
ACTION SHOT OF THE MONTH



It was great to read the quote that we use for all of our demos in your Front and Center column! The song is called Come from the Heart by Kathy Mattea. The chorus says . . . 'You've got to sing like you don't need the money — love like you'll never get hurt — dance, dance, dance like nobody's watchin' — it's gotta come from the heart, if you want it to work.' In our introduction we add ' . . . so may we present to you . . . The Country Heart Cloggers from Adrian, Michigan.

We are an active group of ten women (all but one over 40 years old)! We've danced together for four years and do several demos a month. The friendships we've created both with each other and various other clogging groups are something we all cherish.

It was great reading *our* phrase in your editorial - we *must* be on the right track!"

Editor: Pam's enthusiasm just jumped off the pages of her letter! I strongly suspect they are on the "right track" in more ways than one.

Diane Dolan, Grass Valley, California: We Tommyknocker Cloggers just had a really wonderful experience. The Nevada County Arts Council called a few months ago, asking our cloggers to perform at A Dance Kaleidoscope called Reach for the Stars. One of the members of the Council, Cynthia Weems had the idea to gather all the folks in our area who were involved in the Art of Dance and put on a show at our local High School Theatre.



The proceeds of the show would go to the S.T.A.R.S. Program - Short Term Artist Residence in Schools. This program provides our children with much needed art curriculum our schools are not able to include in their current budgets.

There were 28 different dance routines including tap, African, Hip Hop Jazz, Clogging - you name it, it was there, performed by both young and old. George and Beth Jayne, a professional dance couple who have a studio, choreographed the finale of this event "Chorus Line" to "One". (HAT'S and all!) It took six weeks to learn and five of our eleven cloggers were in the finale.

The Mom of one of our cloggers (Rosanna) sewed for two weeks producing beautiful red satin western shirts with black fringe, black short ruffled skirts with red satin decor. The show was two and a half hours in length, and *everything* was done professionally - stage production, sound, stage manager, lights! For some of our group this was a first with rehearsals, make-up, dress

rehearsal, and March 8th Opening Night! We were even better the second night, March 9th. The energy of clogging brought the house down, and our red costumes were a hit!

What a great feeling to give our time, and the applause caused some of us to become quite stage struck. See what clogging can lead to!



Rise and Shine

Bethany Kidder Westbrook, Maine



My name is Bethany Kidder from Westbrook, Maine and the name of my team is the *Hickory Flat Express Cloggers*. Dan Burr and my mother, Diane Kidder, started our group two years ago and they are our instructors. The reason I am writing this letter is because this past October, I was fortunate enough to become a member of the *1990 All American Clogging Team* in Maggie Valley, North Carolina and I wanted a chance to thank the many people involved in helping me accomplish my goal. I am the first clogger from the New England area to become a member of the *All American Clogging Team*

Clogging Team.

I have been dancing for about 2½ years now. I can still remember the first time I saw the Flatland Cloggers. They were performing in Harrison, Maine and we went up to see them. I couldn't believe what I was seeing. Their feet were moving so fast. I had no idea that a year later I would be invited to dance with them. Mr. Bob Johnson, their Director, was the person responsible for introducing me to the All American Clogging Team. The New England area had just started clogging and had few teams around the area. We had never heard of the All American Clogging Team or what it represented. In New England, most of the clogging is line dancing. There is no competition in the area. Mr. Johnson and his wife invited me to Chesapeake, Virginia to stay with them and dance with the Flatland Cloggers. This past June, Dan and my Mom took me to the airport and I flew down to Virginia. Clogging has been a wonderful experience. I also play clarinet in our local High School Band and we are the State Champions. This helped me in clogging in the area of discipline and practicing to be the best you can be. My team and Mr. Johnson helped me develop sportsmanship, leadership and patience. Mr. Johnson and his team taught me so much in just a couple of months. They introduced me to Southern Style dancing (Appalachian), and it took a lot of practice and patience to learn this style. In New England, we had only seen this style of dancing on the television show, Hee Haw. After seeing the Flatland Cloggers perform in Maine, our team fell in love with this style of dancing. We purchased tapes and watched the many teams performing. We also bought several instruction tapes and watched them over and over . . . dancing in our living room while watching the tapes. Dan and Mom were determined to bring this style of clogging to our area. It's been worth the work, our audiences enjoy watching our exhibition team and truly enjoy this style of dancing. We receive a lot of compliments on our performances and Mom and Dan always point out how fortunate we are to have friends like Mr. and Mrs. Johnson and their team, who have taught us so much.

Dan was the one that introduced my Mom to clogging. I remember how embarrassed I was because my Mom practiced all the time regardless of where she was. One

day, while Mom was barbecuing outside on the deck, she was practicing her steps while turning the steaks. I was so embarrassed . . . all of our neighbors were watching her. Mom asked me if I was interested in taking lessons. I said definitely not!! After watching Mom for about ten weeks, I decided that I would like to try it. I had no idea what wonderful things were ahead for me. Our team is like a big family. Most of our members have two and three in their family on the team. We care about each other and work together so we can be the best that we can be.



The one thing that I would like to say to all cloggers who are just beginning is that it may be really hard and frustrating at first, but once you get the hang of it, its really worth it. Through clogging I have met a lot of wonderful people and have made good friends. I am fortunate to have traveled to so many States and each time I visit a new State, I learn more about clogging.

I hope someday to have my own clogging team and be able to teach them all the wonderful things my Mother, Dan Burr and Mr. Johnson have taught me. Clogging has become very important to me and I am fortunate that my family is willing to travel down South, wherever I need to go, so that I can continue with competition.

Thank you Mom, Dan, Bob and Myrtle Johnson, and *The Flatland Cloggers* for the opportunity of a lifetime.

Diane Kidder and Dan Burr: Bethany is 16 years old, a junior at Westbrook Senior High School, Windham, Maine. Spring and Fall finds her performing in the State Champion High School Marching Band playing first clarinet and running track. Summer and Winter sees her perfoming with the Hickory Flat Express throughout Maine and New Hampshire.

Her development as a clogger has been phenomenal. As her story points out, she decided to give clogging a try after Di had been taking lessons for ten weeks. With only four weeks left to graduation, Di's instructor, Stephanie Caruth of the Granite State Cloggers agreed to allow Bethany to graduate with her Mom's class if Di could teach Bethany all the required steps and routines she had learned in this ten week period. Needless to say, Bethany crammed fourteen weeks of lessons into four short weeks and graduated with the class!!

The History of Negro dance and its music in North America is fundamentally so integrated with our entire music and dance history that it may seem curious here to isolate or limit its boundless divergencies. However, no sequential survey has been made in any general history to date, and episodic treatments can give no concept of the Afro-American contribution in continuity or importance. Hazards are always involved when social and economic problems inexorably impinge on any phase of Negro cultural history, and objectivity becomes an elusive lodestar.

This is in part the saga of William Henry Lane, known as Master Juba. This most influential single performer of nineteenth-century American dance was a prodigy of our entire theater history. Almost legendary among his contemporary colleagues, Master Juba dwindled into oblivion. Negro historians, intent on apotheosizing Ira Aldridge, the African Roscius, ignored him. Yet this is equivalent to writing a twentieth-century theatrical history of the Negro, mentioning only Paul Robeson and omitting Bill Robinson, the great Bojangles. It is more out-



WHAT ARE BMI & ASCAP?

BMI (Broadcast Music, Inc.) & ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors & Publishers), are the licensing organizations which were founded so that the creators of music would be paid for the public performances of their works.

WHAT IS THE N.C.H.C.?

N.C.H.C. (National Clogging & Hoedown Council) was incorporated in the mid 1970's as a means of preserving the heritage of the traditional American Clog Dance. Through its periodical publications, sanctioned competitions and bi-annual meetings, the N.C.H.C. presents a strong program of the art form. The N.C.H.C. is a non-profit organization whose officers are elected by the membership and volunteer their time to maintain the organization. State organizations can become affiliated with the council and reserve a place on the N.C.H.C.'s Board of Directors, to help in making the decisions that shape the course of the organization and its mission.

WHAT IS C.L.O.G. Inc.?

C.L.O.G., Inc. is a national-international organization with non-profit tax exempt 501(c) (3) status, dedicated to serving leaders, instructors, team directors, dancers and clogging enthusiasts for over 14 years. Through the establishment of the National Clogging Convention in 1984, it has united thousands upon thousands of dancers into the largest and most respected clogging event in the world.

WHO NEEDS A BMI/ASCAP LICENSE?

Any user of music who plays copyrighted musical works in public, and whose performances are not specifically exempt under the law, needs a license from BMI/ASCAP or the members whose works the user wishes to perform. As a clogging instructor, licenses are needed from both BMI and ASCAP to cover the music played at your classes, workshops, exhibitions, competitions, and dances throughout the year.

WHY SHOULD I GO THROUGH THE N.C.H.C. and C.L.O.G. TO GET MY LICENSE?

BMI/ASCAP negotiate their fees with users who are often represented by national associations, like the National Association of Broadcasters. JoAnn Gibbs, Executive Director of C.L.O.G. has not endorsed any other BMI/ASCAP negotiations.

We certainly hope all of you will join and support both organizations. The dues are \$20.00 yearly per organization. Both need and welcome your membership.



BEGINNER TO SUPER ADVANCED - TRADITIONAL TO ULTRA MODERN

- #1 AN INTRODUCTION TO SOUTHERN APPALACHIAN SQUARE DANCING A beginners guide to the traditional square dance forms with which clogging steps became intermixed as part of a regional tradition and is one of the square dance categories of clogging competitions. Taught by: BILL NICHOLS



rageous in that Robinson has embellished an already established form, whereas Juba was actually an initiator and determinant of the form itself. The repertoire of any current tap dancer contains elements which were established theatrically by him. Herein is the cornerstone of his memorial.

Negros were first brought to America in the sixteenth century. They came principally from the Gold Coast, Ivory Coast, Congo, Angola, Benin, Gambia, Senegal, Nigeria, Dahomey, and Togoland. Conditioned physiologically and psychologically to elaborate, legalistic tribal ritual and the extrovert, centrifugal community ring-shout, then to the restricted disorder of slave-ship holds, plantation huts, and enforced dissolution of their cultural traditions, with only the slightest elements of western European tradition to draw upon, they evolved art forms which became indigenous manifestations of American culture.

That Negro music making survived is miraculous when we consider the Slave Laws of 1740, which remained among the basic regulatory laws for Negroes during the subsequent century and a quarter. These were promulgated after the Stono Insurrection of 1739, in South Carolina. A group of slaves attempted an escape to Florida, got hold of some rum en route, stopped to celebrate with a song-and-dance bout, and were captured in a bloody charge. They had marched "with colors flying and drums beating." The laws of 1740 stringently prohibited any Negro from "beating drums, blowing horns or the like which might on occasion be used to arouse slaves to insurrectionary activity." Since most states patterned their slave laws after those of South Carolina and Virginia, the effect of these prohibitions would have discouraged any people inherently less musical. Substitutions for the forbidden drum were accomplished with facility - bone clappers in the manner of castanets, jawbones, scrap iron such as blacksmiths' rasps, hand clapping, and foot beats. Virtuosity of footwork, with heel beats and toe beats, became a simulacrum of the drum. In modern tap dancing the "conversation" tapped out by two performers is a survival of African telegraphy by drums. Since African dance had already developed rhythms stamped or beaten out by dancers as counterpoint to antiphonal musical accompaniment, and solo dances set against the communal ring-shout, the formal source material surmounted any restrictions. the slave created the bonja, too, made from a hollow gourd without resonance board, slack strung, which developed in the banjo of minstrelsy and jazz.


The juba dance (simplified from giouba) was an African step dance which somewhat resembled a jig with elaborate variations, and occurs wherever the Negro settled, whether in the West Indies or South Carolina. One variation - crossing and uncrossing the hands against kneecaps which fanned back and forth - was incorporated in the Charleston of the nineteen twenties. Juba and Jube are recurrent slave names particularly associated with dancers and musicians. Juba also occurs as the name of a supernatural being in some American Negro folklore, and became the popular name for an expansive weed, the Juba's-bush or Juba's-brush.

The Negro dancer on the American stage was originally an exotic, much the same as blackamoors in a Rameau

ballet opera. Blackface "Negroes" appeared in eighteenth-century Captain Cook pantomimes and Sheridan's Robinson Crusoe (New York, 1785). In 1791 a Negro troupe of comedians and entertainers, under the direction of one Louis Tabary, gave performances in New Orleans. A typical playbill announcement offers Paul and Virginia, with music by Mazzinghi and Reeve, and accompaniments by James Hewitt, featuring a "NEGRO DANCE by Monsieur Labottiere and Mrs. Darby" (New York, 1805). By 1810 the singing and dancing "Negro Boy" was established with the traditional clown as a dancehall and circus character. These blackface impersonators simply performed jigs and clogs of Irish or English origin to popular songs with topical allusions to Negroes in the lyrics.

Blackface minstrel songs, to the accompaniment of a genuine Negro instrument, the banjo, abetted by tambourine and bone clappers, were popular by 1820, but genuine Negro performers continued to appear only in sporadic interludes. The African Company gave a New York version of the London burletta *Tom and Jerry* in 1821, but the comic dance by the characters *African Sal* and *Dusty Bob* had long been performed in blackface.

"Daddy" Rice, the famous, original "Jim Crow," was a blackface performer who first definitely used a Negro work song. Picked up from a livery-stable porter, this monotonously cheerful refrain - "spin about and turn about and jump Jim Crow" - with accompanying jig and shuffle, focused attention on the Negro as theatrical source material in 1829. Traditional Anglo-American fiddle breakdowns, such as *Turkey in the Straw*, and popular ballads as well, were absorbed into the minstrel amalgam. The minstrel show, as a unit of songs, dances, and jokes, crystallized in the eighteen forties. Although the stock "Negro" was already formed, there was some slight effort initially to approximate Negro music.





I like to think of Bill Nichols as "the Johnny Appleseed of Clogging." If you ask clogging Instructors where they first learned to clog, chances are good that the original source was Bill Nichols in Fontana Village, North Carolina.

In the early 1970's, Nora and Lendal McCullar square danced with caller Earl Brown in Birmingham, Alabama. Earl brought home clogging steps from Bill Nichols - three to be exact - and Nora and Lendal were launched into a twenty-year love-affair with clogging. Lendal rattled off those first three steps - Double up Double down; Cross over; Double step rock step - and they triggered memories of this Editor's oldest children practicing those same steps in our garage eighteen years ago. Their teacher was Wade Driver who learned from Big John Walters, who in turn learned from Bill.

Nora and Lendal sought more clogging instruction from Shelia Popwell and Bill Nichols. In 1975, they started teaching clogging in Birmingham and Nora implemented classes with printed explanation flyers, now called cue sheets. Their Town and Country Cloggers adult team and Dixie Footstompers teen team have been augmented by the more recent Honey Bear Cloggers for the younger children.

Nora and Lendal have served as officers of the *Alabama Clogging Council* and currently are the Editors of the ACC's *Heart of Dixie Clog Notes*.

The list of team accomplishments in both exhibition and the competition arena is long. They've won several Sportsmanship Trophies, which is an off-stage honor to be prized above all others, in this Editor's opinion.



You must be a member of one of these (N.C.H.C. or C.L.O.G.) to be eligible for licensing by BMI/ASCAP at these organizations' discounted rates.

EXCERPTS PARAPHRASED FROM THE BMI/ASCAP LICENSE AGREEMENTS:

A. DEFINITIONS:

"Licensed Premises" - Shall mean any place at which those instructors, who are members of N.C.H.C. or C.L.O.G., conduct classes, workshops, exhibitions, competitions and regular club dances.

"Active Member" - Shall mean a person who conducts one or more of the above defined activities.

"Workshops" - Shall mean educational classes for experienced dancers.

B. BMI/ASCAP GRANT:

BMI/ASCAP grants to N.C.H.C. and C.L.O.G. members, a non-exclusive license to perform, present or cause the performance at licensed premises, only works which BMI/ASCAP shall have the right to grant public performance licenses during the term hereof. The license shall be restricted to performance of music in the manner as described in section C. below and is granted in consideration of the payment of the license fees.

The licenses do not include the following;

- 1. Dramatic rights, the right to perform dramaticomusical works in whole or in substantial part, the right to present individual works in whole or in substantial part, the right to present other context which may constitute an exercise of the "grand rights" therein; or
- 2. The right to broadcast, telecast, cablecast or otherwise transmit the performance licensed hereunder

to persons outside of the licensed premises.

3. The licenses do not authorize performance of music by means of coin-operated phonorecord player (jukebox) as defined in the Copyright Law - (17 U.S.C. Section 116).

C. PERFORMANCES AT LICENSED PREMISES AND RESTRICTIONS

The license granted herein shall be restricted to performances of music by the playing of records, prerecorded tapes, CD's or other mechanical devises, or via the reception of broadcast audio transmissions on receiving apparatus and amplification thereof through loudspeakers located on the licensed premises, in a designated area on the licensed premises during dances, workshops and dance instruction conducted by N.C.H.C. and C.L.O.G. members.

Such instruction shall be limited to clog, square, round, contras, and modern dancing, as those terms are commonly understood in the dance profession. In no event shall this license authorize performances of recorded music for the following:

- 1. On the licensed premise (other than incidentally) adjacent to or outside of the area in which dances, workshops and instructional classes are being held,
- 2. Performances of music at any time other than while such covered events are in session,
- 3. During athletic classes, dance instruction known as aerobic, gymnastics, slimnastics, jazz dancing as those terms are commonly understood in the dance profession,
- 4. At any trade shows, conventions, expositions and shopping centers/malls, (The trade show, convention, exposition and shopping center/mall would have its' own license),
- 5. On any other BMI/ASCAP licensed premises or facility.

This form must be signed and returned, even if you are not subject to the license agreement.
