Dear Bobbie.

It is with some degree of sadness that I must tell you that Omaha Lightnin' Clogging Company is no longer a group. After only two short years in Omaha, I moved to Kansas City, Missouri. As a result, the group did disband—although all members are presently dancing in other groups. As Lightnin', we were a small group, but we were bonded tightly in friendship and in our mutual love of clogging. Although the group is officially retired, the friendship will always remain!

My greatest achievement out of the group is my friend and former student, Doug Van Fleet. A year and a half ago he wanted so badly to learn how to clog and he just couldn't locate an instructor to work with him. When I first met him, a mutual friend of ours suggested to him that I might be able to help. From that moment on he was all smiles and "on fire" to learn to clog. And learn he did! He couldn't get enough! He not only took my open class, but he asked me to give him private instruction as well. He would diligently practice at home (built himself a wooden floor in his garage!) and most anywhere else the opportunity would arise. I've been told that one of his favorite spots is while waiting in line at the grocery check-out! The feet just start moving on their own—especially now that buck steps are familiar to him.

Anyway, I can tell you that as his former instructor, it makes me feel so wonderful to have nurtured Doug's sincere desire to clog and make it a reality for him. I have to laugh because he calls me his clogging guru—a term that I, myself, bestow on "the great" Steve Smith for me. Now I'm hardly a Steve Smith talent or ever will be, but for Doug, I have been able to communicate the breakdown of steps, share the different styles and spend lots of time showing him a little bit of the way. I've really only been the tip of the iceberg in comparison to where I know he will now go with this. In true reality, it has been his own aggressive persistence to learn this dance form that has made it happen for Doug. I just happened to be the particular one to show him a little bit of this and a little bit of that and encourage him to go for it. But it has been Doug's own energetic motivation that has carried him through.

At present, Doug is dancing with another Omaha group and, best of all, is teaching a few students in his own home who need a little extra help and encouragement—students who dance in the same group he now performs in. He's wonderful at it and I couldn't be prouder!

Daytona Beach, Florida by Evon Johnson




End of Summer Round-Up

Partnering Techniques to Make Your Appalachian Figures Look and Feel Better

Boy! It was hard to open my eyes and roll out of that bed this morning, to turn on this high tech computer machine, and to get this November article started. It is one of those wonderful times here in central Florida when Mother Nature flirts with the idea of fall and cooler weather. The air conditioners are temporarily shut down and the windows are wide open. It rained pitter patter all night and into the first hours of the morning, a luscious natural symphony without meter or written score. Music! Music! Music!

One of the Christmas catalogs, of which this household receives about half a ton every year, is advertising a sweatshirt displaying Martha Graham's axiom: "Dance is a song of the body." There is also a sweatshirt that says: "Dance or Die." I tend to relate to that one.

A couple of days ago I talked on the phone with Debi Dillow at Jacksonville who said something to effect: "When I dance, the every day stress load just seems to melt away." Most of us chronic dancers relate to that.

Of course, that every day stress dump may be offset by that certain stress load that comes with donning the mantle of team director/instructor/coach. If you are still hunting for that point in time, space, and circumstance where all your dancers are ecstatically pleased with all the current tunes, routines, outfits, and schedules, take comfort. You are not alone.

So much for preamble and nostalgic meandering. C&C's first order of business is dishing out encouragement to local instructors to take a keen eyed look at the traditional music and dance structures that make up the ole time clogging formations which, when patched together, make up ole time clogging routines. C&C's second order of business is to break down those formations into usable 4-count teaching pods for beginners. If, however, in the exploration of basic partnering efficiency, our competition colleagues discover some overlooked techniques that help smooth out one of their fuzzier formations, then so much the better.

C&C operates in what we define as an exhibition environment: that is, you can mix and match what you know and what your group can execute in any order or timing pattern that works. A whole routine does not have to be taught in one session. Pieces-parts, from partner drills to big circle formations, can be taught in 4-count timed pods and later strung together to make up an exhibition routine.

There are several ways we get introduced to the ole time dance formations:

- 1) We grow up with them.
- 2) On some social occasions we get to do some playparty crash-bash-and-laugh dances (e.g. Sally Goodin and Nine Pin).

- 3) We get to watch some real hotshot free styling team executing a steamroller routine at incredible tempo (free styling including quarter beat poundings on the tops of their toe knuckles. Owee!).
 - 4) We sign up for a workshop.

Number 1 is not likely for most of us. Numbers 2-3 are not conducive to encouraging us into a "I-can-teach-thisstuff-to-my-group" frame of mind. Number 4 is the winner.

Nothing beats a workshop environment. All the carefully written papers in the world do not carry the same learning weight as a workshop with the people that really know what they are doing. But having the paper reference at home when you have the time to think things out, that's when the hardcopy comes in handy.

It's takes some time and research to put yourself in a confident position of control such that, in the beginning, your group gets the feeling that you really know what you are doing. Whether or not you really do is immaterial.


Some of us are across the board dancers. If the music is playing, we're dancing, everything from the simplest "Honor your partner" to the intricacies of the Brazilian tango. All forms of dance teach us something about all other forms of dance.

Before we continue to explore what we need to know about timing ole time clogging formations, let's meander into the ballroom dancing arena and take a look at some of the "pieces-parts" of the enchanting tango.

The tango is, if not the most, at least one of the most intricate and stylized of all ballroom dancing formations. In spite of the intricacies of quick motion and posture extremes, the tango is choreographed in 4-count pods. In ballroom terminology a written tango schedule might look like this:

Euroclog 96

Holiday greetings from Jirka and Jarka Vasakovi and the Caramella clogg dancers.

It has now been 30 days since Euroclog 96 and we can finally sit down to write about it. Euroclog 96 was a hectic 3 days in which 212 dancers from England, Slovak, Denmark, Germany and the Czech Republic met in Prague to enjoy dancing. 





If a tango basic = 4 beats of music, then 2 tango basics = 8 beats of music. If we are choreographing a fancy tango combination that consumes 8 beats of music, we can choreograph 16 beats of music in several ways:

- 1) 2 tango basics (8) + fancy combo (8) = total (16), or
- 2) 1 tango basic (4) + 1 fancy combo (8) + 1 tango basic (4) = total (16), or
 - 3) 1 fancy combo (8) + 2 tango basics (8) = total (16).

If a fancy tango combination uses up 12 beats of music, then the 16 count phrase can be fleshed out with one 4-count tango basic. Tango formation number problems are handled just like ole time clogging formation number problems.

When we watch the tango experts put on a top of the line tango exhibition, we tend to get so overwhelmed with the motion and the stylized presentation, it is easy to lose track of the fact they are working with a dead-bang 8-count phrase.

The same kind of hypnotic awe, when we watch our top of the line clogging teams, sometimes overshadows the fact that they are working with that dead-bang 8-count phrase developed on 4-count pods. We simply get so lost in that expert presentation that how to present this information in easy to chew 4-count pieces seems out of the question.

Essential to a well executed ole time clogging routine for the beginner is the willingness of the choreographer to slow the tempo, simplify the formations, and incorporate 4-count timing pads into his routines such that from time to time his weaker dancers can catch up and the next formations can be instigated with all dancers in balance and ready to proceed.

At the competition level, the well defined partnering setup for the tango is very tight. If you can't feel the whisper of your partner's upper legs against your upper legs, you are not tucked in tight enough. Competitors are going to lose those crucial tenths of a point on the score sheet that mean the difference between first, second, and third placing.

The same kind of judgmental considerations will result in the loss of those critical tenths of a point on the clogging competition floor. A judge will see a lead dancer whipping his partner around in two beats instead of dancing her around in 4 beats. Or see a lead dancer fail to lift his arms high enough to allow his partner to execute her roll without bowing her head or breaking in her back. This will cue a judge to listen for a drop in sound level and quality.

Or a judge hears the sound level deteriorate and knows that a lead dancer is whipping his partner around in two beats instead of dancing her around in 4 beats or the lead dancer has caused his partner to bow her head or break her back. It doesn't matter. Your team just lost a critical tenth of a point.

Back to the tango. Do we start to teach the tango from this tight stylized position? No, we don't. The guys would get glassy eyed and freeze up and the girls would get mad and go home. Every dance form has its beginning level.

In ballroom instruction, we teach the guys and girls from the ground up on separate sides of the rehearsal hall. The guys are taught to move forward using the left foot. The girls are taught to move backward using the right foot. Only after each has had some individual stepping practice, do they get paired up in "closed position" (face to face) as teams.

Before we team them up, however, we teach them how to handle the other team member, a shoulder to shoulder operation. We teach the girls that it is they that ultimately determine how close a guy can dance. She does this by putting her left hand on his right shoulder such that the thumb of her left hand is firmly implanted in the front of his right shoulder joint. She backs up the thumb pressure with her braced shoulder and elbow. From this position, she can fend him off if he comes in too close. Chuck Norris could probably put a name to this move.

Additionally the third finger of her left hand is gently but firmly implanted on the back of the same right shoulder. Essentially, this guy cannot make a move without her knowing that he is going to move.

In answer to our girls having set the dancing distance required, the guys make the latch-up workable. Carrying his right arm weight in his right shoulder, he reaches around his partner's body mass and presses the palm of his right hand into her upper rib cage such that he can feel her left shoulder blade when it moves. Not down on her lower rib cage. And certainly not around her waist. Through well timed pressures of his right palm on her upper rib cage, the lead will "tell" his partner the direction of their next move.

When you watch an experienced ballroom dancing couple present themselves on the dance floor, the latch-up is so smooth it is hard to imagine that it took the instructor 3 paragraphs to explain the move, numerous reminders and repetitive coaching, and 3 months of practice for the dancers to get it right.

In our clogging formations the "closed position" is rarely utilized. Our face-to-face positions are usually at arm's length. Be that as it may, teaching dance formations of any kind where more than one person is involved requires the instructor to be aware of the techniques that are incorporated in well executed upper body and arm movements.

No matter how well the information is presented, when it comes time to coordinate the feet, the arms, and the bodies, these things, especially the upper body moves, are going to have to be re-addressed from time to time. It is always harder to dance with the upper body than the lower body.

On the wall of the dancing studio where I studied many moons ago, over the chest where all the donated and lost dancing shoes were dumped against the day that you forgot or lost your shoes, there was a sign which read: "You moves from your belly button down. You dances from your belly button up." Nothing I've learned since is quite so succinct.

When beginning dancers are concentrating on their feet, their arms forget to perform. If they raise their heads and arms, their feet will tend to forget what they are doing. Those of us who tend to have a rather jolly out look on this dance teaching business refer to this situation as the military syndrome, a "naval blockade". Oops! Another one of those darn puns. Think about it. It'll come to you.







Dancing Contra

by Dan Ward American Squaredance August 1996

This month I am going to answer a reader's request to explain "What is contra dancing."

Historically, Contra dances are older than squares. They come from English Longways dances dating back to the 1600s and perhaps earlier. The term *contra* is derived from the word *contrary*. The dance formation consists of two contrary lines of dancers, literally and physically opposite (contrary) to each other.

The early English dances were truly Victorian in nature. The men all danced in one line, the ladies in the opposite line. What little physical contact there was consisted of a hand touch, not even a hold. The man's palm was turned up and the lady rested her hand in his palm. We continue to see this same position in square dancing today. The promenade and courtesy turns are examples.

Early settlers from England brought this dance form with them, and in many cases, these tended to be same gender dances since the ballroom swing position was not used. In its place dancers used a two hand turn. On of the most popular contra dances of that day was Sir Roger De Coverly. Better known to us as the Virginia Reel.

They are a delightful and uncomplicated form of dancing. For the most part, they use common square dance movement. (Square dances actually took these movements from the contras.) Basic contras use 12 to 15 square dance movements. If one is looking for some challenge, they need look no further than today's contra. Or by contrast, a delightful social dance where you dance with not just eight people in a square, but 15 to 20 people in the line which contra dancers call a "set."

The two basic contra formations most popular today are "Alternates" and "Beckets." In the alternate (duple) formation, partners are in opposite lines facing each other and upon completion of the dance figure move onto the next couple with partners always across from each other. In the Becket formation, your partner is next to you just like a square dance formation and you dance in this position with each couple in turn along the line.

Contras offer the dancer sociability, repeatable dance routines, challenge without complication, all based on no more than eight or nine movements in a complete figure. These are matched to the 64 counts of music just like a square dance singing call.

Contras are gaining popularity throughout the dance community because the dancer can dance in unison with the music, much like a round dance, but using the square dance movements, they are familiar with. My suggestion is, try 'em. You'll like 'em.

Figure

- First couple balance and swing; go down the center and split the ring
- The lady goes right and the gent goes left*
- Everybody swing your corner
- New Corner Allemande Left
- Promenade the one you Swung

Repeat figure for #1 man and each of the remaining women:

- Same old gent and a brand new girl, down the center and away you whirl
- The lady goes right and gent the gent goes wrong, etc.

Repeat all for couple #2

• Use any middle break of your choice, then:

Repeat figure for couples #3 and #4.


• End with closing break of your choice.

Depending on your group, you may wish to go only once through the record without resetting the needle (cutting dance time from about 15 minutes to about 3.5 minutes). If so, use the following sequence.

Opener

- Couple 1, couple 3, middle break, couple 4, couple 2, closer; in that order.
- * After a long (16 count) balance and swing, the designated couple crosses the set and splits the opposite couple. Then they separate and walk around the side couples until they are in a position to swing their current corner. Everybody swings corners.

Sponsoring Your First Clogging Workshop Part V: Working with Volunteers and Staying on Top of Details

Sponsoring a workshop takes a lot of time and energy. Don't ever fool yourself into thinking it's going to be easy. To be successful, you will need a team of "key" dedicated people to share the responsibilities, and you will need to be organized. One person cannot do it all, unless they plan to sacrifice the rest of their activities and devote all of their time to this event. Even then, without the involvement and support of others, your chances of success are limited.

Gather together everyone interested in helping out and accepting some responsibility. The list all of the tasks which need to be done to achieve your goals. Brainstorm with your group for this first-time event, otherwise you're sure to miss some important elements. Areas to include on your list are: promotions, facilities, syllabus, security, hospitality, vendors, sound equipment, registration, advertisements, decorations, instructor liaison, t-shirts, door prizes, etc.

The more areas of responsibility you have and therefore, the more volunteers, each with a small piece of the action, the better off you'll be. If you're fortunate, and have a lot of people involved, break down the responsibilities further. For example, promotions can be divided into 1) flyers (printing, distribution) and 2) other promotions (ads, posters, news releases to radio and television). Granted, this is not always possible due to lack of volunteers.

Your goal should be to have each person take on one task, concentrate all of their efforts on it, and do a fantastic job. You do not want your volunteers to feel burdened with too much to do. This is supposed to be fun. The more responsibility and pressure one has on them, the less likely they are to enjoy doing it and volunteer the next time.

Once you have people assigned to different areas of responsibility, be sure to spell out exactly what it is they are to achieve. Do not take for granted that their idea of "promotions" is the same as yours or the group's. Everyone must understand exactly what their job is and what it is going to entail in terms of their time and effort.

Every team needs a leader to guide them and pull everyone together. Being a leader, however, does not mean being a dictator. There will be occasions when a decision(s) needs to be made and this falls on the shoulders of the leader. However, to keep your volunteers happy and feeling involved, solicit their ideas regularly, and whenever possible, take a group consensus on how something should be handled. Each of us likes to think we know the best way of doing things, experienced or not, but often times, our perspective is not accurate or someone may have a better idea. So, listen to your volunteers. You want them to feel that this is a group effort, as it should be.

Remember, your volunteers are people, too. They have feelings, as well as lives of their own outside of clogging. Everyone needs to feel important and needed. As a group leader, you should stay abreast of what your staff is doing. However, you must let them do their job as they see best. Share your ideas and guide them. However, do not step in and take over. This is a sure way to lose volunteers.

If one of your staff complains they cannot possibly get the job done, do not offer to do it for them. This is a surefire way to get yourself overburdened. Listen to them, empathize with them, offer suggestions. However, make it clear it is their responsibility to decide on a solution. It they cannot get their job done, they need to find someone who can. As group leader, you must delegate the responsibilities and let your staff do their jobs. The only time you want to step in and "take over" is if something has completely run amuck or someone is deliberately doing their own thing instead of what they were assigned to do.

Whenever possible, let your staff know they are appreciated, and you're glad they are a part of your group. If people do not feel appreciated, you're not going to get them back next time.

Besides people, sponsoring a successful event requires a lot of organization. For some of us, being organized comes naturally. For others, it takes work. It is the leaders responsibility to stay on top of the "big picture." The leader needs to oversee the volunteers, assure that deadlines are met, and pull everyone together.

One tool that is helpful in doing this is a "lead time" schedule.

A typical lead-time schedule looks something like this:

My lead-time schedule lists every task, no matter how small, that needs to be completed. I have found this to be a very effective and necessary tool for a top-notch event. By referring to my schedule regularly and keeping it up-to-date, I can monitor our achievements and make sure everything is getting done. It's a good practice to provide each of your key staff people with a copy of the lead-time schedule, so they always know when their deadlines are.

You can have a top-notch event and have fun putting it together, if you remember a few basic things: 1) delegate responsibilities, 2) remember that your volunteers are people, too, and have many of the same needs as you. Listen to them and let them know they are appreciated, and 3) stay organized. Workshops are not easy to put together, but you can make them less difficult by following these few basic tips. You'll then be well on your way to a successful event.




