

What are BMI & ASCAP?

BMI & ASCAP are licensing organizations which were founded so that the creators of music would be paid for the public performances of their works.

What is the N.C.H.C.?

The N.C.H.C. stands for the National Clogging and Hoedown Council and was incorporated in the mid 1970's as a means of preserving the heritage of the traditional American Clog Dance. Through its periodical publications, sanctioned competitions and bi-annual meetings, the N.C.H.C. presents a strong program of education into the history of the dance and the furtherance of clogging as an artform. The N.C.H.C. is a non-profit organization whose officers are elected by the membership and volunteer their time to maintain the organization. State organizations can become affiliated with the council and reserve a place on the N.C.H.C.'s Board of Directors, to help in making the decisions that shape the course of the organization and its mission.

Some of the N.C.H.C.'s efforts include:

- Sanctioned competitions throughout the year, which provide a monitored environment for competitors and provide categories which encourage use of traditional clogging figures and steps.
- Annual judging seminars to train apprentices in the use of score sheets and the criteria needed to objectively score clogging competitions.
- An annual Spring/Summer meeting held in a different location around the country each year to present the latest techniques in teaching of both the traditional and modern forms of clogging.
- A full schedule of traditional classes at the annual C.L.O.G. National Convention held each Thanksgiving weekend.
- A liability insurance plan for member instructor's classes, exhibitions and events.




To belong to an organization simply to have a string of abbreviations to print after your name, seems patently superficial. 
Thanks so much for your publication. I really enjoy reading about what other cloggers are doing around the country.


Cabbage Patch Kids - Florida



Who Needs a BMI/ASCAP License?

Any user of music who plays copyrighted musical works in public, and whose performances are not specifically exempt under the law, needs a license from BMI, ASCAP or the members whose works the user wishes to perform.

As a clogging instructor, licenses are needed from both BMI and ASCAP to cover the music played at your classes, workshops, exhibitions and competitions throughout the year.

Why should I go through the N.C.H.C. to get my License?

ASCAP and BMI negotiate their fees with users who are often represented by national associations, like the National Association of Broadcasters. What better group to represent the needs of cloggers than the N.C.H.C., who for over 15 years has worked to serve the needs of instructors and dancers nationwide. By negotiating with BMI and ASCAP on behalf of cloggers nationwide, the N.C.H.C. can insure that licensing rates will be fair and equitable for all cloggers. In addition, the N.C.H.C. will receive no commission for the licenses purchased by its members and no additional fees will be added to the prices you pay for your BMI/ASCAP licenses. If you were to purchase your licenses directly from BMI and ASCAP, it would cost \$91.00 per year for BMI and \$58.00 per year for ASCAP - a total of almost \$150.00 or even more, based on the number of classes and exhibitions you do! By utilizing the N.C.H.C.'s collective buying power, your BMI license would cost only \$30.00 per year, regardless of your student load and class schedule! ASCAP negotiations are currently underway, and a rate competitive with BMI is expected.

How do I go about obtaining my license through N.C.H.C.?

By joining the hundreds of cloggers around the country who are members of the National Clogging and Hoedown Council, you can enjoy the low group rates for BMI/ASCAP licenses. The membership fee is \$20.00 per year which entitles you to *Toe Tappin' Talk*, The periodical publication of the N.C.H.C., plus \$1,000,000 liability insurance coverage for your classes and events and reduced admission into all N.C.H.C. sanctioned events. The N.C.H.C. is dedicated to serving the needs of cloggers nationwide. [Send \$20.00 check to N.C.H.C., P.O. Box 71015, Durham, NC 27722] We are proud to be able to negotiate this licensing agreement on behalf of the dancers we serve.

On Hiring Instructors: Written Contracts!

A CONTRACT is an agreement between two or more parties for doing or not doing something specified. It can be an oral agreement or a written document signed by both parties. Unless there are witnesses, an oral agreement is difficult to enforce if one party breaks the contract.

When I was about six or seven years old, I accepted an invitation to a Birthday Party. Several days later I was invited to a second Birthday Party on the same day as the first, but this one was to have a *PONY* to ride! I can remember instantly wanting to back out of the first Party in favor of the tantalizing Pony ride but my Mother made me honor my word and go to the one I had accepted first. Over the years there have been many similar situations and that Birthday Party lesson stuck with me. Apparently this type of morality lesson is either no longer fashionable or other folks don't have a neat Mom like I do.

Many Clogging Instructors verbally agree to teach at a given workshop and then renege when a "Pony Ride Workshop" comes along. The lures can be substantially more money, more envisioned "prestige", or proffered vacation or sightseeing opportunities. Double-booking might also be due to poor schedule-keeping or memory failure. Whatever the excuse, the workshop organizers who have counted on that particular Instructor are left high and dry with wasted advertising expenses and disappointed dancers who may have attended specifically to learn from that particular Instructor. While the errant Instructor is off riding his/her Pony, his/her reputation is becoming tarnished at the passed over workshop, and news like this travels rapidly. The really startling thing is that these are usually the very folks who helped that Instructor become well known at the beginning of his/her teaching career.

It therefore is becoming increasingly critical that a booked Instructor be somehow made to honor an obligation. Written contracts, while not completely tamperproof, are legally more enforceable than oral contracts. Additionally, they might make an Instructor more aware of what is expected of them. For many years, Nora and Lendal McCullar have had a written contract with any Instructor hired for their special workshops, and they were kind enough to send a copy. We have revised some of the contract to make it a sort of generic one, which could be simply copied and used by any group. Additional language can be added to suit other situations or requirements.

Some last minute problem situations are unavoidable. The hurricane that roared through Tampa, Florida cancelled a major Square Dance weekend and I never heard how they handled all the folks who paid preregistration. Genuine illness can fell an Instructor (but if this is a ruse to go to another workshop, it will probably be found out!). Some Instructors make an effort to find a substitute, however the workshop group is under no obligation to honor either the pay schedule *OR* the contract with the original Instructor.

How to Teach Yourself to Tap

The Robert Audy Method
Tap Dancing
Robert Audy/Random House, Inc. New York 1976

In the story of tap dancing in America you can find the story of American popular entertainment since the Civil War. The rise of minstrel and vaudeville shows, ragtime and jazz, stage and movie musicals and even the social dancing of the rock era are linked, in one way or another, to the durable popularity of tap. Tap dancing is up-front in its meaning: its joyous form is its happy content. While tap has gone in and out of fashion over the past century - its most sustained period of eclipse being from the beginning of World War II until the late 1960s - even when it has disappeared from the forefront of the national consciousness, the sound of tap could be heard resounding throughout our culture.

The appeal of tap, like the popularity of all our mass cultural phenomena, has to do with its accessibility. Tap dancing looks like and indeed is something that anyone can do. In the popular Busby Berkeley movie musicals of the Depression, it was entirely credible that a bashful amateur dancer from the Midwest (invariably played by Ruby Keeler) could step in for an ailing Broadway performer and become a tap star overnight - that happened in real life. Shirley Temple, a child with limited dance training, became a tap sensation; seventeen-year-old Debbie Reynolds, who had never done tap before being cast in Singin' in the Rain, was given a crash course by costar Gene Kelly and so danced her way to the top, in what proved to be the best film musical of all time.

It figures, then, that tap was born in entirely amateur circumstances. Tap dancing existed well before it had a name, and its key routines were passed along from entertainer to entertainer well before tap teachers came along to identify the different steps and formulize them.

Most dance historians agree that what we now refer to as tap dancing turned up in the urban ghettos where poor Irish immigrants and free blacks intermingled in the 1840s; tap finds its roots in the English Lancashire clog dance, the Irish jig and African tribal rituals. The first famous tapper was Thomas Dartmouth "Daddy" Rice, an Irishman who, in the 1830s, dressed up in a black porter's uniform and did a step called "Rockin' de Heel," which was inspired by the antics of an old black stage-driver Rice had met. (From the very beginning tap became associated with racial stereotypes that later proved difficult to shake off.) "Daddy" Rice's principal competitor in the public eye was a free-born black named William Henry Lane; Charles Dickens, who saw Lane perform as "Master Juba" in the 1840s, wrote back to England about the amazing prowess of this very fast tapper.

For a long time after that, tap was largely the province of black men and Irish entertainers who donned blackface. The blacks performed in downtrodden "pick" (for pickaninny) acts, and the Irish dominated the usually all-white minstrel circuits. It was at the turn of the century that tap started to spill over into all forms of stage entertainment. The advent of the cake walk in 1900, Eddie Mack's first "buck" dance up and down a set of stairs in 1903, the huge New York success of the all-black musical *Shuffle Along* in 1918, and the concurrent rise of male-female dance teams spread and enlarged the notion

of tap. By the time Bill "Bojangles" Robinson did his lightning stair dance in Lew Leslie's *Blackbirds of 1928* - and in the process became an overnight superstar - Buddy Bradley, an unsung black choreographer who coached many of Busby Berkeley's shows to success, had already been teaching tap to Fred and Adele Astaire, Ruby Keeler, Mae West, Eleanor Powell and Paul Draper.

Once Bradley's students drifted on to Hollywood in the late twenties and early thirties - at the same time sound movies came of age - tap's place in American life was assured. Astaire, who liked to think of himself as an allaround dancer (as he certainly was), had in fact had more tap than ballet training; with Ginger Rogers, he turned tap and other forms of musical comedy dancing into a top box-office attraction. Keeler, Temple, Powell, Ann Miller, as well as Bill Robinson - all played substantial roles in the popularization of tap. Later on, in the early 1940s, Paul Draper invented "classical tap," proving that the steps could work just as well with music that did not come from Tin Pan Alley. In the late forties and fifties Gene Kelly succeeded Astaire as the movies' number one dance star and demonstrated once again that you didn't have to have an elegant, reedlike figure or white tie and tails in order to do tap.

By the time Kelly reached stardom, tap was already in decline. The craze had begun to warm off in the late thirties, when Broadway musicals (soon to influence film musicals) began to reflect new trends in jazz dancing. Choreographers like George Balanchine, who staged the ballets for *On Your Toes* in 1936, and Jerome Robbins, who did *On the Town* in 1940, revolutionized show business dancing en route to revitalizing American ballet.

When, in the late sixties, tap dancing returned to prominence, the original impetus was a hugely successful series of Broadway and film musical revivals which helped feed a nascent nostalgia craze. First came Ruby Keeler, who put on her dancing shoes again for a 1969 Broadway revival of No, No Nanette; she was soon followed by Debbie Reynolds in Irene and Alice Faye and John Payne in Good News. At one time Ann Miller was playing Mame in New York while Ginger Rogers played the same role in London's West End. The final kicker was the huge success of That's Entertainment, an anthology of clips from MGM's old technicolor musicals that was released in 1973. Within a year, Capezio's sale of tap shoes quadrupled, and tap teachers throughout the country reported enrollment increases ranging from 50 to 100 per cent.

Far more interesting than tap's links to nostalgia or camp, however, were the ways in which talented theatrical choreographers, most of them raised in the jazz-ballet tradition, began to take advantage of tap's rich show biz associations and find a use for them in the new, grown-up American musical. As early as 1959, Jerome Robbins, who had played such an important part in ushering out the tap age, was bringing tap back into the Broadway musical - and bringing it back to serve serious purposes. In Gypsy, the musical saga about the death of vaudeville, Robbins devised choreography that both parodied old tap routines and rethought them; in that show's greatest dance number, "All I Need Is the Girl," a fledgling hoofer's rehearsal of a new routine becomes a subtle dramatic prophecy of the show's most crushing incident of emotional betrayal.



Black Creek Bash






"Bartman" - Jeff Driggs introduced the crowd to the "Simpson Strut"

Robbins later retreated permanently from the theater into ballet, but his most esteemed successor as a Broadway choreographer, Michael Bennett, has also worked hard to incorporate tap into modern musical comedy for functions other than that of providing sheer razzmatazz. Company, a sober 1970 musical that was Bennett's career breakthrough, opened its second act with a tap number ("Side by Side by Side") in which the gaiety of the smiling dancers exists in ironic counterpoint to the synical sentiments about marriage the song lyrics describe. In Follies (1971), a group of heavy, middle-aged ex-Follies show girls re-create an old routine while dancers portraying their sleek, younger selves do the same number in poignant mirror image behind them. A Chorus Line (1975), the most ambitious dance musical of the past decade, uses the story of the creation of a tap routine during a Broadway audition as a context for dramatizing the interior lives of seventeen dancers.

Although he has been most successful at it, Bennett is not alone in finding new dramatic meaning in tap dances. Gower Champion, in Mack and Mabel (1974), choreographed a tap number ("Tap Your Troubles Away") to leaven a grim twist of plot, and Bob Fosse, in Chicago (1975), used a desultory soft-shoe routine ("Mr. Cellophane") to present a character on the verge of psychological collapse. Perhaps nowhere has tap turned up in more theoretically hostile surroundings than in The Wiz (1974); in that black reworking of The Wizard of Oz, choreographer Geoffrey Holder had Tin Man Tiger Havnes (a performer best known for having impersonated Bill Robinson in Fade Out, Fade In on Broadway ten years earlier) do Ray Bolger-like tap steps in the midst of other dancers' rendition of the more current Bump. Unlikely though it may seem, Haynes's tapping fit in just perfectly.

No matter how sophisticated the deployment of tap by modern Broadway choreographers, the key to tap's appeal will always be the infectiously high spirits it communicates. And no one has explained that better than Gene Kelly, when he described to a biographer how he thought up the title number for "Singin" in the Rain."

"They knew I hadn't come up with an idea, but I told them not to worry, that I'd think of something," Kelly recalled in 1974. "Then a couple of days later I was running through the lyrics of the song to see if they suggested anything other than the obvious when, at the end of the first chorus, I suddenly added the word 'dancing' to the lyric - so that it now ran 'I'm singin' and dancin' in the rain.' Instead of just singing the number, I'd dance it as well. Suddenly the mist began to clear, because a dance tagged onto a song suggested a positive and joyous emotion. Then I went through the script to find out at what point I was at my happiest."

The glory of tap dancing is that it can always lift us to

However, we mainly use old time fiddle tunes and when we put on a performance, the women don't dress in tights and short skirts as you might expect on a group of young girls at a jazz dance recital.

I hope Clog dancing can survive the changes and new trends and be maintained as an American Folk Dance.




