



One of my favorite local tourist side trips has vanished! North and east of Orlando, near the road into the Black Hammock and Liar's Lodge Fish Camp, were the the natural, spring fed troughs in which grew 90% of the nation's commercially marketed watercress. WATERCRESS - a perennial [Rorippa Nasturtium officinale] usually growing in clear, running water and having pungent leaves, used for salads, soups, and as a garnish.

Watercress was also used to line and define rows in meat cases in very fancy butcher shops, as a green garnish atop steaks in very fancy restaurants, and in 'high tea' sandwiches. The sandwiches were my first watercress experience nearly forty years ago; thin, crustless, brown bread, cream cheese, and a thin layer of watercress leaves. The bread, the cream cheese, and the watercress were all good, sturdy Amish farm fare fancied up for the crooked-pinkie, front-parlor, headmaster's 'tea'. The minute I bit into my first sandwich, I knew it was not lettuce. Many years later in The Leopard, a brownstone, price-fixed restaurant in New York City, I had cream of watercress soup. The word 'pungent' is apt.



I do not know why I enjoyed seeing acres and acres of long trenches filled with watercress, with a natural spring bubbling out of a pipe into each 'pond'. Once I watched the harvest - the tops banded and cut and the similarly banded roots thrown back into the water to produce another crop. Man's ingenuity in taming a simple wild cress, which usually appears on the edges of creeks in spring, takes away something from the brief spontaneity of the early appearance of

'greens' after a cold, root-cellar winter. But then, Florida is not hampered by winter - perhaps that was the joy of the watercress farm.

Happily, for those who like watercress, I'm told that the watercress farms moved further south. My northern visitors will never again hear me say, "Would you like to drive out to see the watercress farms?"

If it is your error, you lose that copy, but will receive the following month's issue at your



The only other requirement is that the featured person must be listed in the Directory of this paper. Let me hear from you!

Peg McLerran writes they have created a new team category called Regional Traditional Free Style for the 1989 U. S. Clogging Championship which will be held June 2nd and 3rd (see ad this issue for further info). Realizing different regions of the country have their own traditions, Peg hopes this new category "will encourage the preservation of the regional dances that have been squeezed out of most competitions." Whatever is traditional to your region is what Peg wants. Four, six, eight, or sixteen couple teams of all ages are invited to do "Your Thing", using hoedown or traditional music, and free style footwork in a routine under eight minutes. The scores will be averaged after the high and low scores are thrown out. Each participating team is asked to bring a representative who knows the figures and patterns their team is using, and these representatives will collectively judge the category. Peg says: "If it looks good, feels good, sounds good and is common to your area, then do it."

This Editor thinks this could be a very innovative category accounting for the many regional variations we've all heard about.

Bernadette Savoie started a senior citizen clogging class in St. Johns, New Brunswick (Canada). Often the older dancers dropped out of clogging after graduation from a regular beginners class because the pace got too fast for them. Bernadette and the senior cloggers are having a ball, and she writes, "I feel like a doctor doing something very good for a patient, and it's wonderful to see these old and new happy faces again!" 



Blue Ridge All Star Clogging Classic Gainesville, Georgia

The first annual Blue Ridge All Star Clogging Classic was held on February 11, 1989 at the Georgia Mountain Center in Gainesville, Georgia. It was hosted by Kerry Thomas and his teams, Sugar n Spice, Sassafras, Southland Express, and Limited Edition. The competition had over five hundred dancers in participation, and an excess of six hundred spectators. The competition began at 9:00 AM with Solos. It was very encouraging to see so many young solo competitors. The 6 and under age category was the largest with forty girls and twenty boys competing. The Grand Champion Solo Female was Sonja Shepard from Tennessee. The Grand Champion Male Solo winner was Scotty Bilz from Georgia. The team categories began immediately following Solos. First, second, and third place teams were awarded trophies, and each member of the placing teams received ribbons. The following teams received Grand Champion Awards:

Stadel Charon, Inverness, Florida, is a musician, a clogger and instructor (albeit a reluctant one), and a master woodworker and carver. He makes mountain lap dulcimers with either the traditional scroll finial or a magnificent, hand-carved, eagle finial. (By special order, he carved a rather fearsome, mule-head finial for this editor's dulcimer.)

He also carves the canes from odd-shaped trees/roots, each one an unusual animal head, often dictated by the configuration of the root.



Some of his most recent wood carving endeavors are pictured here - mountain cloggers! He has completed about a dozen, and no two are alike. This editor has purchased the three pictured here, plus a fiddler and bass viola player. They are four to five inches high, with delightful detail and facial expressions and are subtly and artfully colored. He has been experimenting with various woods and has located a source for larger basswood pieces in preparation for large figures in the future.

In St. Petersburg, there really is a Pied Piper, but instead of leading children out of town never to be seen again, she leads them through a variety of dances and on to bigger and better performances wherever they go. Her name is Elvi Lamping, and she is the director/instructor of three teams of children cloggers. They are the Cabbage Patch Cloggers, ages 10 - 12; the Cabbage Patch Pee Wees, ages 5 - 9; and the Southern Sweethearts and Beaus, age 13 and over. Elvi combines a God-given talent for working with children and an endless source of energy to produce the most eye-catching, exciting entertainment around. Her secret is she truly cares about every one of her 'kids', and they respond to that affection.



Elvi, who was born in Cuba thirty-seven years ago, has been clogging for only five and a half years and has been teaching for four of those years. Elvi originally began clogging with Becky James of the Berry Patch Cloggers and then went on to become an instructor at the Jeanne Lynn Dance Studio where she has over 145 students, and has formed her own clogging team which now consists of forty-three children. She loves to mix country with modern music to provide variety for the kids.

When not clogging, Elvi enjoys spending time with her husband, Sam, and her daughter, Michelle, going to the beach and fishing. She is also Vice President of the St. Petersburg International Folk Fair Society and is very active with the children's groups at her church. Elvi has always loved working and teaching children and believes the Lord has blessed her with the patience and ability to do so.

Elvi's goals are to grow with her team's abilities to perform, dance, and to meet the needs of the elderly in her community by the young people sharing what they enjoy and entertaining them and bringing a smile and joy into their lives. She also stresses good fellowship and love among the children and parents on the team. Since America has opened it's

arms to the people of Cuba to come live in this free land, Elvi has always wanted to do something in return and feels that teaching young people in our country to realize that clogging, as an American Folk Dance, is a very important part of our American Heritage and is her way of saying, "Thank you, America."

The Cabbage Patch Cloggers began almost four years ago with approximately ten children, dancing at local fairs and nursing homes. In the short time that has passed, they have grown to over forty in number (three teams), with a waiting list, and have expanded their appearances to include several local television stations, Walt Disney World, Stompin' Grounds, Ghost Town in the Sky and Sea World, to mention only a few. Although 'her kids' are always in demand, Elvi still sets time aside for them to dance at local nursing homes, because the children touch the lives of the elderly so much. Nurses report that patients who were listless and unresponsive, perk up after watching the children dance and getting to talk with them.

Although they consider themselves a show/exhibition team rather than a competition team, they have an outstanding record in this area too. In 1987, 1988, and 1989, they entered the Southern States Competition bringing home carloads of trophies, and the Florida State Championship in 1988.

In addition to their clogging abilities, several children have shown a real talent for writing original dances which have won in competition. Also, two 7-year-olds won First Place in the Star Search Finals that were held in Clearwater and were later flown to New York for a private audition.

One quality that stands out is the definite family atmosphere that prevails throughout the three teams with the children and parents being close friends and very supportive of one another. They really enjoy what they are doing and being together. As the mother of an only child, Elvi says, "Clogging has given my daughter the brothers and sisters she's always wanted."

When you meet this Pied Piper and her kids, it is no small wonder that so many children have followed Elvi Lamping down the fun road to CLOGGING!!!



Members receive free admission to both. All first, second, and third place winners from ACHF sanctioned competitions are invited to compete at the Fall Competition with no registration fee.

The Ben Smathers Award, given to the highest scoring winner for male and female (over sixteen years old), will receive an invitation to dance on the Grand Old Opry (at Ben Smathers' discretion).



Charity Competition and Concert

Through the combined efforts of many top clog dancing workshop instructors, for the first time ever, a clogging competition will be held at Atlanta's beautiful World Congress Center and the historically registered Fabulous Fox Theater, one of America's most unique and beautiful theaters.

It's a double contest: a clogging competition and a fund-raising competition for clogging clubs and teams. All proceeds will benefit the Brain Tumor Foundation for Children. The goal is to help add a wing to Emory University's Henrietta Egleston Children's Hospital in Atlanta for the specific purpose of providing treatment, therapy and research for children

with malignant brain tumors.

The clogging community has long been known for their tremendous contributions to civic and charitable endeavors, and we have received many indications of desire to help from cloggers across the country. All participating cloggers will help raise funds between January and June 1989 for the Brain Tumor Foundation for Children. The team raising the most money for the foundation will receive a seven-foot trophy identical to the seven-foot trophy presented to the Overall Grand Champions of the competition. The competition will be held June 2nd at the World Congress Center and trophies and dance-offs will be presented during a country-western concert June 3rd at the Fabulous Fox Theater, staring Lee Greenwood and T. Graham Brown, and featuring the Grand Champion Clogging Team.

I became involved as a local sponsor with this benefit because several brain tumor children are clogging students at my studio. I wanted to help because I so admire these children for their tremendous courage, their super strength of character and their tenacity for life. Many other dance studios will not accept these children because 'they are different.'

Children who have had brain surgery, chemother-

apy, and radiation to remove, kill, or slow the growth of tumors are turned away by most dance studios -- even though dancing helps these kids recover some of their motor coordination lost as result of brain tumor treatment. Many of these children are nearly bald as a result of chemotherapy and radiation treatments. Some squint eyes or are even legally blind as a side effect of treatment. Yet, brain tumor children long for the same acceptance, the same learning opportunities, and the same accomplishments every other child yearns for.

Their minds are sharp, and they are fighters. They literally have had to fight for their lives, and in comparison, fighting for knowledge and ability is

much easier. THEY DON'T GIVE UP!

Part of my job as a sponsor of this benefit competition and concert is to contact businesses, dance supply vendors, and other clogging groups to secure more sponsors to help cover production overhead so that every cent possible raised by clog dancers can go 100% to the foundation. I am hoping that readers of this article, especially those we haven't been able to reach in other ways, will want to participate in this worthwhile undertaking and help us help these kids. Many people do not know that brain tumors kill more children under age fifteen than any other disease except leukemia. I didn't know that fact until after I was approached to provide clogging classes for these children.

We are looking for a lot of volunteers -- competitors, fund-raisers, spectators -- to come help make our clogging competition and music concert successful, and have a great deal of fun along the way to helping add a brain tumor wing to Henrietta Egleston

Children's Hospital.

Exhibition Exclamation

Cloggers take heart. You do not have to be involved in competitions to be worth your salt as a clogger. I have written an article or two over the last thirteen years expounding on my acquired philosophy about the activity of clogging, expressing the notion that it is a performing art and not a competitive sport. I still maintain that most clogging competitions are an ordeal that mostly involve cloggers either patting each other on the back or stabbing each other in the back. All of the preparation, time, and expense involved just isn't fun unless you are one of those groups that must prove that you are better than everyone else. This usually

means being protective about your routine and steps, becoming selfish and self-centered. 'Better' by whose standards? Maintaining tradition is fine, but why must we always compete? Why not just teach?

Despite what seems like an endless list of competitions begging for your time and effort, I honestly believe there are hints that competitions are becoming less and less desirable. More and more clogging groups are seeing the light. They are burning out sooner on competitions and are discovering that they are not any less of a viable team for doing their own thing; having fun; enjoying an occasional workshop/ dance, and more exhibitions.

Exhibitions are really where it is at. Clogging teams need to expose their talents and spread the fun aspect of this activity to someone besides other cloggers. Festivals, fairs, grand openings, parades, parties, benefits, and country music shows are just a few of the opportunities that can keep you plenty busy. Sometimes this involves a little promotion. Appreciative audiences are far more rewarding than a room full of trophies you seldom get a chance to brag about. Yes, my team does have a room full of trophies.

Don't get me wrong, I still get involved in a competition once in a while. There are good and bad competitions just like anything else. Kerry Thomas has done a good job with the Blue Ridge Mountain Competition. He evidently has a good pulse on what cloggers really want. His new Blue Ridge Allstar Clogging Classic forced him to refuse participation after eight-five teams. An obvious draw is the nonsanctioned, not-so-restrictive rules that open the door and allow more room for creativity. No professional rule pleasers here! This makes me interested.

Still, my heart is in exhibitions. I think it is time that those teams that embrace the philosophy of sharing the activity of clogging; emphasizing the fun and entertainment value; clog up and be recognized. No one has yet held up this banner. Maybe I am that person. I truly suspect that there are many exhibition teams out there whose ideas and opinions should be better represented in the clogging world. You do not have to have a competition trophy to prove you are a legitimate clogging team.

I was pleasantly surprised recently in a conversa-



tion with a director of a Georgia clogging team well known for living, breathing, and eating competitions just about every weekend and hardly ever going home with anything less that a first place trophy. This director actually admitted to being just about totally burned out on competitions. This team has burned the competition flame longer and harder than most. I don't think I am too far from mainstream thinking when I predict that more and more teams will be less likely to ignite the competition flame for very long, if at all.

I salute all the exhibition teams that maintain and share the true spirit of friendly fun, entertainment, and shared excitement that clogging is meant to be --- without feeling the need to compete with their feet!



This S. Y. S. (Save Your Stuff) is brought to you by convention directors/instructors from around the world.

Shoe Tip: Using a waterproof, indelible pen, put your name and area code/phone number on the instep of the soles of BOTH your tap shoes. Calls and UPS will be COLLECT!

When you purchase a syllabus or a bag of records, immediately put your name and address on them in a prominent place.

Just like camp, jackets, sweaters, coats, and shedable clothing should have name tags - for children and adults.

If you are a chronic "forgetful", put a check-list in your pocket and make sure everything that came into the hall goes home; i.e., car keys, jean jacket, three children, husband, mother-in-law, AND be sure you know what their clothing looks like. A "lost" jacket held up week after week is apparently unrecognizable to the owner!

A large northern club holds a quarterly auction of lost and found items. The last one netted the club \$147.00 (minus 10% instructor's commission for finding, toting, and storage) and disposed of five and one-half pairs of boots, eighteen scarves, two winter ski hats, a London Fog topcoat, and three right and twenty-two left mittens/gloves (none matching).


SAVE YOUR STUFF!

How You Can Be A Needle Expert



It is important for you to know that the only link between the record and the phonograph is the needle. If the needle is worn or damaged, imperfect or distorted sound will be produced. This is one reason why it is so important that the needle be in good condition.

Upon close examination, it can be seen that the needle tip resembles the tip of a ball-point pen. If is designed to ride against both sides of the V-shaped record groove as illustrated below.



As the record rotates, the needle tip follows the patterns of the record grove as it was imprinted by the record manufacturer. As the tip rides in the record, it generates large amounts of heat and pressure on the record grove. This constant friction causes wear to the needle tip that leads to "flats". Flats can be described as the grinding down on a conical stylus tip into a chisel point that may damage records. It is extremely important that the stylus be checked regularly.



HINTS ON NEEDLE LIFE: How long will a phonograph needle last and how will I know when it is worn out? Unfortunately, when you can hear that the needle is worn (a hissing sound from the record) or see shavings on the record, it is already too late - the damage has been done. An easy way to determine needle wear is to keep track of approximate hours the needle has been in use. When gauging the length of time a needle will last, many variables must be taken into account. Things like the tone arm weight, record condition, dust in the air, whether a monaural or stereo needle is being used and tip material of the needle all contribute to needle life. If the above conditions are controlled, you may expect the following hours of play from your needle:
