
A MAGICAL TRIP . . . "DOWN UNDER"

Our first stop was Fiji, relaxing there for three days before heading to Cairns, in Queenland. This area is in northern Australia, nearer the equator. It is very tropical. We spent our time there snorkeling in the Great Barrier Reef and exploring the tropical rainforest. To reach Kuranda, high in the rainforest, we took the Kuranda Railroad. It weaves its way through 15 tunnels and 2 suspension bridges with majestic overlooks along the way.

The temperature was still high for the Saturday morning workshops, with Steve and Janet still in shorts. After lunch son Jared joined Steve for 'Old Pop in an Oak' which was a lot of fun. Later we were treated to a Flatfoot workshop with video cameras working overtime. This was sensational as for many people it was the first they had ever seen this style of clogging.

Our finale for the evening was 'Bojangles' and Steve's sensitive interpretation left some of us in tears! Sunday was cooler, but Megablast soon warmed us up. This was followed by a Waltz Clog workshop, then an intermediate teach by Pauline called 'Wantin' and Having it all'. The hit of the afternoon session was 'Makin' it' with Jared Smith showing us how it really should be done, with all the latest moves. An Aussie style Barbecue was organized for tea (sorry no prawns or kangaroo steaks) just sausages, lamb chops and patties with lots of salad, followed by drinks called "spiders" (lemonade and ice cream).

Our last evening was coming up, and we soon regretted eating so much. Wild Wild West and Turkey in the Straw are not the best dances to do on rather full stomachs - Ugh!

Editorial for July

A Sense of Community -

I've often wondered what bonds clogging groups together. While I'm sure the charisma of the instructor plays a big part, there seems to be other mysterious alchemies going on. We are not joined by a common age, generation, occupation, sex, ethnic background or religion.

In the beginning it is the love of dance that draws us. We are probably convinced that we'll never be able to clog, but we try, we practice, and one day discover we CAN! This revelation is experienced by other class members with whom we share our first bond, followed by more steps, more difficult material and perhaps a first workshop or exhibition. We then (hopefully) begin to take newer members under our wing and the circle widens.

It is my conviction that though the dance is the basic ingredient, we ultimately develop a "sense of community" which in years gone by was part of the joy of living in a small town, knowing and helping and being helped by one's neighbors. We were on a first name basis with the Mayor who probably owned the local grocery store or barber shop. Town Meetings were well attended by nearly everyone and no one locked their doors.

Todays frenetic pace allows little time for "neighboring". We go into a clogging group ostensibly to learn the dance, and find a wonderful, wider, extended family which many of us have never experienced before. I call it a sense of community. It is the kind of activity that goes beyond the dance classes - weddings, christenings, funerals, bake sales, car washes, and fund raisers. I remember that a local clogger needed blood transfusions. The appeal went out for donors and there were so many that the local blood bank hollered Uncle. After that, the club established a Blood Bank account for all its members and maintained it yearly.

I've been involved in clogging since 1972 - 24 years. Lindy Reyes and I published the first Double Toe Times in September 1983. The growth of clogging groups in those 24 years has been phenomenal. I truly believe it is because of folks like Shelia Popwell who, a long time ago, coined the phrase "caring and sharing", and Richard Jett who declares, "a good time will be had by all".

It is the hometown instructor, without much thought of remuneration, who nurses us through those first wobbly steps and then continues to nourish our dance needs week after week, year after year. We must give back the same tender consideration, for we are a family of cloggers!


Western New York Clogging Association

April 10, armed with two carry-ons, backpacks and camcorder, we boarded British Airways Boeing 767 at Boston Logan Airport at 5:30 PM and landed at Heathrow Airport in England at 5:00 AM (the magic of time zones). 
Although tours are super, we wanted this trip to be shackle-free of pre-planned lengthy tourist stops and eating regimentation.





Once there, butterfly sanctuaries nocturnal wildlife enclosures, and shopping for native crafts occupied our morning. Of course, the boys purchased boomerangs for their best friends. The highlight of our afternoon was an Aboriginal production, "We Are Proud to Be, Aborigine." It was a moving experience. Returning to Cairns from Kuranda, we took a noiseless Sylrail, a four person car that hung from a moving cable. It was a 45-minute trip and took us directly over the rainforest.

From Cairns, we headed south to Adelaide, a city of 1 million people. It was here that we would do the workshop. As we walked through the airport tunnel toward baggage claim, we heard a growing roar. When we glimpsed the welcome banner we knew that the throng of applauding and cheering people were there for us! What a welcome by the Colonial Cloggers! To be met with such open arms set the tone for the upcoming weekend. It would truly be a union of two different worlds through the vehicle of dance.

We had several days before the workshop to adjust our biological time clocks and were escorted daily on different excursions. Pauline Elliott, the director of the Colonial Cloggers, and her husband Ivor, put my family up in their home. They were incredibly gracious hosts. It's not easy rearranging your entire house for four people. Ivor is still in shock, having observed some of my strange eating habits.

He never could quite adjust to me putting ice in cereal and adding water to the skim milk! Pauline was making constant trips to the grocer. She had never seen such "jelly eaters" as my two sons We introduced Pauline and Ivor to grilled cheese sandwiches and Ivor introduced me to a "Shandy," one part 7-up (which they call lemonade) and 1 part Beer. It was an English drink and very refreshing. However, iced tea was not to be found on the continent. They drink it *hot*

Judy Hoyle, co-director of the Colonial Cloggers and Roger, her husband, were our constant guides along with Pauline and Ivor. Together we held koalas, stroked kangaroos, took pictures of wombats, a platypus, wallabies and Tasmanian devils. We took a. river boat ride on an old paddle wheel, visited Victor Harbor, tasted wines in the many wineries and walked through "old Adelaide." I must say that on an empty stomach, the wineries had me reeling. They had to "cut me off," so to speak. I also got the chance to play golf with Ivor and the boys went to school one day, making some pen pals.

The countryside in Adelaide was much different than the tropical Cairns. Adelaide, which lies at the southern-most tip of Australia, is very desert-like, receiving only one inch of rain all summer. With its many varieties of Eucalyptus trees it presented a unique and striking landscape.

During the week, I was the guest instructor at three of Pauline's different locations where she teaches. Some of the workshop participants from other Australian states came early to be a part of those classes. Friendliness and hospitality was the standard. People were eager to introduce themselves and to share their excitement abour having us there. They were excited that Janet and my two boys, Jared and Jordan could make the trip. Janet and I performed several duets which are not yet so common there, and were very well-received.

Finally it was time for the workshop. The workshop was full with registration being closed at 270 people a full two months in advance because of hall size limitations. Pauline was enthused because she had not imagined such a turnout was possible. In fact, her initial best hope was for a number of about 100. The size of the workshop and enthusiasm of the dancers was delightful because it raised the energy to a high level.

What touched my heart the most was the unity that resulted from bringing clubs all over Australia together. It was my fondest hope. Clubs from Queenland, Victoria, South Australia, Northern Territory, Western Australia and New South Wales arrived representing their respective states. Many had to fly a distance of 2000 miles or more to get to the workshop.

The workshop took place in a large gymnasium with a wooden floor! The stage was beautifully decorated with banners touting "Clogfest '96" with the American and Australian flag crossed in the center of the backdrop. Huge, colorful, musical notes were hanging from the ceiling and added a festive flair to the event. Besides myself, there were other instructors from all parts of Australia who did an excellent job of teaching.

Sponsoring your First Clogging Workshop

Part 1: The Preliminaries

You've decided to sponsor your first clogging workshop. Everyone's excited as they anticipate their very own clogging workshop. Numerous details need to be taken care of:

When should you have it? Where should you have it? Who should you invite to instruct? How long should the workshop last? What will it cost to sponsor this event? The list goes on and on and seems overwhelming.

Where should you begin?

Slow down and start at the very beginning . . . "a very fine place to start" as I recall from a favorite childhood song. Too often. people get excited with a new idea that sounds like great fun and rush forward without thinking their idea through thoroughly. In the end they realize they got in over their heads, and too often, the result is disappointment and frustration. Applying a few proven business tactics will help make your clogging workshop (or any event) a success.

First of all, begin planning well in advance. The longer the event, the more time you'll need to pull all of the details together.

Keep your perspective!

Sponsoring a clogging workshop can be great fun and very rewarding. That is, if everyone gets involved and fully supports the idea -- the same idea. Before you dive in head first, sit down with your group and discuss what exactly it is you want to do. If you want the support of your group, and you should, you need to involve them from the beginning. If your group/team/club is not interested in working to sponsor this workshop, think twice about doing it. One or two people cannot do it alone.

Do you want an afternoon workshop? A full day workshop? or a two or three day event? Do you want dances included in your event? Exhibitions? Do you want to invite local and/or national instructors to teach at you workshop? How will you promote the workshop? Where do you want to draw your audience from? . . . As you're deciding these things, keep in mind the following:

How many people do you have who are willing to work and help sponsor the event? (Who can you really count on?)

Do you have any money in a group treasury to invest in the event? The longer the workshop, the more it's going to take.

If you have money at your disposal, how much are you willing to risk by investing in this workshop?

Your audience.

Will your area support such an event? The importance of this cannot be emphasized enough, because initially, that's where you will draw most of your support. It's easy to feel that you're going to put on the best event ever, and of course, everyone will know -10-

that and be busting down your doors to get in, right? Unfortunately, this rarely happens at first time events. It takes time to establish your workshop's credibility and for the 'word' to get out and attract others.

Initially, plan on drawing from within a 100-mile radius for a one-day event. Yes, some will travel further, but marketing studies support that most people will not travel over 100 miles for a one-day function that does not involve a sleep-over. For an event that involves an overnight stay, you can plan on people traveling from further away, but remember, you're not likely to draw many of them that first time around.

Knowing the concentration of cloggers in your target area will assist you in determining the likely size of your workshop. To help get a realistic picture of the number of cloggers in your area, take a local map and pinpoint the location of your event. Draw a circle around it, 100 miles out on all sides. Then take a look at how many clogging groups, clubs, and teams meet within the area. This may seem like a lot of wasted time; after all, you know how many cloggers are around you, right? You may find yourself pleasantly surprised if you actually do this exercise. Some of those cloggers you knew were just "down the road a bit" may actually be further away and may not necessarily travel to your workshop.

Once you get an idea of how many cloggers are in your area. estimating how many will support your event by attending is more difficult. How congenial is your group with the other groups around you? Unfortunately, as clogging grows and spreads, with new groups breaking away from old, hard feelings tend to develop. This will affect your attendance, so give it careful consideration. If your group, as a whole, gets along well with the other groups in your area, you can safely plan on 50% of each group supporting you the first time. It may be more, and it may be less, but this is a fairly safe bet.

Perhaps you want to involve other groups in sponsoring this workshop? By doing so, you are likely to draw more people to your event. However, depending on how you handle it, you could end up with more "chiefs" that want things done their way, instead of "indians" that you need to help get things done.

The Monetary Investment.

Very little can be accomplished today without some financial risk and investment. How much does your group have to invest? You'll need money up front to print promotional flyers and for any deposits that may be required (example, to reserve a hall). If you do not have much money available, you can try to raise the money with various fund-raisers, providing you are planning this event far enough in advance.

To determine what it will cost to run your event, draw up a budget, or list of projected expenses, for it's really quite simple, and if prepared carefully, it will represent a realistic picture of what you can expect. It will also help you price your workshop.

Begin by making a list of all the expenses that will be involved. Estimate what each will cost. If you're not sure of a particular item, call around to a few suppliers and get some estimates. Don't forget about the resources available to your group. Someone may work for a printer or know some one who does. Someone else may know the owner of a hall. Some of the best bargains are at your fingertips, so tap into them. Don't just guess what items will cost.

More often than not, just guessing, we underestimate. When planning your budget, you'll be better off overestimating and trimming the figures down later.

Items to include in you budget are: (Note: this list is comprehensive, and many of the items listed are optional and not necessary for your event to be successful. Many of the expense items may be obtained at no cost.)

Income:

Registration Vendor booth rentals Advertisements in Syllabus Syllabus sales **T-Shirt Sales**

Expenses:

Preparation and Promotional Costs

Deposits (Hall flooring, etc.)

Printing and paper costs for promotional flyers

Typesetting and log artwork for flyers

Advertisements in clogging publications and other syllabi

Telephone calls

Paper and postage for local news releases

Event expenses -

Hall rental fees and setup fees

Travel and lodging expenses for instructors and/or workers

Flooring and stage rentals

Printing of syllabus

Purchase and printing of T-shirts

Dancer/spectator badges and/or ribbons

Sound equipment rental

Chairs and tables rental

Insurance

Decorations

Security

Awards and/or prizes

Gratuities to facilities staff

Miscellaneous (allow \$50 to \$100)

Afterparty refreshments

Net = Income less expenses. (If this is a negative number, you need to trim down your expenses!) After preparing your budget, you should have a better idea of the monetary investment involved in sponsoring your workshop. A well-defined budget can help keep you on track, providing you revise it accordingly and use it as a guideline for expenditures.


After you've chosen your dates, decided on the magnitude of your workshop, realized who your audience will be, and defined your budget, you are will on your way to sponsoring a successful workshop. Next time, I'll provide tips on choosing a location and negotiating a rental contract.





Cajun, Line Dancing, etc. Also workshops for Fiddle, Guitar, and Dulcimer. While the dance and instrumental workshops were going on, all around the corridors of this Highfields Marlock Derbyshire School were groups of instrumentalists playing fiddles, mandolins, guitars, bass fiddles, dulcimers, harmonicas, whatever. Master musicians! Some cloggers would clog in the middle of the group on 2' X 2' boards, keeping time to the hoedown tunes with more attention to tap sounds rather than body action.



Saturday night we queued up an hour early to get good seats for the dance concert. "Footworks" was originally the Green Grass Cloggers, then Fiddle Puppet Cloggers, now Footworks, put on an excellent hour show. They are super entertainers and excel in syncopation and a cappella, and perform all over England in almost daily gigs. More bands followed their show with a Salsa workshop, Maracatumba and Cajun dancing into wee hours of the morning.

Sunday morning ended around 2:00 following by teams demos, then musicians en masse and freestyle dancing til 4:30. Most music is provided by live bands which gives me an idea how to beat the strangle-hold the BMI/ASCAP has on our clogging world.

Why don't we have live music or taped music from the prolific and ubiquitous Bluegrass groups, at least when making convention tapes by the instructors.

Dave drove us to a nearby home for an after party for the festival staff and we enjoyed a catered buffet of Chinese, Indian and Italian foods, and camaraderie and a review of the success of the festival in restrospect. The hosts were Shirley & Paul Niblock and are enthusiastic Morris dancers.

Monday we were now on our own again and drove up through Scotland, endless mountains, some snow-capped, to Inverness home of the Loch Ness Monster. Then down the other side by Loch Lomond to Liverpool where I just had to see the Beatles Museum. Every turn of the road is another breathtaking scene; so much beauty! Quaint, picturesque, no wooden houses, mostly stone that are hundreds of years old - stone shingles 1/2" thick. Stonewalls everywhere, millions of sheep, narrow streets (except dual highways); like a fairy-tale paradise. We tried to stay at B&B Farms so to enjoy the animals up close. One farm had 1,000 sheep and 100 cows. Most farms are owned by the wealthy; i.e. Duke of Devonshire, and lease to choice farmers under "Trusts". Trusts preserve the character of the land and protect land from developers.

On the Dunscar Farm, Rachel (12 yrs old) let me hold James who's mother ewe only had enough milk for the larger of the twin lambs so James had to be bottle/formula fed by Rachel every four hours. How I loved those lambs. Sheep only lamb once a year and in April so the farmers were extremely busy night and day to assist with lambing. The phrase, "Jesus is the lamb of God" came to mind as I cuddled the dear little creatures.

We stopped in Dunblane to pay respects to surviving parents of the recently massacred 16 children and teacher at a primary school by a mad gunman. The school is already torn down and readied for a memorial. One of the father's of a slain child came into the gas station and if I wasn't told who he was, I would've thought, "There's a sad looking man."

We went through castles, caves, Stonehenge, Bath, museums, flea markets, walks among the hills, Hadrian's Wall




