Euroclog '95

Clogging in the Czech Republic is very popular, as well as country music, bluegrass and country dancing. (No couple dancing, but old time square dance, which the dancers teach and dance with all the spectators). During the last five years, about 50 square dance clubs came into being and the same "fate" is waiting for clogging. Magazine "CVAK," which Caramella started to publish last year after the stay in USA, has got 50 subscribers — dance groups, including Slovakia. Until now, we had three isues published and one special issue for Euroclog.

Issues included, for example, an article from *Double Toe Times* about Bascomb Lamar Lunsford and Bailey Mountain Cloggers, terminology and reading cuesheets, movements (in continuation) for mountain dancing (Big circles, Kentucky running set, etc.), news from us, schedule of events, addresses, and advertising part.

Rocky Mountain Dance Round-Up

Safe Harbor for the Dances of our Past By Nancy A. Biehler

There's a special congregation that takes place every summer around the 4th of July in the Black Forest of central Colorado. Members of the Lloyd Shaw Foundation gather for their annual meeting and dance camp. Not only is it a delightful respite from the rest of the world, where old and new friends can share their love of America's folk dances, but it is an extraordinary time for catching up with the past. Not unlike Berea's Christmas Country Dance School or the Kentucky Dance Foundation's winter in the Woods, RMDR offers a westernized schedule of daily classes that include Contra, Round, Quadrille, Country/Western Dance, Clogging, Traditional and Modern Squares, as well as English, Scottish and Mexican Dances. The camp program differs from year to year, dependent upon the leaders present. This year was particularly unique, because of the presence of 17 Europeans representing the international LSF contingent from Belgium and Germany.

I participate each summer to advance my collection of traditional square dance figures, the figures Lloyd Shaw set out to preserve when he wrote Cowboy Dances in 1939. Shaw's western "trail in" to square dancing is as captivating a story as Bascom Lunsford's legendary efforts in the Appalachian region. In the 1920s, when Bascom was just discovering his avocation as an amateur folk collector. Lloyd Shaw was superintendent of the Chevenne Mountain School District in Colorado Springs. As a life-time educator, he was concerned about the physical welfare of his students, and the overall impact of competitive sports. In his perspective, ball professionals who spotted for new talent at the football and basketball games tended to confuse a player's sense of values. Shaw searched for the right venue to build self-esteem, teach manners and proper male/female behaviors, and still provide a meaningful activity to his students.

While Lunsford wanted to create a pride in heritage among 20th-century Appalachians, Shaw sought a means by which his students would be better socialized for life in the modern world. In 1922, he invited Elizabeth Burchenal to teach her folk dance program at the Cheyenne School. In addition to international folk dances, she also presented the quadrilles and contras of New England. Shaw was impressed with the idea of folk dance as a form of play and offered weekly folk dances in the school gym. Early film footage of his students illustrates the dance program he established, beginning with bunny dances and play-party games at the kindergarten level and evolving to more advanced styles of dance as the children matured. Students often practiced at lunch hour and after school. They grew up dancing and did not think things should be any different. One former student recalled a newspaper report that said the Cheyenne School basketball team was good because they danced, and it made them well-coordinated.

Dear Bobbie,






s'Hertogenbosch. There was live music played by the band "Virginia Reel." The group that set this up was the South Hill Country Dancers. Again, a group of line dancers.


Another great feature of the downtown park is that you are within walking distance of all motels, restaurants, and shopping. The main entrance of the festival is a block away from the heart of the city.

A few days ago, EUROCLOG '95 finished — the biggest clogging festival in Europe, organized by Caramella, in cooperation with Stevens Worldwide Inc. There were cloggers from the USA, Denmark, Switzerland, Germany, Holland, Slovakia and the Czech Republic (47 groups from 7 countries).

There were 45 cloggers from Germany at Euroclog '95, about 60 from Slovakia, 150 from the Czech Republic and 40

members from Caramella. From USA only a few brave people, who "tried" Euroclog, and I hope it was a positive for them as well. At Euroclog '96 we will have a chance to welcome all dance groups from the USA. Who was there from the USA? Two Bay State Cloggers, two Hillbilly Cloggers (San Francisco), two Mile High Cloggers (Colorado), two Fancy Feet from Florida. But, the most important was Steve Smith from Kentucky and Jay Dumcum from Kansas. They were a great team, together with Donald Thompkins from Florida and four instructors from Europe: Monika Zoeller, Daniela Schell, Elli Kern from Germany, and Jarka Vasakova

from the Czech Republic. At the workshop we had levels Basic, Intermediate and Advanced and two hours of Hoedown. Jay was teaching the basics of Canadian tap dance, and the hall was absolutely full!

There were about 300 spectators at the Country Ball on Friday night, and everybody danced with live music, very popular square dance and country mixers. All the instructors danced freestyle with live music, too. Spectators were watching 13 clogging shows, and duet-to cajun music played by "Naley Band."

Saturday night dancers danced on the stage, there were about 700 spectators, 3 live bands played in between 30 clogging shows mainly Czech and Slovak groups. The festival was not competitive. The top job of the evening was "a cappella" with Steve Smith and Jay Dumcum.


It was very nice to watch Steve Smith during our few days and nights, getting to know everybody. There are strong friendships between all dancers and on top of everything — [Sunday night] we had dinner together and gave Steve and Jay presents. Everybody cried and laughed and it was very emotional. We are again and again listening to the tape which Steve Smith recorded together with Katerina's translating on Sunday night. It was great!



On May 13, 1995, the Celery City Cloggers hosted their 4th Annual Spring Fling. We had 102 dancers and spectators who converged at the Kalamazoo Fairgrounds for a successful day. Instruction was provided by the instructor of the Celery City Cloggers, Debbie Snell, plus Kevin Butler, Shane Gruber, Sharon Chambers, Barbara Barrett and Dana Willard. Their creative choreography and enthusiastic teaching made for a fun day.

The format of how we run our workshop is quite different than most and we would like to share this idea with you.

Question: As a participant at a workshop with more than one room, have you ever said, "I can't decide what room to go to. I don't know the challenge level and I don't recognize the song titles."

A frequently asked question and a common dilemma at workshops. The following is what we do to help the participant choose a room with knowledge.

Before each teaching block, all dancers meet in the large room. Each prospective instructor will showcase about ½ of their routine with the music playing, so you can place yourself accordingly in the room that matches your clogging experience. This also gives you a chance to listen to the music and choose according to your music likes and dislikes. Then we split into our two rooms for 45 minutes of teaching. Then, immediately while the routine is fresh

on our minds, we all meet in the large room again. To share in the excitement, each group shows the other room what they learned with cues.

Let's face it, we all like to show off a little, and it gives all dancers a feel of all routines taught during the workshop.

Dancers really like this format and come back each year expecting the same format of showcasing and sharing of routines throughout the day. Try it

at your workshop and see what you think.

We also ask all to bring finger food and my club members bring the sandwiches and solid food to round out a food buffet fit for kings. In order not to ruin the flow of dancing, we have a running break for eating. Then, in the middle of the day we have an hour of demos, requests and snacking.

Many workshops have their demos at the end of the day when people are too tired to dance and anxious to get home. By having this in the middle of the day it gives the dancers a break but yet the excitement and dancing continues.

Mr/Ms/Kid Stomper Shoes • Steven's Buck Taps Sam's Petticoats & Pettipants Danskin Dance Tights, Shimmery Tights & Dance Trunks Shaw believed so strongly in his program that he created an exhibition team, the Cheyenne Mountain Dancers, and in 1924 took his students on tour to demonstrate the folk dances at colleges and high schools throughout the western United States. The concept that folk dance provided social training for school children was emphasized further by Henry Ford, who published a text of American folk dances a few years later. He promoted the notion that dancing taught "pupils to stand upon their own feet, to think for themselves, not to be easily swayed or led by others, but to lead themselves." He felt that group dancing helped young people develop self-confidence and poise, which made them good decision-makers in their adult lives. All of these behaviors fostered conscientious citizenship and nurtured a democratic society. This line of thought coincided with Shaw's own philosophy of education.

The turning point in Shaw's dance activities came in 1934, when he first observed a square dance competition in nearby Central City. In addition to the fun the dancers were having, Shaw recognized an opportunity to promote a "nearly lost American folk dance." It became important as a student activity, as it represented a cultural inheritance unique to this country. Though Henry Ford's text presented quadrilles, lancers, squares and contras, one researcher pointed out that he employed square dances as a formal, high society activity. Shaw was interested in its value to the school system. He brought square dance callers to instruct his students. He studied the works of old dancing masters to better understand the heritage and style of the dances. His personal library includes numerous "how to" dance books, for waltzes, polkas and reels. He incorporated all of these dances into his school program. As he expanded his repertoire of square dance calls, he searched for more of the old figures. Books in print contained varieties of the eastern quadrilles, but did not reflect the livelier calls of the western dance. He found traces of old dances and calls, but sensed that, at least in the West. the square dance was a dying tradition.

As enthusiasm for square dancing increased, Shaw determined to write a history that would document the survival of square dance figures in the western United States. He felt that they were a living record of life in the Old West. His text, *Cowboy Dances*, was published in 1939. In it, he offered not only a history of the square dance, but also basic instruciton and calls for over seventy-five figures with which he was familiar. Since its first printing, *Cowboy Dances* prevails as the recognized authority on early western square dance.

Like Bascom Lunsford, Shaw conducted lectures and training programs at schools and colleges across the country. Lunsford, however, used performances to exhibit mountain culture as an oral tradition. Shaw achieved success by writing a text that provided public access to square dance. Indeed, the demand for information was so great that he offered master classes during the summers from 1940 to 1958. He trained educators in every facet of American folk dance, from simple couple dances and reels to square dance calling. As the popularity of square dancing grew, callers from other parts of the country joined the effort and, by 1950, callers' colleges appeared in several locations nationwide. However, during its first decade, Shaw's summer school set the standard. From a geographical perspective alone, it is possible to understand his impact on the folk tradition in modern America. In the first seven years of his callers' college, more than four hundred participants, primarily school teachers from thirty-six states, completed the

program. The nationwide tours, the book publications, and the square dance clinics all contributed to Shaw's "wide influence" in the revival of square dance.

He routinely kept a spiral notebook of "field notes" in which he recorded figures he observed at dances. He noted the name of the caller who directed each figure, and indicated any variation in the pattern of the dance. Shaw's granddaughter, Enid Cocke, claimed that he fully understood the difference between the quadrilles of the northeastern United States and the circle and square sets of the Appalachian region. In the quadrilles, action takes place across the square, with figures performed by either 1 & 3 couples or 2 & 4 couples. In the Appalachian square, action progresses around the square, with one couple visiting the other couples, followed by each succeeding couple performing the visitations. The presentation of Cowboy Dances performed by the Cheyenne Mountain Dancers included a Kentucky Running Set and Sicillian Circle dance. Among his personal books is a copy of Cecil Sharp's Country Dance Book, Part V. In the margins, Shaw made notes about the change in particular figures between East and West. For instance, he remarked about the western use of the do-si-do after each visiting figure; whereas, in the Appalachian format, a corner and partner swing generally follows visiting figures. He commented on the simplicity of the figures in the eastern dance. In the last decade of his life, Shaw expressed concern that a growing number of callers, who implemented new figures to challenge dancers, destroyed the basic beauty and joy of the simple dance. His initial goal of reviving America's square dance as a socializing mechanism for his Cheyenne Mountain students spawned an empire of square dancers the world over. In face, of approximately 150 Appalachian figures that remained, Shaw documented some 75 surviving calls in the western square dance. By 1970, a Square Dance Encyclopedia listed 2,173 different figures, including variations of the same name.

Lloyd Shaw retired from the Cheyenne Mountain School District in 1951. That year, dancing was eliminated from the school program. However, Shaw's contribution during his 35-year career reached beyond the dance movement he initiated as an education experiment. Alumni of Shaw's various square dance programs already coordinated annual state festivals. During the post-war years, both national and local government agencies considered group recreation programs a positive influence in the community. The old institutions of folk fun offered Americans a chance to be free in ways that were "good for everybody"; they made people "friendlier," more cooperative, and enabled them to become "better acquainted with one another." Square dancing experienced phenomenal growth over the next two decades. One researcher estimated that by the mid-1970s, over six million enthusiasts worldwide participated in the activity.

Lloyd Shaw died on July 18, 1958. Though Lunsford outlived him by fifteen years, the momentum of Shaw's square dance revival is sustained in hundreds of square dance clubs around the world. The summer workshops he began in 1940 continued informally after his death under the direction of his wife, Dorothy. She extended her husband's work by organizing his network of callers, dance leaders and old friends into The Lloyd Shaw Foundation. Today the Foundation carries on the work of both Dr. and Mrs. Shaw, primarily as an educational unit dedicated to preserving American folk dance.



Lest We Forget

October is autumn in the mountains. The hills and valleys are aflame with a palisade of reds, yellows and browns. Across the Nantahalas to the Smokies, from the Balsams to the Blue Ridge Mountains, October is a time of sounds, color and scents. The sounds come from the dancers who have gathered at Stompin' Ground for the Annual Dance-Off. They come from all walks of life and from all across this great nation. They have journeyed far to compete in the Annual Hall of Fame Clogging Competition.

For it's October in western North Carolina Highlands and God has set every tree and bush afire with His mighty paint brush. October is fodder pullin, molasses makin, sausage grinding time. It is a time when the mountain folks read the signs of nature and walk among God's creations and give thanks to the Almighty for their blessings.

For October has again come to the valley, and folks have gathered for a weekend of pure Southern Appalachian clogging. A year's preparation has honed the dancers into championship form that will enable them to compete against the best of the best.

Tis October in the mountains and off in the distance squirrels are seen scurrying about, gathering acorns for a long winter, while the grouse are eating in the fields that are covered with tattered gold. It's time for pumpkin pies, apple butter and an early morning fire. It's corn shuckin, quilt making time, hot sassafras tea, jellow jacket soup and country hams being cured in the smoke house.

Til October in the valley and as in the past, the crystal clear sound of the five string banjo, the down beat of the up-right bass and the crying of the fiddle can be heard. Stompin'

To understand what kinds of dances I'm talking about, you have to grasp the time frame of development in the dance figures. In America, there was first the Appalachian square dance, a survival of English and Scots-Irish heritage peculiar to the northern borders of England. During the westward expansion, the Appalachian square dance evolved in true folk fashion, with imprints of the cultural and environmental experiences of life in the west. So that by the end of the 19th century, there were at least two distinct forms of square dance, those forms still being danced in Appalachia, and the newer western style. And in between the two, lay varying degrees of the original Appalachian square dance, i.e., those forms adapted in the Ohio Valley, the Ozarks, and West Texas. While Bascom collected the figures he observed in the Appalachians, Shaw was recording the figures he observed in the west. Then about mid-20th century, as a new sense of nationalism swept the country after World War II, Americans became movitated by patriotism, and family values and pursued entertainment that seemed to restore the traditional ways of the past. Shaw's widely-publicized book, Cowboy Dances, set the standard for old-time square dancing, and before long, millions of people were learning to dance. Unfortunately, across the continent, there were differing interpretations of calls and figures, and it was quickly becoming difficult for folks who danced in one city to travel 70 miles north and expect to dance the same figures. So the callers got together

For, once again, October is autumn in the Carolina Highlands and Southern Appalachian clogging is alive and well. God has allowed us to enjoy a heritage handed down over several generations, and the dancers answer the Almighty with their dancing feet, "Thank You God, all is well."

and formed an organization called Callerlab in 1970 to standardize the calls and teaching levels, and make it easier for greater numbers of people to square dance in any city they traveled to around the world. The result became the most popular form of square dance known today. It is now the national folk dance, and callers the world over continue to invent new calls and patterns to entertain the dancers, because there are now guidelines to teach the same figures in Seattle that are being taught in New York City and Paris, France! Does this scenario sound familiar? A similar pattern occurred in clog dancing, as Appalachians brought their fancy footwork out of the mountains in the early 1970s and suddenly thousands of people wanted to learn to clog. And, not unlike what happened in square dancing, cloggers, too, have added precision and standardization, which have made it easier for more people to learn, but have ultimately changed the original dance form.

Fortunately for us, there are organizations like the Lloyd Shaw Foundation and the National Clogging & Hoedown Council, which carry the preservation responsibility for Appalachian square dance and western square dance tradition, and they have been able to survive in small pockets across the country, in the shadow of the modern square dance.
