Sunshine State Bluegrass Festival and Sanctioned Clogging Competition

Punta Gorda, on the West Coast of Florida, ordered beautiful sunshiney weather and got it! As you can see from the photo below, the outdoor bluegrass performances drew large crowds, particularly the U.S. Navy Country and Bluegrass Band, called *Country Current*, from Washington D.C. Their banjo player was outstanding.

A huge circus type tent was set up for the clogging competition, with a raised platform stage and ample seating (1000 chairs). Substantial prize money was awarded, prompting Bob Johnson, Director of the *Flatland Cloggers* (one of the overall Winning Teams) to declare that "they had won enough to buy new tires for their bus".

Mr. Bill Pattie, overall Director of the whole festival stated that the canned food collected at the gate netted 6,650 lbs of food which was delivered to the Salvation Army Pantry. I'd like to thank Bill and his wife for a wonderful day. I'll be back next year!

NCHC becomes Division of CLOG

"On January 27, 1996, the Executive Board of the National Clogging and Hoedown Council, Inc., a non-profit organization incorporated under the laws of the State of North Carolina, unanimously approved a resolution to merge with National Clogging Leaders Organization, Inc., a non-profit organization incorporated under the laws of the State of Georgia."

"Being a unrepentant supporter and proponent of traditional clogging and hoedowning, the unanticipated proposal conveyed by CLOG Chairman of the Board John Douglas for merger of NCHC and CLOG received my immediate attention. Naturally, my thoughts focused on what such a merger would mean to the continuation of NCHC's mission and purpose. Other Executive Board members exhibited the same concerns. This led to extensive discussions between the Board members and John, during which the initially conveyed proposal was clarified and certain modifications agreed upon. My judgement, after careful consideration of the issues, was that potential benefits to the NCHC resulting from a merger would significantly outweigh any possible disbenefits. In general, a much larger organization with greater resources would substantially enhance the NCHC's capability to preserve and promote traditional clogging and hoedown dance. Subsequently, the Executive Board met to determine what response should be made to CLOG. My vote was cast in favor of the merger based on the above noted judgement. My strong recommendation is that cloggers interested in traditional dance become active members and insist on fully developing the opportunities that will become available under the merger."

Many years ago when I was a beginning square dancer, the group had "ANGELS" who were very advanced dancers, but who came to the beginner classes to help teach the new dancers. One older couple, Pat and Ed, were always there, mixing and mingling during the breaks in addition to assisting on the dance floor. They worked the room like politicians and were always friendly and gracious. New dancers are usually intimidated, unsure and inhibited. None of that for Pat and Ed, they saw to it that we all met each other and more importantly that we laughed and had fun.

Later, after we became fairly adept Mainstream Square Dancers, and had attended a couple of conventions, we decided to go to what are now called PLUS classes. Whew -- what a different atmosphere! In the first place the calls and the movements were WORK! Secondly, no one seemed friendly - in fact there were two "PAT" Squares who would not allow anyone else in their square, nor would they "square up" in anyone elses square, and they didn't talk to anyone else. Even the caller hung out with the seasoned plus dancers, ignoring the new folks. I guess you know what happened -- we went back to our Mainstream dances, and volunteered as Angels. That was fun!

Any clogging group who forgets about their beginners or who, for some reason, decides not to have beginner classes, is headed for trouble. The same is true for clogging conventions who only cater to the very advanced cloggers. Nuff said!



Tony McUmber, Chairman of the Contra and Traditional Committee is pleased to announce that the committee has chosen the following dance, as the Traditional Dance of the Quarter for the period beginning March 1, 1996.

CHEAT AND SWING

from Cowboy Dances by Lloyd Shaw

MUSIC:

Your favorite hoedown or patter tune.

Use your favorite opening break.

FIGURE:

A: First Lady out to the couple on

the right; Cheat or Swing or do as you

like!

B: . . . and don't forget your own;

on to the next.2

C: Now you're home, everybody

swing.

Swing your opposite, Swing your corner

Now your (original) partner

And promenade all.3

Repeat all for couples 2, 3, and 4.

Don't worry too much about timing in this dance, except in the opener. This could turn into more of a comedy than a dance and should be good for much hilarity. 1996 is a Leap Year: try this one out at a Sadie Hawkins Day dance or any time you want to fill the hall with laughter.

First lady leaves her partner and goes to the second couple. Second man may either swing her or reject her and swing his own, leaving her in the lurch. Either lady may try in any way to get him to swing her. Regardless of the result, the first lady then goes home and swings her own

Repeat the previous operation for the first lady and third and fourth couple. After she's been all the way around go to C:, the break.

After all the cheating and swinging, everyone should be with the original partners again. There are no permanent partner changes in this dance.

Secrets of Successful Leaders

Why are some people sought after as speakers, entertainers, or just to be in their company? These folks aren't particularly good looking. Some don't really have attractive voices or are even particularly good speakers. While most seem to be in good humorall seem to have a common bond-- a tremendous interest in others.

After spending a short time with that type of person, one usually finds oneself deeply engrossed in conversation,



usually about one's self! This is a good sign that these folks have the quality of being likable. If people like you, they will forgive just about anything you do wrong. If they don't like you and you manage to do everything exactly right, it still doesn't matter.

This "like" factor can swing elections and is very real in corporate business as well as in the square dance leadership area. One doesn't have to please everyone all of the time. This attempt can be disastrous. One can be toughminded but likable and more than likely will become an elite leader who easily wins the good will of everyone. No one can tell you exactly how to be likable. People who try too hard usually aren't. So what are the traits of likeable folks?

One trait is OPTIMISM. The pessimist sees the difficulty in every opportunity and the optimist often ask other people to help. They respond to disappointments by formulating a plan of action. Pessimists react to such difficulties by assuming there is little they can do to change the situation.

Likeable people have the ability to make others feel comfortable. Leaders who keep their emotions under control put others at ease. These leaders accept others for who they are and thereby make people more productive.

For seven out of ten folks in management who lose their jobs, the reason isn't lack of ability--it's personality conflicts. As an executive reaches middle management and beyond, the primary criteria for advancement are: communnication skills with superiors and motivational skills with subordinates.

Likeable people don't take themselves or their jobs too seriously. This is true in their presentations as well as in one-on-one relationships. Likeable people don't think the world is a comic stage, but at least they can see the humor in situations. The story goes that when President Kennedy was asked how he became a war hero, he replied, "It was involuntary. They sank my boat."

Are you someone others enjoy being around? The answer may be deceptively important to how successful you will be as a leader.

Mary had a little lamb.

It's fleece was white as snow.

Everywhere that Mary went,

The lamb was sure to go.

A Professor of English with a Ph.D. in poetry would analyze the rhythmical structure of this familiar nursery rhyme and point out to his students that the first and third lines have four accented syllables and the second and forth lines have three accented syllables. There are some fancy words (i.e. iambs) with multitudinous Latin based syllables that identify this poetical rhythm structure and a student would be expected to memorize all of them and regurgitate same on exam day if he/she wanted to pass the English course.

Every kid in kindergarten, however, assigns this rhyme a dead bang 8-count time line and sing-songs the rhyme like this:

The point to be made here is that vocalized rhythms can be considered as complex or as simple as the user chooses to make them.

Our traditional music can be heard and counted on a dead bang 8-count time line. Our traditional figures and formations can be learned, taught, called and danced utilizing an 8-count time line. For those of us who teach, the challenge of assimilating dance information so that it can be transmitted to the student is a major part of the fascination.

As we become more adept at what we do, we either streamline or simplify our teaching and calling procedures to fit the group with which we are working.

OK! Preamble is over. Let's get on with it.

Just for fun, let's take a look at 2 single basics and 1 triple basic under an 8-count time line.

Line 1 is the time line.

Line 2 vocalizes the time line.

Line 3 vocalizes the steps used.

Line 4 names the steps utilized.

Note the addition of the upper 1/4 beat in beats 1 and 3.

A certain amount of license has to be taken inside the graphic because spacing doesn't always come out even.

Try to vocalize the following 4-count phrases. How many 4-count phrases? How many 8-count phrases? How many 16-count phrases? How many 32-count phrases?

Allemande left with the old left hand.

A right to your partner with a right and left grand.

Meet your honey with a hey-hey-hey and

promenade the other way.

Make a ring, a great big ring.

<u>Listen now</u> to what I sing.

<u>Chicken in the bread pan pickin' out dough.</u>

<u>Honor your corner and do-si-do.</u>

"Patter" is sing-songed to an 8-count time line in 4-count phrases. Patter is an embellishment a stage caller in a grand hall can utilize to enhance a recreational dance environment. Or, during an exhibition, from outside the routine.

It's not likely that a person who is dancing and calling from inside the dance formation is going to utilize patter. If you are that aerobic, my hat comes off to you. Nay. I stand in awe.

What we novice callers want to be able to do is school ourselves to teach and call a named figure or formation and have all our dancers executing the same maneuver at the same time. The visual elegance of the formation is directly proportional to the response time to the call combined with the uniformity of the execution. SHEESH!! Sounds like something Issac Newton would have said.

id-1947 was the big turn-around point for square dancing. From what today we refer to as the traditional dance that had changed only slightly during the previous 100 years, to the contemporary form that was about to take-off, few people could even have dreamed of what was to come.

Several elements contributed to the changes in the way things were. One of the creations of modern means of transportation, the automobile and modern roads and highways that made it possible for those in square dancing, the dancers and caller/teachers, to move in ease from their previously locked-in communities, thus allowing the activity to spread.

And then there was the development of the modern public address system and transcribed music that would make it possible for every caller to be understood as well as heard and provide him with an endless supply of musical accompaniment.

And finally, there had to be a voice that would awaken America to its dance heritage, someone with the vision and the energy to research the available dances and provide leadership training for the new breed of callers and teachers. This voice came from a school teacher who was so enamored with the dances of the pioneers that he wrote a book about them and created a means of showing off the activity to the rest of the country. That man whom we've been talking to you about over the past few months was Dr. Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw. The book was COWBOY DANCES and his visual means of displaying the activity to others was The Chevenne Mountain Dancers.

* * * *

The callers in our area, (and I'm sure in other areas as well), who were returning from a week of concentrated learning and dancing with Shaw at his callers school in Colorado Springs that summer, were "chomping at the bit," anxious to put what they had learned into practice with the dancers at home. But how?

Remember, to this point our square dancing was great fun and was attracting large turnouts to the one-night-stand form of dance, but because new dancers were always entering the group, each evening had

to start from the beginning and work its way up. There was little opportunity to develop smooth dancing or to create a spirit of "belonging" that we as callers had with the exposure we had experienced back in Colorado.

The answer was classes. We needed to have a set learning time for the dancers during which they would not only learn new dances but they could be taught HOW to dance smoothly and considerately. By dancing with the same group for a set period of time and with the enrollment closed during that period, several things we hadn't had before would be accomplished. The dancers would become acquainted with each other. During the class they could develop automatic reaction to the calls and be given the time to develop attitudes and skills that would be important for the future of square dancing.

For those of you coming into the activity in recent years it will seem strange, perhaps, that there was a time when classes were not an essential part of the program, but back then they came as an amazing revelation.

The classes that started that fall of 1947 opened a whole new world for us. From the caller's stand point, learning to teach was a challenge. He had to learn how to develop a lesson plan and discover the most effective method of retaining an average learning-level within the group. This he may have achieved by continually mixing the dancers, by having them change partners for a square or during the teaching of a couple dance.

Almost from the beginning, sparked by the enthusiasm of the callers and teachers in our area, the dancers had learned about Lloyd Shaw and his dancers. Now, with the first of the six-week classes graduating and forming into clubs and with new classes starting up, the dance-leaders felt that the next step was to bring The Cheyenne Mountain Dancers to Southern Cali-

To accomplish this, which was to be no small undertaking, the callers and the dancers needed to work closely together-another first for the then young activity. An invitation was sent to Shaw and accepted. November 4-8, 1948, as set for the timing. The plan was to present two performances of the young dancers in two different parts of the city. These would be

fornia.

held on a Thursday evening and the following Monday. The period in between would be used for a dance seminar patterned after the sessions held in Colorado Springs.

The enthusiasm was unbelievable. The budding square dance activity in the area had caught the imagination of the press and the new-born television industry and we were assureof adequate coverage for the event. The Los Angeles Mirror, one of our large dailies, ran a series of photographic "how-to-square-dance" articles on its front pages and, as a result, when tickets went on sale for the performances, they were bought up in less than a week's time.

The seminars were something else. They would be held in Hollywood High School's gymnasium and even though it was large, it could only accommodate a portion of the many who wanted to attend. In order to be fair, it was decided that one couple from each of the clubs in the area would get tickets and even though only a small percentage of the dancers would be on hand, it was felt that they could share the experience with the other members of their club.

With less than a year to plan all of this, it took the combined efforts of a large number of men and women to make it cometogether. But come together it did.


ANNA WELLS TAKES APPALACHIAN DANCE TO EUROPE

Our departure date for our European vacation had finally arrived. (January 26, 1996). With four suitcases packed, we were ready to catch our plane in the Tri-Cities in Bristol, Tennessee. We were to fly to Atlanta, then on to Zurich, Switzerland where we would rent a car and make the five hour drive into Lofer, Austria where we would make our home for a week in Schloss-Grubhof, an old renovated castle built by the King of Bavaria in 1325. After one week there, we would drive back to Zurich and fly to Faro, Portugal for our second week. First of all, the weather was so foggy in Atlanta that our flight was switched suddenly to Cincinnati where we boarded our plane for the 8 1/2 hour flight into Zurich. From there, we were well on our way to a very interesting and exciting vacation.

Before leaving home, I made a point of contacting all of the cloggers in Germany listed in the "Double Toe Times". I received three replies. The first was a call at home from Danielle Schell. We would not be close enough. Then, when we arrived at our castle home, I received a fax from Ellie Kern from near Frankfort, Germany. Again, she was still nearly a 5 hour drive from where we were staying, but we had a very good conversation by phone. I was disappointed we couldn't get together. However, she referred my letter to Leo Kropft and his Spiky Brush Cloggers in Salzburg, Austria. That was only a 1 hour drive. He also faxed a note to me at the castle to invite me to their practice on Thursday night. I rarely go anywhere - vacation or other - without my clogging shoes or wooden shoes "just in case" the opportunity presents itself for me to kick up my heels a little. I have clogged flatfooted and used the Dutch wooden shoes in nearly all the southeastern states, Arkansas, Las Vegas, Hawaii, in the Caribbean and now in Austria and Portugal. Needless to say, I was chomping at the bit to dance after tramping through the snow for a few days.

After touring Salzburg for the day (the city of Wolfgang Mozart's birthplace) we headed north near the German border to find the culture center, and were two hours early for Leo's class. The local businesses are open only at certain hours so there was no place anywhere to get a bite to eat. Lucky for Ray and I, I had brought along a few snacks "just in case." We did find one small bakery shop open where we purchased a couple of rolls (hard and cold) on which we spread our cream cheese, finished off a banana and an apple which tended to curb our appetite until later. Waiting at the culture center we noticed a few people going into the building. We entered and were greeted by Leo's wife Gertie and Leo. Jr. Leo. Sr. was the only one who spoke fluent English so, needless to say, he interpreted for us. His classes are small (only about 9 in number) and low-intermediate level but Leo teaches one class then begins another. He is working with his youngest son, Thorston, who is a very good clogger, to teach beginners so that he can work with the more advanced dancers. Leo's group, Spiky Brush, is the only clogging team in Austria. Leo works for a printing company in Salzburg and has access to making his own very professional class fliers for advertisement. He is a very good clogger and instructor. He taught one of Jeff Driggs' ClogCue routines to Casey Jones and I followed along. During their break, he asked me to do some demonstration in flatfoot, which he had never seen, and in the wooden shoes. I had some of my traditional Appalachian music tapes with me, and I started moving my feet. They all seemed

intrigued and wanted to do what I was doing. They all got on the floor and tried to follow the moves with the translation aid of Leo. He seemed to get the hang of it right away. Then I demonstrated in the wooden shoes and , again, they were just astounded. They had never seen that before either. I gave them a brief history about the wooden clogs. There was good fellowship and cordiality although the language was difficult. The clogging time had come and gone and was too short. Being an avid clogger, it was the "icing on the cake" for my tour. Before we left, Ray videoed and told them that we plan to run it on our local hometown television in Norton, Virginia, through our clogging media. I will always cherish my memories of clogging in Salzburg, Austria.

Our week passed in Austria all too quickly and now it was time to drive back to Zurich to catch our flight to warmer weather - Faro, Portugal. We had reservatioons at the Montechoro Beach Club right on the Atlantic Ocean. The weather was considerably warmer but with a nip in the air. Our first day, Sunday, was very nice - enough so that Ray and I donned our swimsuits for soaking a few warm rays from our balcony. It sure felt wonderful while folks back home were enjoying subzero temperatures and 16 inches of snow. We soon learned there was dancing in the hotel lounge so most evening found Ray and I there waltzing and jitterbugging to the Latin beat. We met several English friends there. One young girl, Liz (about age 21) sang with the piano player and had everyone spellbound. Later, she wanted me to teach her the *Achy Breaky Dance* so we found a corner in the hotel lobby to go through the paces.

Another evening, everyone wanted to learn country line dancing. Being from America and watching me dance, they soon learned I am a dance instructor.

From first to last, from the opening curtain on Thursday night until the time the curtain of the prestigious Pasadena Auditorium closed on Monday, everything came off like clockwork. Those who attended the seminars felt it was the experience of a lifetime and the thousands who attended the dance performances were transfixed with the spirit and ability of the dancers.

Lloyd Shaw had left his hallmark on our community. Square dancing had received a huge shot-in-the-arm and we here in our area were truly "off and running"!

* * * *

A popular radio personality, Paul Harvey, recounting one of his real-life stories would frequently add a postscript which he labeled "The rest of the story." It just so happens that there's more to our tale of Lloyd Shaw's 1948 visit to Los Angeles and . even though I may have told it to you before, I'd like to recall for you "The rest of the story."

* * * *

The twice-yearly treks of The Cheyenne Mountain Dancers were customarily two-week affairs, alternating visits to the east and the west coasts. On this November '48 tour the group had left Colorado Springs making appearances in New Mexico, Arizona, and finally reaching San Diego where they spent the night on the Wednesday before their prime appearance in Hollywood.

Arising early the next morning they prepared for their 100-mile bus ride along the Southern California coastline. Not one to miss the opportunity for a history lesson, Shaw pointed out the route taken by the early Spanish mission fathers, stopping at the missions and other scenic and historical sites along the way.

A half hour or so out of San Diego, Shaw stopped the bus and had his students get out and take a look at the magnificent beach and surf of La Jolla. It was a picture-perfect day and because most of the youngsters had never seen an ocean before, they crowded to the cliff's edge to get a better view and to feel the spray.

Three of the more daring boys, anxious for a closer look, ventured down the path to the water's edge. Unfamiliar with the ways of the surf, the trio were unprepared when one of the giant breakers crashed over them, sweeping them into the ocean. Two managed to grab onto the rocks and pull

themselves to safety. The third, young Tommy Collins, was washed away and drowned.


At about 9:30 that morning I received a call from Shaw telling us of the accident. "Pappy" at this point had no idea what was going to happen. Naturally, all of his people were devastated. We told him that we would plan to cancel the two shows and the workshops and refund the money. He told us to hold up on any decisions for the moment and that he would get back to us.

At noon he called again. He had reached young Tommy's parents and they expressed the wish that if he (Shaw) and the dancers were able, they should go ahead with their scheduled plans and simply dedicate the night's performance to Tommy. The dancers themselves agreed and felt that this was the way that Tommy would have wanted it. Only one or two of us in the area knew of the accident. It was decided to keep it that way and plans went ahead as scheduled.

day, but everyone who watched must have been aware that something "special" was taking place. By the end of the intermission the word of the catastrophe had gotten out and the already exuberant audience became even more loudly appreciative as the final half of the program went on.

Our photographer, Joe Fadler, stationed back stage said that he felt the dancers were gliding a full foot or so above the dance surface. "They were floating on air," he recalls. Sitting in the balcony I could feel that the experience was reaching the audience. These young dancers were telling everyone, "This is your American Heritage-take it and enjoy it!"

All of this took place just two years shy of half a century ago, but so great was this visit of "Pappy" and The Cheyenne Mountain Dancers in the launching of American Square Dancing in our area, that we have benefited from the event all of these many years.




In a spritely Western Cowboy number, The Cheyenne Mountain Dancers electrify the capacity audiences.

Well, the sell-out crowd that night at Hollywood High School was phenomenal. When the house-lights dimmed for the performance one could sense the expectancy of the audience. The curtains were opened just a foot or so and the dignified, white-haired gentleman stepped out onto the stage and in his deep voice announced. "We dedicate this performance of The Cheyenne Mountain Dancers to Tommy Collins." The curtain opened, the music started and the show was off and running.

At this stage of the game only a handful of us knew what had happened earlier that

The Lakeside Country Cloggers Be All That You Can Be

Every clogging group has its own organizational style. Some are run completely by one person — sometimes as a part of a dance studio or business. Decisions as to what to wear, which numbers will be learned and performed, which shows to do, who will be on the performing team, etc., are usually made by one person. In many cases, people are very happy about this style and it works quite well. Some are run for profit, some are non-profit (intentional or not). Some are semi-cooperative — it's still a business, but some of the decisions and responsibilities are shared by the team members. Then there is the cooperative style that the Lakeside Country Cloggers have adopted. "Be all that you can be" is our philosophy.

I sometimes refer to our group as having been "orphaned." Our original core team was made up of two night school classes in the mid-80's which were taught by Jack Simmons. When health problems prevented Jack from teaching, Art Teamerson picked up the reins and kept us rolling for a while. Eventually, Ginger Armstrong became the official night school instructor. Through Ginger, we started attending conventions in Buffalo, New York, and generally started realizing how big this "clog thing" really was, even though it wasn't that big in the Rochester, New York area at the time.

By this time, however, there were vastly different skill levels in the class, and it was becoming a real problem. Ginger was unable to split the class due to the many other commitments in her life. So, when the news of her departure came up, she basically explained that there was a difference between a clogging class and a clogging group, and that we should start our own group.

Okay, so now what do we do? By then, we all really loved clogging and wanted to stay together. Eleven of us met at one of our homes to plan our future. We decided to draw on our own resources and become a cooperative team. We elected a director, secretary, and treasurer, decided on a name, found a place to practice, and developed a philosophy of the director being a coordinator or facilitator.

I'm sure it was difficult fr our first director, as we all started out on an equal basis and still wanted to maintain our right to have a say in what happened. Granted, sometimes decisions were (and still are) slow; what colors and styles to wear for shows, for instance, took quite a long time to decide on. We recently changed our look, and it took us at least that same amount of time again.

We try to delegate as much as possible. We don't require our director to be an instructor. As a matter of fact, several of our

members enjoy working up routines from conventions and presenting them to the group. Some of our members have done some choreography; several have gone on to teach the night school classes.

We are now about 17 in number, and whatever needs to be done can usually be met by one of our member's talents or contacts, whether it's being director, teaching, figuring our insurance needs, finding a place to practice, videotaping, announcing, etc.

Granted, we did (and still do) have help. The Haley's and several others from Buffalo were a very good source of information and encouragement. Several people joined our group when their own performing group disbanded, and they have given us a lot of insight. Some of our moms and dads have pitched in with announcing, running the music, publicity, etc.

We try to be assured that a potential new member will fit in as a real team player as well as on clogging ability. We don't need rigid rules about attendance at shows because our members want to be there; if we won't have enough cloggers to do a show, we say so upfront and turn the booking down if we have to.

All proceeds from our shows go into our treasury for our business expenses and to help with costuming, sound equipment, etc. No one profits financially and no one is paid for their respective responsibilities.





Ray had arranged with my two sisters, their husbands, my three nephews and wife to meet us at the airport - and we headed out in the

blinding snow to find a restaurant open where we could enjoy a good, juicy, all beef American hamburger. It sure was good to be home among familiar faces.

I have to agree with my clogging colleagues who have traveled abroad. Clogging seems to have no language barrier and tends to promote goodwill and friends anywhere you go in the world.

What this requires from us novice callers is the ability to overlay our next call on top of a formation in process. What is required of us musical directors and teachers is the ability to analyze what makes a figure work or not work for any particular group.

That caller-feller on the stage at the local recreational hall, when the play party dancers get mixed up, out-of-sync, and the formations get messy, he can rest easy on the calling platform with the band and wait for the dust to settle before making his next call. He can even throw in some amusing patter while the dancers find themselves, their partners, and home spots. Exhibition, on the other hand, has to be more coordinated and competition considerations go way beyond that.

Let's take a look at the following 8-count time lines. Let's consider 4-count phrases at the very bottom of the call-and-teach skill-level barrel. Here is what (calls included) 2 left-hand pull-bys with follow-up positions would look like in 16 beats followed by a right hand pull-by and a left hand pull-by in 16 beats.

Line 1 is the time line.

Line 2 is the call line.

Line 3 is dance line.

Now we're looking at Allemande Left and the first two half passes of Grand Right & Left in 20 counts. We haven't quite cut the time in half, but we're getting close.

The point is this: Somewhere between the snappiest patter coupled with the flashiest dancers and the most simplistic directional calls to teach or make easy the formation lies what is best for you and your group. And what is best for you and your group is nobody's notion but yours.

That's what us novice callers and "traditional" choreographers do. It's our job. It's our challenge. It's our art form.
