

This chart was printed on the front page of Canadian Dancers News July - September 1989. We enlarged it and sent it out to several long time clogging experts, in the hope that they could insert "buck dancing" in its proper place. Since there are no approximate dates included, other than 1450 to Present, this 540 years of American dance represents the ancestry of square dancing only. It

has been my impression that old time buck dancing "grew out of" Appalachian Mountain Dance. We contacted the Lloyd Shaw Foundation and have ordered a small book on the history of Square Dancing by Dorothy Shaw, "Pappy" Shaw's wife. We are constantly asked where clogging came from. One "expert" stated flatly in a newspaper interview that it came from China! We thought our readers would enjoy this genealogy chart and if anyone has any other historical bits and pieces they'd like to share, send them to The Double Toe Times and we will print them.



Good action photos are extremely difficult to take (except in my case by sheer accident) and often a newspaper photographer will snap a few for the paper and will give or sell prints to your dancers. When they are screened we can enlarge or reduce the photo. (It does not affect the photograph.) We have received copies of photos done on a copier, and they simply are not reproducible. We must have an original photo.

Please take note of an increase in advertising rates and the addition of 1/16th page ads, which must be prepaid for a minimum of six months. A business card (white with dark lettering and logo) or letterhead from your stationery can be used for the paste-up, or we will set up the ad for you. Our advertisers report excellent response from The Double Toe Times readers.

Those of you who have visited the Double Toe Times office know that it was once the back porch of my home, and is now closed in with the entire outside wall huge floor to ceiling windows. I have a heavily wooded back yard which has been kept natural (no grass) for several reasons. It is nearly impossible to grow grass in shade, and I hate to mow. I have festooned the back yard with bird houses, which the squirrels took over after enlarging the entrances, bird bath, and feeders. I foiled the squirrels by stretching a wire about 75 feet between two trees and hanging the bird feeder in the middle. The squirrels leaped from trees and missed. They tried walking the wire and fell off. Now they only pick up the bird's crumbs and look up eyeing the feeder with longing. In a weak moment, I decided to put up a squirrel feeder. A four by four post with a metal garbage can lid nailed to the top, and holes in the lid so rain would drain out, and my backyard circus began.

I don't save stale bread for bread pudding any more. In fact, a local bakery outlet lets me have twenty torn up loaves for a dollar - they probably think I'm a bag lady. Wild bird seed, cracked corn, sunflower seeds, niger, lettuce, fresh spinach, cut up fruit; the jays and the squirrels are fat and frisky in my yard. I even buy huge jars of yukky peanut butter and peanuts in the shell now and then. I accidentally bought peanuts pre-salted in the shell and the little devils nearly drank the bird bath dry. The variety of year round birds is incredible. THIS year, however, I have one huge crow probably because of the cracked corn, and I have seen the pair of pileated woodpeckers again after several years absence. The red bellied woodpeckers alternately eat the bread and

Friend Bob Keller helped me design, and then built, a long desired deck off the back of the office. With the possible exception of camping

then come tapping on the end of my house!

at the beach with my Mom, I cannot remember when I've enjoyed anything as much as my deck. It's like

my own private park.

After I have been away for a few days, the squirrels come up on the deck and look in the windows as if to say "where's the bread?" Yesterday along about lunchtime, a raccoon moseyed across the yard. I've lived here over ten years, and have never seen a raccoon in this area. (I do have a possum who sneaks into the garage to eat my cat's food at night.) Grabbing the camera, I ran for the deck but the 'coon high-tailed it under the fence. Today, as I sat typing this, I glanced up (it is again about noon) and the raccoon was slowly picking its way into the yard, aiming for the squirrel feeder. The camera was still handy, and ever so slowly I moved to the window. The 'coon went up the post slick as a nickel, and I snapped a dozen photos as it had a cracked corn lunch! If they aren't too dark, I'll put one in next month's Front & Center and we'll have a contest to name the Double Toe Times Raccoon! My City Wildlife isn't nearly as exciting as Earl Powell's (North Carolina) tractor riding search for a cow who had just calved, but they just won't let us keep cows in the city!

Betty Lou Hintz, Dewey, Arizona is the Instructor of the Humboldt 4-H Cloggers, Humboldt, Arizona. Assisted by Laurel Garner and Ralph Hintz, the group was formed January 1989 in response to a need for a recreational activity for kids in this rural area. They started with ten children and now have 65 youngsters ranging in age from five to eighteen! (Included are Betty Lou's two grandchildren Ralph and Elizabeth Schaan.) They use the name of the town and school, and use the school colors - black and white - for their costumes. Classes were originally held on the stage at the Humboldt Elementary School, but soon grew too large and the Reata Pass Restaurant donated the use of their back dining room. This small rural community has been very generous and raffles and donations paid for their sound equipment and records. Elaine Steele, director of the Steele Clog Tappers, Apache Junction, AZ and Kay Davis and Reed Davis, Cactus Country Cloggers, Tucson, AZ gave lots of moral support and suggestions, and supplied them with cue sheets and names of suppli-

In the past year and a half, they have performed for school functions, the V.A. Hospital, the Pioneer Rest Home, and Young's Farm Pumpkin Festival. They have entered several parades and won First Place. At the Yavapai County Fair and the State Fair Clogging Competition they brought home several red and blue ribbons and two Grand Champions. Betty Lou said that the biggest thrill to date has been five of the team entering the (CA) Knott's Berry Farm Competition. Adam and Clay Garner placed second in Matched Duets, and Ralph and Elizabeth Schaan came in First Place and Overall Grandchampions in Mixed Duet.

"These children are truly committed and feel good about themselves and their dancing. They thrive on the recognition. Their parents, their teachers, the school and the community are very proud of them."

COPYRIGHT LAWS CHANGE MEETING TUNES

Meeting planners: Listen and face the music.
That's my advice if you use copyrighted music at your functions.

If you've been making the assumption that hotels, meeting venues, or production companies are paying licensing fees for your meetings' music, you're off key. In fact, you may be breaking the law. While you probably won't get arrested, you or your organization could be opening yourselves up to a lawsuit.

What has happened? Has Congress changed the law?

No. This is nothing new. The copyright law has been on the books for more than a decade, but no one has enforced it vigorously in the meetings industry. That was the case - at least until now.

Under U.S. Law, to perform copyrighted musical works in public - and that includes meetings, conventions, and trade shows - requires permission from the owner of the copyright. You can obtain the rights to most songs through licensing societies, most notably the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP) and Broadcast Music Incorporated (BMI).

Change of Tune

Recently ASCAP and BMI began to enforce aggressively compliance with the U.S. copyright law covering musical works. Why the sudden

change? It's a three-party melody.

* When Congress expanded the copyright owners' public performance rights in 1976, it applied a broader definition to the words "perform" and "perform publicly." It also eliminated the need for the material to be used at a "for profit" function. Now, based on Federal court interpretation, the law covers the use of material at meetings.

* Historically, hotels and other meeting sites have paid licensing fees ranging from a few dollars to several thousand dollars a year for both live performances and pre-recorded music played anywhere on their premises. Obviously, these facilities absorbed the fees for music performed at meetings held on their premises. Now the reasoning seems to be, it doesn't make economic sense for the site to pay licensing fees if the site is not the sponsor or producer of the trade show or meeting.

These fees can be as much as several hundred dollars daily, depending on the use of the music, the event, the admission charge, if any, and several other factors. Consequently, sites have renegotiated their agreements with the music licensing organizations so that they will pay the fees only for music played in their lounges, elevators, common

public space, and at events they sponsor.

* The ranks of music composers, the people ASCAP and BMI represent, are growing, and so are their demands for revenue. Members want the licensing organizations to increase their diligence when it comes to collecting royalties.

Music Liability

Some meeting planners have turned to production companies to make the required payment. Whether or not the production company pays the fee is immaterial. What is crucial is that the language of licensing agreements stipulates that the sponsor of the event or meeting is responsible for payment and for signing the agreement.

Who is the sponsor? In the case of meetings, it's the end user - the person, corporation, or association who/that presents the event. For trade shows, for example, the sponsor is the organization presenting the show or renting the premises and not the individual exhibitor who has probably paid

a fee to be a part of the event.

What music is included? Almost any music that is not in public domain is covered by the law - whether it is presented live or recorded, is used with slides or video, or is played by juke boxes and DIs.

You should note that the license has nothing to do with those licenses that need to be obtained for the synchronization of music to film, videotape, or slides. Synchronization rights require a separate license from the copyright holder. This is not administered by the performing rights societies.

"Public" Meetings

In the past, there was one criterion used to determine if the sponsor had to pay a fee: Was the event "private" or "open to the general public"?

Our legal stance had been to assume that if an event was private, meaning closed to the general public, no license was required. That interpretation is now incorrect. Even though an event is closed to the general public, members of your group form a "public". Any music, therefore, that is played before such a gathering is considered to be a public performance and subject to the copyright law.

Who is exempt? A good rule to follow: No one. There used to be non-profit exemption, but that was dropped in 1976. One exemption possible to-day is in the case of educational or charitable events where there are no fees paid for organizing the event, no admission charge, and the performers play for free. If there is a ticket price for the event, then the revenue is given to the charitable fund. You should get the exemption - in writing - from both ASCAP and BMI.

Before you decide whether you are liable for paying a licensing fee, consult your attorney.

What does all this mean to the meeting planner? To save yourself a headache, upon recommendation by your attorney, comply with the law.

Licensing Agreements

If you hold many meetings throughout the year and use a lot of music, your best bet is to sign a blanket agreement with the licensing organizations. That way you are covered for more than three million songs. ASCAP and BMI have already sent out mailings of such agreements to meeting sponsors (see "Excerpt"). If you have not received one, contact the performing rights societies for copies of their agreements. (ASCAP, One Lincoln Plaza, New York City, New York 10023; 212-595-3050; BMI, 320 West 57 Street, New York City, New York 10019; 212-586-2000, ext. 460.)



Copyright Law . . . Continued

Rates vary depending on the frequency and length of your meeting, the number of attendees, and whether or not the music is performed live. They can run from as little as \$10 a day for a minimum use and a small audience to more than \$1,000 for live music played before several thousand paying attendees.

If you use music infrequently, it might be worth your while to pay a separate fee each time you use copyrighted material. It might also be worthwhile to discuss with the meeting site whether you are covered by their licensing agreement. In some instances, a hotel's licensing agreement might cover sponsors of outside events, making it unnecessary for your organization to pay the fee. Finally, be sure to review the situation with people working at your production company.

Overall, you usually **will** be obligated to pay a fee. The licensing organizations mean business. While compliance is to some extent on the honor system, in the last year of two, ASCAP and BMI have actively been policing use of copyrighted music and pursuing violators of the law. Clearly, truth or consequences is the name of the tune in this case. So you might as well face the music and pay the piper.

Excerpt From BMI Warning to Planner

Late last year, the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP) and Broadcast Music Inc. (BMI), both based in New York City, sent out letters to organizers of meetings and conventions. They spelled out precisely what they expect from planners of meetings and conventions where copyrighted music is played.

Both licensing organizations maintain huge musical catalogs, with some overlap. Signing a licensing agreement with ASCAP allows you to use any ASCAP music at your event. But to use a work that is in BMI's repertory, and not in ASCAP's, will require a separate agreement with BMI.

Excerpt from BMI's letter

"...Very simply, whenever you, or any of your exhibitors or members, use copyrighted music for your trade show or convention, you must by law have permission for that use from the creators - the composers and publishers. And that applies to every individual song, whether played by musicians at a concert or dinner dance; or by radio, tapes, or CDs to accompany a video presentation in an exhibition booth or meeting.

"That's why the BMI license agreement you receive is so important to you. When executed, it grants you unlimited legal access to the more than 1,500,000 musical compositions licensed by BMI..."

MUSIC INDUSTRY TELLS GROUPS: PAY TO PLAY

A crackdown on the use of copyrighted music at meetings and trade shows will result in new costs - and paperwork - for meeting planners and show managers.

The American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP), and Broadcast Music Inc. (BMI), the music industry's major copyright enforcement agencies, have charged that copyrighted music, both live and recorded, is being played extensively at meetings and conventions, but that few meeting sponsors are paying for their use. Last summer, both agencies sent letters and licensing agreements to about 7,000 association meeting planners and trade show managers advising them to become licensed with their organizations - or to risk the legal consequences.

One reason planners may not have been aware of the need to pay is that ASCAP's hotel licensing program, which allows hotels to play copyrighted music in public spaces, used to cover music played at their meetings. That ended on Jan. 1, 1989, after the hotels protested that they shouldn't have to pay for the music played by meeting groups. BMI's hotel licensing coverage never extended to

groups.

Copyrights for most popular music fall under the purview of ASCAP and BMI, which between them represent about 150,000 music composers and publishers. Unless all the music played in the public domain, such as classical, "it's nearly impossible not to use any BMI songs," said Michael Murphy, manager of sales and marketing in BMI's musical attractions department. Since the same holds true for ASCAP's music, companies and associations would need to be licensed with both.

According to the agencies, trade show managers are responsible for reporting to and paying ASCAP and BMI if any copyrighted music is played at the show, even if it is used only in individual booths. And corporate meeting planners must pay for copyrighted music played at their company's meetings. As of now, neither BMI nor ASCAP has begun notifying meeting sponsors of the need to pay licensing fees, although they are planning to do so.

Sheldon London, general counsel for the National Association of Exposition Managers, called the issue "of looming importance. People have not planned for these expenses. For some, it will be modest, and for others it will be significant."

Each year, a meeting planner or show manager would have to fill out and return to ASCAP and BMI a license agreement listing the dates of any upcoming meetings where music is to be played. ASCAP and BMI would then send a statement to the planner after the meeting. Fees could range from \$10 to \$1,250 per day.

The responsibility to pay the copyright holders for use of their music is nothing new, according to Murphy. "People ask us if the law has changed," he said. "It hasn't. There's always been a need for clearances, but it's only now that we've created a license for conventions."

Jed Mandel, a partner in the Chicago law firm of Neal, Gerber and Eisenberg, said many of his 50-plus association clients have been solicited by ASCAP. Mandel acknowledged that "it's an option, I suppose, to do nothing" about obtaining a license. "But if they use somebody's copyrighted music, they are violating the law and the copyright holder's rights."

In accordance with the U.S. Copyright Law, penalties for willful infringement can range from Continued

Copyright Law . . . Continued \$500 to \$100,000 per song performed, payable to ASCAP or BMI. When licensing efforts fail, ASCAP gathers claims of infringements and then files suit in the name of the copyright holder, however, "the licensing people are educators. They explain the situation and get agreements. It's a relationship between creators and users of music."

On a Good Note: Agreement Reached

On February 9, the National Association of Exposition Managers (NAEM) came to terms with the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), and orchestrated an equitable licensing agreement for the use of copyrighted music

at meetings and conventions.

Barry Knittel, director of licensing for ASCAP, says that the new agreement will allow meeting planners to use "mechanical music" (copyrighted music from radio, records, audiotapes, compact discs, films, or videotapes) at any gathering of people with a joint interest or concern -- such as a meeting, convention or trade show -- for a flat rate of four cents per attendee. For example, if 10,000 people were attending a convention, the planner would pay \$400 (\$.04 times 10,000) for any copyrighted mechanical music used during the convention.

The fee schedule for live music is entirely different, however. The live-music fee licenses the use of copyrighted music performed at a specific function. Therefore, if a convention has four functions where live music is performed, the planner would have to pay a fee, based on the attendance at each of those functions. The live-music fees start at \$25 for functions with fewer than 250 people and run to \$500 for functions with more than 10,000 people (see chart).

Planners will have to pay a minimum fee of \$100 for any copyrighted music (live or mechanical) used at a show, but no more than \$4,000, regardless of the size and number of individual functions where live music is performed. Beginning in 1992, fees will be adjusted on the basis of changes in the

Consumer Price Index.

In working out the agreement, NAEM and ASCAP tried to strike a balance between their members' needs. Under ASCAP's original guidelines, licensing fees for music used during a live performance would have been based on the total attendance for the convention, not the number of people attending the function where the music was performed. Therefore, if 1,000 people were attending a convention, but only 500 went to a banquet, the planner would have been charged on the basis of 1,000 people. Under the new NAEMASCAP agreement, the planner pays a fee based on the 500 at the banquet.

Shelly London, NAEM's legal counsel, declined to comment until details of the agreement could be officially announced at a March 2 press conference. He also noted that NAEM would not negotiate with Broadcast Music, Inc. (BMI), another licensing organization, until after that date.

"Many [meeting planner] associations will be sending out the licensing agreement with a joint letter to their membership," says Knittel. "We think a strong relationship will grow between ASCAP and exposition, trade show, and convention organizers, because they know how important music is to them, and ASCAP is a valuable library card to a vast repertory."

And From Your Editor . . .

We have received countless letters and phone calls from Clogging Instructors, Country Western Dance teachers, and Square Dance callers regarding ASCAP and BMI licensing. The language in their contracts is very specific - dance teachers must be licensed by both organizations if they wish to use any of their respective copyrighted music. Go to your record or tape case and pull out several of your favortie numbers. The odds are that four out of five will be either ASCAP or BMI! (My weird collection of records included Double Dutch Bus, Frankie Smith - BMI; The Bird, Jerry Reed - BMI; Southern Air, Ray Stevens - ASCAP; and Singing Canaries, featuring the Parker Canaries with Hal Pearl at the organ, Aragon Ballroom, Chicago, Illinois - NO MARK! You reckon we could clog to an organ version of La Paloma complete with roller canaries?) It would be hard to imagine what our rock and roll youngsters would do if the only thing they had to dance to would be hoedown tunes or 'public domain' tunes like Boil that Cabbage Down or Old Joe Clark played by live musicians.

The advice from here is either switch to folk music or buy both licenses. Convention planners can write ASCAP and BMI for further information.







Still Standing Tall Among Us

Richard Allen "Rick" Flory 1958 - 1990

Richard Allen Flory was born August 6, 1958 in Lawrenceville, Illinois. He was a graduate of the Latin School in Indianapolis, attended St. Meinard College in St. Meinard, Indiana and Danville Area Community College in Danville, Illinois. He received his Master's Degree from the University of Houston. Interment was at St. Patrick's Cemetery on April 25, 1990. His parents, Raymond and Marilyn, reside at 3815 Illini Avenue, Danville, Illinois 61832.

Texas, the Lone Star State, glows a little less brightly this month, as it mourns the passing of

one of its shining talents, Rick Flory.

Rick, a member of Houston's Rhythm Cloggers and Editor of the Texas Clogging Council's quarterly news magazine, The Texas Clogger, passed away April 23, 1990, at 31 years of age. Although he was unable to dance for the past year due to his weakening legs, he was determined that the dancers of Texas continue to have the information they required to enjoy the hobby they loved and shared in common. His editorial efforts have made a lasting impression on every clogger in the state of Texas now, and for years to come. His knowledge and ability enhanced the appearance, content and quality of the magazine, making it one of the most professional-looking and informative Council-sponsored publications in the Nation.

A Memorial Service held in Houston on Wednesday, April 25, 1990, was filled to capacity with his many clogging and professional colleaguesand friends, his parents Raymond and Marilyn Flory of Danville, Illinois, brother John, sister-in-law Cheryl and nephew Curtis of Garland, Texas and brother, David, of Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Co-workers from the laboratory of Spring Branch Memorial Hospital, where he worked as a medical technologist for five-and-a-half years, joined in pra-

yer with his extended family of cloggers.

Reverend John W. Gill, who officiated at the service, recalled Rick as quiet-spoken, who rarely spoke unless he had something to say. But when he did have an opinion, there was no mistaking his meaning. Gill spoke of Rick's fierce loyalty to friends and of his two passions: clogging and computing, calling him a "clogging junkie" since he "couldn't get enough of it--wrote about it, danced it, performed it, lived it and thoroughly enjoyed it."

During a period of personal remembrance, when those gathered were invited to share their own memories of Rick, Ron Hodge, president of the Texas Clogging Council, announced that the Texas Clogging Council would recognize Rick's contributions to that organization by naming one of its scholarships as the Rick Flory Fellowship, which will be awarded annually at the State's Spring Clogger's Rally to a deserving student of higher education. Gloria Driver, director of the Rhythm Cloggers, recalled Rick's four years with the club and how his "fresh ideas and endless steps contribu-

ted more to our clogging ability than any other single clogger in our club's (15 year) history."

Friend Bill Gandy, Cita Messina (a co-worker), Len Kowalski, Sherry Mantey, Ethel Wilmesmeir, also spoke at the service about Rick's friendship and his love of clogging.


Music, such an important part of any clogger's life was offered by Musical Director and organist Rob Landes, and musical theater star June Terry.




31st Buckeye Dance Convention







Last summer's blistering heat wave caused an outbreak of heat-related illnesses. Emergency rooms across the country were crowded with victims. Over 1,000 people in the southwestern United States died; others were left permanently disabled.

In one southeastern state where the temperatures ranged up to 105°, 118 people died. The tragedy is that heat-related illnesses are preventable.

Certain groups of people can be identified as high-risk in relation to these illnesses. Athletes and military personnel who are undergoing rigorous training and conditioning in hot, humid weather are particularly vulnerable.

Anytime there is a combination of poor air circulation, ambient temperature that is close to body temperature, and high humidity, the setting is ripe for heat-related illnesses.

If high environmental temperatures persist over a period of several months, acclimatization usually occurs. This requires gradual daily exposure to high temperatures.

There are three types of heat-related illness: heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke. Heat Cramps. These are intermittent, painful contractions of skeletal muscles. These cramps often occur in acclimatized individuals who replace the fluid lost in sweat by drinking water, but do not replace sodium. The sodium depletion is believed to be responsible for the cramps. Heat cramps usually occur in muscles that have been involved in strenuous activity - most often those of the legs. The cramps last a few minutes and generally disappear spontaneously. With heat cramps, the body temperature is normal and the serum sodium by be normal or low.

The treatment is to replace sodium with salt tablets or an electrolyte solution.

Heat Exhaustion. This is the most common heat-related illness seen clinically. Excessive salt and/or water loss due to sweating account for the symptoms, which include central nervous system disturbances, such as headache, dizziness, weakness and irritability; and gastrointestinal disturbances, such as nausea and vomiting.

Patients are generally sweating profusely, and body temperature may be mildly elevated. Since these symptoms are not exclusive to heat exhaustion, the history of exposure to hot, humid weather is necessary to make a diagnosis.

Treatment of heat exhaustion is rest, a cool environment, and intravenous replacement of sodium and water. If untreated, heat exhaustion can progress to heat stroke.

Heat Stroke. This is the most serious of the heat-related disorders. It is characterized by a body temperature of at least 40.6°C (105°F), central nervous system disturbances, and usually, a lack of sweating that results from unexplained failure, or exhaustion, of the sweat glands. The patient's mental status may vary from agitation or confusion to lethargy, stupor, or coma.

Heat-related illnesses can be prevented. Persons engaging in strenuous activities during hot weather should limit the activity to the cooler times of the day. Acclimatization is accomplished by gradual exposure to hot weather - 10 to 15 minute increments over a period of 10 to 20 days. Full acclimatization may, however, require up to two months. There is a misconception that because one runs three miles at 7 o'clock every morning when it is cool, he/she can compete at 9 AM in a running meet when it is hot, and expect to be acclimatized. Such a misconception could prove life threatening.

Salt tablets are beneficial, but must be accompanied by an increased amount of fluid. The drinks consumed during exercise might include electrolyterich products (Gatorade, Thirst Quencher); however, most juices, canned drinks (especially diet drinks), and buttermilk contain sodium.

When temperatures are unusually high, strenuous outdoor activities should be canceled, and individuals should be cautioned against starting weight reduction programs that include heavy exercise.

Clothing should be light-weight, light-colored, and loose-fitting. In addition, as little clothing as possible should be worn indoors. If it is necessary to go outside, clothing should cover as much skin as possible, and direct sunlight should be avoided. Shade can be created by a parasol or wide-brimmed hat. For those accustomed to air conditioning, going outside should be limited to cooler times of the day. Exertion should be minimal, and adequate hydration is imperative.

Editor's Note: Every year about this time, we try to publish either this article or a similar one on heat related illnesses and how to prevent them. It is important for Instructors to be aware that heat can kill. We would like to note that many Directors and Instructors are seeking certification in Standard First Aid courses and training in CPR.



Thanks to the efforts of many dedicated cloggers, the art of clogging has been passed down from generation to generation. Mr. Jack Simonds of the Cedar Grove Cloggers is one of those dedicated Instructors. He was instrumental in introducing clogging to upstate New York at a dance-athon at Brockport, NY in 1982.

Jack studied and graduated at Fontana Dam, North Carolina with the Smokey Mountain Cloggers in the Fall of 1981. Jack Simonds is still able to use his many talents by choreographing routines, sharing them with others, and continuing to give of himself to the clogging community in western New York.
