
Clogging an Integral Part of WNC Culture

Its hard to think of mountain life and heritage without conjuring an image of heel-kicking cloggers shuffling to the rhythm of fast-paced fiddling and banjo picking.

The Southern Appalachian dance form has attracted an international attention in the past 25 years. The dance came into the world spotlight again recently with its prominent billing at the opening ceremonies of the Olympics, featuring the Leather'N'Lace Cloggers based in Leicester.

Folk Dance Glossary



Bascom Lamar Lunsford

Buck and Wing Dancing, Flat-Foot Dancing

Influenced by African single dancing; the traditional freestyle dancing where the individual, wearing shoes without taps, beats out the rhythm of the music with hands hanging loosely at the side and with the feet staying low to the ground. Traditionally, a man would buck dance to show off his individual talents for a lady. Wing dancing features a couple doing the same thing.

Flatfoot Dancing

Feet low to the ground, no taps, no kicking; arms hang at side.

Freestyle Dancing

A style of dance that varies with the individual and is traditionally danced to live music, usually a fiddle. Freestyle dancing is "caught, not taught" and reflects the dancer's spirit and originality, involving improvised steps without any prepared choreography.

Precision-Line Dancing

All dancers perform the choreographed steps simultaneously. Was prohibited from the Asheville Mountain Dance and Folk Festival from 1971 to 1995 by traditionalists who feared that the form threatened the spontaneous free-style.

Contra Dance

A folk dance in which the partners form two facing lines; a country dance.

Appalachian Square Dancing

Folk dance usually danced in a big circle with figures performed either by two couples in a circle of four, where the couples travel around the ring to execute calls with different "circle four" sets, or with all couples in the circle participating in one large formation. Best danced to the tune of a fiddle, five-string banjo and a guitar, but a piano will do.

Mountain Music

Typically uses a fiddle, banjo, mandolin and often a dulcimer or guitar to create a special quality of music characteristic of the people of the Appalachians.

Editorial for October

Bob Feingold, Editor of the award winning *Texas Clogger* wrote an editorial about Postal Reform and other issues. Hooray for fellow editors! Bob attended the three hour seminar on the new Postal Reform—his bulk mail has become standard mail, our second class has become periodical mail. Bob stated, "...the new Postal Reform is the largest single overhaul in the way our mail travels since the time of Ben Franklin. That's like more than one hundred years." I don't know if that's Post Office hype or Bob Feingold humor. Surely electricity and airplanes had an effect on mail! This whole new automated Post Office mandate was to take place July 1, 1996. We had to CASS certify our mailing lists—all zips had to have the extended zip and labels had to have bar codes. 'Course there are some addresses that the Post Office simply does not have extended zips for yet, and last month, they couldn't do my paper-work because their computer was down. Additionally, NO ONE seems to know ANYTHING about ANY of this!

I add the following for your edification. It is reprinted from *Modern Maturity*, September-October 1996.

Puzzling Postcards

The picture postcard arrives. Along with its "miss you" and "love you" and "wish you were here," there's an ominous promise to drop by—soon! But neither the card, a photo nor message ring a bell. You don't recognize the handwriting, you don't know anybody in Gallitzin, Ohio, and you can't read the last two lines of the message, including the signature—because they're covered by an adhesive strip, two and three-eighths inches long, and full of high tech hieroglyphics. Blame it on the technological age.

It's a LMLM (pronounced "lim-lim') label carrying a computerized bar code with crucial delivery information. U.S. Postal Service employees apply LMLM labels along the bottom of postcards—with LMLM machines of course—when the written message leaves no room to print a delivery code on the card itself. They are used on other mail when addresses are written unclearly or in unusual places on the envelope, thus confounding the computerized OCR (Optical Character Reader) machine that automatically sorts the mail.

The adhesive on LMLM labels is intended to release easily and cleanly allowing you to finish reading the postcard. That's not always the case—so maybe you'll just have to wait to see who shows up.



Euroclog-Prague, Czech Republic

I was thinking about you the other day, when we were on our way to EUROCLOG 96 in Prague. I went with two other girls from my club this year, and oh boy, did we have fun!

For time reason, and since there was a special airline offer, we decided to fly from Stuttgart to Prague. Besides, for one of my dancers, it was the first trip by plane, and so we all got a little excited. After a smooth flight, we landed in Prague and waited for our luggage. After 30 minutes, we got a little nervous, and I

was very glad that I had packed my tapes and clogging shoes in my carry-on-bag. Well, we did get our luggage when the luggage conveyer was fixed—about an hour after arrival.

On the way to the hotel, the weather changed into rain, and we were very glad to arrive in our hotel "Kavalir", where we spent a pleasant weekend: delicious food, friendly service and a spacious room. After lunch, we decided to take a nap, since it was still raining. Thus, we were ready to party when we headed to the Friday evening Czech Country Ball. We enjoyed watching all the different exhibitions of dancing (Polka, Tap, Clogging, Preestyle, Square Dance...) and were ready to hit the dance floor when Jiri Vasak invited us to all join in. Time passed quickly, and unfortunately, we had to leave to catch the last tram to get back to our hotel.

The next morning, after a great breakfast buffet, we headed for the school where the workshops were to take place. It cannot be far, we thought, since we had booked the hotel closest to the workshop halls. However, when we reached the tram station, we realized that this suburb was not on our map. Well, we do not speak Czech, but we found two schools in 30 minutes. At 9:00 a.m., we walked into the right school, in the meantime, we had grown to a group of about 30 cloggers.

It was great seeing so many friends from last year being back, and we made new friends with cloggers from England and Slovakia. Once there, I put on my clogging shoes, grabbed my tape and was ready to go. My first workshop was a beginner routine to "We Shall Be Free," a nice warm-up routine, which was widely enjoyed. The next hour I spent in the intermediate hall, where Tereza Bachus was teaching. Since the dancers were having a little difficulty with the English calls and we had a problem with the microphone, I exchanged the two intermediate songs and taught the song with the easy sequence first. This proved to be a wise decision, and with a little bit of pantomime, we got on O.K.

After the morning workshops, various competition were scheduled for Saturday afternoon. Since the three of us had not yet seen much of Prague, we left and took a city tour. It was beautiful— lots of buildings, the famous "Jugendstil" Architecture, Carls Bridge with all its artists, and, of course sunshine and ice cream. Time passed quickly, and another evening program was organized by Jiri and Caramella—various exciting performances, the giving-away of the awards for the winners of the various competitions, and even some country comedians. Too soon, we had to catch our tram back.

Sunday, all the dancers were back for a day of more workshops. Back for more—next year, Euroclog will be held in Pilsen, the beer city, from May 2-4, 1997. We will be back!





The dance tradition that began in small mountain communities, first enjoyed the light of stage here in Asheville. It spread to the world, where now clogging teams spot the nation, from Maine to California.

It has grown so popular world-wide that, next to the Biltmore House, the weekly Shindig on the Green at City-County Plaza is Asheville's most popular tourist attraction, said Richard Dillingham, director of the Southern Appalachian Center at Mars Hill College.

Since 1967 the weekly Saturday night outdoor summer event features bluegrass, fiddlers, old time bands and clogging. It seems that everyone but Ashevillians realize the treasure they have, Dillingham said.

The Bailey Mountain

Cloggers out of Mars Hill College have performed at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., and all over the Southeast. The renowned group receives a dozen invitations each year to perform at international festivals from Mexico to Australia, artistic director Barbara Kohler said.

With the 69th annual Asheville Mountain Dance and Folk Festival coming to the Civic Center this Thursday night, Asheville will once again host and showcase the brightest talent in clogging, keeping alive a dance tradition that has a fascinating history and that has slowly evolved through the years.

A Hodgepodge of Cultures: Europeans immigrating to America brought with them their community traditions and music and dance forms. The country dance, popular in Europe, formed the basis of American folk or country dance, but evolved into a form purely American.

While the industrial revolution hampered the development of these traditions around the country, the isolation of small mountain communities allowed the dances to flourish.

This isolation among the communities explains the strong regionalism in mountain style square dancing traditions.

An eclectic dance form, clogging is a masterful mush pot of many cultures that settled in the mountains.

Some figures in mountain dancing and the tunes that accompany them can be traced to the 15th and 16th centuries said Steward Carter, the director of the Asheville's Folk Heritage Committee.

English settlers who tapped out the beat of the music with their wooden clog shoes on cobblestone streets brought their country clog dance to the Appalachians. The Scots-Irish contributed their jig, the French, their contra dance.

From this curious melange of sources developed the big circle

treasure they have, Dillingham Said. Cloggers compete on stage as part of Asheville's Mountain Dance and Folk festival at the Thomas Wolfe Auditorium in the 1950's.

mountain dances and the individual buck dancing and flat-foot dancing.

Put all together, you have a new dance form that traditionally accompanies a fiddle, banjo, mandolin and guitar - a multicultural combination in itself. The banjo was originally an African instrument which, in combination with the European fiddle, creates a sound distinctly Appalachian.

Mountain people danced and played music to entertain themselves. The dance became a focal point for the people. Because they lived so far away from each other, a gathering in a barn or living room provided a place for communication.

Buncombe County resident and jack-of-trades Bascom Lamar Lunsford understood the talent and artistic expressiveness of their craft. While he watched the commercial world stereotype and degrade the people of Appalachia, he fought to defend a spirit and a culture that was truly special.

From Asheville to the World: In the late 1920s, while the dance flourished in small mountain communities, Asheville had become the largest city in the mountains and a growing center of tourism. In 1927, the Board of Trade proclaimed Asheville to be modern, cosmopolitan and culturally diverse.

But within a 20-minute radius of Asheville, a strong rural mountain culture thrived - a culture that Lunsford thought endangered and sought to document and preserve.

Lunsford traveled to the most secluded mountain communities scouring for the talent that grew so naturally among Appalachian people. His recording sessions for the Library of Congress of 315 mountain songs he had learned by heart earned him the name "Minstrel of the Mountains."

Sam Queen, the area's most talented caller out of Maggie Valley, transformed square dancing from personal entertainment to







Sponsoring Your First Clogging Workshop Part IV: Promoting Your Event

With the preliminaries out of the way and a facility reserved, it is time to begin promoting your event. The importance of this cannot be emphasized enough. If you want people to show up, you must let them know about it. It's never too early to start; the sooner, the better.

There are numerous ways of promoting your event, including word of mouth, flyers, advertisements, radio, newspapers, gimmicks, etc. Although you don't want to ever stop "talking up" your event, do not rely on word of mouth, especially for a first time event. People need to see something in writing. It not only adds validity to what you're doing, the printed word can serve as a reminder later if it is saved.

The most popular method of promoting clogging events is with flyers. You have probably seen many. Printing and distributing flyers will be crucial to your event's success.

When developing your promotional flyer(s), be sure to include all of the crucial information prominently. This includes:

This information is vital. It is very frustrating to receive a flyer which lacks the most basic and necessary information or one in which you have to search (in the fine print) for it.

Generally, the more information you provide, the greater your chances are of "seducing" a potential buyer to act and check it out. Don't hesitate to list all of the attractive highlights of your event: Guest instructors, special classes, facility or area attractions, etc. "Different strokes for different folks." Don't assume the one thing you look for in an event is going to attract everyone. From experience, I can say that events I have promoted with detailed flyers drew larger audiences than those with limited information. Marketing studies will support this.

If you provide a lot of information in a very congested, hard to read manner, you will defeat you purpose. Keep the most important information prominent—bold and slightly larger typeface is normally adequate. To provide a lot of information in a presentable manner, professional typesetting is usually required. Remember to bake advantage of the resources in your group. Someone may have experience with promotional layout and design or be able to have our piece typeset at little or no cost.

When reproducing your flyers, always make copies from the original. The quality and legibility of your flyers will decrease dramatically as copies are made from copies made from copies, etc. Many people will make copies of your flyer for their group or friends; you want them to have first generation flyers, so the copies they make will still be of good quality. Keep the color of your paper stock light so the print shows up bold and dark, and they can be easily reproduced. Black on white or yellow have been proven to be the most legible.

Including an eyecatching graphic or logo is always a nice touch. Just be sure the graphic is relevant to what you're promoting. You do not want to confuse or mislead people.

Once you have flyers, don't sit on them—pass them out! Send a supply to all the local groups in your area. Send flyers along with anyone attending another workshop or event. I no one you know is attending a particular event, send a supply about two weeks in advance to the group organizing the event. requesting that they display them. Carry a supply of flyers with you everywhere. Make sure everyone in your group has access to a supply. The subject may come up over dinner at Aunt Millie's and suddenly, you have a captive audience. You need to give them information right then and there. Follow-up with periodic reminders. Mailing flyers can be expensive, but they can pay for themselves providing you mail to selected individuals. If you decide to mail flyers, send one to everyone who ever danced with your group. Those who've dropped out may be intrigued enough to come back and see how your workshop has grown. Once you sponsor your first event, you'll be able to generate a mailing list. Keep building this list year after year. The marketing "gurus" say you should not remove anyone from your list for at least three years. If you haven't heard anything from an individual for three years, you can safely delete them from your list. Other groups may be willing to share mailing lists they've generated, or perhaps you can offer to exchange the list you'll be generating for theirs now.

Depending on the quantity of pieces you're mailing, you may be able to use third class or bulk rate. Different postal rates have different requirements, such as minimum number of pieces or having all pieces pre-sorted by zip/postal code. Check into it. You may be able to save a considerable amount of money.

Although flyers are probably the most effective means of promoting your event, do not exclude other advertising mediums. Depending on where you want to draw your audience from, consider advertising in clogging and other dancing publications. Don't forget to include the vital information listed earlier in all display ads. **Editor's Note**: Send your information to these publications at least three to six months before the event. Many are published quarterly and you may miss a deadline.

During the month or two just prior to your event, advertise on your local radio stations and newspapers. Many radio stations and newspapers will mention events free of charge, especially if you're a non-profit group or you're contributing proceeds to a charitable cause. Posters in local businesses can also be effective.

You want to draw spectators as well as dancers, so don't limit yourself. Spectators generate revenues and who knows, they may show up in your next beginner's class.

Distributing gimmicks, such as candy or trinkets, promoting your event can be effective, however they can also be costly. Tap into the minds of your group for other creative methods. Creativity generally attracts attention, and you want attention. Remember, whatever you do, do it with taste and tact; or you could do yourself more harm than good.

something fun to watch. He formed a team in Maggie Valley called the Soco Gap Dance Team.

This team competed at Asheville's Mountain Dance and Folk Festival which Lunsford introduced in 1927. As the first ever clogging competition and folk festival, it forever changed the face of the dance. Trophies and audience applause for fancy footwork now inspired dancers.

On a national level, the festival became a model for other folk festivals and prompted Lunsford to help establish other festivals around the nation. Lunsford ran the Asheville festival for 46 years until his death in 1973.

Once called "mountain square dancing," the term "clogging" is rumored to have been coined by the Queen of England when the Soco Gap Dance team performed for the English monarchs in their 1939 visit to Washington, D.C. After watching the performance, the Queen remarked that it looked a lot like the English clog dance. The press picked it up and the name stuck. The exhibition marked one of the first times that costumes and taps were used in performance - a standard today.

Since around World War II, steps have become standardized. With the creation of national associations and workshops, regionalism of dances is in danger of extinction.

For years there has been a grand debate between traditionalist, or purist, and contemporary cloggers as to the proper form of the dance. Many stick fast to the original buck and wing dancing to mountain music and shun the popularized precision line dancing to any style of music.

The dance form has survived and flourished in part because of its flexibility. "We are introducing clogging to young students in coordination with popular music - country, rap, rock - and once they are hooked, we reel them back to the traditional music," Dillingham said.

Much of the recent spotlight on clogging stems from the flexibility of the dance form. Canter believes that a balance of the old and the new is healthy. "We need to remember our roots and to teach the next generation the history behind the culture. At the same time, I love to see young people apply it to their music and express themselves."

In 1981, the U.S. House of Representatives proclaimed square dancing as the national folk dance of the United States.

A Form in Peril?: Catherine Proctor, the owner of Mountain Smokehouse Restaurant on South Spruce Street said that 75-80 percent of her customers are tourists. "I don't believe that most local people are aware of the uniqueness of clogging and how people from around the country and world come to observe this mountain tradition."

Anita Sherman, a dancer with the Green Valley Cloggers, moved from her home in Arizona to Western North Carolina so that she could clog Southern Appalachian style.

"I love free style dancing," she said. "Out west you can mostly find only precision clogging. Here you have traditional flatfoot and buck dancing with mountain figures and freestyle - to live music. With live callers, dancers are kept on their toes to find out what the next figure will be."

Proctor said that busloads of international groups from as far as Asia and Europe include on their itinerary an evening of clogging entertainment at her restaurant.

The dance needs to be preserved, Proctor believes. Other counties, such as Madison and Haywood, have incorporated it into their school's physical education curriculum, as it was at one time in Buncombe County. All students used to be on clog teams.

"The Southern Appalachians are a vortex of mountain culture. People all over the world think of this as the region that houses it," Canter said.

Scanning the broad array of trophies accumulated by the Bailey Mountain Cloggers in recent years, Dillingham wishes that more local people appreciated what a strong history Asheville lays claim to. "It's time that we realize what a gem we truly have - something the rest of the world caught onto a long time ago," he said.

Old Dominion Cloggers are also a terrific team of dancers. Justin and Caitlin Low from the Hickory Flat Hoedowners are such great cloggers—they're really going to go places! We felt that it was an honor to be able to perform on the same stage with all of these wonderful cloggers. We'll never forget the fun we had, and the new friends we made. This is what clogging is all about!

Sponsoring Your First Workshop Continued

Promoting your event will be critical to its success. Begin as early as possible and keep promoting it with enthusiasm. Don't ever slow down. The average person receives a considerable amount of new information every day, very little of which is retained for any length of time. We need to hear and see things over and over again in order to remember them. Some people say an individual needs to receive a piece of information at least three times before it makes a real impression, so don't give up. **Promote! Promote! Promote!**

Summer is hot and sticky in Florida, so what could be better than going to summer camp? Going to a CLOGGING summer camp, that's what! Kathy Loviska and the Lighthouse Cloggers set up Camp Clickiwicki at the KOA in Okeechobee again this July and invited all the "Bub Scouts" to join them for a fun weekend.

Last year, several of the Country Fever Cloggers piled into Barb's motor home and set off for the two-hour drive to the Big Lake. The KOA Campground is a fabulous place with two swimming pools (adult and family), places for the kids to play, camping cabins (if you don't do real camping), full hookups for campers, large clean showers, and almost everything you could want in a campground. 


