HEAT

Last summer's blistering heat wave caused an outbreak of heat-related illnesses. Emergency rooms across the country were crowded with victims. Over 1,000 people in the southwestern United States died; others were left permanently disabled.

In one southeastern state where the temperatures ranged up to 105°, 118 people died. The tragedy is that heat-related illnesses are preventable.

Certain groups of people can be identified as high-risk in relation to these illnesses. Athletes and military personnel who are undergoing rigorous training and conditioning in hot, humid weather are particularly vulnerable.

If high environmental temperatures persist over a period of several months, acclimatization usually occurs. This requires gradual daily exposure to high temperatures.

There are three types of heat-related illness: heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke.

Heat Cramps. These are intermittent, painful contractions of skeletal muscles. These cramps often occur in acclimatized individuals who replace the fluid lost in sweat by drinking water, but do not replace sodium. The sodium depletion is believed to be responsible for the cramps. Heat cramps usually occur in muscles that have been involved in strenuous activity - most often those of the legs. The cramps last a few minutes and generally disappear spontaneously. With heat cramps, the body temperature is normal and the serum sodium will be normal or low.

The treatment is to replace sodium with salt tablets or an electrolyte solution.

Heat Exhaustion. This is the most common heat-related illness seen clinically. Excessive salt and/or water loss due to sweating account for the symptoms, which include central nervous system disturbances, such as headache, dizziness, weakness and irritability; and gastrointestinal disturbances, such as nausea and vomiting.

Patients are generally sweating profusely, and body temperature may be mildly elevated. Since these symp-

toms are not exclusive to heat exhaustion, the history of exposure to hot, humid weather is necessary to make a diagnosis.

Treatment of heat exhaustion is rest, a cool environment, and intravenous replacement of sodium and water. If untreated, heat exhaustion can progress to heat stroke.

Heat Stroke. This is the most serious of the heat-related disorders. It is characterized by a body temperature of at least 40.6°C (105°F), central nervous system disturbances, and usually, a lack of sweating that results from unexplained failure, or exhaustion, of the sweat glands. The patient's mental status may vary from agitation or confusion to lethargy, stupor, or coma.

Heat-related illnesses can be prevented. Persons engaging in strenuous activities during hot weather should limit the activity to the cooler times of the day. Acclimatization is accomplished by gradual exposure to hot weather -

10 to 15 minute increments over a period of 10 to 20 days. Full acclimatization may, however, require up to two months. There is a misconception that because one runs three miles at 7 o'clock every morning when it is cool, he/she can compete at 9 a.m. in a running meet when it is hot, and expect to be acclimatized. Such a misconception could prove life threatening.

Salt tablets are beneficial, but must be accompanied by an increased amount of fluid. The drinks consumed during exercise might include electrolyte-rich products (Gatorade, Thirst Quencher), however, most juices, canned drinks (especially diet drinks), and buttermilk contain sodium.

When temperatures are unusually high, strenuous outdoor activities should be canceled, and individuals should be cautioned against starting weight reduction programs that include heavy exercise.

Clothing should be light-weight, light-colored, and loose-fitting. In addition, as little clothing as possible should be worn indoors. If it is necessary to go outside, clothing should cover as much skin as possible, and direct sunlight should be avoided. Shade can be created by a parasol or wide-brimmed hat. For those accustomed to air conditioning, going outside should be limited to cooler times of the day. Exertion should be minimal, and adequate hydration is imperative.

Editor's Note: Every year about this time, we try to publish either this article or a similar one on heat related illnesses and how to prevent them. It is important for Instructors to be aware that heat can kill. We would like to note that many Directors and Instructors are seeking certification in Standard First Aid courses and training in CPR.

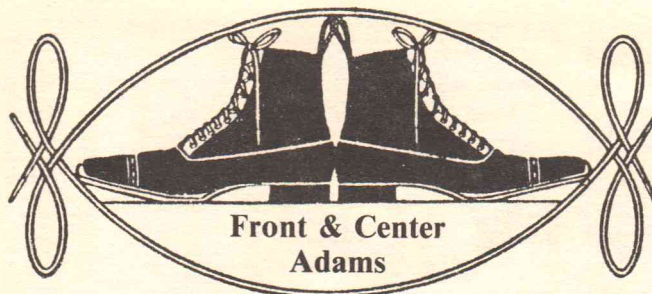

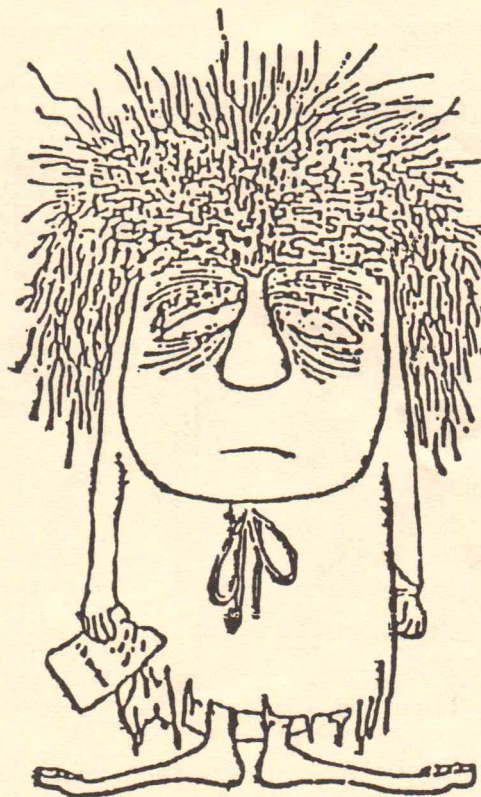

He told us they had a couple of radio stations coming in and were going to be selling hotdogs for only a quarter, from the trailer out in front of the store. Now we're starting to get a little excited.

Our performance was suppose to be from 6 pm to 7 pm. We are on the same hour as the *Buckeye Specials*. Talk about some fast moving cloggers! These junior high girls can make Kay and I look like we are standing still. Course I keep forgetting we'll be 50 years old this August. Clogging keeps you young! They had originally asked Kay and I if we could do two numbers. At the last minute the two numbers turned into three. So we quickly threw something together for our third number.

At 5:45 pm, a pleasant lady came up and introduced herself as the "lady in charge." Her daughter was the main singer - for an hour performance. Sounds great to us - at last here is someone who knows what is going on. She showed us the order of performances and said we don't have to perform back in "Automotive" that we will be performing right up front where the check-out counters are!

The *Buckeye Specials* were to go on first and our first dance was to go third. Her daughter would be singing in between the dance routines. Kay and I are really getting excited now and the adrenaline is starting to flow faster. At five minutes 'till six the *Buckeye Specials* arrived. Thank goodness! We were starting to think the daughter would have to sing four more songs and Kay and I would have to repeat our dances. The *Specials* unloaded from their van and brought an easel and sign in the store. And there we were; *The Double K Cloggers* listed as the third act on the sign (but then there were only three acts listed). Talk about proud! Kay and I had never been billed on a sign before and there we were right up in front for all those check-out counter people to see.

When it came time for the show to start, Kay and I did just exactly as our clogging instructor, Sallie Adkins, always taught us. Find your own little corner somewhere and quietly go over your steps 'till time to go on. We did just that. We went down the aisle past the *pocket books*

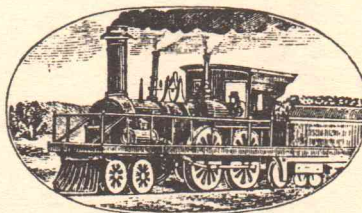

This year, 14 teams from Georgia and Florida entertained the crowd and each other for seven hours on a Saturday.

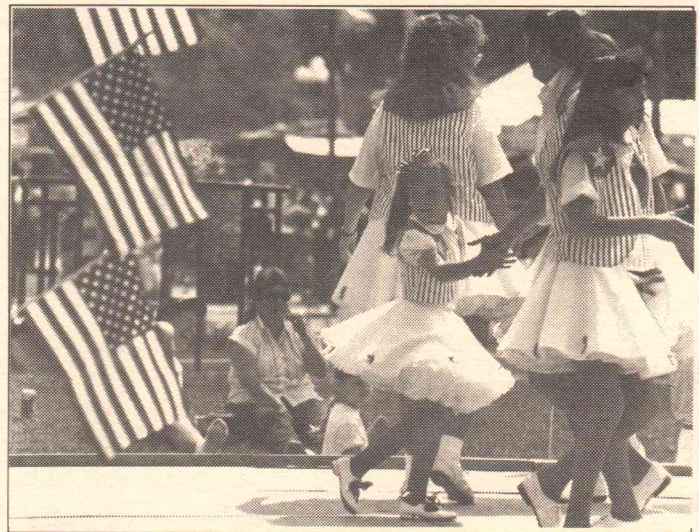

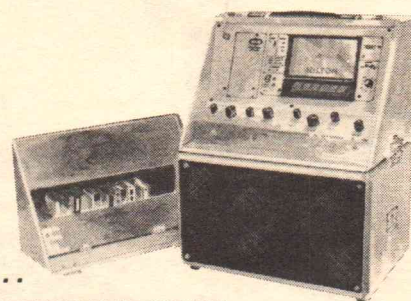

Juba and American Minstrelsy

Composer-performer Dan Emmett, for example, made a particular effort to keep Negro elements in his work, especially in the "walk-around" finales for which he was noted. These were usually in two parts - the first containing melodies embellished with rhythmic phrases, ejaculations, and verbal interjections (in the best Negro tradition), followed by a chorus and dance based on an old-fashioned fiddle tune. These early works are in distinctly different vein from Foster and the later sentimental ballad repertoire. An anonymous scribe for the *New York Herald*, writing at the late date of 1895, was exceptional in realizing this difference.

One great essential to the proper presentation of Negro character, song-and-dance acts was fitting music of a catchy, swinging, Ethiopian nature. While "Dan" Emmett never figured or posed as a dancer, he is responsible for some of the very best "walk-arounds" ever written. Most of these, if not all, were composed for Bryant's Minstrels in the year 1859. Among the most notable and popular ones may be mentioned "I Ain't Got Time to Tarry," "Billy Patterson," "High, Low, Jack," "Chaw Roast Beef," "Turkey in de Straw," "Loozyanna Low Grounds," (not lowlands, as it is generally sung), "K.Y.Ky. or Whose Foot Am Dat Aburnin'?" which was produced in 1860, and "High Daddy" in 1863.

Unquestionably the Negro qualities of minstrel music dwindled, and even the adapted Negro techniques of performance which had been taken over grew vague and sloppy, save in rare instances. Yet because of the vast influence of one Negro performer, the minstrel-show dance retained more integrity as a Negro art form than any other theatrical derivative of Negro culture.

Juba, born William Henry Lane, circa

1825 or later, seems to have sprung full-panoplied from the brow of Terpsichore. Probably a free-born Negro and, from the first records of his appearance at about

fifteen, unencumbered by family, he was generally adopted by the entire fraternity of white minstrel players, who unreservedly recognized his genius. He had supposedly learned much of his art from "Uncle" Jim Lowe, a Negro jig and reel dancer of exceptional skill, whose performances were confined to saloons, dance halls, and similar locales outside the regular theaters. By 1945 it was flatly stated by members of the profession that Juba was "beyond question the very greatest of all dancers. He was possessed not only of wonderful and unique execution, but also of unsurpassed grace and endurance." A *New York Herald* feature writer has left us a description of his early extratheatrical performances.

At the time when he performed at Pete Williams', in Orange Street, New York, those who passed through the long hallway and entered the dance hall, after paying their shilling to the darky doorkeeper, whose "box office" was a plain soap box, or a wooden one of that description, saw this phenomenon, "Juba," imitate all the dancers of the day and their special steps. Then Bob Ellingham, the interlocutor and master of ceremonies, would say, "Now, Master Juba, show your own jig." Whereupon he would go through all his own steps and specialties, with never a resemblance in any of them to those he had just imitated.

The best in the profession danced there, as well as Juba. A most amusing feature of the entertainment was the comic "walk-around," given in true darky style, with the lean, the fat, the tall, the short, the hunchbacked, and the wooden-legged, all mixed in and hard at it. It was from a one-legged performer there, whose second leg was a wooden one, that Dave Reed learned his celebrated "stiff" leg steps.

(This reminds one of Peg-leg Bates, whose handicap turned him into an amazing virtuoso performer among our current dancers.) Negro art forms always reached the public in the popular dance halls, even when the legitimate theaters were closed to them.

Juba's fame was already so legendary that by 1845 he achieved the unprecedented distinction of touring with four white minstrels and received *top billing!* I am quoting their 1845 handbill, from the Harvard Theatre Collection, in full, since it gives an idea of the musical mainstays. Juba, incidentally, was a first rate singer and tambourine virtuoso.

Great Attraction! Master Juba! The Greatest Dancer in the World! and the Ethiopian Minstrels! Respectfully announce to the Citizens of this place that they will have the pleasure of appearing before them During the Day Under a Pavillion. The Company is composed of Four Skilful Members, and from the immense success which has attended them wherever they have appeared, they are confident in promising their auditors the most irresistible ludicrous, as well as scientific Entertainment that they have ever listened to.

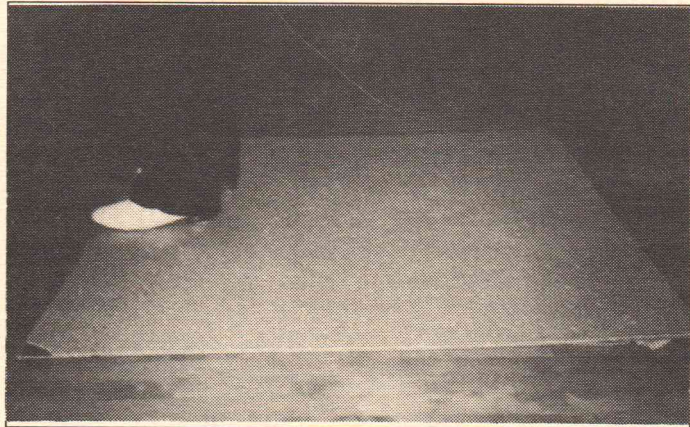

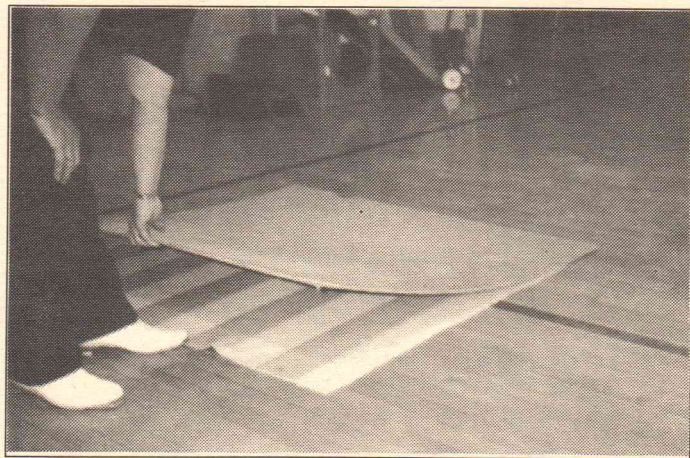
Texan's Step-A-Tune

Having read articles about Step-A-Tunes or dancing boards, I recently built a couple for myself. One of the dancing boards is kept at my home while the other travels in my van for use in classes, workshops, and demonstrations. My board is somewhat different from others, but is very functional as well as attractive.



My Step-A-Tune is made from a 4x4' sheet of 3/16" masonite. To the slick side of the masonite sheet, I glued 1/8" exterior linoleum tiles. Sixteen tiles are needed and either exterior or interior grade tiles will work. The particular tiles I used were left overs from a new floor I put in my recreation room. Since the color of the tiles match the floor, I never have to put the Step-A-Tune away.



To provide cushioning and prevent the board from sliding on the floor, I use a 4x4' square of rubberized carpet backing to place the board on. Since the backside of the masonite has a ribbed surface, the masonite adheres to the backing and no slipping occurs. The carpet backing was provided gratis by asking a distributor for a piece.

I also have a frame made of 2x2" boards upon which the dancing board can be placed. If I am interested in my audience hearing particular sounds, I will generally put the board on the frame and place my sound system's microphone underneath. Generally, however, I merely place the board on the floor.

If or when a tile chips or breaks, it can easily be replaced. If one desires their board to be colorful or fancy in design, they are limited only by their imagination and the variety of color combinations and designs of tiles that are available.

My dancing board readily accomodates my shuffle style of clogging as the tile surface has a natural degree of slickness. Since I constantly emphasize the drag/slide, I find the surface and cushioning are especially easy on my knees and feet.

Since many of my students live in homes or apartments where there is little space for clogging, they find this type of dancing board to be very practical and inexpensive.

To be a clogger with a "leading role".

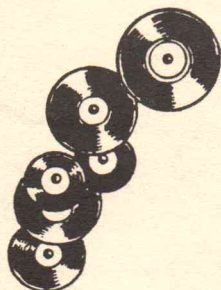

BEGINNER TO SUPER ADVANCED - TRADITIONAL TO ULTRA MODERN

in which he will give correct Imitation Dances of all the principal Ethiopian Dancers in the United States. After which he will give an imitation of himself - and then you will see the vast difference between those that have heretofore attempted dancing and this WONDERFUL YOUNG MAN. Names of the Persons Imitated: 1. Mr. Richard Pelham. New York. 2. Mr. Francis Brower. New York. 3. Mr. John Daniels. Buffalo. 4. Mr. John Smith. Albany. 5. Mr. James Sanford. Philadelphia. 6. Mr. Frank Diamond. Troy. 7. Master John Diamond. New York.

The program is an interesting dictionary of the foremost “Ethiopian” dancers at that period. Of these, Pelham, Brower, and most particularly Master John Diamond, were most important. The latter, somewhat Juba’s senior, was his only serious rival, and considered second only to Juba.

Master Diamond (1823-1857) achieved prominence about 1839. He was billed as a performer of the Negro Camptown Hornpipe, Ole Virginny Breakdown, Smoke House Dance and Five Mile Out of Town Dance, in “all of which he will come in those Unheard of, Out landish and Inimitable Licks, what is Death to all de Long Island Darkies, and which secures to him the title of King of Diamonds.” (In jazz repertoire today there are at least three *Smokehouse* variations and the *Camptown* is well represented. Those “Inimitable Licks” survived as the “hot licks” of swing. There is a definite continuity of terminology.)

Diamond’s style was considered a wonder. “Small of

stature, he executed in an extremely neat and slow fashion.” An incurable dipsomaniac, his dancing was held to be “considerably better than his temper and disposition.” Since the “Master’s respective merits were continually debated, a series of “Challenge Dances” was initiated to award the indisputable palm. They danced their first match at John Tryon’s Amphitheatre in 1844.

These challenge matches demanded the same attention for an artistic matter that our ancestors lavished on their sporting events. There were at least three judges, for time, style, and execution. On occasion an audience had the decisive voice in determining the victor. “The time judge sat on the stage in the first right entrance, the style judge sat in or near the orchestra pit, and the judge of execution sat *under* the stage. There, with pad and pencil, the execution judge checked the missing taps, defective rolls and heel work, the lagging in the breaks. At the conclusion of the contest the judges compared notes and awarded the prize on points.”

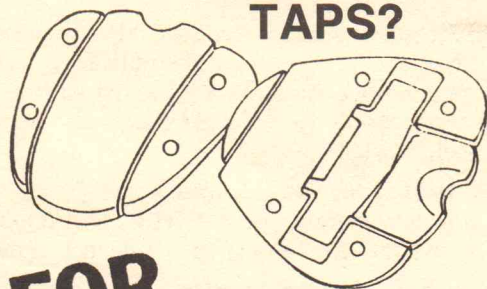
Gardening . . . man's effort to improve his lot

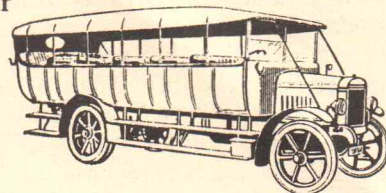

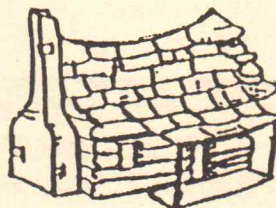

Did You Return Your BMI/ASCAP Declarations Page?

You may be one of those people who didn't give another thought to the BMI/ASCAP music licensing agreement that came in the mail from N.C.H.C. (National Clogging and Hoedown Council)/C.L.O.G., Inc. Is it stuffed in a drawer somewhere? If you mailed it in time, you are receiving the full benefit of your licenses. If you missed the deadline, N.C.H.C./C.L.O.G., Inc. will be accepting the applications year round. The fees are the same. However, the licenses are not pro-rated according to when you pay your fees. The licenses are still renewed during the first quarter of each year. The previous deadline allowed N.C.H.C./C.L.O.G., Inc. to meet their deadline in order to get the lowest possible rate for the licensees.

Regardless of whether you get licenses with N.C.H.C./C.L.O.G., Inc. or other organizations, those who are subject to licensure still need them. If one were to negotiate their own licenses they would pay \$100 - \$150 per agency and possibly more. N.C.H.C./C.L.O.G., Inc. is providing the cheapest rate. N.C.H.C. and C.L.O.G. will receive no *commission* for the licenses purchased by its members and no additional fees will be added to the prices you pay for your BMI/ASCAP licenses.

What are BMI & ASCAP?

BMI (Broadcast Music, Inc.) & ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers), are the licensing organizations which were founded so that the creators of music would be paid for the public performances of their works.

Who Needs to Mail the Declarations Page?

Anyone who is a member of N.C.H.C./C.L.O.G., Inc., even if you are not subject to the license agreement.

Who Needs a BMI/ASCAP License?

Any user of music who plays copyrighted musical works in public, and whose performances are not specifically exempt under the law, needs a license from BMI/ASCAP or the members whose works the user wishes to perform. As a clogging instructor, licenses are needed from both BMI and ASCAP to cover the music played at your classes, workshops, exhibitions, competitions, and dances throughout the year.
