

Not planning for their visit, I really felt I hadn't enough food to feed eight young, healthy and hungry dancers, but I know they enjoyed their showers and sleep in this cool Colorado night air.

Augusta Heritage Center, Davis & Elkins College **AUGUSTA 1995 SUMMER SESSION A SUCCESS**

Participants from 46 states and 16 foreign countries came to Elkins, West Virginia, this summer to participate in the 1995 Augusta Heritage Arts Summer Workshops on the campus of Davis & Elkins College. Over the past twenty-three years Augusta has grown into the largest program of its kind in the country offering over 200 workshops and mini-classes in traditional music, dance, crafts, and folklore. The 1995 summer session, which ran from July 9 to August 11, was seen as a highlight in many ways.

During the 1995 summer program, an estimated 2700 students, instructors, musicians, and staff took part in Augusta workshop activities. craft fair, and family activities which concluded the session.

Since Augusta was founded in 1972, Elkins, Randolph County, and the state of West Virginia have become a focal point for people interested in learning about the traditional arts. In addition to students, staff and tourists, Augusta attracted journalists, film crews, and photographers from around the world to the Davis & Elkins College Campus this summer. Among them were a film crew from Hungary and Transylvania, two journalists from Germany, and a variety of other reporters and free-lance journalists.

Perhaps the most visible impact which Augusta has on the cultural life of Randolph County is the weekly "Pickin' In The Park" series in Elkins City Park, cosponsored by the Elkins Parks and Recreation Department. This free evening of bluegrass and old-time music attracts hundreds of participants and spectators to City Park each Wednesday evening during the summer for impromptu jam sessions, and to the Hermanson Campus Center during the winter months.

The 1996 Augusta catalog is expected to be released in February, and will contain complete program and registration information.



Of course, everything wasn't smooth sailing by any




In the September 1995 issue, we took two couples holding hands and facing each other and called the formation a HOEDOWN SQUARE. In some locations, the formation is traditionally called a "small circle set". Some might refer to the same formation as a "two couple ring". Regardless of what we are going to call it, plan to call it whatever it's being called by whomever, wherever you happen to be at the time. There is traditional clogging ambiguity as there is line clogging ambiguity. As line dancers, some folks could stand nose-to-nose and never see eye-to-eye on whether to call DS-BU-DS-R(b)-S(f) a "Sally" or a "Rocking Chair." Personally, I'd rather dance than quibble.

So for the purposes of this series, the formation consisting of two couples holding hands and facing each other is dubbed a HOEDOWN SQUARE. In Exhibits A-D, the hoedown square at 12 o'clock is referred to as the ANCHOR SQUARE. The formations as drawn do not represent acceptable staging. They are drawn so we can find the ANCHOR SQUARE in every exhibit without having to hunt for it.

then we must be able to visualize the changes in ring formations as the number of couples or hoedown squares get smaller. It is the smaller "rings" with which we will most like be dealing. The geometry does change and we need to school ourselves to deal with it.

For most groups, a group of 4 hoedown squares represents a really good session. If 3 squares show up, hallelujah. If two squares make the floor, we're still in business. One square is still a "go" project. With 3 couples (1 square with one couple out and waiting to cycle in), we can still practice BIG RING PROGRESSION.

For easy reference, Exhibits A-D have been reprinted. Let's assume that you are setting up your couples to promenade onto an exhibition floor in handhold position (ref.: page 2). OC1 (Otis & Olivia) is your first couple out and will lead your other couples into a counter clockwise STAR PROMENADE FORMATION. Otis & Olivia will do this because they have been coached to do this. They are one of your ANCHOR



When you get brave enough to call your first hoedown routine, it is an effective drill pattern for you and your dancers, especially if you are calling and dancing at the same time, to regularly anchor your first and last couples at 12 o'clock until you and your dancers get a feel for the motion and changes of position. You can tell them you are setting up this way for their benefit. They'll buy it.

In the September '95 issue, we also began to take a close look at what happens to BIG RING FORMATIONS made up of hoedown squares, as the number of hoedown squares becomes five or fewer.

The assumption here is that the people who have been reading this series of articles are basically line dance cloggers who are seeking insight into how to educate themselves to teach and call traditional clogging formations. If this is the case,

Most of us have some understanding of the odd-couple/even-couple dance structures. And if you have been keeping up with this series on a regular basis, you know that we have designated a named even couple as Eddy & Edwina.

Eddy & Edwina have a unique even couple position in this article. They are not just any even couple somewhere in the ring. They are, regardless of the number of couples in our ring formation or its acquired shape, always the last couple (CABOOSE) to come on stage.

They are the other ANCHOR COUPLE. Knowing where this couple is in your on-stage formations can get you out of



Red River Sojourn

To quote some anonymous someone, "we've been there, done that." After a year of fund raising, practicing, learning, and developing new costumes, our goal of a trip to the mountains of New Mexico finally came to fruition. In July "The River City Cloggers" and "Toe Tappin' Time" of Tahlequah, Oklahoma packed up costumes, shoes, and high hopes, and headed for Red River, New Mexico where they were to help the town high up in the mountains celebrate its 100th birthday.

The teams, under the direction of Keith and Betty Stretch of Wagoner, Oklahoma, arrived at their destination on the second of July, leaving behind them the typical heat of an Oklahoma summer. To their joy, the temperatures were much cooler — but also the atmosphere was much thinner. Red River sits nestled between mountains that reach heights of 11,000 feet and the town itself has an elevation of 8750 feet, so there was a lot of huffing and puffing at first practices..."give me more oxygen".

The first official performance occurred on Monday evening at the Community House where everyone participated in a talent show attended by townspeople and travelers from all over the U.S. and even some from Russia. The Community House sits in the middle of town and is a rustic looking log structure with wonderful wood floors to dance on. The windows were open to let in the cool mountain air and as the music drifted out, more and more people drifted in. To the delight of the clogging teams, we discovered some hidden talents of part of the group. Joe Claver, who along with his daughter, dances with the group, wowed us with his singing rendition of "As Time Goes By." And the youngest daughter of one of our team members, Stephanie Epp (5 years old) had the audience in the palm of her hand as she sang. Of course, Keith and Betty had to do their infamous version of the "Hee Haw" classic — "Where Oh Where Are You Tonight?".

The next day was the 4th of July parade and as we lined up (77th out of 120 entries) we were all wondering when the temperature was going to reach the 70° mark that Betty had told us about. The sun was out but the wind was blowing, and as we stood there with our shorts, T-shirt, and red-white-and-blue collars on, we were wondering where we could buy some gloves. But finally the parade began and as we marched along, we began to warm up a little. As people discovered who we were, we had trouble going ½ block before being asked to dance. So all along the way we stopped and danced a cappella. Then, in front of Texas Red's Steak House where the judges' stand was, we stopped long enough to perform a whole number.

After grabbing a bite of lunch, we made our way through the throngs of people and headed back to the Community House, where the annual games were to begin. The first order of business was all kinds of sack races, followed by the egg toss. At least during the sack races, a person could warm up a little, but those egg tosses can be a mess. Eggs were flying everywhere — are eggs supposed to be good for your hair? (Oh yes — during the games the winners in the parade were announced. Guess what? We were beaten out in our division by some Clydesdale horses! And they couldn't even dance.).


During the following days, dancers and their families made side trips to Taos and Sante Fee, took the ski lift to the top of the mountain, visited the Rio Grande Gorge, and just walked the mile-long strip of Red River meeting other kids. Each evening we performed to crowds of 200–300 in the Community House and as word got around, the crowds increased. The Community House has square dancing from May through September as part of its activity. During the day there

are workshops on square dancing, line dancing, and when instructors are available there are workshops on clogging and round dancing. So during the day, Betty taught beginner and intermediate clogging and on the last evening of their stay, the two groups of students performed routines they had been taught during the week.

Keith is a square dance caller, so he was kept busy with his portion of the program.

At the end of the week no one was ready to return to Oklahoma and leave the beautiful mountains — but we did. However everyone asked us to come back next year. I'll tell you one thing, when we go back we're gonna figure out a way to beat those horses!

a lot of exhibition kaflooey jams. When you are controlling the floor, whether in the practice hall or on the exhibition stage, you will refer to them and their whereabouts a lot.

The politic dancing position for a novice caller who is dancing and calling at the same time is last couple, lead dancer (Eddy's position). From this position you can monitor everybody.

Otis & Edwina will end up directly behind Eddy & Edwina when the STAR PROMENADE formation is fully formed and rotating counter clockwise in center stage.

Now you can bark the 4-count call: "Make a big ring and circle to the left."

The simplest way to make a ring from a STAR PROMENADE formation is for the couples to back into it. To fancy it up a bit, the lead dancers will engineer their tags into an inside roll or flip (Double Toes Times, September 1994) while backing into their own ring positions.

Your ring should now be actively circling to the left (clockwise). If you have been following the movements and changes of positions of the Otis-Olivia and Eddy-Edwina couples in your mind's eye, the traveling order of the four individual dancers in your ring is Otis, Olivia, Eddy, and last but not least Edwina.

Now you can bark the 4-count call: "Odds to the right and circle up four." Otis will break handhold with the dancer to his left, travel to his right taking Olivia with him, and latch up his now vacant left hand with Edwina's right hand. This change of formation is accomplished on the move.

One formation should flow into the next. The flow of the formation does not stop until the Otis/Olivia & Eddy/Edwina HOEDOWN SQUARE has achieved its home spot in the designated big-ring position. For our drill session, this position will be always be at 12 o'clock regardless of ring shape.

Eddy's (EVEN LEAD's) job will be to take charge of correctly placing the hoedown square in the ring regardless of its circle shape, square shape, triangle shape, or 2 by 4 shape. That's his job.

But your job as BARKER is to deliver the "Odds to the right and circle up four" call in advance of the ring positions to be danced by the ANCHOR HOEDOWN SQUARE. You will want those newly formed hoedown squares (small circle sets) to keep on clogging clockwise, roll themselves forward into a correct stage position and square themselves up to anticipate your next call which will be your first figure formation. A late call on your part can result in your hoedown squares having to inelegantly futz around and back up into position.

A well timed call on your part and Eddy can take charge of placing his square. As he is coming into his correct home spot he can see every other couple in that ring. Every EVEN LEAD in your group should be schooled to accept the responsibility of that positioning. They have the visibility. Odd couples are looking to the outside of the ring. They can't see a thing.

Edwinas should be schooled on the "Odds to the right and circle up four" call to change their right hand position from open ring position to closed square position, that is, they move their right hand to the front of their bodies. There is nothing more frustrating to Otises bravely attempting to make neat and elegant latch ups with their corner Edwinas than to be snatching and grabbing for a latch up with an Edwina who is still carrying her arm as if she were still in a big ring formation, or what's worse, has dropped her hand to thigh level. There is a great clue in this paragraph for our competition greedy colleagues who still ask the question: "How come we get

docked points for a late latch up?"

If you have schooled yourself and your dancers to the wall-clock concept, your anchor couples should have very little problem squaring up their hoedown square at 12 o'clock. The rest of your couples are now distributed evenly around the remainder of the ring.

OK. You are in drill session.


And here is the brain teaser of the month. Assuming that you have planned to place your HOEDOWN ANCHOR SQUARE at 12 o'clock, and you want your four anchor dancers (Otis & Olivia, Eddy & Edwina) to latch up their hoedown square and roll that small circle set into 12 o'clock position, at what "o'clock" will you deliver the call, "Odds to the right and circle up four"?

Certainly not at 12 o'clock. That would be too late. So at what o'clock?

All of these ring formation logistics will need to be adjusted to meet staging requirement at exhibitions. You can always adjust the location of the 12 o'clock mark when you start to work on staging. After you get some confidence going, you won't think about it much.

But you get on that stage and some of your dancers go astray, the ability to nail a 12 o'clock position somewhere on an exhibition hall wall is a pocket skill, that is, one worth having in your pocket when you need it.

Time to pair'um up, line'um up, crank up the tape player, parade'um out, close up the star, open up the ring, nail your ANCHOR HOEDOWN SQUARE at 12 o'clock, and call the HOEDOWN FIGURE of your choice. YEE HAW!!







Lynne Ogle and ten of her team members from Silver Dance Express were the attraction of the cruise. We boarded the ship thinking we would just "bump" into them — how big can a ship be, right? Wrong — the ship held over 2,000 passengers as well as over 900 crew members, on the "Funship" called "FANTASY."


Our cabin — really about the size of my walk-in closet at home — did have a window and we loved the view! Just before time to take off the Captain announced that everyone had to take part in an emergency drill, go to our cabins, put on our life jackets and report to our "muster stations."

After the drill we went to the top of the ship to await the tugboats which would pull us out to sea. The beauty of the ocean in front of us was breathtaking. We waited for about 15 minutes and the tugboats never arrived. The Captain made an announcement that one of the stabilizers (this is what keeps the ship from rocking side to side) was malfunctioning. We should have a good time, food and drinks are available on the Lido deck, and we will take off shortly. About three hours later, we felt a little movement, looked out our window and sure enough, we were moving! We scurried up to the deck for a better view. There were huge orange markers showing our Captain the safe route to sea and a Coast Guard helicopter hovering overhead to be sure we were on the right track.

We had dinner in a beautiful dining room with the view of the ocean passing quietly by as we sailed through the dark night.

Friday morning we were up early and had breakfast in the cool morning air. Since we were late leaving Port Canaveral, we weren't able to disembark in Nassau until after 11 a.m. Several people in our group were disappointed because some of their tours were postponed or canceled. On the ship we found several lounges, two beautiful theaters where shows are held nightly, a discoteque where you could dance all night and the casino!

We visited the straw market in Nassau and then went back to the ship — quickly changed into our swimsuits and headed out for Paradise Island (see photo below). We took a ferry boat ride to a beautiful island and visited the hotel and casino owned by Merv Griffin. All of the kids on Lynne's clogging team were parasailing, jet skiing, snorkeling in the beautiful clear blue water, and lying on the beach. This was definitely my favorite part of the trip. The ocean was beautiful and warm, but still a little rough from the storm before, and the waves were tall. We splashed and played in the water then sat at a beachside bar area and had a cool drink. Our time there was over much too quickly as we had to return to the ship in time for dinner.



This was "dress up night" and everyone was invited to the Captain's cocktail party before dinner. The ladies were beautiful in their gowns and dresses and the men looked handsome in suits. Dinner was again grand in our elegant dining room. After dinner many of our group returned to shore for a night of dancing on the town. They had to be back aboard the ship before 5 a.m. as we sailed for our day at sea.

Our day at sea was wonderful. We started out with breakfast on the Lido deck, then moved to the pool area at the rear of the ship. We could see nothing but water all around us. The round pool was surrounded by two hot tubs. There was a bar and waiters that came by every couple of minutes to see if we needed to quench our thirst. After lying around for a while we decided to change locations and went to the pool area in the center of the ship. This pool was bigger, with a huge slide, needless to say this is where all the cloggers stayed!

Pat Nelson spent her

time between the two halls making certain that everything went as planned. Pat's husband, Richard, and daughter, Lori, spent their time running back and forth assisting all of the Special Edition members with their endless list of demands. Stefan Volk, a local German instructor, taught at the workshop and also became a good friend to Special Edition. One of the members of Special Edition, Dick Malsbary, at the very last minute was unable to make the first portion of our trip. Since all of our routines were choreographed for six couples, we had to give Stefan a crash course in two of our routines so that we would be able to exhibit on the last night of the workshop. After the workshop was over we took a tour of some of the beautiful sites in Frankfurt and Heidelberg, including a tour of Heidelberg/Rohrbach Castle. Our hosts made certain that we experienced some of the traditional German cuisine by taking us to a local traditional "cider" restaurant called Diauta Schneider in Sachsenhausen and by treating us to tea on Sunday afternoon, better known in Germany as a "Kaffeetrinken." The next day some of us were even lucky enough to experience a joy ride on the Autobahn at speeds of 130 mph. We drove to Rudesheim and took a ferry ride up the Rhine River where we saw beautiful wine vineyards and medieval castles.

That night members of the Crazy Tap Cloggers and their friends and family treated us with a barbecue at the home of Claudia and Bianca's parents. We all enjoyed sharing stories about the places we had visited in Germany and we all made plans for a reunion in Atlanta.

On Tuesday morning we all said tearful goodbyes and promised to stay in touch. We hopped aboard a bus for Koln, Germany, where we visited the Cathedral of Kohl, the world's oldest

and largest gothic structure which took 600 years to build. This cathedral contains a lovely gold and jeweled chest which is said to contain the ashes of the Three Kings. We all felt so moved by this awesome structure. Then it was on to Belgium. We toured Brussels, Ghent and Brugge, Belgium. In the City of Ghent, we visited the 12th Century Castle of the Count of Flanders, where we were amazed at the instruments used to interrogate prisoners. In Brussels we all took turns having our picture made in front of the famous "Mannekin Pis" Statue Fountain of the Little Boy.

One of the highlights of our time in Brugge was our 171/2 mile bike ride across the cobblestone streets of Brugge and the wheat fields of the outlying villages. Diane Wells claimed that she had not been on a bike since she was a little girl and even then it was for a very short length of time. 

and shakes while sitting at the base of a very large statue at the head of Wenceslaus Square across from the Main Railroad Station.

Sunday, we were able to follow more classes and Steve Smith showed us some fancy advanced steps. It's a pleasure to watch him dance.




Most Europeans felt left out or "boycotted" as the phrase was. Considering this was Euroclog, I would suggest that the organizers



I am forever grateful to Carolyn Stevens and Stevens Stompers for their sponsorship and vision.

The workshop took place in Prague, the most beautiful city in the Czech Republic. Prague was never bombed in WWII because Hitler wanted to retire there because of its beauty. Prague's castle (1000 years old) and the St. Charles Bridge (600 years old) are incredible exhibits of craftsmanship, withstanding the test of time. Just think, the castle is almost five times as old as America!

This was the first unveiling of EUROCLOG. What a success! 300 dancers from all over Europe were present to learn from Jay Dumcum (Kansas), Donald Thompkins (Florida), Daniela Schell (Germany), Ellie Kern (Germany), Jiri Vasak (Czech Republic), Monika Zoeller (Germany), and of course, me (Kentucky). The workshop ran very smoothly and the organization was incredible. All wooden floors were a special treat!

The host team, Caramella, is headed by a very competent Jarka and Jiri Vasak. They and their team of "helpers" escorted Jay and I throughout the week, taking care of our every need.

The evening dances were refreshingly different than back home in the States. Team performances were interspersed with live music where fun "hoedowns" were quickly taught and danced or without instruction, people got on the floor and did their "own thing." Much of the music was polka and lively polka couples often circled the floor. It was amazing to watch much of the audience spill onto the floor to take part in the live music. As I said before, *refreshing*.

Another interesting aspect of the workshop was that most participants (at least the Czech dancers) were interested in steps, not routines. Recreational clogging/public classes are not yet rooted there and most cloggers learn to clog to be on performing teams. Caramella is especially adept at creative choreography. None of their routines look anything alike. I laughed when they told me they thought line dances (clogging and CW) are VERY

BORING. And when you watch their creative team routines — they are!



Sound like a great place to visit? You bet!



Many of you will have read some of my contributions to this magazine over the past two years, well, here I am again, Nancy from England. This time I am asking for help from clogging friends across the States. I remember one Richard Nelson of Georgia once saying to me he never met a clogger he did not like and it is the warmth and generosity that he was referring to that I am looking for in my quest.

Here in England I run a youth team of cloggers the Smokey Mountain Steppers. Fourteen 16-year-old girls who are, each and every one of them, and English Rose. We are busy clogging and fund raising for a trip to the States next summer, but what we desperately need are one or two host teams to accommodate us once we get there!

We were hoping to go down to Georgia and share our clogging experience with Special Edition and their friends, but the Olympics have put paid to that. So, now we are in urgent need of some real American hospitality. The aim of the tour is to spend two or three weeks in the States visiting different teams in different areas, attend workshops, display ourselves if we can, and see something of the country. We are searching for some hosts — preferably in areas where there is something "going on" at the time we are coming — which is August 1996. I see from the Double Toe Times that Ohio, South Carolina and Ontario (Canada) have festivals at that time of year but you may have knowledge of other events — large or small. I would like the girls to stay in pairs if possible and with a clogger of roughly the same age. It will need to be a family which is prepared to work within the schedule for the duration of our stay in that area and I, as team manager over here, would negotiate that schedule with the team manager who was hosting us.

The Smokey Mountain Steppers originate from Worle School in the South West of England. I teach Drama at the school and I consider this a testimony to what special girls they are — no teacher would give up 2/3 weeks of their summer vacation unless it was for something really special! They are all 16 years old and their dancing is electrifying. This summer they attended my Jamboree by the Sea and were highly complimented by all the members of Special Edition who were here at the time as our guests.

If you, or your team, can be of help to us we would be really pleased to hear from you. Pat Nelson has agreed to be our con-

tact in America, so please get in touch with her first. I am aware that this is quite a request, but rest assured, any hospitality shown will be more than readily exchanged for any team wishing to visit England.

Dear Bobbie,

Hello, it was good to talk to you yesterday and find out nothing was really hurt by Opal in your part of the world. But everyone's newspaper has pictures of Panama City and its surrounding beaches and towns that were hit very hard. We thought the two and a half days without electricity and one day without water were bad. They were just inconveniences. A hole in the roof is no comparison to no home.

Let me show you pictures of a different kind. One and a half weeks earlier in Panama City Beach, Florida, pictures of Kevin McVey and his wife's first clogging

workshop. We all had a great time learning routines, meeting new people, and having a short little vacation on the beach.



Everyone was warm and welcoming. I was someone they had just met and had only talked with on the phone. It was a good workshop with good teachers and a great turnout of students and parents.

My letter to you is to in some way tell Kevin, his family and clogging family we all hope the future is going to be brighter and if we can help let us know. We are concerned about him and his family.


