

AMERICA'S CLOGGING HALL OF FAME - SPRING WORKSHOP.

he American Clogging Hall of Fame held its annual Spring Workshop on Saturday April 27, 1996 at the world famous *Stompin Grounds* in Maggie Valley, North Carolina. Over 3000 dancers from throughout the eastern United States participated in the all day workshop and solo competition.

"This year's event was our best ever", said workshop coordinator Lou Maiuri, of West Virginia. "It's great to see so many dancers out on the floor learning about traditional dancing". Workshop instructors Maiuri, Ray Hattaway of Florida, Bob Johnson of Virginia, Sonja Shepard Wiseman of Tennessee, Elliott & Cheryl Skeen of North Carolina, and Jeff Driggs of West Virginia led classes in a variety of topics including running set and country hoedown, Southern Appalachian square dancing and smooth dancing, flatfooting and clogging and country western line dancing. Bob, Lou, and Elliott led a massive circle through the paces in traditional categories, while Ray taught the intricate rhythms of flatfooting. Jeff charged up the crowd with a frenzied routine to MEGABLAST which featured a variety of formations and domino effects. During the breaks, Lou and the staff kept the dancers going with nine-pin square dances, reels and play party dances.

CAMP CLOG '96 AND NATURAL BRIDGE CLOGGING CHAMPIONSHIP

Over 120 dancers from 6 states met at Natural Bridge State Park on Saturday July 13, 1996 for the 8th Annual Camp Clog Workshop hosted by Jeff Driggs and Jeff Parrott. Jeff and Jeff's special guest instructor this year was Josh King, of Nashville, Tennessee.

Jeff Parrott kicked off the day with two easy routines, and Josh followed with a dance to My Maria. Jeff Driggs taught a fun routine to Rodeo Rock and Parrott kept everyone on their toes with Scatman. Jeff's team routine to the Atlanta Reel had dancers turning and circling at a head spinning rate, and by the end of the day Josh's advanced dance to the Mission Impossible Theme really offered a challenge for the mind-weary workshoppers.

Vickie Dean of Australia won the award for the farthest traveler to the workshop. Vickie dropped in on the camp during a summer visit that has included stops at several workshops and visits with many clogging instructors. Richard Smith's Columbia Cloggers, of Crothersville, Indiana, took home the award for the most registered dancers.

Saturday Evening gave those in attendance the opportunity to go to a dance held on world famous Hoe-Down Island. Richard Jett, the usual Master of Ceremonies, was out of town, so the Clogging McClain Clan and their American How-downers led the program with a variety of line dances, squares, mixers and freestyles. Tandy Barrett, who has long been a part of Camp Clog, joined the group on Saturday Night and Driggs and Tandy did a little taste of their infamous Hillbilly slow dance for the laughing crowd. After the dance, the instructors joined Harold Staggs, Jimmy Hill, Brenda Muse and others at the Natural Bridge campgrounds for some old-fashioned gospel singing, story-telling and marshmallow roasting 'round the campfire.

Plans are already underway for the 1997 Camp Clog Workshop. A new resort in the Slade area is building a 10,000 square foot dance hall, which will boast one of the biggest wooden dance floors around! In additional, separate developers are building cabins and lodges that will offer cloggers a much larger range of accomodations.

LEST WE FORGET

Outside, the cool morning breeze was whispering in the tall majestic hemlocks and there was the sound of water running over bed-rock in the mountain creek beside the home of Sue Ledford Reese. I really don't know how long I've known Sue. We go back a long way. Went to the same school together, danced on the same square dance team in the late 40's and early 50's. These teams were good enough to win some awards in the process. Our exhibition team danced several times a week at the request of the summer visitors in the western North Carolina Sue Ledford Reese



Highlands. By the time the sun was Highlands, N.C. peeking over the mountain, our conversation had reached back in time and had centered around the late Cleo McCall. "You know you don't find many free style dancers who could dance like Cleo anymore," Sue stated, "He was the best." He was a man who never missed a beat. The genius of his dancing feet had the most perfect sound I've ever heard for a free style dancer."

As Sue explained, "with the crying of the fiddle and the shuffling of the feet, Cleo had lightening in his heels and a patter in his voice as he called the set and winged his way through the figures. He kept the set moving and his voice was as clear as a bell," she added, "Cleo danced with humility, with his head held high and his shoulders laid back, you knew who was in charge when you were on the dance floor."

Folks in the Southern Appalachian Mountains have been dancing this way for years. This style of dance was fetched over from the 'old country' and has remained the same over the years.

Cleo started the exhibition team at Helen's Barn and every Wednesday, Friday and Saturday nights the team would perform to a packed house. He was also instrumental in helping organize Hillbilly Day that was held each July in the early 1950's. At his invitation several well-known dance teams would put on performances during the day to the delight of the several thousand visitors who had gathered along Main Street in downtown Highlands, North Carolina.

"The memory of his dancing is a haunting thing", explained Sue, "I'll never forget his two-tone, black and white wing tip shoes. You could spot him a country mile. With those bright shoes and the big smile on his face you knew right then that the folks would be getting their money's worth. You can never relive the time you first met a person like Cleo as you can never recapture the last years of your youth but you can never forget it either."

As you roam the Southern Appalachian Mountains, search out the hidden coves and valleys. Listen for the crying of the fiddles, the twang of the five string banjo. Hunt as you will for as surely as the sun rises in the east and sets in the west you will fine other Cleo McCall's in every crook and cranny.






Bob Johnson teaching a square dance class



Partnering Techniques to Make Your Appalachian Figures Look and Feel Better

What appeals to an audience viewing a group exhibition is the synchronized movements of the individual participants.

Whoever said "Timing is everything" was not necessarily addressing us traditional dancers, but he or she might as well have been.

Working out the execution problems of position, spacing, tempo, tracking, and time/distance ratios for any particular group and figuring out how best to coach individuals to dance effectively in twosomes, foursomes, eightsomes or howevermany-somes you have on the floor, is what we instructor/callers do.

Some of the C&C suggested timing devices that novice callers/instructors of traditional dance formations can utilize to help synchronize themselves and their groups are 4-count pullbys, 4-count wraps and rolls, 4-count call pads, 4-count dance pads, and 4-count quarter clock turns.

We figured out that the lead dancer traveling the inside track of a star promenade must control the distance he travels in 4 counts to give his partner, traveling the outside track of the star promenade, a fighting chance to keep up (ref. Double Toe Times, November 1994). The arc-distances are not equal. On the same 4 counts, she has to travel a greater distance on the same arc. We speak here of the distance traveled not a change of dancing tempo. We designated "four/thirty" (4/30) as a reasonably standard distance traveled of 30" in 4 counts. That means that a time distance ratio of 4/10 is just about dancing in one spot.

This month, let's examine the distance, the moves, and how many counts an odd couple might yield to an even couple to enhance it's ability to smoothly and elegantly roll under it's own arch. Two formations that these moves would affect are:

Split the Apple

and

Dive for the Oyster. Dig for the Clam. Look for the hole in the ole tin can.

Two opportunities present themselves during the execution of these figures such that these formations inadvertently get raggedy and rough. The first error falls to the arch-unit. The second error falls to the dive-unit. An interesting aspect of the second error is that, although the error indeed belongs to the dive-unit, it will be reflected in the arch-unit's performance and the arch-unit gets to be the

focus of the "Oh Dear! What a shame!" Not nice. Not nice at all.

Unschooled dancers tend to stand on the spot and "grow an arch", leaving their elbows dangling under the bridge. If this type of whimpy arch is examined, the inside of the elbow joint will be facing upward toward the ceiling. So is the lead dancer's thumb. Not good. Not good at all.

When the dive-unit dancers attempt to travel under the arch, they have to lean way over to miss the dangling elbows. By now the arch-unit dancers recognize the fact that the bulk of the two dive-unit dancers is not going to make it through the stingy spacing between their bodies so they move sideways

to make more room. This forced move usually results in the detachment of arch hands. The arch-unit dancers lose touch with each other. The arch formation breaks down. The dancers lurch apart, grabbing and snatching trying to re-establish contact. Not smooth. Not smooth at all.


Really sharp couples don't just "grow an arch", they engineer well made arches from "git-go". That means more horizontwal space between the dancers of the arch-unit and more vertical space between hands and the floor. It all happens in the first 2 beats of the formation.


From "git-go" at hoedown square home positions [4 dancers holding hands, facing corners), the arch-unit dancers step sideways, forward, and turn slightly toward the inside diagonals. From the hands-ready position, at "git-go" the hands swing down, around toward the back. The arms rotate from the shoulder and carry the hands to the apex of the arch. The inside of the elbow joints are now facing the floor and so are the thumbs on the arch hands. The span of the arch is stretched from the shoulders. [This motion can be termed "roping from the shoulder".]

Additionally, when the arch-unit dancers roll under their arch, they fold themselves into the archway on a curved track meeting shoulder-to-shoulder, then back-to-back.

So, first, let's have Eddy & Edwina [our even couple] engineer a well formed arch moving forward. A well formed, moving arch has already smoothed over one of our potentially raggedy edges.

At the same time that Eddy & Edwina are executing their well formed arch, Otis & Olivia [our odd couple] are moving

moving torward, diving through the arch. The time/distance ratio of these motions in the first 4 counts for both couples will be pretty standard, about 4/30 or 4/40 depending on how rambunctious your group tends to be.

- 1) For the Split the Apple formation, Otis & Olivia detach their partnering hands to make possible tracking in opposite directions. Otis pulls Edwina [his corner] under her own arched arm and Olivia pulls Eddy [her corner] under his own arched arm. To finish up the formation, Otis and Olivia pull their corners into a straight line.
- 2) For the Look for the hole in the old tin can formation, the pulls under the arched arms are executed in the same manner. The figure finishes up when, Otis & Olivia pull the foursome back into the original hoedown square.

On moving under their own archway, we want our arch-unit dancers to able to elegantly dance a tight curve [track a small arc] under their bridged arms. Their arms are elevated over their heads. Their backs are straight. Their heads are up. There is no detachment of hands. All of which is possible if our dive-unit dancers have been coached to reduce their time/distance to 4/10 in the second 4 counts of this formation.

At this point, let's stop the music and take a look the messy breakdowns that can occur when the dancers don't manage themselves well and then take a look at how we might coach our dancers such that these rough spots are smoothed over.

Our competition colleagues might ought to give some thought to the following considerations. In an environment where <u>raggedy</u> can cost you a couple of points on the score sheet, the more <u>raggedy</u> you can smooth over, the better.

- 1) If Otis & Olivia [dive unit].are stingy with time and space in the second and third 4-counts phrases, they squeeze Eddy & Edwina [arch unit] into rotating on their own centers.
- 2) If the arch-unit dancers, who already have executed a perfectly stretched and round archway, are forced to turn on their own centers, the arch will surely break down or, at best, lose it's elegance because they have cracked their backs and ducked their heads to keep from detaching their hands.
- 3) The last thing we want the dive-unit to do is "tie up" the arch-unit into "knots" so tight that it is unable to execute its part of the formation in a fluid manner.

How well the dive-unit dancers manage their time/distance ratios will directly affect how well arch-unit dancers manage their turns through their arch.

The nature of first arch and dive motions are going to be vigorous. Once the dive-unit dancers breach the arch, however, they need to be coached to stand up and reduce their time/distance ratios until Eddy & Edwina have also successfully breached the arch. Eddy's & Edwina's breach is the more difficult one to execute.

It is Otis' & Olivia's job to support and assist Eddy & Edwina by momentarily dancing back to-back at 4/10 in the second 4-count phrase and turning somewhat to face them in the third 4-count phrase.

The audience will never catch on. But raggedy and rough, they'll catch in a heart beat.

Otis & Olivia should also be coached, not only to shorten their distance traveled, but additionally to extend

their arms and hands toward Eddy & Edwina allowing them plenty of "rope" to set up and execute their first half turns under the archway in an elegant manner. Otis & Olivia should plan to give their corners a full 8 counts to execute the roll under the arch and to reset their hand-hold. And Eddy & Edwina should be able to trust ahead of time that they will have these 8 counts to work with. They should be able to take their time. They should not hurry. They should not be hurried.

Dive-unit gives arch-unit plenty of time and space to smoothly execute the rolls under it's own arch.

The last half turn is executed in the next 8 to 12 counts as Otis & Olivia finish pulling the dancers into the required finished-up formation.

Whipping under arched arms may have been fun on the play ground, but well oiled progression is what we're looking for in this configuration.


We can utilize partnering drills on the line to teach the mechanics of well engineered arches and the how-to's of turning ourselves in a well oiled, smooth fashion under those

arches: (arms well elevated, hands firmly latched, shoulder-to-shoulder, back-to-back, backs straight, heads up, take your time, not turning on centers but tracking a curved line of dance).

This basic partnering combination can then be incorporated into many of our formations in the same manner that we incorporate basic 4-count step combinations in our line dance routines.

Try these figures of various "arching" difficulty after you have taught partners the mechanics of arching and rolling under:

- 1) Flapjack
- 2) Split the Apple
- 3) Dive for the Oyster
- 4) Mow the Wheat
- 5) Four Leaf Clover
- 6) Dip and Dive

Part III - Contracts.

The days of the nod of agreement and handshakes are over. Today, we are hit with written contracts or terms of agreement in almost every walk of life. The same scrutiny you give to agreements signed for your bank loans should be given to any agreements signed for your clogging workshop or other special events.

Written contracts serve a meaningful purpose and should be viewed as a comfort as opposed to something to be dreaded. Contracts are a confirmation of everything that you've **mutually** agreed upon with another party; in the case here, a supplier of goods and services. A good contract establishes a give-and-take relationship between the parties involved, not a one-sided deal to benefit only one or the other.

How do you make sure the contract you're signing is mutually beneficial? You read it very carefully and make sure you understand every clause in it. You also ensure that it covers every item you agree to and contains no extra "hidden" items that were not discussed. Don't ever sign anything you're unsure of or don't feel good about. If a supplier tells you a particular clause is just standard procedure and a necessity, that's hogwash. If you don't like it, either rewrite it so you're comfortable with it or don't sign. Contracts are meant to be rewritten; I do it all the time.

For example - one particular hotel chain always provides the same, standard, preprinted contract. One page, two sides. The front side has a few blanks for the items agreed upon - number of guest rooms, rental fees, etc. The backside is completely full of very small (and light) print outlining dozens of special clauses that are standard to the hotel. Almost every one of them is onesided; the group does something that the hotel doesn't like, the hotel benefits. Never sign a contract like this without a few adjustments and clarifications. The first thing to do is draft an addendum and spell out everything that was discussed. Sometimes, this means repeating items already in the contract, although with clarifications. Rewrite every clause in the contract that is not in the best interest of the group. Above the signature line of the contract, type in that the group accepts the agreement only with the inclusion of the attached addendum. Send two copies of the addendum along with the original contract back to the hotel requesting that they sign both copies and return one to you. I've never run into a facility that refused to sign. However, many times they will want to renegotiate some items. Facilities will offer you the world to get you in their door - agreeing to it in writing is often a different story.

Another reason to make sure **everything** is included in a contract is because, by the time your event comes around, the sales representative you dealt with in the beginning may have left the company or the management may have changed hands. If they have a signed agreement in hand, there's no reason the new parties involved need to agree to all the little "extras" that you were promised but were not put in writing.

Every written contract, no matter who the parties involved are, should contain the following:

the parties entering the agreement the effective dates of the agreement complete list of goods and services to be provided by each party.

charges to be assessed for the good and services insurance/ liability/indemnity protecting each party any applicable contingencies.

special instructions

cancellation agreement to protect each party

(dates and penalties)

signatures of parties involved

The more you put into it, the better off all parties will be in the end. Facility contracts should specifically spell out the following good and services:

sleeping rooms if applicable

- number and type of rooms; room night pattern
- room rates, including tax and services charges
- confirmation policy
- reservations/reservation cut-off procedures
- credit arrangements
- complimentary accomodations
- check-in/check-out times

food and beverage

- function space; setups
- price guarantees
- dates of functions
- setup and service times
- staffing and service requirements

function space

- event schedule with assigned rooms and hours specified and approval requirements if changed; square feet minimum allowance
- setup and tear down times
- room setup requirements
- rental charges
- services, service level, staffing level;
- compensation for substandard performance

equipment

- items provided free of charge (tables & chairs)
- items provided for a charge and the charges (additional flooring that the hotel must go outside to rent)
- dates needed

renovations/construction

- projected dates
- areas of facility affected
- stop-work
- non recourse

safety measures

labor charges

parking and airport service

credit arrangements

other conditions of acceptance, if applicable

special amenities or extended serice hours (free turn down service for VIPs and extended pool

hours)

The cancellation clauses in most facility contracts are very onesided. Basically, they say if you cancel your event within a certain time-frame, you're liable for X-amount of money. Rarely, do they ever mention any compensation for **you** if **they** cancel the agreement. This does happen! If a more attractive piece of busi-





ness comes along, one which will bring in more revenue, your group could very well get bumped.

Depending on the event being booked, I recommend crossing out the facility's cancellation clause and offering to rebook equivalent business within a one-year time frame, rather than pay large fees to compensate them for loss of revenues. If the facility cancels, I'll usually give them a choice of two resolutions: 1)search for and secure equivalent facilities and services within x-radius for the same price that meet with our approval, AND pay for the printing and mailing costs of notifying everyone already pre-registered, in addition to new promotion costs, AND pay the group \$X-amount for undetermined losses. OR 2) pay the group \$X-amount for lost revenues and aggravation (this figure is normally large...enough to discourage them from cancelling).

Option two is often more to the group's advantage monetarily, however, it's often more a headache than it's worth to completely cancel an event without trying to move it. If you need to move your event, you might as well have the facility do the work for you. Rather than lose a lot of money and completely destroy the possibility of your future business, a facility will try to book the group elsewhere.

Make sure the cancellations clause contains a provision that holds neither party responsible for cancellations due to circumstances beyond either party's control, i.e. Acts of God, strikes, governmental regulations, civil disturbance, or curtailment of public transportation facilities.

To avoid personal liability, make sure the group you are entering into this agreement for is listed as one of the contracted parties and not you personally. Also, make sure it's noted where you sign that you are empowered by the group to make these arrangements. As the individual making the arrangement, you can still be held liable for a number of things, but this will offer you some protection.

When it comes to signing contracts, just be aware. Read them carefully making sure they are all-inclusive and mutually beneficial. Securing all of your arrangements in writing ahead of time does not guarantee a perfect event, but is sure will make your life and your event go a lot easier.

Traditional Judge Vs Contemporary Judge

Is it possible for the traditional judge to score Line, Show, Exhibition and the newer sanctioned categories? There are so many rules and regulations to remember.

Likewise, contemporary judges face the same difficult task when evaluating the Running Set, Country Hoedown or Southern Appalachian Freestyle. There are even more stringent guidelines, not to mention the fact that unless you have been with a traditional team for a very long time, how can you know what figures and formations are acceptable?

If a judge does not like a category, how can this person be fair and impartial? I know that in the long run it saves money to only have five judges. However, suppose that individual has a weakness concerning the traditional category, a weakness for either not fully understanding or appreciating the dance form. How is it possible for this judge to determine the deserving winner? Is a judge simply writing down a score, going through the motions?

Now, I'm not trying to knock the people who judge, because we all know this is not an easy task. At the end of the competition they have to answer to the directors, mamas, and daddys about why their child didn't place.

This position is a hard burden to take on and you have to admit after seeing 180 teams go across the stage you can't exactly have total recall.

If you want to judge a particular category then why not just say so. Inform the competition chairperson of what categories you would like to judge. You should be familiar with clogging, of course, but also be familiar with the categories. You should know what you are going to judge backwards and forwards and leave room for improvement. No one person knows everything.

Going to the NCHC judges training is a good place to start, but don't assume that they will teach you everything there is to know about judging. They make a lot of good points however, there is no way to cover the history of traditional clogging in a weekend.

To learn how to judge contemporary, spend time with your contemporary dancers and directors. Learn how the routines work and about the choreography.

If you want to learn how to judge Appalachian style clogging spend time with the traditionalists like Garland Steele, Bill Nichols or Bob Johnson. These, and other recognized experts, can explain, show or dance you through anything.

Most importantly when judging a category, make sure that you share the same enthusiasm as the dancer. Otherwise, you are cheating the dancer, yourself and the competition itself.



dancers from 22 teams from Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana to world famous Hoe-down Island in Slade, Kentucky for a full day of clogging events.





Many local people attended as well as cloggers from Utah, Tucson, California, Cottonwood and Queen Valley.


