Marcia Rice of California writes, "Many years ago I read half of an article by Steve Smith (unfortunately the second half) which appeared in the September 1986 Double Toe Times. The article was titled "Use your Head when it Comes to your Feet." Could you reprint these important articles again?"

Also - regarding the June 1988 article "Practice Makes Perfect."
". . . I also highly recommend the use of a 'telephone pick-up', but warn my students that they will still get some background noise (taps) which comes through the microphone."

Editor: The Steve Smith articles on foot care are on our most requested list, so we are reprinting them in this issue and Ocotober 1988.

Bob Orman, Olympia Washington, sent the neat "hug poem" (found elsewhere in this issue) and asks some tough questions. They are questions being asked by many folks lately. Basically his question is how can we best share and learn clogging routines from all over the clogging world. At first glance videotapes seem to be the answer except for the fact that each videotape producer (usually the individual choreographer) has to pay some pretty stiff fees to use a copyrighted recording resulting in an exhorbitant cost per tape. This is why Steve Smith's tapes have no music. Additionally, this problem exists for conventions and workshops. It is illegal to reproduce and

sell copyrighted music without paying royalties. A second method is to purchase syllabuses from conventions and try to learn from the printed routines providing 1) the record is still available; 2) there are no errors (either accidental or deliberate; 3) you understand that particular terminology. Carl's Clogging Supplies and Specialty Records (see ads this issue) both carry syllabuses.

The mystique about instructors from the Southeastern United States being "the greatest" simply doesn't hold water. There are excellent instructors and choreographers in every part of the clogging world.

The reason you see so many southern conventions written up in The Double Toe Times is (sadly) a matter of economics. Just as it would be costly for you to come East, it is costly for me to go West. I have begged for photos and write-ups from every person listed in Upcoming Events, but it seems as though once the convention is over, it is forgotten. May I suggest that since it is a ten to twelve hour drive for me from Orlando, to say, North Carolina, that you consider driving an equal distance from your home base in California or Oregon. I believe you will find renewed enthusiasm, outstanding midwestern and western instructors and choreographers, and enough material to keep you challenged until the next convention!

I can identify with your "bear that went over the mountain to see what he could see" feeling, and I

know that the apple that hangs the farthest out on the limb always looks the sweetest, juiciest apple on the tree. I have traveled to some of the Never, Never Land Conventions and conclude that in all actuality, "there's no place like home."

Thanks, Bob, for the Garfield "Clogger"!





Washington is incredibly beautiful. The "Evergreen State" has pines that can droop or soar; are nearly white-green, blue-green, or black-green; and countless varieties. The lodge-pole pine forests on Whibey Island are hushed and dim and church-like, and seem to touch to sky. "The bluest skies you've ever seen are in Seattle" except when it's raining, which on the western side of the Olympic Mountains is often and on the eastern near-desert side is seldom. Sage is the ground cover on the non-irrigated mountain slopes. The valleys on the eastern side are laid out in neat patterns of fruit trees, mostly the famous

Washington state apples, but apricots and black bing and yellow Queen Anne cherries were being picked.

In Chelan, it was a chilly 50° - 60° on July 10th, though during the days it would get up to 90°, a fact that local TV newscasters were nearly giddy about. One could nearly O.D. on the clear, dry air. A resident group of Canada geese floated by far out on this cold glacier-formed lake.

We drove the long road along the other side of Lake Chelan to a beautiful state park where the campers were perched in tiers down to the lake, and chipmunks darted everywhere. They were too quick to photograph!

The California quail froze for a moment, but my camera was never at-the-ready. They are fairly big birds by comparison to our quick, little quail at home, and are beautifully colored with a delicate, comb-like ornament of feathers perched on the top of their



More on the 37th National Square Dance Convention



Anaheim, California

Could the 37th National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim, California have been real, or was it all a fantastic dream? At five o'clock in the morning of June 22, my friend Jan Carlson and I left Janesville, Wisconsin for the Chicago airport, and by midafternoon from the second floor balcony of our fashionable hotel, we watched a kaleidoscope of beautiful and original square dance outfits on Convention Way in Anaheim that did not end until midnight on Saturday, June 25th. Soon we too joined the parade in the cool, bright California sunshine and explored the convention center where dancing, seminars, shopping, and dining would begin the next day.

Like a couple of wide-eyed kids at the fair, we wanted to do and see everything and enjoyed a wide variety of events, sometimes as participants (clogging and square dancing), more often as observers (round dancing, contra, and the after-party shows). The beautiful, stylized round dancing to Latin rhythms at the Marriott Hotel, a novelty to us, was perhaps the most visually exciting of all the dancing to watch. Isn't it about time we added some Spanish flamenco heel clicks to our English-Scottish-Irish-European-African-Indian-Appalachian-American clog melting pot? If someone with imagination and skill wanted to develop the idea, I'd sure like to be first in line for the first workshop!

We cruised the vendors' booths, pausing for questions and purchases, stopped often for capuccino and treated ourselves to nachos and char-broiled hamburgers on the shady sides of two outdoor courts. We went to a sewing seminar and took in the Exhibit Hall, the Country Western Show, and the spectacular "Golden State of Parade" fashion show.

In the Clogging Hall, there were some twentysix instructors, including old friends and acquaintances Marilyn Hansen, Grayce and Eric Bice, and Lyndee Campbell, all Southern Californians, and Ralph Pierce from Knoxville; also Lois Elling whose Page 8 cassette tapes teach my beginner classes in Wisconsin more than I do! Despite the difficult acoustics, the hall was a popular attraction, and the Apple Creek Cloggers' Friday night after-party show, produced and directed by Marilyn Hansen, was a delightful and often hilarious success.

It was not possible to determine how many of the nearly 35,000 dancers who attended the convention visited the Clogging Hall, but cloggers I talked with seemed to agree that in general our own separate clogging workshops and events offer more learning experiences and opportunities to share the enthusiasm and joys of clogging than the National "Square Dance" Conventions. The hall was abuzz in anticipation of the Southern California Clogging Association workshop in Riverside September 2 - 4.

The Disneyland After-Pary Saturday night into Sunday morning was relatively quiet and subdued, a time to slide tired feet into sandals and relax in cool breezes until dawn; to plan our remaining stay in Orange County; and to begin to sort out special memories of our firest National FOLK Dance Convention to share with friends and family back home.

Some of these steps are known as "bop".


Another step was created, so the story goes, When a barefoot man stumped his toes

And finished with a "fancy double" close.


When a hornet went up the leg of his pants

It was made a standard in the clogging dance.


The "Tennessee mountain step" started with an old geezer

America's Clogging Hall of Fame (ACHF), a non-profit organization, was formed in 1984 and is heavily involved in the sanctioning of clogging competitions and the attendant Rules and Interpretations, Score Sheets, Judges, and Calendar. It is also devoted to honoring past and present leaders in the clogging community through annual inductions into the Hall of Fame and the forty-eight member All-American Team composed of current, top dancers from all over the country. They also award two college scholarships to outstanding high school seniors/cloggers every year.

ACHF's home base is The Stompin' Ground in Maggie Valley, North Carolina, and all Hall of Fame honorees' placques adorn the walls of the lobby. A Spring Workshop and Fall Competition are held in The Stompin' Ground with the Fall Competition incorporating annual honors, the presentation of Hall of Famers. and the All-American Team. Members receive free admission to both. All first, second, and third place winners from ACHF sanctioned competitions are invited to compete at the Fall Competition with no registration fee. NCHC has been invited to participate by sending their winners to the Fall Competition in Maggie Valley. The Ben Smathers Award, given to the highest scoring winner for male and female (over sixteen years old), will receive an invitation to dance on the Grand Old Opry (at Ben Smathers' discretion).



Taking Care of those Valuable Feet


We clog with our feet! That we need healthy and 'unhurting' feet goes without saying. I decided to write this article because of some painful personal experiences with injured feet. This is a two-part article with the first article emphasizing the need for clogger knowledge about foot care, with some illustrated foot-strengthening exercises. The second article will delineate some of the foot care aids that you might decide to use to avoid foot injuries. Footstretching exercises will be illustrated in the second article.

As a clogging instructor, I have had numerous students drop out of class due to foot, leg, and knee injuries. They are often disappointed and hopeless, not knowing that there are some strategies that may help them rehabilitate.

In April of 1982 at the National Clogging and Hoedown Council's Spring Meeting in Ohio, I severely injured a nerve in the top of my foot. I continued to dance with MUCH pain. I had classes to teach, exhibitions to perform, competitions to go to, and worst of all, I just wanted to CLOG.

To make a long story short, I refused to stop dancing which aggravated the injury and made it impossible to heal. Finally, after many doctors (each giving different advice ranging from surgery to dietary changes) and much wishful thinking on my part, I did what I had to do - I STAYED OFF OF MY FEET!

I was given crutches and told not to walk on my injured foot for four to six weeks. The emotional pain was excruciating - I thought I would die. However, life went on. I caught up on schoolwork that needed to be done and Janet ran classes. I found out that competitions ran on without me and exhibitions could be cancelled. Those were gloomy days,

3) Return slowly to starting position.

but I learned patience and learned to truly respect my feet. I had treated them miserably for three years, and they were telling me the only way that they could with pain. I had danced in street shoes without support or padding, on concrete many times. I had stomped, jumped, and beat my feet unmercifully. I was time to stop. It was six more months before I could BEGIN to clog. It has taken four years to return my feet to their rightful state of health. I have learned much on how to care for MY feet. I hope that the information I share with you will be helpful so you can care for YOUR feet!

I divide foot care into four categories:

- 1) Stretching Exercises: Warms and stretches the muscles - helps to avoid tears and pulling of the ligaments, tendons, and nerves.
- 2) Strengthening Exercises: Builds the ligaments and supporting tissues of the foot.
- 3) Foot Supports: Provides support for the pounding that clogging feet take.
- 4) Shock Absorption: Cushions shock of repeated impact between foot and surface.

Illustrated below are four foot-strengthening exercises that require only a two-foot piece of surgical tubing (get a medical friend to get you a piece). Make a loop at both ends using white adhesive tape tightly bound to secure the loops. One loop will go around your foot. The other will serve as a way to anchor the other end. Simply wrap the tubing around the leg of a couch or some other heavy object and thread one loop through the other. Now you are anchored to the furniture. Slip the other loop around your foot as illustrated.

Work up to fifty repetitions on the Dorsiflexers. Inverters, and Everters. Thirty repetitions on the Plantar Flexors will do nicely. Plantar Flexor exercises are particularly important to avoid heel pain resulting from tears in the plantar fascia.

I made the mistake early in my rehabilitation of thinking that if I just stayed off my feet, then they would heal. That was only part of the treatment. I also had to rebuild the muscles that had atrophied. I continue these exercises today and consider them very important to my foot maintenance. Give them a try, and I'll have some new ones for you next month. We'll also talk about stretching exercises, foot supports, and shock absorption.

- 1) Tubing around foot.
- 2) Move your foot and ankle from extreme-in to extreme-out position.
- 3) Return slowly to starting position.



- 1) Stand erect on step.
- Raise up onto your toes.
- Lower yourself so your heels drop below the step as far as possible.
- 4) Return to starting position.


We visited Joan Martin, instructor for the Windy Page 14


The Director of The Flatland Cloggers, Chesapeake Virginia, Mr. Bob Johnson had seen me dance in Orlando and Daytona Florida and invited me to come to Virginia for the month of July 1988 to dance with his team. On July 5th, I flew to Virginia and the next day we all boarded the Flatland bus headed for their annual trip to Harrison Maine for four days of performance at Harrison Old Home Days.

I was introduced to real mountain style dancing and was totally lost in the beginning. The entire team pulled me through and each time we danced, I loosened up and became a little more familiar with their program. Their type of dancing is totally different from the clogging in Florida. They are constantly doing something, and there's no time to just do basics.

Once again, we climbed on the bus for Virginia. We performed a show every Sunday. These Sunday shows were more difficult that those in Maine because the audiences were smaller and tamer, but we always managed to wake them up.

On July 30th, I entered the East Coast Clogging Championship in solos. After the scores were tallied I couldn't even think straight when they told me I'd tied for Grand Champ with Elliott Skeen, North Carolina. We were both presented with a Grand Championship trophy.

The whole trip was really a great experience, and as long as I live, I'll never forget Bob Johnson and The Flatland Cloggers.



Making a List...

with key words to jog my memory. Some of those lists are 20 years old, and when I read them and begin remembering and laughing, I get no writing done at all. If, as my daughter says, my writing helps her to know me better, I wonder what my lists would mean to her. She'd commit me! All those funny drawings in caves discovered by archeologists are actually early cavewomen's lists. TK meant two deer and a dinosaur for dinner, and O + meant make new clay pot and a blanket for Uncle George's birthday. If I had homesteaded in Kentucky in the late 1700's, the Indians would have run for their lives after seeing my charcoal lists on the birchbark trees! Listmaking, folks, comes with the package. Like blue eyes or big feet. Doing the items on the lists is irrelevant. The whole point is the high hope, great expectation aspect of making the list. And a list is not just a list; it's an art form. I use most anything - backs of envelopes, the top strip on page two of the classified section, inside my telephone book under Emergency Numbers. My prize is my hymnal from Linden Hall School for Girls - every morning during 8AM Chapel, I dated and did my list for the day slanted crossways across a hymn in green ink. Things like "Nov. 7, 1951, see Bumpy and Buttons after class in gym", or "Mar. 1, 1952, campused for one month. I didn't tell who helped me run the Art teacher's red nightgown up the flagpole. Dr. Horne tried not to laugh."

I have a list, actually a lot of lists, of topics

When I am in a precise, today-I'm-gonna-get-alot-done mood I use a standard, yellow, legal pad, and I write very clearly with very small handwriting. The lower right corner starts from the bottom line. two items per line (I mean small) as a grocery and sundries list, and grows from the bottom up to conserve space at the top for very important items. The upper right corner is my do list. It has some permanent items that are put on daily so that I can check something off in the evening - i.e., do laundry. feed dog. I always do those things every day, but it's so gratifying to check them off. The entire left side of the paper is for those REALLY, REALLY important things, some of whick keep getting transferred to my newest list, like an accountant who "carries the balance forward." For instance - "UPS X'mas package to Carol" shows up on lists dated 11/1, 12/3, 1/22, 2/10 (with four exclamation points) and 3/19. Carol got the package of April Fool's Day. Or the item Pick up Watch - the jeweler has called four times. Nine out of ten, I forget my list when I go to the grocery and have to wing it - which is why we have eleven bottles of catsup on the shelf and no mustard. But it's fun to check off what I did remember, and there are always a few goodies to start a fresh list with. Listmaking builds to a crescendo as I approach Christmas. I always ask the family to make a list of what they each want. This year I promptly misplaced their lists and was embarassed to ask again. It is now January, and their lists turned up in my brown coat pocket. Isn't it nice that they have June birthdays?

And a Reader Writes . . .

by Marcia Rice Bloomington, California

July 1988 Steve Smith's article on Getting Cue Sheets in on Time. Great, wonderful - I love it! Your insight is right on target. I have headed this type of cue sheet committee many times for our own Southern California Clogging Convention and the Possum Trot Workshop. For the last three years it HAS BEEN VERY FRUSTRATING getting cue sheets days before an event (a week if you're lucky) and even on the day of the event. The proposal you suggested setting a date in your contract for when the cue sheets are due, and then charging the workshop instructor five percent of their fee for every day they are late makes sense to me! I have already passed this information on to my constituents to incorporate into our contracts.

How about another suggestion? In addition to getting the cue sheets in on time, how about some attempt being made to have the cue sheets accurate? Many of us have been to too many workshops where a syllabus was bought, and eighty to ninety percent of the cue sheets had errors in them - and sometimes major errors! What a waste of time and printing as well as a waste of our money purchasing there poorly done syllabusi. To date I know of only one person with an almost perfect track record. When I pick up one of her cue sheets, I know it can be easily read and understood. Out of the hundreds of cue sheets she has done. I think I have only seen one error and a very minor one at that! I would like to commend Janice Hanzel from Northern California for all her dedication and countless hours of work slaving over the typewriter (as well as the phone)!

Maybe it would be well worth our while to hire her as a clearing house for all cue sheets (sorry Janice!) instead of throwing thousands of dollars away on syllabusi that are essentially worthless. Or. . . maybe those of you who are in charge of collecting the cue sheets for workshops could put this into the contract: "The workshop instructor will be responsible for cue sheet accuracy. They will be responsible for reprinting corrected cue sheets and will distribute them to all who purchased the syllabus. The aforementioned corrected sheets will be done in a timely manner (say within two weeks). The reprinting being limited to MAJOR errors such as section omissions; section changed from cue sheets originally sent; more than

(two or three???) step changes." I may be over-stepping my bounds, and I certainly DO NOT want to step on anyone's toes or ruin friendships, but it sure would be nice to go to a workshop and pay for a syllabus that I know is at least ninety percent accurate. By the way, Steve, THANKS! . . . and I'll be looking for your cue sheets for our upcoming convention over Labor Day weekend!



Editor's Note: Thanks for your timely comments! I just put together a 111 page syllabus for The Pirate's Ball and might add some interesting near-epithets on the condition of the cue sheets such as 1) copy extending too far beyond a reasonable margin; 2) a copy of a copy of a copy of a copy (UGH); 3) black blobs; 4) folded on a line (on a copier copy this 'breaks up' the typed line and is nearly unreadable; 5) handwritten corrections which are unreadable to all but a handwriting expert; 6) lack of name, address, and phone number with proper zips and zones on every sheet of every routine!

The View from There Continued

This trip to Washington gave me the opportunity to 1) learn how to work with my new camera on some of the most breathtaking scenery in the world; 2) talk with clogging folks in their own bailiwick. Both 1) and 2) now have a clear, crisp focus! I was told that a three or four state area in the Pacific Northwest currently has over forty clogging instructors and a potentail mailing list of 800. I have been told about a single instructor in California who had over 500 show up for a new beginner class and had to split the class up to other nights.

I saw several teaching agendas and the clogging program from Anaheim. The June Hee Haw Competition in Nashville saw top winners from Utah. The fine folks in Washington, California, Utah, New Mexico, Oregon, Arizona and eleven other western states are choreographing, teaching, performing and GROWING!

My sincere THANKS to Ann and Fred Bresch, Kenn and Ginny Trimble, Mary Dart, Misty Mailloux, Shalynn Mercier, Cher and Ron Francis, Joan, Chop & Buzz Martin, Audrey and Bill Metz for their Pacific Northwest Hospitality.

My love to the Harker kids who still let me "Mother" them; to Bill Harker who patiently puts up me; and most especially to my dearest friend Carol Harker.
