Sponsoring Your First Clogging Workshop Part 1: The Preliminaries

You've decided to sponsor your first clogging workshop. Everyone's excited as they anticipate their very own clogging workshop. Numerous details need to be taken care of:

When should you have it? Where should you have it? Who should you invite to instruct? How long should the workshop last?

What will it cost to sponsor this event? . . . The list goes on and on and seems overwhelming.

Where should you begin? Slow down and start at the very beginning. . . "a very fine place to start" as I recall from a favorite childhood song. Too often, people get excited with a new idea that sounds like great fun and rush forward without thinking their ideas through thoroughly. In the end, they realize they got in over their heads, and too often, the result is disappointment and frustration. Applying a few proven business tactics will help make your clogging workshop (or any event) a success.

First of all, begin planning well in advance. The longer the event, the more time you'll need to pull all of the details together. Before you choose the dates for your event, do your homework and make sure your workshop will not conflict with other local events or major national events. To determine what else is going on, collect flyers at events you attend

and read the ads in the clogging publications.

Keep your perspective! Sponsoring a clogging workshop can be great fun and very rewarding. is, if everyone gets involved and fully supports the idea -- the same idea. Before you dive in head first, sit down with your group and discuss what exactly it is you want to do. If you want the support of your group, and you should, you need to involve them from the beginning. If your group/team/club is not interested in working to sponsor this workshop, think twice about doing it. One or two people cannot do it alone.

Do you want an afternoon workshop? A full day workshop? Or a two or three day event? Do you want dances included in your event? Exhibitions? Do you want to invite local and/or national instructors to teach at your workshop? How will you promote the workshop? Where do you want to draw your audience from? . . . As you're deciding these things, keep in mind the following:

How many people do you have who are willing to work and help sponsor the event? (Who can you

really count on?)

Do you have any money in a group treasury to invest in the event? The longer the workshop,

the more it's going to take.

If you have money at your disposal, how much are you willing to risk by investing in this workshop? These factors are key in determining the type of event you should have.

Your Audience. Will your area support such an event? The importance of this cannot be emphasized enough, because initially, that's where you will draw

most of your support. It's easy to feel that you're going to put on the best event ever, and of course, everyone will know that and be busting down your doors to get in, right? Unfortunately, this rarely happens at first-time events. It takes time to establish your workshop's credibility and for the 'word' to get out and attract others.

Initially, plan on drawing from within a 100-mile radius for a one-day event. Yes, some will travel further, but marketing studies support that most people will not travel over 100 miles for a one-day function that does not involve a sleep-over. For an event that involves an overnight stay, you can plan on people traveling from further away, but remember, you're not likely to draw many of them that first

time around.

Knowing the concentration of cloggers in your target area will assist you in determining the likely size of your workshop. To help get a realistic picture of the number of cloggers in your area, take a local map and pinpoint the location of your event. Draw a circle around it, 100 miles out on all sides. Then, take a look at how many clogging groups, clubs, and teams meet within that area. This may seem like a lot of wasted time; after all, you know how many cloggers are around you, right? You may find yourself pleasantly surprised if you actually do this exercise. Some of those cloggers you knew were just "down the road a bit" may actually be further away and may not necessarily travel to your workshop.

Once you get an idea of how many cloggers are in your area, estimating how many will support your event by attending is more difficult. How congenial is your group with the other groups around you? Unfortunately, as clogging grows and spreads, with new groups breaking away from old, hard feelings tend to develop. This will affect your attendance, so give it careful consideration. If your group, as a whole, gets along well with the other groups in your area, you can safely plan on 50% of each group supporting you that first time. It may be more, and it may be less,

but this is a fairly safe bet.

Perhaps you want to involve other groups in sponsoring this workshop? By doing so, you are likely to draw more people to your event. However, depending on how you handle it, you could end up with more "chiefs" that want things done their way, instead of "indians" that you need to help get things done.

The Monetary Investment. Very little can be accomplished today without some financial risk and investment. How much does your group have to invest? You'll need money up front to print promotional flyers and for any deposits that may be required (example, to reserve a hall). If you do not have much money available, you can try to raise the money with various fundraisers, providing you are planning this event far enough in advance.

To determine what it will cost to run your event, draw up a budget, or list of projected expenses, for your workshop. A budget takes time to prepare, but it's really quite simple, and if prepared carefully, it will represent a realistic picture of what you can expect. It will also help you price your workshop.

Begin by making a list of all the expenses that will be involved. Estimate what each will cost. If you're not sure of a particular item, call around to a few suppliers and get some estimates. Don't forget about the resources available to your group.



Someone may work for a printer or know someone who does. Someone else may know the owner of a hall. Some of the best bargains are at your fingertips, so tap into them. Don't just guess what items will cost. More often than not, just guessing, we underestimate. When planning your budget, you'll be better off overestimating and trimming the figures down later.

Items to include in your budget are: (Note: this list is comprehensive, and many of the items listed are optional and not necessary for your event to be successful. Many of the expense items may be obtained at no cost.)

Income:

Registration Vendor booth rentals Advertisements in syllabus Syllabus sales T-shirt sales

Expenses:

Preparation and promotional costs -

Deposits (hall, flooring, etc.)
Printing and paper costs for promotional flyers
Typesetting and log artwork for flyers
Advertisements in clogging publications and

other syllabi Telephone calls

Paper and postage for local news releases

Event expenses -

Hall rental fees and setup fees
Travel and lodging expenses for instructors
and/or workers

Flooring and stage rentals
Printing of syllabus

Purchase and printing of T-shirts

Dancer/spectator badges and/or ribbons

Sound equipment rental Chairs and tables rental

Insurance

Decorations Security

Awards and/or prizes

Gratuities to facilities staff

Miscellaneous (allow \$50 to \$100)

Afterparty refreshments

Net - Income less expenses (if this is a negative number, you need to trim down your expenses!)

After preparing your budget, you should have a better idea of the monetary investment involved in sponsoring your workshop. A well-defined budget can help keep you on track, providing you revise it accordingly and use it as a guideline for expenditures.

After you've chosen your dates, decided on the magnitude of your workshop, realized who your audience will be, and defined your budget, you are well on your way to sponsoring a successful workshop. Next time, I'll provide tips on choosing a location

and negotiating a rental contract.

Editor's Note: Elizabeth plans as many as 130 meetings in one year in her current job. In her free time, she's an active clogger, serves as the Director of the Annual International Cloggin' Jamboree, and is currently assisting NCHC with the spring 1990 meeting and workshop.




Wildwood Whistle Stop

Bring a Quality Instructor To Your Doorstep

How would you like to have your favorite instructor teach you and your class/club in a small, intimate workshop? "That would be great", you say, "but we could never afford it!"

Phooey! You can't afford not to!

I recently did such a workshop, and it was a treat for all of us. Let's look at some of the advantages for the club and local instructors in such a workshop.

Individual Attention and Control

Workshop participants get to meet the visiting instructor "up close and personal." They get individual attention and contact in a way that is impossible in larger workshops.

Team Critiquing

The club/exhibition team has the opportunity to be critiqued by the visiting instructor. Not only is this a neat learning experience for the team, but also supportive for the local instructor. Support occurs when the visiting instructor reinforces some of the same points that the local instructor has been trying to get across for months. Sometimes people listen more clearly to someone from "the outside."

Tailored Instruction

The workshop can be tailored to meet the needs and level of the club/team. Much more latitude on the part of the instructor is possible if the group is small. There is nothing more frustrating than to go to a workshop where the level of instruction and type of instruction doesn't meet your needs.

Instructor as Consultant

The visiting instructor, in a consulting role, can also observe the club "from a distance" - not possible if one is a member of the club. This perspective can offer valuable information to the local instructor in terms of class or club management.

Exposure to Workshop Experience

It is difficult in many clubs, to persuade team members to travel to workshops. By bringing the workshops to their door, attendance is made easy, and everyone can take advantage of a workshop experience.

Now for the BIGGIE - THIS KIND OF WORKSHOP IS CHEAPER FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS! Let me show you how.

Typical expenses if one attends a weekend work-

shop includes the following:

Motel: \$50 per night, 2 nights \$200 if shared with friend

Food: \$10 a day (at least), 3 day Gas: \$10 to \$50, conservative estimate Workshops Fees: \$10 to \$25 TOTAL per person \$30 \$20 \$18 \$118

Add to this the frustration of not being able to hand pick the material taught, fighting large crowds, difficulty in viewing the instructor's feet, and fatigue due to travel, and you have a possible formula for disappointment.

So what would I suggest charging participants for a small and intimate workshop? How about \$40?


If only twenty people came, \$800 is generated, more than enough to cover the most expensive of instructors. Thirty people, and \$1200 is generated. Extra monies can be used to make a local instructor a handsome profit.

"\$40 for a workshop is outrageous!" you say. Not nearly as outrageous as \$118 - don't forget all the "hidden" costs in traveling to a large workshop. This

way, you get to sleep in your warm bed!

No, I'm not against large workshops. Small workshop interest can help to maintain larger workshop interest. By working with those too reticent to ever attempt a workshop outside their own area, self-confidence can be built so that those same participants are able to make the leap to attend a larger workshop.

They're fun - have one sometime!






The afterparty at the Harley Hotel was crowded as dancers continued into the wee hours of Sunday

Heritage Dancing at Centennial '89

Reprinted from Footnotes Volume 39, Number 10 June 1989

One hundred years ago, the Territory of Washington became the State of Washington, the 42nd state of the United States of America. In celebration of this 100th year of statehood, Centennial '89 will present "The Festival of the Century" - the 38th Annual

Washington State Square Dance Festival.

The question thus arises: "What was dancing like in 1889 - what would have been included in a celebratory ball, or dance program, of the time? While my research has not come across any printed programs of that era in the territories, some reasonable assumptions can be made. We know that dancing had been a popular social pastime in the colonies, and that the pioneers took their favorite dances with them as they migrated. We can also assume that the dances done here in 1889 were the dances that had been done 'back east' just a few years earlier. Dance books from that era describe dances then popular, and a dance program would have included quadrilles, pattern (or couple) dances, and contra-dances. Quadrilles are the fore-runner of square dancing, pattern dancing has evolved into round dancing, and contra-dances have become modernized while retaining their 'long-line' choreography.

In the mid-1800's, quadrilles were normally a fivepart dance, each part having its own style of music and being equivalent to one of today's dance tips. The dancers, according to books of the time, were cautioned to "never take part in a quadrille without knowing . . . the figures". The MC would announce the name of the dance, the orchestra would begin playing (on signal), and the dance would begin. There would be only a slight pause as the musicians prepared for the next part of the dance, and the dance would continue until the final (5th) part was completed. Small pocket-size books described the dances, and many a dancer could be seen refreshing his memory prior to leading his lady onto the floor. One book went so far as to state "Dancing quadrilles without a 'prompter' or 'caller' is the only correct style of dancing, and will, in the near future, be the only way that society will entertain them." The number of movements (eg, ladies chain) were limited, yet

a variety of dances were available.

The sound system had not yet been developed, so music was by the available musicians and instruments,

and was the popular music of the time.

As the pioneers traveled west, they made do the best they could. The dances were shortened to one or two figures of the original five, and someone who could remember a dance sequence was pressed into service as a 'caller'. Calling was then only a brief prompt, or reminder, of the next movement. Fill-in patter and the singing call were developed much later. The pioneers danced 'on the old cowhide' when a floor was not available, and many a dance was held along the trail after the wagons were circled and the chores were done. Since fiddles were light and easily transported, they became the standard instruments of use. In the latter part of the 1800's, the quadrilles gave way to what we now call traditional squares,

usually with #1 couple doing the figure with each of the other couples in turn. Those who knew not the dance occupied the #4 position. By the time the visiting couple got to the #4 couple, the #4 couple was expected to have learned the sequence. Later, the dances were modified to have both head couples visiting the side couples simultaneously and sequences were developed to where all four couples could dance a figure together. This is still seen in today's squares with an opening figure, a middle break, and a closer involving all dancers, and a figure twice for the head couples and twice for the side couples.

Pattern, or round dancing had a similar development. In the mid-1800's the pattern dances were minuets, polkas, schottisches, and similar dances, and the WALTZ. Each dance had a prescribed, although limited, sequence, which the dancers were expected to know. Once they had been to a dancing master to learn the dance, they were expected to dance by memory at the formal balls. As the dancers migrated west, there was more 'ad-libbing' done and a free-style dance developed, although the pattern dances were retained. Prior to the mid-1800's the waltz, in particular, was openly criticized - there were such possibilities of bodily contact! The earlier change in clothing styles allowed greater freedom of movement and the waltz became extremely popular, in spite of clerical opposition. Even in the squares, the figures were modified to end with a waltz (or a polka). This was so popular that the Congress of the Episcopal Church in 1877 debated whether to ban all square dancing (hitherto the bulwark against the 'wicked' couple dances) because they had a tendency to round off into the waltz. The Episcopalians decided that was a matter of taste, not morals, and the ban was not passed.

Contra-dances, or country dances, were always popular and were included in all programs. They had (and still have) the advantage that any number of couples could dance, and any couple could join in at the foot of the set at any time, even during the dance. In the pioneer days, it was not always possible to get multiples of four couples for the quadrilles - the long-line formation alleviated this problem. Again, the dancers were expected to 'know the figures', and what calling was done was limited to brief prompts. Originally, the lead, or top, couple in a line would progress down the line dancing with each couple in turn; by the mid-1800's the dances had been arranged so that every second, or every third couple danced as a lead couple until they reached the foot of the line where they changed roles and danced back up the line as the other couples, having reached the head of the line, became lead couples. Thus everyone danced within a minor grouping while still in the long line. This progression is still in use today. The 'longways' dance was thus a community event, as contrasted to the pattern dances, which some described as 'courtship more or less disguised

as deportment'.

A feature of nearly every dance, and often several times in an evening, was a "Paul Jones". Today we call this a mixer, in which partners are exchanged as the dance progresses. Many dances started and ended with a Paul Jones - but the reason for the name is

now lost in history.

Thus, dancing in Washington Territory and then the newly formed State of Washington included all of Heritage Continued on Page 20



clogology - the science or study of clogging.

clogologist - an authority on clogging.

clogitis - a common disease of cloggers, its symptoms including an obsession with clogging and never getting enough of it.

clognesia - what happens in the middle of a dance when you suddenly forget a step; invariably happens when someone is watching.

clogs legs - no, not something you eat, it's what cloggers develop.

clogamaniac - one who clogs so much that he devel-

clogaholic - same as clogamaniac, being absolutely incurable.

clogathon - clogging dance that lasts for days.

clognoramous - someone uninitiated in the art of clogging.

clogeographer - one who writes clogging dances.

clog cabin - a type of dwelling in which early American cloggers lived.

clogometrist - a doctor who prescribes eye glasses to near-sighted cloggers.

clogropractor - a doctor who treats clogger's physical problems.

clogiatrist - a doctor who treats clogger's emotional problems.

cloggy - such as cloggy weather, meaning great weather for clogging.


clogectomy - removal of the clogging bug resulting in complete disinterest in clogging.






