

Everyone will get a much-deserved rest in November and then on go the clogging shoes for seven more performances in December.



PARENTS...YOUR BEST RESOURCE USE THEM!

In Utah, clogging is not taught in clubs, nor to a lot of adults as it is many other places in the world. It is taught in dance studios by private teachers; just like jazz, tap or ballet. The students are predominantly children, teens, and young adults,

(many studios won't even teach adults, let alone have them compete). Most of the competitions held in this area of the United States offer novice, beginning, intermediate, advanced, and championship levels; rather than just championship or advanced. This is great for the student because it allows the less polished clogger more opportunities to compete. But because the emphasis here is on competition; there is more pressure on a director to create more original material, and many spectacular and extravagant costumes, for many more teams. With as many as ten competition teams, ten classes, and two club levels, the work load, problems and stress can become impossible to deal with.

I have always liked teaching my students, watching their progress, creating costumes and choreographing dances. But, with so many classes and competition teams, I soon found myself short of time, money, ideas, and trying to be at three different stages at the same time at every


competition. Not wanting to bring in outside teachers, raise lesson fees to hire other help, nor have myself cloned, I realized my best resource (for better or worse) was my students' parents.

My first attempts at utilizing my 'parent resource' were at

best, unsuccessful. We elected parent association officers. Many who were elected did not want or were not equipped to handle their positions. Some parents wouldn't volunteer for anything, some volunteered for too many things, some didn't follow through, and some made life difficult for those who did volunteer. Some of their fundraisers and projects actually made more work for me. Many of the officers felt that because of their position, their children should not have to obey the same rules as others. Some of the parents felt their position gave them the right to dictate what dances, costumes and performances we would have. Everyone wanted to be chief and no one wanted to follow. We needed organization, and as the director it was up to me.

Twrote a detailed studio policy and had competition team members and their parents sign a team contract, agreeing to certain terms, policies and goals, before the year started.







TEACHING TIPS FOR THE WANNABE

This month's article is intended for those whose aspirations as an instructor extend beyond local classes and regional or association workshops — the exclusive world of the "National" instructor.

Unsure of what exactly qualifies one to be called a "National" instructor, I sought my answer from those I know who have expressed an interest in being one. Bearing in mind that their answers do not imply agreement — here's what they thought:

- A National Instructor is:
- someone whose name is known throughout the clogging world.
- someone whose routines are done everywhere.
- someone who gets paid to travel around teaching workshops.
- someone who's good.

Although there are exceptions among the ranks to each answer, I think this list is what all teachers who wish to expand their visibility hope for.

People approach me all the time and say "I want to do what you do — what advice can you give me?" How much time do you have? I've probably made more mistakes and bad decisions than any instructor in clogging. It's through these mistakes I've learned some valuable lessons. Most instructors who are successful for any length of time are either talented choreographers or good entertainers. Use the hints below and talk to other instructors and with a lot of hard work — and some lucky breaks — you'll be "on the road."

- 1. Write your own material. This is a *must*. Although some of an instructor's appeal is in their entertainment value, the quality of material taught is what gets bookings. If you're getting workshops teaching other instructors' material sooner or later the promoters will save their money to book the instructor whose material you're teaching.
- 2. Keep in mind the level of dancer who attends workshops. So many teachers worry about the competitiveness of the teaching circuit and think they need dazzling routines full of killer steps and jazz to attract attention. Good, danceable routines that have movement and feel good will go over every time. Add a step or two to challenge, or jazz that's not overly aerobic or difficult to teach and you'll have a routine that will get danced long after you've gone home. If it's important to you that the advanced dancers like all of your routines, or that the kids are in your classes — you're likely to limit yourself. If your routine is fun, the kids and advanced dancers will want to learn it. Don't worry about catering to them — they'll fancy it up themselves. Write a good mix of material, and be as enthusiastic about choreographing and teaching your basic routines as you are the intermediate and advanced.
- 3. Be yourself even if you're not fully sure who that is. The point is don't try to copy the teaching style or

mannerisms of your favorite teacher, they could have booked them if they wanted.

- **4. Remember why you are on that stage.** [This one's hard for me.] If you have a story to tell, go ahead and tell it that's endearing. Talk more than you teach that's obnoxious. Most of the bad experiences I've had with cloggers had little to do with clogging. A bad choice of words, a political or social stance, or speeches can alienate people faster than anything. I know.
- 5. Spend time with the dancers. Don't run from the stage to the teachers' lounge or disappear to the hotel room every break. People want to meet you, talk, ask questions, talk, get advice, talk, go over steps, talk...get the picture?
- 6. Beware of non-cloggers who ask you to get involved in a project or enter a business deal. Now, granted, there are some on the business side of clogging who at one time danced, or are physically unable to dance. I'm talking about those who were exposed to clogging, saw dollar signs and set up shop — all in the name of promoting clogging and "love of the dance." If they loved the dance so much they'd do it. Many a starry-eyed teacher — eager to see their name on a workshop flyer, record, or video — worked their butt off on a handshake and a promise of payment, only to be told "I wish we could pay you, but we're not even going to break even," "I don't remember telling you that," or the KILLER "I'm just doing this to promote clogging, I'm not making any money." The hard-learned moral of the story is: even if it's a friend — GET IT IN WRITING! Before you make your next cued record or video purchase, ask the producer of the video how much of the profits go to the instructor whose work is being sold, then ask the instructor how much they have received. You'd be shocked. On a video which retails for \$50.00, the instructor — at best — may get a royalty of \$5.00-\$7.00. Some companies give as little as \$1.50 per video to the instructor. One company offers nothing to the instructors whose past records they are selling using their names and pictures. Even when payment is promised, teachers must rely on the honesty of the producer in reporting sales and paying royalties, so the problems are obvious. Buy videos and records produced by companies run by the instructors and cloggers who appear on them — that way the vendors will make their profits and the instructor will get what's due them.
- 7. Talk to other instructors. There is a wealth of information out there. Don't wait for a T.A.P. session in your area, take time at workshops to ask the instructor a few questions, or talk with your fellow teachers. The local workshop teacher is the best source in the world for teaching tips they do this every night, not just on Saturdays.
- **8. HAVE FUN!** Dancers come to workshops to get new material, mingle and play. Give them an experience they'll talk about 'til the next workshop rolls around.



Canfield Dance Company Visits Munich and Prague

Having checked the agenda, I could clog my heart out morning, noon and night.

I met Naomi on the Friday afternoon, together with her friend Paula, and we renewed our acquaintance after a heartfelt hug.

The evening programme was a bit of a surprise in that the workshop was lead by Alexandra Schell from Germany, assisted by her sister Daniella. We enjoyed learning "Next To You, Next To Me." There were about 30 of us from Germany, Denmark, Belgium and Holland, dancing on a tiled floor in a well-ventilated school hall. I mention this because it was 37 °C

holding workshops in basic, easy, intermediate and advanced.


We attended Jeff Driggs' workshop of "No Limit" and we laughed all the way through his class. He's a real comedian. Needless to say, we really enjoyed it.


The evening commenced with championships followed by Parade of Flags. Ours did not win the "Best" but we did get the "Weary Traveller Award"...Thank you Chip.

In Memory of Norvia Rue Burns

AUGUST 16, 1993

[This is an excerpted copy of the eulogy delivered by Steve Smith at Norvia's funeral service.]

"Hey Chief, what's up" is the greeting I so well remember during the past 13 years. I have only known Norvia for those 13 years and cannot speak of his earlier life. But I can only guess that I was treated to the best of him during his last years.

I was privileged to watch Norvia grow and developing during those years... grow in confidence, harness his strengths, and direct them into purposeful action.

He began to develop his talents as a dance instructor during this time and to share those talents with others. Norvia's life during those 13 years can be be described as a ministry. Through Norvia groups of people were brought together to share the best of whom they were with each other. Through the joy of dance, Norvia was able to form communities of people with incredibly diverse backgrounds and bring them together in a safe and loving way. Regardless of race, gender, income level, or

age, all were welcomed by Norvia. Through his tolerance and non-divisive philosophy, true brotherly love was taught and shared through the vehicle of clog dancing.

There are three exceptional qualities that stand out for me when I think of Norvia Rue Burns: gentleness, nonjudgementalness, and generosity.

Norvia was a gentleman and truly one of the most GENTLE men that I have ever met. Norvia was like a shepherd caring for his flock, guiding with gentle direction. People felt safe around Norvia in part because of his gentleness. I have never been witness to harshness or abrasiveness in Norvia. He attained his goals through gentle means rather than a heavy-handed style.

Norvia's gentleness was also reflected in his sense of humor. He was easy to approach because he laughed a lot and made people laugh with him. I can remember so many times upon greeting me that he would start the conversation with "have you heard the one about...?". His humor disarmed people and made them laugh...And what a wonderfully infectious laugh!

Non-judgementalness. I have yet to meet anyone in my life who was a non-judgemental as was Norvia. Norvia stands alone when I try to think of someone who refrained from negative judgement, criticism, or condemnation toward others. Norvia was a great gift to me in the form of a living example of acceptance and tolerance. To me, he was

a *real* life example of what Christian Living really means.

And Generosity. He was constantly asking, "Is there

anything I can do for you?" He donated his time, energy, and talent to those who surrounded him...and oh was he surrounded. Teaching classes in Campbellsville, Somerset, and Harrodsburg, he was constantly in demand and constantly giving. He seemed to thrive on that loving interchange with others.

Yes, Norvia was a *minister* in every sense of the word. He ministered to people's needs with the loving extension of himself, provided a safe and loving structure whereby people could join together, and celebrate life in the form of dance. What a beautiful ministry!

Norvia died one day before he was to be married. Marriage was an important event for Norvia, one that he had planned for quite some time. You see, he had met another kindred spirit in the form of Patsy West. With Patsy, Norvia found a loving companion who loved and supported the essence of who he was. She was great comfort for his soul, someone with whom he wanted to spend the rest of his life...and he did. She was with him every step of the way in his struggle with his disease.

Norvia and I were playing golf about this time last year at the Old Bridge Golf Club in Danville. It's a very hilly course and we had walked it in its entirety. Neither of us dreamed that his body was already beginning the fight of its life. His struggle with cancer over the next 12 months was a series of hopes, broken dreams, and numerous setbacks. But even more than physiologically painful, it was an incredible psychological challenge to stay upbeat and positive.



If you spent any time with Norvia at all during this past year you know that his outlook was nothing short of incredible. Many times I thought Norvia was in deep denial, that he just wasn't being realistic about the seriousness of his condition. But now . . . as I look back I can see how incredible his reaction really was. He was eternally optimistic, upbeat, and refused to speculate about the future. You see. Norvia was too busy living in the moment. He realized that's the only place that real living can occur. He refused to give energy to the process of regretting the past or worrying about the future. Norvia was really good at living life as it happened, taking what was given him, and truly making the best of it.





The committee did a wonderful job presenting and executing this workshop with great care and success. There were three halls, and one was used for classes on: make-up, inter-personal relations, introduction to clogging, competition and reading cue sheets. Those instructing these classes were: Reed Davis, Alan Keene, Betty Stretch, Sherri Williams and Chrissie Farrar. The other two halls were used for dancing.

Two young instructors were invited to teach this year — they were Bobby Lockart of Lawton, Oklahoma and Tamara Low of Bartlesville. These kids were terrific and they have a very positive future as clogging instructors. Other instructors were: Reed Davis teaching some "oldies"...the floor was crowded with dancers for these. His easy method of teaching was very enjoyable. Ken Beach taught

several dances that were fun and I must say this writer was impressed with his relaxed and professional manner in teaching. Betty Stretch taught some fun couples dances, Alan Keene taught some mountain figures and last, but not least, Bill Francisco of Tulsa, Oklahoma put on his "Santa" hat, bleached his "Santa" beard and taught a Christmas dance that was thoroughly enjoyed by all of the dancers. Bill really knows how to reach an audience. He is very artistic and his routines are always a delight to watch. I might add, that Bill also puts on his "Santa Clog" suit every year and performs at the hospital or anywhere "Santa" is needed.

All in all, this workshop was very successful and there was enough variety to make the workshop interesting and enjoyable.

We are looking forward to an even larger workshop in 1994. The OKA sends you our best and have a happy holiday season!







Parents were given the option of giving volunteer hours to the studio or paying higher lesson fees. Parent Association Officers were *selected* rather than elected, from among parents I knew would do a good job and with whom I knew I could work well. Parents were notified that teams and classes who did not have a team mom to help take care of their needs, could not perform or compete. Other board members and chairpersons were added as needed. We set up regular board meetings to handle problems and make decisions as needed.

These are the officers and volunteer positions we have:

- 1. Parent Association President: coordinates activities between the board, director, assistant director, teaching staff and team moms. If there are phone calls to be made, he/she notifies the team moms, who notify the parents of team members.
- **2. Parent Association Treasurer:** handles competition fees, fund raising funds, student savings accounts, and expenses as needed by the Parent Association.
- **3. Fund Raising Chairperson:** sets up and oversees fundraisers, calls businesses for donations, etc.
- 4. Stage Manager: makes sure each group is at the stage at their appointed time and tells them where and how to go on. He MCs our shows and puts the audience at ease. At competitions, he greets each group before they go on stage, moves their position in the line-up forward or back as needed to accommodate costume changes and appearances on other stages, and checks with team moms to make sure music has been turned in.
- **5. Badge and T-shirt Chairman:** orders t-shirts, jackets and team badges and takes care of all details concerning printing, design, etc.
- **6. Newsletter Editor:** puts out a quarterly newsletter to keep parents and students informed and unified.
- **7. News Reporter:** puts news stories of our group in newspapers, etc.
- **8. Costume Coordinator:** helps find needed costume items and fabric, helps organize the buying and selling of used costumes, and helps find seamstresses.
- 9. Team Moms: come to classes every week so they can learn to line-up performers at performances and competitions. They handle costume and behavior problems at events and have the authority to pull any clogger from line-up who has misbehaved or come without costume parts. They counsel team members and parents, settle disputes, make countless phone calls, celebrate team birthdays, look for lost team members at competitions, turn in team music and help teams practice at competitions. They do anything needed to insure their team's success.
- 10. Team Spirit Parent: creates team cheers, badges, posters, and works to keep team and parent spirit high at all times.
- 11. Birthday Secretary: puts some kind of birthday token on the bulletin board for each person's birthday.

We also have parents who trade bookkeeping and secretarial services for lessons. We have dedicated fathers who transport, setup, and take down our traveling floor and video the shows for us. We have a volunteer father who photographs our group at parties, performances and competitions. We have a talented father who repairs sound equipment and runs the music at our programs. We have team fathers on teams having male members (it's a little hard for mom to retrieve a late dancer from the boy's dressing room).

Besides service hours, we have had parents donate bulletin boards, shelves, chairs, lights, speakers, sound systems, etc.

What are the benefits of all this volunteer work? Many! Because the parents are helping, they appreciate and understand the difficulties of my job as director. I know most of my students' parents by first name and can tell you what most of them do for a living, etc. Because the parents care...the dancers try harder. Many of the parents have started clogging themselves. And, as Bobbie can tell you from having watched our group at a competition in Orem, Utah several years ago...we all really enjoy being and clogging together.

I still spend many stressful hours teaching, choreographing and costuming. But I now have time to actually watch my dancers on stage, share their triumphs and discouragements, visit with parents and occasionally perform or compete a dance myself. I even have time to help my own children and enjoy these experiences with them. I have come to really love the parents of my students, appreciate them and think of them as my friends.

I recommend parent involvement for every studio, no matter how large or small. EVERYONE BENEFITS... ESPECIALLY THE KIDS!

P.S. Last spring the *Double Toe Times* published a letter from a clogger who attended the workshop and competition in Las Vegas in December 1992. She was discouraged that more cloggers did not attend the workshop and wondered if we competition cloggers did not feel we needed workshops any longer. We love to attend workshops but as I hope you can see from this article, it is hard to get all your teams on two different stages all day for all the events. It would be impossible to attend a workshop at the same time. It's too bad things could not have been organized to allow time for both — at different times.

From all of us...we love you Norvia Burns. Happy Trails to you partner... till we meet again.

Editor's Note: Patsy West, Norvia's fiance, wrote of her love and admiration for Norvia Burns and of their last eight months together. Her love and pain and grief brought me to tears. I decided not to publish all of the many pages but to draw excerpts:

... There was always a calmness about Norvia which made him very trustworthy.

... As an instructor, Norvia has touched so many lives. What's so wonderful about this is that he didn't even realize he was doing it. He had people branch out from him to start their own classes and he was always willing to help them any way he could.

... Norvia went through many crises during his eight months of struggling with cancer. But his attitude was marvelous. We stayed on the road going to clogging workshops or visiting the places Norvia used to teach.

... Even as discouraging as cancer may be, Norvia did not give up on his life.

... Norvia was loved by so many people. They were all there for him in their thoughts, their prayers and in their visits. It was such a rare treat to be surrounded by all the concern and love that was there for him.

...On August 12, 1993, God took Norvia to heaven.

... Norvia will never be forgotten. Although he is no longer with us, he will always be in our hearts.
