminole fry bread, gumbo, BBQ rib and chicken dinners, vegetable sandwiches, shish-ka-bobs, Spanish bean soup, chicken pilau, chicken and dumplings, hoppin' john, teriyaki, tempura, fried mullet, corn dogs, boiled peanuts, cracklin' bread, and collard greens. These are not all at one booth, but are some of the specialties of about fifteen food vendors. Standard hot dogs and hamburgers are available for the non-adventurous.

Seminole Camp: Demonstrations of Seminole basketry, patchwork, traditions, chickee roof thatching, and sofkee and fry bread.

Stage Programs: (each one different) All three days (Friday through Sunday) at 10 AM, 1:30 PM, and 7:30 PM. These include bluegrass, country, Celtic, folk, cajun, and bagpipe music. Vocals, storytelling, animal and bird calls, and puppetry. Dance including East Indian, International folk, Irish step, folk, and clogging.

Folklife Area: Harold Dunn of Sarasota will set up his woodcraft circus scenes; the Sailor Circus of Sarasota; plus much, much more.



The CROSS CREEK CLOGGERS, who take their name from Cross Creek, a small hamlet near Gainesville, Florida, were formed in 1978 by John Luna. Today they breathe life into the old ways by performing to the music of string bands, sponsoring public square dances, and continuing to teach classes and workshops. In 1985, the Cross Creek Cloggers toured the Soviet Union as part of a cultural exchange program.

Three Florida clogging groups were accepted by the board for this year's festival: Suwanee River Cloggers, Director: Ednell Newbern, Live Oak, FL; Cross Creek Cloggers, Director: Cindy Weygant, Gainesville, FL; and Sawgrass Revue, Director: Joanie Benton, Venice, FL.

The festival, May 27 -29, 1988, is held on the beautiful grounds of the Stephen Foster Stage Folk






Steve Smith, microphone in hand, demonstrating his Advanced Buck steps!





Possum Holler Fontana Village, NC Easter Weekend 1988

Early spring in Fontana Village was welcome therapy, and I'm home again renewed and ready, for new clogging classes next week - working each day on ten great new dances to teach.

Much as I love the refreshing cold of Wisconsin winters, it was pure animal delight to shed layers of heavy 'woolies' and bask in the cool spring air, just a-settin' and a-rockin' on the porch in the early morning quiet, mist softening the mountain horizon, and only the birds for company.

This year I shared a comfortable cottage with three friends who drove down with me from Janes-ville, and it was fun to observe the clogging workshops through the eyes of newcomers. One of Steve Smith's classes overflowed the scheduled conference room, and my friends incredulously described the scene. Steve was demonstrating steps on a picnic table to cloggers behind him in a concrete area, while in front of him there were dancers on black top (I was one of these), and far above on the hill and below in the parking lot, others were following his steps. Dancers passing by dropped jackets and bags in the grass to join in, perhaps a hundred cloggers dancing in the rain!

The main recreation hall with its wonderful wood floor was often filled to capacity. Many conference room classes were overcrowded, but most teachers and cloggers cheerfully and considerately adapted to the difficulties. The excellence of the choreography presented and the expertise of the instructors were more than worth the minor discomforts to most of us, even to an old claustrophobic like me.

There were dances at all levels and competition; judging and show dance seminars; and evening parties and shows. Additionally, there was a seminar on Freestyling Techniques (Bilz, Summey, Woodall, Skeen, Parrott, Douglas, Petty, Lowery, Driggs) and lectures and panel discussions on Putting Tradition Back in Dance (Steve Smith), Music - Traditional vs. Contemporary (Staff Panel), Keeping the Adult Dancing (Callahan, Smith, Burns) that I very much wanted to attend butdid not. My conscience dictated learning new dances I promised to bring back for classes, and some early evening time with the friends who were with me. The programming in Oklahoma City last year worked much better for me, with the Armadillo Stampede dance workshops preceding an evening and full day of discussion seminars. But perhaps most Fontana participants had to leave for home earlier to be ready for work on the day after Easter.

I would have been especially interested in learning why traditional and contemporary music and dance are considered adversarial. In my view, the old and the new need not oppose each other, and the best of both are thoroughly enjoyable. I agree

with Steve Smith and others that the American folk dance heritage should be treasured, preserved, and continued, but inventiveness and innovation are also a part of our American tradition. It's my belief that only the best of the new will last and in turn become part of the clogging heritage of the future; that fresh approaches, new ideas, and infusions from other traditions are part of what keeps clogging (and other folk arts) alive.

An idea that was tried in Fontana to hold some dance classes specifically for adults and others for kids seemed promising, and Jo Ann Gibbs announced that programming at the National C.L.O.G. Convention would expand this concept. Keeping Adults Dancing is my own aim here in Janesville, and clearly the musical tastes and dancing styles of dancers over fifty are usually somewhat different from those preferred by teenagers. BUT, careful now! We don't want to segregate the old folks from the young'uns. Much as the teenagers might sometimes like to have us old fogies off somewhere else out of the way, participation of extended families is part of the folk dance tradition, and learning and dancing some of each other's preferences can lead to understanding, companionship, consideration, and respect between grandparents, parents, and children, helping to bridge the 'generation gap.'

Adults can better appreciate what the young people are accomplishing if they try it themselves, and kids can learn that old age is not something to be feared, that life continues to delight. Still, the idea of scheduling some adult classes is a very good one I think, and opportunities for the young people to enjoy the company of their peers and their very fast-paced rock and roll in 'peace' is probably welcome, too. It worked very well in moderation, with an outstanding variety of music and dance also available for combined groups.

The Village offered a free night's lodging after our four night reservation, and we stayed over until Monday, attending the community church after the Easter sunrise service at Fontana Dam Knoll was rained out, and started for home tired and happy, sharing memories to be savored and stories to tell.





ALL THINGS CONSIDERED

"The more things change, the less they change" - certainly not an original thought on my part, but one that does seem to apply to American Square Dancing.

The other morning while searching for some ideas for this column, I ventured into 'The Archives' - a dimly-lit section of my garage which houses a potpourri of old dance records, books, magazines and writings on square dancing from yesteryear. With kerosene lantern in hand (just kidding), I leafed through several issues of square dance magazines dating back some 20 to 30 years, and much of the commentary found therein dealt with some very familiar topics.

It seems that our counterparts of yesteryear were wrestling with problems like the drop-out rate, too many dance levels, dancer recruitment, a need for more variety in programs, too long training time, pleas to put fun back in square dancing and a need for visionary leadership.

Sounds familiar. Isn't it interesting that with all the efforts put forth toward progressive thinking and planning in this activity during the last several years from a plethora of the best minds around - that we still seem to be standing on square one?

When dealing with a 'people activity' like square dancing, perhaps, sure-fire solutions to serving the recreational/entertainment needs of the multitude are really never solved! It's simply an ongoing challenge that requires from our leaders a kind, sympathetic ear and sincere efforts to change and grow with the times.

Then, too, it is quite possible that we are being too hard on ourselves; too critical in our evaluations, successes and failures, of the dance movement. After all, it is a people's dance - which simply means neither the people nor the dance is a picture of 100% perfection. I rather like that thought. Because it allows us to complain or compliment, sometimes in the same breath, and know for certain that we have that right as a proponent of the activity.

It's probably safe to assume that some of the same problems the square dance movement is attempting to resolve today, just as in past years, will be nipping at our heels 20 years up the road. In an odd way, that may be a healthy sign. Because if the time ever comes when the activity is unable to recognize it has problems, that is the

day when it will have its most critical one. The process of solving problems and efforts to resolve issues represent normal growth patterns and are healthy signposts that a movement is viable.

Frankly, I'm not too worried about the future of square dancing. The activity has endured and flourished through high and low cycles for hundreds of years. There is no reason to believe that it won't continue to do the same.

If one is looking for a smoking gun in the square dance movement, it won't be the day to day problems that will do us in - the culprits will be complacency and negativity.

As we look for newer and more effective ways to attract the general public to the attributes of square dancing, changes will undoubtedly occur as the movement adjusts to a rapidly changing high-tech society. The ingredients that must never change are the intrinsic values that color and give meaning to the basic fabric of the dance - a joyful social experience that nurtures lasting friend-ships and enhances the quality of life through rhythmic expression.

Square dancing's special flavor lies in its honesty and down home neighborliness. Like Dorothy and the Yellowbrick Road, the search for happiness of the heart can be found where the search began - at the grassroots of home and friends - a Yellowrock with the corner!

Editor's Note:

Though "organized clogging" hasn't nearly the numbers of people nor the written archives of American Square Dancing, Danny's article could well apply to cloggers and clogging today. "... A joyful social experience that nurtures lasting friendships and enhances the quality of life through rhythmic expressions."


Mountain Style Square Dance Figure Key

Odds Lead Right Figure #1


(Caller) "Odds lead right." From a big circle, the odd couples lead out to the right in front of the couple next door.

At the end of last month's figure, the caller had you progress to the line of dance and now you are at this point. Now let us get on with the next circle four figure.




Circle Left Figure #2

(Caller) "Circle left in a little bitty ring."
Dancers in circle fours circle to the left just half way around. Be careful to circle the same speed and place as the other circle fours.




Other Way Back Figure #3

(Caller) "The other way back." The circle fours circle back to the right stopping with odd couples backs to the center of the big set.




Set #1 Figure #4

At this point the caller has set up for the figure. Also at this point, it is one of the best places for the even couple (the square and circle with noses marked "E") to check and make sure the set is square.




Chase the Rabbit, Chase the Squirrel Figure #5

(Caller) "Chase the rabbit, chase the squir-rel, chase the pretty girl around the world." Odd lady dance between the even couple and around the even lady followed by the odd man. (Lady's path is solid arrow.)




Set #2 Figure #6

The odd couple are now in the middle of Chase the Rabbit. Without a stop, the odd lady dances between the even couple again, only this time after the odd lady turns to right and makes a full circle while the odd man goes in front of her and back into place.




Circle Left Figure #7

(Caller) "Circle left."
The circle fours circle
left until the even couple
have their backs to the
center of the set.




Chase the Possum Figure #8

(Caller) "Chase the possum, chase the coon, chase the old man around the moon." Even man dances between the odd couple and around the odd man. Followed by the even lady.




Set #5 Figure #12

After swinging your corner, the man rolls the lady out on his right and both keep turning until partners are facing.




Set #3 Figure #9

The even couple are now in the middle of Chase the Possum without a stop. The even man dances between the odd couple again and this time the even man turns left and makes a full circle




Swing your Partner Figure #13

(Caller) "Swing your partner." Without a stop swing your partner and turn the ladies out on the man's right side.




Set #4 Figure #10

This figure is very good for competition because it will always keep the set square and looking orderly as you can see.




Set #6 Figure #14

After the figure is complete, you find you and your partner in the same place you start. Check this set to be sure you are still square and have done a good job.




Swing your Corner Figure #11


(Caller) "Swing your corner." The swing will be in a big ring. Every time a man swings a lady, he always puts her on his right.




Spring Break Workshop Eustis, Florida

Blue Ribbon Cloggers International




