

I've visited New Orleans, but not during Mardi Gras, and reckon this was pretty authentic, even down to the free bead necklaces, confetti and streamers.





COUNTRY POLKA

6 COUNTS — Men start on left foot, ladies start on right foot.

Dance in country position, moving counter-clockwise (LOD). Keep steps small and feet on floor in sliding movement. Count: 1-2-3 and 1-2-3. You will be constantly changing weight from one foot to the other. Movement is moderately fast.

FOOTWORK FOR MEN — MOVING FORWARD:

Dance these basic steps moving in LOD until you feel you can make a turn. Men lead your partner by guiding her to her right with your left hand while dancing the basic 1-2-3 and 1-2-3. Take all six counts to make turn. You may make one turn or several together. Now for a sigular turn the man drops his right and the lady drops her left hand to sides and turn lady under her right arm as you both continue basic steps. (Men will dance in place as ladies turn). When lady completes turn man will turn under his left arm making turn same as his lady. Again "Turn" as often as you wish, but you must dance the basic steps to make your turn or turns look graceful.



Square and Round Dance Convention Continued from Page 1



This was my fourth trip to Europe to do the dance convention and each year it is always a thrill for me. I am looking forward to Copenhagen in August 1994. Join me!







TO STANDARDIZE OR NOT TO STANDARDIZE

By Jeff Driggs

I heard it again. "I want something in writing — something I can carry in my wallet." "I want to be certified." Many clogging teachers feel that it is important to have a system of certification that gives them the authority to be thought of as a *qualified* instructor.

The idea has merit. Certification would provide teachers with promotable clout, added self esteem and all of the baggage that is used to sell a certification program. Teachers could have business cards with initials on them, and network within their certified circle. All of the confusion with cue sheets, terminology and instructional methods would dissolve, because now we would all know how it is supposed to be done — we've learned it the RIGHT way...we're certified.

The most striking argument in favor of standardization and certification comes from the Western Square Dance Community. They pulled it off. You can square dance anywhere in the world to standardized calls at standardized levels. CallerLab dictates standards, and determines what is necessary to be a certified caller. It really has worked for them, and the dance form they have developed has experienced a great deal of success.

But...let's back up for a moment to the fledgling days of CallerLab and Western Style Square Dancing, when a dance form that could be universally understood was just a gleam in Henry Ford's eye.

Western Style square dancing evolved from the many different squares and circle figures danced throughout Appalachia, plus innovative new figures and movements developed by creative thinkers. The process of elimination and addition was not an easy one. Entire square dance forms were abandoned and styles forfeited to create a new, and *standardized* dance form — the Western Style Square Dance.

Egos were crumbled and infinite compromises reached to develop the form. Many of the traditionalists scoffed and pulled away — dooming the new form to failure. Some defiantly continued to call their dances as they always have. If you come to the mountains of West Virginia, a square dance is still more likely to mean old time mountain squares and big circles, than a Western Square Dance.

My point here is that even though Western Square Dancing has achieved success, and made standardization and certification possible, they had to develop a NEW dance form to do it.

It makes you wonder — is this possible with clogging? What styles will be forfeited to achieve a dance form that new

teachers - eager to be certified - will never know?

Ira Bernstein, in his book Appalachian Clogging and Flat-footing Steps points to the difficulty of giving a definitive definition of clogging and flatfooting, referring to the slight styling differences in execution as more defining than the steps themselves. The style of clogging taught at workshops today includes tremendous influences from the tap, jazz and step dance forms. What parts do we keep? What do we say doesn't belong.

These are all important questions to consider in shaping a program that offers *certification* to instructors.

Who makes these decisions, so that we can all agree and get certified. Please help me with this, so we can get started. Who among us holds the absolute authority to determine what a clogging instructor is supposed to teach, and how. Who will teach the seminars that I keep hearing about, and who will sit in judgement of applicants? What checklists will be used — what criteria?

So far, the T.A.P. (Teacher Assistance Program) has shunned the idea of certification, promoting rather a unique sharing and networking of ideas and techniques to help cloggers group and learn as instructors.

I truly believe that even though there are inconsistencies in terminology, cue sheets and dance styles, we've all done a pretty darned good job of promoting and teaching clogging nationwide, while still maintaining a regional flavor.

Every effort I've seen to standardize an aspect of clogging has alienated certain cloggers. Can line dance cloggers and freestyle cloggers agree? Is there still a place for freestyle and hoedown in a standardized, certified, all-cued clogging world?

Ed Durlacher, a renowned square dance caller and educator during the first half of the century, said about the unstandardized, uncertifiable form of square dancing... "When in Rome, do as the Romans do is about the only way to describe the way square dancing should be done when visiting other sections of the country." "If variety is the spice of life, then the many variations of figures used in squares is the reason why square dancing was, is, and always will ever be popular." [from Honor Your Partner, Devin-Adair Publishers, 2nd revision 1948]

How relevant those words are to the dance we enjoy. Standardization is to many the single most important issue in clogging today.

Please make your feelings known and send us your feedback. Answer the question — is certification possible?

The clogging world awaits our answers.



Jebadiya and his new clogs picked up the steps quickly.



took out the last bully.



DANCING TIPS: All the ladies, inactive as well as active, move toward their partners and then return to place. Then each gent moves across the set, joins both hands with his partner, brings her back to his place and retains the hand hold for the following Sashay. During the Sashay figure each active couple and the inactive couple which started just below it, must maneuver so that they end in a line four across the set with the two ladies back to back. The Sashay down, Sashay up and on the sides of the set, facing in, with the ladies on the right of their partners. The Ladies Chain returns the ladies to their own line, opposite their partners.

COMMENTS: This is an easy dance and ideal for beginners. Even so, the dancers will sometimes be unsure which is the correct opposite couple for the Ladies Chain in B2. The caller should emphasize the need for the active gents take a good look at the couple immediately below when the Sashay begins in A2 and for the inactive gents to the same with the active couple immediately above. Then the gents can ensure that the proper couples end the Sashay in line and that these two ladies dance the Ladies Chain in B2. This is the gents' responsibility because the ladies are facing out of the set and cannot see the other couple as easily as the gents can.

a. Lady to the right and gent to the left and three hands around.

b. On to the next and four hands around.

c. Lady to the right and gent to the left and three hands around.

d. Swing in the center and right on home.

CHORUS:

a. Allemande left, grand change around (right and left grand).

b. Meet your partner and promenade home.

Note: Each couple is active in turn, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th.

DESCRIPTION:

- a. The 1st lady moves to the #2 couple, while the 1st gent moves to the #4 couple. The two sets of three dancers on each side of the square circle left until the
- b. The #1 couple meets in the center of the set, join inside hands, the gent's right with his partner's left, and lead on to the #3 couple where they circle four.
- c. The #1 lady now moves over to the #4 couple and the #1 gent to the #2 couple and repeat as in (a).
- d. The #1 couple meets in the center of the set and swings until the call: "On Home," at which time they move into their original position.

FIGURE 2

CALLS:

- a. Top or leading couples (#1 & #3 or #2 & #4), right and left thru on the right (that's over and back).
- b. Top ladies chain on the right (that's over and back).
- c. Half right and left thru (one right & left thru), promenade.

- a. Allemande Left, grand change (right and left grand), half-way around.
- b. Meet your partner and promenade home.
- c. Repeat figure with top couples moving to the left.
- d. For the calls: (a) top or leading couple, right & left thru to the right, coming back to the left, etc.

DESCRIPTION:

- a. Head couples execute a regular right & left thru with the couples on their respective right sides.
- b. The same couples perform a ladies chain with this variation: When the lady advanced toward her opposite gent, extending her left hand to him, he takes her left hand in his left hand, places his right on the left arm of the lady at her elbow, and helps her around in a turn. Her partner does the same when she returns to her place.

- a. Head couple out to the right and circle four.
- b. On to the next and circle, Then two ladies chain (that's over and back).







The seniors will be doing clog demos and coming up in March, will be at the Beacon Hill Lodge, Optimist Club on Upres Street and the Trade Center.







National Clogging Convention

NOVEMBER 24-27, 1993 OPRYLAND HOTEL, NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE, USA

My husband and I decided to go to the National Clogging Convention. It was our first time and we were looking forward to it. We had heard a lot about the National Clogging Convention and the Opryland Hotel, but we just couldn't believe it.

How were we supposed to find our way in this huge hotel to the halls without getting lost? At the reception we got a map of the hotel and explanations where to go to. After 10-15 minutes we finally arrived at our destination which wasn't easy to find. There were little "traffic jams" all over because everybody took pictures of the gorgeous Christmas decoration.

After registering, we received the syllabus of 179 pages. We spent the night to figure out which workshops to attend the next day. It wasn't easy to decide because we had a big choice. They offered Basic to Advanced, clog CUE, Oldies and Country & Western and Couple dances. The program started at 9 a.m. and ended at 5 p.m. You could learn a song every hour. For us, this was a completely new experience, we don't have this speed of teaching. So we had to keep our eyes and ears open because everything went very fast. You could almost say that every hour there was a "migration" from one hall to the other. There was no time to get off your shoes, you just put them on in the morning and kicked them off in the evening.

In general we went to the basic and intermediate workshops. One time we made the big mistake to go to the advanced hall. There we realized, we don't clog we just do a little warm up.

A big problem in the beginning was that voice and music were hard to understand, but we got used to it. We appreciated a lot some organisational aspects. Each hall had water fountains which we don't have in Germany. In each hall, there was one responsible for the music who had a walkie-talkie and when the music in the next hall got too loud, the person in charge was informed and you were able to hear your own music again.

On Friday and Saturday a big event was prepared in all the halls. We were taught a routine to Rocky Top. We danced it over and over. On Saturday afternoon we finally started. There were signs for each State and Country. After going to our sign we learned that 18 Germans had come to the Convention. When everybody was ready we marched right through the hotel to the parking lot. Every State and every Country was welcomed. We wanted to set a record in the Guiness Book. What happened then cannot be described. Imagine, 5,000 cloggers clogging Rocky Top. I will never forget this. The atmosphere was great, even if we didn't beat the record but I'm sure everybody enjoyed it.

Another highlight were the exhibitions on Saturday night where the different groups showed what they could do. After the performance of "Ultimate Dance Force" we were totally thrilled, the best in clogging you get in the US right now.

When we were sitting on Sunday in the plane flying back to Germany we were both sure: attending the Clogging Convention was worth it. It was very impressive, we had lots of fun and we have learned a lot. Maybe one day, we'll have a clogging convention in Germany, too.

SOCIAL DANCING

Jazz up your fitness routine with a regular dose of dance.

Evelyn resolved that in 1994 she'd exercise regularly. But it's only the beginning of the new year and she's already bored with her new stationary bike. The rowing machine and treadmill at the YWCA also hold little appeal.

When a friend coaxed her to go along for an evening of free dance lessons, she realized exercise doesn't have to be a chore.

It's true. Whether you're swirling across the floor to a Strauss waltz or doing do-si-dos to the commands of a square dance caller, you're getting exercise — and probably having fun too.

Dancing pairs you up with more than a partner.

From burning calories to socializing with friends, dancing offers these health benefits:

■ Calories — Dancing can burn as many calories as walking, swimming or riding a bicycle. During a half hour of sustained dancing you can burn between 200 and 400 calories.

One factor that determines how many calories you'll expand is distance. In one study, researchers attached pedometers to square dancers and found each person covered nearly five miles in a single evening.

■ Cardiovascular conditioning — Regular exercise can lead to a slower heart rate, lower blood pressure and an improved cholesterol profile.

Experts typically recommend 30 to 40 minutes of continuous activity three to four times a week. Dancing may not provide all the conditioning you need, but it can help. The degree of cardiovascular conditioning depends on how vigorously you dance, how long you dance continuously and how regularly you do it

- Strong bones The side to side movements of many dances strengthen your weight bearing bones (tibia, fibula and femur) and can help prevent or slow loss of bone mass (osteoporosis).
- Rehabilitation If you're recovering from heart or knee surgery, movement may be part of your rehabilitation. Dancing is a positive alternative to aerobic dance or jogging.
- Sociability Dancing contains a social component that solitary fitness endeavors don't. It gives you an opportunity to develop strong social ties which contribute to self-esteem and a positive outlook.

Would you like to dance?

Tomorrow night when you consider settling down for a little television, turn on the music instead. After a few spins around the living room, you'll have so much fun you may forget you're exercising.



Saturday night was filled with costumes, masks, confetti, streamers, laughter, fun, and sparkling smiles.


Sunday morning I was still more sore and tired, but filled with enthusiasm. It was back to the halls for more workshops and dancing.

It is the people that make the workshops fun, and it was the people of "Southern Spectacular Celebrates Mardi Gras" that made it truly SPECTACULAR.




