Silver Dollar Express 1990 Italy Tour


Silver Dollar City, of Branson, Missouri, sponsored two European Clogging Tours this summer; one to Holland (Tennessee Hoedowners) and one to Italy (Silver Dollar Express). Rex Burdette, of Silver Dollar City, and JoAnn Gibbs, of Georgia, were the coordinators of both trips. Silver Dollar City hosts an International Folk Festival each summer where different countries are represented by folk dancers, singers, and musicians. In exchange, the City has sponsored different talents to represent them and the U.S.A. at folk festivals in foreign countries.

The Silver Dollar Express were truly an all-American team, with six members from four different states. Dieter Brown and Todd Coker of Georgia, Chip Summey and Jessica Whitaker of North Carolina, Missy Pearson of Missouri, and Alana Sellers of Florida made up a dynamic team.

Our team had three weeks to prepare and practicing together was difficult. To help, routines were videoed and sent to those who could not attend practice. Two days prior to leaving, our team met in Georgia at the home of JoAnn Gibbs. Costuming was not a problem, as six different team outfits were loaned by the teams of those going.

July 31st found us, along with family and friends, in the Atlanta airport. It took over an hour to get the team's baggage checked. We boarded Delta for a seven hour flight to London, England, connecting with Air Europe for a 2½ hour flight to Rome, Italy. On our arrival in Rome, we were greeted by our guide, Carmella. The festival, and our home for the next seven days, would be Cava Dei Tirreni, about four hours by bus. We were informed that we would be riding with 32 Soviet performers. Needless to say, we were nervous at first; but by the end of the trip we had made many new friends. We found them to be very similar to ourselves. They sang, laughed, fought, and played games as we do. The most ironic part of meeting this group was that they were from Soviet Georgia, and since Dieter and Todd were from Georgia, U.S.A., a special bond of friendship was formed. We both exchanged many gifts with each other (they really enjoyed all of the Georgia souvenirs).

There were many adjustments that our team had to make: time change (7 hours difference), lack of ice, air conditioning, fans, shower curtains, and water

pressure. The hotel that we stayed in had a three star rating. It was extremely hot and difficult to get totally wet when taking a shower, but it was clean and became even nicer after we saw where some of the other groups had to stay.

The other countries represented were; the U.S.S.R., Algeria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, and Italy. Each country had a different traditional folk talent. Most of the music was live. The shows were at night on the square in Cava, where there was an audience of 7,000 every night. The Silver Dollar Express had six performances and danced in two parades during the trip. We did one show for an







So You Want to Teach Clogging At School?

You have made the decision that clogging has a place in the school as an after-school activity. Great! Now comes the hard part. You must get the principal's support, select a site, choose the best afternoon, and gather your equipment.

Approach the principal with the positive elements of the program, its benefits for health and the involvement of a group of students usually left out of "ball game sports". Choose your site carefully. You will need at least the space of an empty classroom with a tile or wood floor. At Conyers Middle School, we teach in our auditorium which has a stage. The surface was hardwood, but it is now covered with tile. The dancing area is about 20x24 feet. If the principal has restrictions about damage to the floor, portable "clogging boards" can be built from 4x8 sheets of plywood and 2x4 boards.

Before you begin, analyze the school activities schedule. Choose a good day for you and for drawing the most participation. We avoid Fridays. Our best teaching days are Wednesday and Thursday. If you want to really fire up the student body and get people interested, arrange a special assembly program with a visiting clogging team providing the entertainment. We did, and it works wonders!

Check with the P.E. Department or Media Specialist to see if a variable speed record player exists or can be purchased. Get your records and routines ready, shine up your clogging shoes and be prepared.

At the beginning of each school term, a general information sheet and sign-up forms are distributed. On this sheet, I try to anticipate every question that is likely to be asked about the program and the requirements. These forms are distributed either through the P.E. Department or directly to the students home-rooms. I collect them, and sort them as to the class they need using information from the form.

Our program utilizes three levels of clogging beginner, intermediate and advanced, which we call Workshop. Our beginning classes are for those who have never clogged before. We start with bouncing to music, walking to music, double toe, double step, single basics, triple basics, shuffles, and combinations of these including "fancy doubles", and what Big John [Walters] calls a "get-it" to name but a few. We teach two or three simple routines to a variety of music. Our classes are 45 minutes, one day weekly.

Intermediate clogging adds more difficult combinations of the basic steps and puts them into harder routines. This class is designed for those students who have had at least one course of clogging at our school or elsewhere. On the form I ask for any previous experience and who the instructor was so that I may know the range of expertise for each class.

The Workshop Class is designed for those students who have had a least two years of clogging experience in a class, or who have danced or are presently dancing on a team. This class is operated like a mini-workshop. In this group we teach a new routine every two weeks. The students share routines they have learned, and we stress that the students learn to read standard C.L.O.G. cue sheets. We live and swear by the workshop material we receive and those things printed in the Mule, because with both instructors being full-time classroom teachers, we really don't have time to write a routine every time we need a new one.

As a note, during this last year, we combined the Intermediate and Workshop classes quite successfully due to a limited amount of stage time available.

Financing an intramural program such as ours is quite an undertaking. Our job was made easier some 5 years ago when the county school system budgeted money for the total intramural program at the middle school level. I am director of the entire program and am given \$3,000 with which to pay an hourly wage to any teacher who instructs in an intramural activity. This money cannot be used for the purchase of equipment or supplies. Prior to this budgeting of money, The clogging program was financed totally by fund raisers such as t-shirt sales, bake sales, etc., and something we call "Clogging Night at CMS" which is usually held in the Spring.


This event features guest clogging teams from all over the Metro-Atlanta area who come, at no cost to us, just to help us in our endeavors. We try to feature teams from our own area since that draws a crowd, however, generous groups such as Buckin' Mule and the Kingston Railroad Cloggers have traveled to Conyers [Georgia] to help us! Admission is \$2.00 and all proceeds go into the Clogging Fund. This is our in-house account handled by the school bookkeeper. From this account all clogging equipment and supplies are purchased.

To make a clogging program of this type work, you have to put aside personal desires for fame and fortune, the idea of competition, and the idea that everyone who signs up to learn to clog will become a part of a performing team. This mind set has to be transmitted to the students taking your class. The goal of the intramural-type program is to teach this wonderful dance-form, and to HAVE FUN! You won't get rich or famous, but you will know that yearly about 50-75 kids learn to enjoy the good clean fun of clogging and have a wonderful experience. When you see these same people later having become a member of a team outside of school, that is just the icing on the cake!

In future articles, I hope to explore the operation of a non-profit school performing team, the way discipline is handled, and especially a look at the experiences of going to a an outside workshop with students. 

If there is a patron saint of cloggers in south Georgia and north Florida, it would have to be Ray Hattaway.

Few have done as much to spread the word about clogging, or have touched as many people, as this 41 year-old disciple of the double toe.

Over the past seven years, he has taught classes

in Tallahassee, Valdosta, Moultrie, Sylvester, Albany, Tifton, among other towns, and has held workshops and clinics in much of north Florida.

He has gotten dancers off their heels and up onto their toes, adding style to their steps. Former students include many of south Georgia's best cloggers, including several who formed Valdosta's Clogging Express.

Ray's classes have also resulted in at least two marriages, though he remains one of the eligible bachelors of clogging. At his youngest sister's wedding, her Irish in-laws prevailed on him to show off and raved about how much clogging reminded them of Irish dances.

The name Ray Hattaway has become synonymous with a dedication to clogging, to people, and to quality teaching.

In fact, dancers now drive "from all over creation" (often 60 miles each way) to attend his class in Moultrie or to practice with his Panther Creek exhibition team.

"I just love Ray, but my father isn't too sure about him."- Worth County female clogger.

"The boy's a mess but he sure can dance."former student, now an instructor.

"I owe most of what I know to Ray."- Florida gypsy clogger.

"Ray who?"- Dan Quayle.

Note: Most of the following information comes from friends and family -- Ray's schedule makes him hard to nail down. Call his Tallahassee apartment and you'll hear one of the strangest answering machine recordings around, second only to George and Diane Howell's.

The doctor of clogging is also a master of foreign language. The oldest of three children, a veteran of the Florida public school system, he got his bachelor's degree from Valdosta State College in 1970; his parents still live in Valdosta.

He then went to Florida State University and came out with two Masters degrees, one in foreign languages (1973). While at FSU, he began teaching German and continued as a German instructor at FSU off and on until 1987.

He restores old cars and motorcycles in his Florida shop and still makes an annual Motorcycle Week trip to Daytona with Buzzy Ireland.

Evolution of a clogging fanatic

In a rare early morning phone interview, Ray confessed to being uncertain whether he started dancing in 1983 or 1982 (though he didn't sound entirely awake). Informed sources point to 1982.

Reportedly tired of breaking bones in motocross racing, he decided to find something less painful and discovered clogging. He recently admitted to a crowd in White Springs, that he got the clogging bug after seeing the Suwannee River Cloggers at the Florida Folk Festival.

Looking to learn, Ray hooked up with the Orange Blossom Specials in Tallahassee and six months later was teaching his own class in Valdosta.

Within a year, he was traveling neighboring counties spreading the word. Soon he was driving from Tallahassee to teach in towns around south Georgia, rolling up the miles on his orange Volkswagen.

elderly home. We danced on concrete that was on an incline. During one of our line dances, Chip lost his balance and took half our team to the ground with him. We were all laughing so much we could hardly finish the dance, even as we think about it now, it makes us "slip" a smile. The last show we did was in a small town somewhere in the mountains of Italy. We say somewhere because even our guides did not know where we were. After a two hour bus ride with the Algerians, we waited three hours to perform. We finally danced at 11:30 p.m. and then were served pizza.

The parades were a bit unusual. Our guides walked with us as we danced, and held the crowd back. The Italians did not sit on the curbs and watch, they became part of the parade. Our first parade went fine. We walked a little, then clogged, walked, clogged, etc., but the second time was an experience. We were asked to parade up and down the same street four times within 20 minutes (clogging the entire way). We got back to Cava's square and performed three more dances. This was all before the show. We have to admit, it was fun, but just a little crazy and unexpected.

The sound of the taps and the team's enthusiasm made clogging a favorite of both the crowd and the other performers. Some of our team taught several Algerians, Soviets, and Italians how to clog. In return, they shared their dance styles with us. A disco was held every night for the performers after the show. This helped everyone to become better acquainted. Alana was announced on stage as being the "crazy one" of the group. Jessica had an Algerian admirer ready to visit her in the U.S. Missy learned to dance the lambada, Algerian style. The Italians called Dieter, "Dino", and called Chip, "Cheep". Todd answered to all different names: "Ted", "Tom", "Tim", etc...

Probably the most hair raising experience was driving "Italian style"! The majority of the cars are small and mopeds weave in and out of traffic. There were no stop signs (well there were some, but they seemed to take on the "slow down a bit, okay, punch

the gas!" meaning). There were no real lines separating traffic. Drivers honked their horns constantly and passed on either side of the car ahead of them. We decided that the Italians definitely love to speed and scare anyone in their car. As an example, part of our team was riding with Pepa (alias "Suicide Sam"), the rest were in Antonio's car. The roads were narrow with plenty of curves. Pepa was chasing Antonio, and while he was driving he put a pair of boxer shorts over his eyes. Yes, we were not quite sure if we would see the next day! Antonio won when Pepa began to pass him and there was a huge truck coming toward our "tin can" of a car!!! Visions of past Easters and Christmas' with our families rushed through our heads as our last day on earth seemed to have arrived!

The Italians provided lunch and dinner for the performers. Each country had their own tables. We had one table with six chairs (we felt as if we were at a family dinner and had been placed at the kids table). The food was good. Pasta and watermelon (or "fire-melon" as the Italians called it) were part of every meal.

Sightseeing was on the agenda everyday, starting at 9:00 a.m. Our group learned that the schedule





The John Bob Stepatune

by John Patrick Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

The John Bob Stepatune is named after its inventor, John Bob, legendary clogger from Bobville, who specialized in late-night jams with hard-driving old time music. This handy little stepatune is small enough to carry around with you to jam sessions for use on a variety of surfaces. It consists of a board, a carpet, and a piece of foam rubber.

The board is what you clog on, of course. The carpet and foam rubber can be placed under the board, as needed, to provide the proper amount of cushioning to protect your knees and ankles from excessive shock, and for added friction to prevent the board from slipping and sliding, because of its simple design, the John Bob Stepatune is easy and expensive to build.

The board should be plywood or particle board, 1/2" to 3/4" thick, 24" x 24". It can be sealed with polyurethane, if desired. No framework is necessary.

The carpet is just a scrap of carpet 26" x 26", with loops on each corner to attach the carpet to the board. Old shoelaces are ideal for the loops. The loops should be tight enough to hold the board in place, but loose enough to permit removal of the carpet from the board without untying them.

The foam rubber should be 1/4" to 1/2" thick, 26" x 26". Carpet padding is good for this.

On grass, use the board by itself. The carpet and foam rubber are not needed here.

On concrete or hard, smooth floors, use the carpet and foam rubber under the board for maximum cushioning and friction.

On a carpeted floor, use the carpet under the board for friction. The foam rubber will probably make it too mushy or bouncy here.

The John Bob Stepatune. Don't leave home without it!



Our team and the other visiting performers were taken to the city of Paestum to see the ancient temple ruins. We walked on and among the ruins and marveled at their size and how well the structures had survived time. We were able to shop a little, but were afraid to spend too much since this was the first place we had been. We should have bought the store out!

The next day our group was lucky and able to swim at a private pool (Chico's house). It was one of the best days of our trip. This was the first time we were able to get totally submerged in water since our arrival. Chico's dad is a promoter of all of the rock concerts that come into Italy. His home overlooked Cava and was gorgeous. Many rock stars have stayed at his home including Duran Duran, Tina Turner, Prince, and U2 to name a few. It was GRANDE and BELLA (great and beautiful)!

Next we were off to Casserta with the Soviet team to visit the Royal Palace. After seeing the rooms of the palace, we toured the grounds which featured long walkways, lots of stair steps with landings overlooking beautiful pools of water with white swans. We were so tired from the heat and the $3\frac{1}{2}$ klm hike, that after we sat down, all we could think was "I've fallen and I can't get up! Someone bring me a Coke!" We were so thirsty. This had to be the best Coke we ever had.

Dieter, Chip, and Missy attended a meeting at the City Hall in Cava. The speeches were translated to English and each came across with the same point; they were glad that both the Soviet Union and the U.S.A. were represented. Politicians must be the same all over the world. They would talk about a subject for thirty minutes and it was translated in one minute. Our entire group went to another meeting and presented our gifts to the Mayor of Cava. We also went to an Italian church service (Italy is about 99% Roman Catholic).

We had taken souvenirs to give to the other countries as a token of friendship. After the last show in Cava (televised live), our team brought out our remaining gifts (pins, buttons, pencils, maps, and stickers). Our team was besieged with people tugging and pulling, trying to get anything they could. Some-

one even tried to take Chip's sequin belt off his waist. It was exciting, but a little frightening.

The last day we went to Pompeii to see the city that was destroyed by lava during the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 A.D. When we arrived, we expected to see everything covered in lava, but the city was being restored to its original form. Some artifacts (bodies, pottery, tools, etc.) were on public display in glass cases. We found it amazing to see the bodies that were fully preserved by lava and the detail of their expressions, clothing, teeth, and bones. Shopping in Pompeii was limited, unless you wanted a beautiful cameo. We found ourselves spending a lot of our money on buying Coke to drink as the weather was hot. The Italians thought we were strange for always drinking Coke and wanting ice.

We were back on a bus with our friends from Soviet Georgia. Arriving in Rome, we had 30 minutes to check our luggage and jump on an Air Italia flight to Amsterdam, Holland. We passed a duty free shop in the Rome airport and we bought up as much as we could. Our



In May of '87, he took six adults to do a show with the Hagar Twins on the 'Love Boat' to Mexico, a country-and-western cruise "full of Germans" according to a teammate. While onshore in Mexico, some local street urchins immediately recognized Ray as Willie Nelson. So much for fame.

Ray's a regular at Fontana Village, NC, packing as many people into his cabin as possible for a week-

end of lots of dancing and little sleep.

He now heads the Panther Creek Mountain Dancers based in Moultrie, GA. Their exhibition team numbers 30, and his Thursday night class draws nearly 60. The team is active in competition and supports local hoedowns. Panther Creek will host their own annual Christmas workshop and dance in December.

On the national level, Ray is second vice-president of the National Clogging and Hoedown Council, a member of America's Clogging Hall of Fame, an active competition judge, and a promoter of events. He also has some solid opinions about clogging politics, basically, "If it's not broken, don't mess with it."

And through the years, he has collected a pile of trophies for himself and his teams. And a pile of friends.



Star Spangled Etiquette by Ralph & Tammy Pierce

We have just released a blue grass version of "The Star Spangled Banner", done by Charlie McCoy and the band from Hee Haw. As we release this song and dance routine, we are aware of the controversy that may develop concerning the appropriateness of the national anthem for a dance tune, or the concerns of some people as to when they would be expected to show special attentiveness during its performance. Should the audience keep their seats or should they stand during its performance?

We had these same concerns also before we did the recording so we contacted the Tennessee National Guard and the Knox County Library and asked them for any information they may have concerning personal conduct during the performance of the American Anthem. We would like to share our finding with you and your readers to clear up any concerns.

Basically three things need to be presented to require special attentiveness during the performance of the American Anthem. These are: 1) the presence of the American flag, 2) the playing of the American Anthem and 3) the intent to honor the flag.

In a workshop where this clogcue is being taught, the intent to honor the flag will be absent so your conduct would not be any different than it would be with any other song. In a stage performance where the performing team uses the flag as a prop for their routine, special attention may be appropriate during the presentation of the colors.

It is our hope that an explanation of the above will allow every clogger to freely use and enjoy this version of "The Star Spangled Banner", choreographed by Charlie Burns.

We are very interested in any comments or information your readers may have on this subject.

Even experienced Instructors have to quiet the dancers before they begin - many do it by simply SHHHHHH-ing into the mike until everyone hushes. If the dancers get rowdy during the instruction, stop the music and simply wait. They will usually quiet down.






