Big Circle - Full Circle!

Many years ago, Big Circle or old-time mountain square dancing was done with a sort of sliding, shuffling foot action. Some folks in some areas did fancy foot stompin' during the square dancing. The concentration, however, was on the calls with the footwork an exuberant display of enjoyment of the live music and the completion of simple patterns.

With the advent of the recorded music and line method of teaching, and subsequent "line routines", the rapid spread of clogging almost obliterated old-time square dancing. The Southeastern United States has clung to it tenaciously with the National Clogging and Hoedown Council and America's Clogging Hall of Fame making valiant efforts to preserve this heritage.

We have had two excited and enthusiastic reports from folks who have just been introduced to Big Circle "called" dances. One came from Joan Martin, Ellensburg, Washington who was delighted to have participated in Big Circle clogging called by Anne Bresch at the Mid-Winter Festival in Tacoma, Washington. Joan writes: "The best thing about it is you don't even have to know how to clog to join in and have fun. All you need to know is a two-step. Eventually you can do the Basic Clog Step. I think we could use more of this. So next time you see an introduction to . . . Big Circle Clogging, try it!" 

Editor's Miscue



Upon meeting, the conversation usually goes, "Are you sisters or twins?" And the reply is, "Yes!"

Identical twins, Trudy and Judy, are from Colorado Springs, Colorado, and have been clog dancers and clog instructors for the past fourteen years. Just a few names they have been labeled with over the years have been: "Gold Dust Twins" and "Toni Twins" (for those of you who remember from years ago), "Double Trouble", "Pete and Repeat", "Twinkies" (Heaven forbid), "Carbon Copies" --- those familiar to most people with clones. Do they get tired of it? "No, not at all --- it has been a lot of fun over the years." They were dressed alike as children and still do so occasionally for special events (without an identity crisis!).

Before Clogging (BC), they were award-winning waterski competitions/performers at a local resort hotel and, being disciplined musically on the flute and piccolo, played with the Colorado Springs community orchestra and band. Both have also been actively involved in the square dance community. Their children, Bob and Tandy (Judy's) spent their teen years clogging and Holly (Trudy's) is following in their footsteps.

Over 'this same period of time, they have seen a lot of growth in clog dancing, not only in size, but in the dance itself beginning with the traditional (drag/slide) clogging, speed dancing, buck dance steps, inclusion of choreography other than line dances and square dance figures, break dancing, aerobic arm movements and head movements, aerials, rock 'n roll, country swing and 40's swing movements, and Canadian step dancing. They, too, enjoy a variety of all of the above.

Their latest venture is a social clogging club known as Double Your Pleasure (what else). Presently Trudy and Judy instruct exhibition/competitive teams, the Rocky Mountain Cloggers and Sweet 'N Sassy Cloggers, respectively, and, since they and Trudy's husband Sherman enjoy dancing too, they have danced on each other's teams. They co-instructed the Cheyenne Mountain Cloggers social dance club and both danced on the Centennial State Cloggers exhibition/competitive team under the direction of Judy's daughter, Tandy Bos. Trudy also instructed a youth group known as the Rocky Mountain Connection until the team grew up and became interested in boys/girls and cars. They enjoy choreographing routines and conducting workshops, both locally and internationally, as Blue Ribbon Cloggers (confusing, isn't it - but each group has it's purpose). Awards have been captured from the Silver Dollar City Clog Competition as well as the Hee Haw International Clog Competition. Trudy and Judy always look forward to whatever is next in the clogging realm.

Double Your Pleasure would welcome anyone coming through Colorado to stop in and visit them in scenic Colorado Springs at the base of Pikes Peak (bring your camera and clog shoes). And yes, their spouses know which one is which, as does the FBI for who they've worked for several years (fingerprints

tell the story).



The Oil Patch Cloggers From Small Town to the Big Time A Success Story in the Public Schools

by Keith Neal Osage, Oklahoma

The Oil Patch Cloggers were formed in the Hominy Oklahoma Public Schools in September 1987 under the direction of of myself, elementary P.E. teacher and Marilyn McGee, elementary music teacher. Looking for something new and unique for our classes, we took basic lessons from Alan P. Keene in Tulsa. With his encouragement and help, the Hominy group was formed. The group then consisted of sixty-three kids ranging from third grade to fifth grade. These students and teachers donated an hour after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays to learn clogging. With twenty percent of the student body of our elementary school involved, it was easy to gain administration support. By November 1987, a performing group of twelve dancers had developed. They were entered in the Terlton Oklahoma Volunteer Fire Department Talent Show and Fund Raiser. They won a first place.

As dancers gain confidence and basic clogging skills, they are added to the performing group. The only expense for each dancer is the cost of shoes and a group T-shirt. Shirt logos and printing were done by Mary Jo Tannehill, the art teacher at the school. The performing costume consists of purple T-shirts with a white logo, to go with the school colors, and everyone wears bluejeans. Any student who can learn the dances and get shoes and a shirt is part of the performing group. The ability levels range from the very basic to the very skillful dancers. The age group now ranges from second grade to seventh grade. No student is required to drop out, so the age level continues to expand. This group now includes four adult dancers who also help with the kids. We do not think we could function without our adults to help.

Mrs. McGee is no longer connected with the group since she has left the teaching profession. Our adult assistants and dancers now include Nancy O'Leary, R.N. and mother of three group members; Marsha Howell, mother of a group member and college student; and Gracie Norton, clogging enthusiast and close friend. My wife Karen Neal handles the sound system, tapes, and the picture taking for the group. The lessons are Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:00 to 4:00. They are held in the elementary gymnasium which has a tile floor.

The Oil Patch Cloggers have performed at numerous events in the past two and one-half years, such as school programs; the Tulsa Bluegrass Festival and Chili Cook-Off; T-Town Bar-B-Que; Glenpool Black Gold Days; Catoosa Frontier Days; Cleveland Pioneer Days; The Oklahoma Education Association Centennial Celebration; Hominy Free Wheel Celebration; Ms. Skiatook Pageant as entertainment; as well as many shopping center and nursing home performances, and many others. The highlight of this year has been to be selected as one of the six honor groups statewide to perform at the Oklahoma Education Association State Convention in Oklahoma City. Uncoming events include the Tulsa Mayfest Celebration and the Homecoming 90 Celebration planned for Hominy in June.

There are sixty-eight active members in the Oil Patch Cloggers. Presently the group has thirty-two beginners and thirty-six intermediates in the program. Lessons are free to anyone wanting to be a part of clogging. For me, teaching clogging to these kids is done out of love for clogging and working with the kids. In addition to being director and instructor for the group, I am also a member of two groups in Tulsa. The 11th Street Cloggers and the Clearwater Cloggers Exhibition Team, both under the direction of Alan P. Keene.

The group will continue as long as there is a desire to learn clogging, a willingness to perform, and perhaps most importantly, to enjoy the fellowship that clogging brings. The Oil Patch Cloggers appre-

Chip did a Nine-pin and some Big Circle calling and Donna taught mountain precision figures to eighteen squares (144 dancers). They are new to this type of

dancing and eager for more.

I was delighted with the big circle dancing at the NCHC Spring Festival recently held in Indianapolis, Indiana, and the comments made by several callers that they didn't have to beg folks to get up and dance - they were on the floor and READY!

It all goes to show that rather than mountain style "coming back in fashion", it is being introduced for the first time in many area, and readily finding

Here's more on the subject from Frank Bonner's excellent book on Clogging and the Southern Appalachian Square Dance. (Reprinted by permission from the author.)

The Southern Appalachian Square Dance Heritage (Big Set and Running Set)

The term Kentucky Running Set was introduced by the English folk song and dance collector Cecil Sharpe in 1917 while studying mountain folk songs in Kentucky. This type of dance was originally called a hoedown or square dance, as it is today by the native mountain people. The term hoedown may have been derived from a farmer that was so overjoyed at the end of a day that he "would throw down his hoe and dance." Sharpe described the Running Set as representing a stage in the development of English country dance. It shared the speed, step, and rhythm of the ancient sword dances (and so believed to be the link between modern square dancing and ancient pagan ceremonial dances), therefore predating John Playford's recorded country dances of The English Dancing Master published in 1650. Ceremonial origins of many of the figures are discussed by Cecil Sharpe, Frank Smith, Patrick Napier in their books (re: bibliography).

This is, of course, possible considering the predominance of English immigrants to America during the Colonial period and the mountain people's use, even to the present day, of a dialect out of northern England and lowland Scotland straight from Elizabethan time (Shakespeare's era). However, the structure of this dance also closely resembles the Irish "rinnci fighte" (pronounced rinky fight); it is probably best considered Anglo-Celtic in origin. too is not surprising since the English influence gradually lessened as the 19th C. progressed (remember, the mountain dances were not studied until the 20th C.; their origin is mixed and will

probably remain a secret).

More and more pure Irish, especially after the potato famine of the mid 19th C., immigrated to the U.S. Considering the lack of stratification in class and the lack of formality, or in other words, the casual background of the Irish, Scotch-Highlanders, and Scotch-Irish people, their community culture would best fit the isolation of the mountain areas and the unbounded expansive attitudes of the new pioneer American culture.

The sheer numbers of Scotch-Irish present in the

mountain country along with their well-known reputation for dancing seems would assure them a prominent place in the development of the American mountain style of dance. To this end, the bow and curtsy actions common to English dances are absent from both the Irish and American mountain style dances. The promenade used to bind figures in American dances is absent from English Country Dance. Indeed, southern mountain people, unlike their structure-oriented predominately English New England neighbors (containing fewer Scotch-Irish and Blacks), had a common disdain for social or community structure. As a general rule simple community structure (such as pioneer and mountain American) does not produce highly structured dances.

To contrast the quadrille (forerunner of American eastern and western square dance and popular during the early development of American square dance) with dances of other countries, the German, Danish, and Scandinavian (Skanek Kadrilj) quadrilles have a verse and chorus, but no progression; the Anglo-French quadrille has five (eventually going to three) separate sections each with a different structure; and other similar dances like the Lancers and Circassion Circle dances feature progressive movement around the circle, but only use one figure and no chorus.

According to Thurston writing in Northern Junket the Irish "rinnci fighte" is described as a dance for any number of couples (four being most common, but also danced with six or eight couples) and has the following structure which most closely resembles the American style:

Introduction

Body

Figure led by 1st couple Figure led by 2nd couple

Figure led by 3rd couple Figure led by 4th couple

The whole sequence of bodies and figures is repeated, but with a different figure until tired. It ends with a finale.

Now consider the American (Kentucky) Running Set (a dance for four couples in square formation) which has two versions depending on the figures used. Short two couple interludes or fillers may follow a figure prior to visitation to the next couple in version I, but less often depending on the figure in version II.

Sponsoring Your First Workshop Part IX: Wrapping It All Up/ **Analyzing Your Success**

Well, it's all over . . . now what? You may think all of the work is complete when the final dance is over, however, there is still much to be done. Typically, when your event is over, you'll want to forget about it for a while. I recommend you "wrap" it all up before collapsing from exhaustion or departing on that six-week vacation. If you set it all aside, you'll more than likely procrastinate, and next thing you know, considerable time will have passed and some things will not be as meaningful or effective had they been taken care of right away.

So, what do you need to do that is so important?! Start by paying your bills. Don't make your hired instructors wait for payment. Pay them prior to their departure. They've fulfilled their obligations; now you should fulfill yours. They will remember you for it and will be more inclined to have a favor-

able impression of you and your event.

The same goes for the facility you used. Their part of the deal has been fulfilled, and they should not have to wait for payment. This not only helps establish a good relationship with the facility, it establishes a favorable credit rating for you and/or your group should you have to use this facility as a reference in the future.

Also, be sure to take care of any other outstanding bills you may have from other suppliers, i.e., flooring rental, etc. Suppliers will be anxious to work with you again in the future if you pay your bills promptly. They may even negotiate lower fees with you for having a history of prompt payments.

Keep detailed records of all of your expenses. These will be helpful in planning future events.

When using facilities where their staff assisted with much of your setups and provided other services, it's important that you show your appreciation by leaving a small gratuity. This is especially true if you're working with a hotel facility. Some people to consider for monetary gratuities include: catering/ convention services manager, setup crews, bellmen, registration desk staff, and anyone else who displayed a pleasant attitude and made an extra effort to be helpful. If your sales representative was especially helpful, send he/she a small gift showing your appreciation. Typically, monetary gratuities are not given to sales people. I do not recommend gratuities for everyone, only those people who stood out as exceptionally helpful.

I've mentioned in earlier articles that you should provide a means for your attendees to provide feedback about their experiences at your workshop. This is more important than many of us realize. Not only does it say to your attendees that you're interested in fulfilling their needs, it is an excellent source of

suggestions and new ideas.

The simplest means of requesting and receiving feedback is a written evaluation form made available to everyone in attendance. Keep it simple, so it can be completed quickly. I recommend a checklist with a simple rating scale. Provide areas to critique the facilities, the workshops, and space for additional

comments. You may even want to ask how they heard about the workshop to determine which advertising avenues are working best for you. A simple layout I use is:

Additional Comments (what did you like most? least?)

Let your attendees know you want to hear from them. Provide a visible place for them to deposit evaluations, as well as an address to mail them to after the event.

Then, don't just collect them, read them! Pay close attention to the comments and suggestions your attendees offer. After all, you do want them to come back. Within two weeks after the event, tally up all the responses and look for trends in attendees' reactions. Even if only a small number of people respond, you can usually get a good idea of the general feeling overall. Share the results with your volunteers and with the facility you used. Keep the good suggestions and constructive criticism in mind for improving future events.

After the event, meet with your volunteers or key staff to discuss their reactions and experiences. Do this while the event is fresh in everyones' minds. This is a good time to determine everyone's willing-

ness to do it again in the future.

Lastly, although you probably thanked everyone on site for their assistance and contributions to the success of your event, send out written thank-yous to all who contributed. This can mean an awful lot to many people, and you should make an extra effort to show your appreciation. Do not take people for granted, or you may find yourself without helpers in the future.

[Editor's note: And a last "last", send in a writeup telling us about your workshop - with pictures if you can - to The Double Toe Times. Share your fun - what was most memorable - who taught - how many came - we'd like to share, too - and it's good publicity for your next year's event.] * * * * * * * * *

Over the past nine months, I've provided a considerable number of suggestions to help make your first event, and those thereafter, successful. Everything I've mentioned is proven to work. I hope you'll find this information helpful and that you'll solicit others' ideas when coordinating your event(s).

Sponsoring workshops may sound easy, but it's not. To be successful requires a lot of hard work and dedication. You can have fun doing it if you: (1) plan ahead; (2) work with your volunteers; (3) promote it every chance you get; (4) keep your perspective; and

(5) remember, you cannot please everyone.

I look forward to reading all about your successes in future issues of The Double Toe Times. Good luck and best wishes for numerous successful clogging workshops.!

ciate the support of the community, the parents, the school administration, and the local school board. They [the school board] let them use the elementary gym for practices, the buses during the school year to travel to performances, purchased a sound system, and allowed them to do all this as a school activity. This clogging program could not be as successful without these supporting people. Also the Oil Patch Cloggers owe a big 'THANKS' to Rita and Bruce Pagen of Mainstream Plus in Tulsa for helping us obtain shoes small enough to fit some of our feet. Rita spent a lot of time that first year and effort getting some shoes special-made. Without all this, and lots of prayers, the Oil Patch Cloggers could not exist.

Clogging can be a successful program in the schools across the country if it is approached in a positive manner by everyone involved. The following thoughts and comments are from the two school administrators most closely associated with the clogging program.

Why I Consider the Clogging Group as Asset... by Herma Langwell, Principal Horace Mann Elementary School, Hominy Oklahoma

The Oil Patch Cloggers have been a vital, positive image in our community for the past three years as they have danced their way into hearts across Oklahoma. They were initiated at a time following a serious economic decline in this area caused by the oil crunch. This group lifted the spirits of a community largely comprised of people who are dependent on oil and ranching for their livelihood.

Community pride and individual self-esteem have grown in response to this clogging organization, which is headed and organized by elementary physical education teach, Keith Neal. He gives generously of his time and talents, holding two practice sessions each week after school in the elementary gym where he conducts physical education classes all day. Mr. Neal arranges the schedules for all performances and public appearances for the clogging group and made all necessary transportation arrangements, using school buses for this purpose. He is also the bus driver.

School and parent relationships are greatly enhanced through the clogging endeavor. Most parents are appreciative of extra efforts exhibited by teachers, and the people in a community develop a more positive image of the entire school personnel through their association with one teacher. I believe the image projected by a teacher, whether positive or negative, is a significant influence on how an entire school system is perceived by the community.

Students involved in the clogging program are privileged to visit events and functions throughout the state, which broadens their knowledge and areas of interest. They feel good about themselves and the recognition they receive for performances. The opportunity to perform before an audience is an added enrichment to the balanced curriculum of the students' education. An activity such as this is advantageous to this school's educational program.

Clogging - A Program That Developed Itself by Gerald Christy, Superintendent of Schools Hominy Public Schools, Hominy, Oklahoma

In the education setting of rural Oklahoma, a constant search for student enrichment programs is vital to the development of the total child. Schoolparent relationships, student self-esteem, and community pride are all direct benefits to be enjoyed when those programs can be established.

In Hominy Oklahoma such a program is in full swing. The Oil Patch Cloggers, a volunteer student dance group, is completing their third year of public performances. In it's infancy, the program began as an extra service to interested students by physical education instructor, Keith Neal. As word began to spread, the students began to receive invitations to perform all across Oklahoma. Experiences gained from these invitations cannot be duplicated in the regular classroom setting. Students are privileged to attend events and broaden their knowledge through participation in the clogging group.

The Oil Patch Cloggers have become an integral part of our school system. The Board of Education now provides free transportation and other needed support to the group with hopes of insuring their continued success. Through the dedication of teachers, students, and parents, the Oil Patch Cloggers are dancing their way into the hearts of many Oklahomans.

Big Circle - Full Circle

Version I is for a hoedown which uses figures similar to the small circle figures of the Big Set dance. This is the dance described by Cecil Sharpe when studying the dance in Kentucky in 1917. Basically only two couples dance together at one time as described above.

Version II

Introduction

Figure led by 1st couple (with couples 2,3,& 4 singularly or together)

Body or chorus

Figure led by 2nd couple (with couples 3,4, & 1 singularly or together)

Body or chorus

Figure led by 3rd couple (with couples 4,1, & 2 singularly or together)

Body or chorus

Figure led by 4th couple (with couples 1,2, & 3 singularly or together)

Ending

Version II is for a hoedown which uses figures that can be used only in the Running Set or 4 couple square, but not the Big Set.

It is a different version (variation) from that described in version I only in that more than two couples may be dancing at the same time (refer to the section describing figures for the Running Set only). Each couple in turn leads a figure, but two, three, or four couples may be included in the figure at the same time, instead of just two at a time.

The two versions may be mixed in the same dance. That is to say small circle figures from the Big Set may be used in the same dance as the figures designated as for the Running Set only.

The filler, that which separates the figures (re: doing a circle left and Kentucky Do Si Do [common Georgia Rang Tang] after couples 1 and 4 perform Chase the Rabbit), may be done by all couples for variety if it doesn't interfere with the smooth flow of the dance. A two couple filler done by all, works best when the progressing couple has just completed the figure with the last stationary couple before returning "home" for the body or chorus.

The term **Big Set** or **Big Circle** is not native to the mountain people who danced it, as they called it a square dance. It is a dance for "as many couples as will" closely resembling the Circassion Circle dance, but with more figures. It has the following general structure:

Introduction

Big circle figure (done by the entire group)
Small circle (done by all two couple sets)
Interlude or filler (usually swings within the small circle)

Small circle figure

Interlude

Small circle figure

Interlude

Small circle figure

This sequence of small circle figures and interludes continues until the caller, dancers, or the band decides to quit. Each figure is different as commanded by the caller from a repertoire of

prelearned figures; figures are often repeated.
Big circle figure/Ending

All of the small circle figures are done within the framework of the original large circle with the even numbered couples remaining in place and the odd numbered couples traveling in counterclockwise progression. This big circle structure allows easy mixing of all the dancers creating a cohesive group feeling as does the Circassion Circle dance and other circle mixers

A unique characteristic of this dance, adding to it's lack of rigid structure (or in better words, free spirit), is the fact that the southern Appalachian old-time fiddlers would play any tune that came to mind without regard to the figure being danced; change from one tune to another while the dance is being called; and often disregard the standard 32 bar phrase common to most northern European, especially English dance music.

To contrast Irish set dancing with the southern Appalachian style set dancing Thurston offers the following comparison:

Introduction

- both are similar having brief sequences of movement where all couples do the same thing.

Ending

- the Irish finale is like the introduction.

- the American is likened to a game similar to "nine pine" (Old Dan Tucker), in other words, a group fun figure.

Proportions

- the Irish body is more substantial (possibly explaining why it is not repeated as often) and contains vigorous steps thus limiting the figures to around five.

-the traditional American style contained 6-14 or more figures lasting almost indefinitely and was without the vigorous steps, except occasionally by individuals as the spirit hit them; the promenade (chorus) served as a brief break between the figures.

The modern clogging version of the southern Appalachian style square dance is more like the Irish versions in it's use of vigorous steps and fewer figures. Modern precision clogging set dances resemble the traditional Irish set dances in that they are memorized and danced with the same steps and figures each time, but in America each dance group has it's own specific routine in a manner much like the sides of Morris dance teams that hail from different towns.

The original steps for both the Big Set and Running Set were generally a fast walking or running step during the movements, but while standing idle the "fancy Dans" would move their feet doing fancy footwork (jigging, clogging or buckdancing freestyle steps). This was also noted by Sharpe in the 20th C.; dancers would often improvise variations of their own special moves. Tempo of the dance varied with



the tune, but generally was about 140 beats per minute.

The big Set and the Running Set ran contrary to other square dances in that all the old French quadrille figures were danced by opposing couples as in modern western square dance. In addition to the pre-Playford English Country dances and Irish rinnci fighte they (the Appalachian sets) resemble Irish, Scottish, and French traditional reels for 4, 8, 12, 16 or more dancers. This is to be expected since the original form of Irish and Scottish reels was imported from France early in the 16th C. (the French and English were constantly exchanging dances) - the Alman Haye (Haye d'Almaigne) being the most likely father of all Scottish reels which were then imported to Ireland; here the Irish replaced the Scotch ballet footwork technique with their own intricate steps.

In the mountain style squares a couple may dance with any other couple moving in a counterclockwise progression. Many Scottish, Irish, and some English dances were for "as many as will" with a minimum of four couples. This may be a natural process (which) lead directly to the use of the Big Set as more and more people were available to dance. Or perhaps, general circle mixers which get everyone involved mixed with the square Running Set sequence to form a new element, the Big Set.

One more distinct possibility exists, that of regression or a natural return to more primitive dance forms due to the isolation and infrequent social encounters of the highland people. Through lack of repetition, the people may have simply forgotten what they learned in the old society of their ancestors. This, along with the natural element of improvisation and adaptation from various other nationalities or individuals (so common to folk dances) to suit the social climate, is more likely to have created the "new" style dance, rather than it being a mere preservation from pre-Playford times.

Considering the number of regional differences no single hypothesis on the origin of the steps or dance structure can answer all the questions raised. As is the case with other American music, song, and dance steps, the southern Appalachian square dance represents another hybridization of all the possibilities noted above (and probably some others not mentioned) —— a little of this and a little of that along with local preferences and individual improvisation.




