There's Music in the Hills





America's Clogging Hall of Fame Inducts Three New Members

The American Clogging Hall of Fame inducted three new members into their ranks of notables at their fall meeting in October, at Maggie Valley, North Carolina.

Samye Arthur

In the early seventies, Samye Arthur accompanied her husband, George, as he went about the country teaching clogging. She was always there to lend a helping hand. She would take care of the music, help confused dancers or just step onto the floor to assist whoever needed her.

As time passed many of these dancers wanted to start a team just for the enjoyment of getting to travel to different communities and fellowship with others who loved southern Appalachian clogging. These trips took the River City Cloggers of Huntington, West Virginia to Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and throughout the entire state of West Virginia.

Samve has danced with four teams. She made all of the appointments, scheduled the performances, designed all of the costumes as well as handling all the arrangements for the trips that took them to various competitions and benefit performances. When she and her husband were invited to Maggie Valley for the first meeting of the American Clogging Hall of Fame by founder, Dan Angel, the input she gave at this meeting served as the ground work for the annual competition. She performed at the first Hall of Fame annual competition and won first place for her age group in solo competition. Her fondest memories of competition were when she performed with her dance team The West Virginia Mountain Mamas. She has never missed an annual Hall of Fame meeting or dance off, and is available for whatever job needs to be done.

Lou Maiuri

The information on the second inductee to the American Clogging Hall of Fame is provided in a letter from his wife, Jessie Maiuri.

"My husband loved dancing long before I ever knew him. We have been married 48 years. He began his clogging classes with the CBS Travelers. Believe me, he would start dancing from the time his feet hit the floor in the morning. He worked hard and put in long hours until the CBS Travelers asked him to join their team. Traveling to competitions with them one year, he and his young partner won overall grand champion for their buck-and-wing in their age category in West Virginia.

In 1990, Lou decided he wanted to form his own team which was called Appalachian Country Cloggers and they competed up and down the east coast. Presently he is a certified judge, and is chairman of the Hall of Fame spring and fall workshops. He also holds the position of Treasurer of ACHF, and was instrumental in establishing the Sloan Dance Off.

For the past two years, Lou has been employed by the WV State Parks Division teaching workshops for the guests who come to the parks as a group, camping, or alone. He finds this very rewarding and a fun

thing to do. This allows him to meet many people from all walks of life and from many different states. Anytime he can, he is more than willing to help any team who asks for his help. The main thing he has tried to maintain is to keep alive the old time heritage of clogging and square dancing."

Richard Dillingham

Richard was born in the Mars Hill area on a small tobacco farm about three miles from the Mars Hill Campus. He grew up with four brothers and sisters and claims about a hundred and fifty first cousins in the immediate area. He also claims a total of 20,000 cousins in a thirty mile radius from the Mars Hill College. Growing up in the rural community based on the farm, there was no boredom whatsoever, and with church and school, he had to really look for ways to get in trouble. As a teenager he would walk with his friends and cousins to Mars Hill on Saturday night for the square dances. Not only were the dances themselves fun but you were able to walk your girlfriend to and from them. His first paying job was working for the college physical plant as one of about five window washers.

Richard came to Mars Hill College as a student when it was a junior college and graduated with a AA degree. Soon after, he was drafted into the Army and spent time in Vietnam. When he came home, Mars Hill had upgraded to a senior college and he returned to get his bachelors degree in English. His ambition at that time was to be a writer and he wrote many short stories and even plays about things, places and people

he never knew. His professor put him on the track of writing about things he knew. His first project was a fiddle player who had lived down the road from him. While doing research on this and many other stories, he was noticed by the Mars Hill College staff and was asked to establish a museum and records center based at the college about the local community and it's history.

Until recently, Richard was the director and all around parent to the performers of the Bailey Mountain Cloggers. He would spend his days in the museum he created and his nights watching over his dancers as they prepared for performances. If any of his dancers had problems in classes or just general life problems, he would have the answer. Although he spent many days with his dancers, they still did not know much about him? When asked when he was born he would say "when the mountains were hills". When asked where he had been born, he would simply answer, "My Momma said a buzzard laid me on a rock and the sun hatched me". His dancers know him only as a man who has spent a lifetime of preserving the mountain heritage and as a special friend to all of them.

Richard now spends his time still helping the students he adores and continues to gather information about the surrounding area of the Appalachians. He is preparing for the 150th anniversary of the college in 2006. He also hopes to publish some of the short stories and plays he has written about his home here in the Southern Appalachian Mountains.

The Miner's Dance

By Robert Lee Cook, Boulder, CO Reprinted from American Square Dance Magazine from Sets in Order September, 1971

If we wanted to do a structural outline of the development of the Frontier Dance, it would look like this:

1598-1841: Sprouting and budding. 1841-1890: Blossoming and bearing

1890-1910: Going to seed.

1910-1930: Going to Hell, a dying dance

1930-1955: New blossoming, hybrids,

at its peak.

1955-NOW: The modern strain. going... where?

The full story of the Frontier Dance can merely be touched in this brief essay, and I am acutely

aware of how much I am leaving untold.

1841-1890 was

the Golden Age of the Frontier Dance. A11 that was really exciting and interesting happened in that time

rounds, couples dances, quadrilles, the development of the wild squares. Interesting influences came in with European immigrants, and more influences and variations came in from New England and the mid-Atlantic states. After the Civil War very important things would come up from Texas and New Mexico. and would continue to come from the Midwest. Mining and cattle barons would introduce new "high sassity" dances from English and New York ballrooms, and western America would enjoy dancing such as not been seen since, except for a few 20th century people such as Pappy Shaw and Herb

Greggerson.

A whole long book could be written about this period, tracing all the influences, borrowings, graftings, changes, inventions, variations, and brainstorms. During this period several strains of the Frontier Dance developed simultaneously, always overlapping and borrowing from each other, and yet each in some ways being entirely itself. Such a strain (and some, a non-strain) was the dance of the miners.

The great panic of 1857 reduced much of the U.S. to near despair. Frightened, restless, desperate people hoped for any sort of miracle that would put food on their tables, money in their purses, and bring then some measure of economic security. In the several little settlements

Gregory and other did find gold, and

"The sounds approach bedlam, rendering conversation impossible and the music, such as it is, blessedly unhearable." From a report sent from Blackhawk, Colorado, by an eastern journalist.

> Denver, Colorado, there were less than a hundred people (some half dozen of whom were women) in the summer of 1858. That summer a few dollars worth of gold flakes and dust were painstakingly panned from some of the tributaries of the South Platte River. Word filtered back to Missouri, set fire to the marsh grass of economic depression and caused the whole Missouri valley to explode, launching in to the skies that greatest of all hot air balloons, the Pike's Peak Gold Rush!

> Of the 150,000 people said to have set forth for the Pikes Peak gold fields in 1859, perhaps two-thirds completed

their journey, the others turning back

defeated by distance or else by the cries of "Hoax!" and "Humbug!" from those who had already discovered that Pikes Peak wasn't made out of solid gold. But that 100,000 arrived, and more after them, coming from all over the U.S. Besides bringing desperation, hope, and fantastic greed, they also brought dances from every state in the Union. settlements sprang up along the Platte. A few daring farmers broke the soil and found that the Great American Desert really would grow crops. Jackson and

Horace Greeley himself came out to

investigate, going back east to spread the word that there really was gold as well as a rich agricultural potential.


And the gold definitely was there, if not in the quantities mentioned in tall tales. In 1859 Jackson found gold at Idaho Springs, Gregory at Black Hawk, the Boulder Party at Gold Hill - all within

50 miles of what was to become Denver. In the following years rich strikes were made in many other parts of Colorado, in Utah, in Idaho, Montana, Nevada and the Black Hills. Gold and silver meant people and towns railroads and commerce and farms, ranches and gardening.

Thus, the Pikes Peak Gold Rush - born largely of myths, found largely to be untrue by most of the gold-seekers, and never in all the years since nearly as productive as we romantically like to think it was - caused two strains of the Frontier Dance to blossom. One of them



(the dance of the Miners) never really amounted to much because it was very soon swallowed and engulfed by the other strain which was to become the dominant strain which was to become the dominant one until 1930. Whatever was later grafted onto it, out of Texas or New Mexico or the Eastern U.S., the Frontier Dance - and the American Square Dance - would always be chiefly the dance of the clodhopper, the sodbuster, the farmer.

Nobody gave a hang about dancing during the earliest days of the Gold Rush. The early frontier camps, as had been those in California, were rough, primitive, and without women. Gold was all that mattered, and no one who had spent 14 to 16 hours a day working a Long Tom, a Rocker, a gold pan or a pick had any energy left for anything more difficult than stumbling to his bed. A lot of miners, of course, spent an additional few hours in one of the many saloons, which made dancing even more possible.

Much has been made in fiction, films, and general tradition of the "dance hall girl", and some will argue

with these lusty and busty women. They first appeared in the mining towns, stayed for the railroad boom and the cattle boom, and became so important a part of western life that as recently as last week they were causing a great deal of worry for a grand jury in Denver.

As soon as a mining settlement began to form, three situations almost instantly appeared: the saloon, the gambling tent, and the dance hall. One of our Colorado towns, just six weeks after its local rush began, boasted a population of two-thousand six-hundred (of which two-thousand five-hundred eighty were males), eight saloons, three dance halls,

five gambling tents. There were also two undertakers. In another six weeks an additional thirty or more "girls" had arrived. The first church was not built until the next year.

Let's forget the romantic hokum of the movies. The "girls" were seldom girls, did not prance around in cancan costumes, and were not hired primarily to dance, and seemed to have an average weight of about 200 pounds. They were nothing mote than the original B-girls of the Wild West, and their descendants in our own Go Go Era are tame, pale, and decorous in comparison. The clumsy grotesque dances in which they most often engaged with the miners were a far cry from the saloons of the East Coast, and are colorfully described in a report sent from Black Hawk, Colorado, by an eastern journalist:

"The sounds approach bedlam, rendering conversation impossible and the music, such as it is, blessedly unhearable. Some of the ladies of the establishment join with some of the less inebriated customers in what is purported to be dancing, but indeed seems more akin to some savage and aboriginal fertility rite."

But some interesting dancing was done in the dance halls. The min-

ers, coming as they did
from all over the eastern United States,
represented a rich
mixture of backgrounds, origins,
and cultures.
Wastrel sons of
famous Newport
families mingled
with the dregs of
the Missouri River
fronts. Sturdy, moral

Midwest farm boys worked side by side with hardened cynical men from the California diggings. Men with high standards and possessing fine educations went into partnerships with fugitives from every sort of justice and with dropouts from eastern failure. The society of the early mining towns was largely classless (except in terms of who had money and who did not), and even the financial status of a

per-son DANCE
was subject to instant change according to

change according to individual luck at the sluice box or at the gambling table.

Such a hodgepodge of dancing backgrounds, and most of the dances were to some degree - attempted in the dance halls. Each hall had one or more fiddlers as well as a hired or volunteer "prompter". The classier joints often had a "dancing master", although this occurred later in the mining period. Early in the evening, before the whiskey fumes had become too heady, simple quadrilles or squares were done - *very* - simple, because the miners were already tipsy, the girls overweight, and the place a bedlam of noise.

In the earlier years (1860-1870) these dances were the same simple dances being done in the east - Midwest and Appalachian figures, strong touches of New England, some figures from the south. Style was the important thing, and some quite prodigious jigging, pigeonwinging and prancing took place, depending on where the dancer was from and how well he knew his regional style. Thus, the four men in a single set usually had four different styles (the girls had mostly one: fat), and each proceeded to hoe down the other three. The dances and calls themselves seem hardly to have been worth noting (and indeed, no one seems to have bothered to note them all), but the matter of "style" had definitely come to the frontier and would thrive there until as recently as 1948 or so. when regional styles became swallowed up in the nationwide Universal Shuffle.

CLOGGING MADNESS!

hour to write their routine. Each dancer was given a sheet with the breakdown of the music, corresponding lyrics, and the sequence of the 2:14 minute song.



SPECIAL AWARD - Good Sport Lunatics "for making a complete

spectacle of themselves" - Marcia Rice's team. (Cracker Jacks)

STEP BY STEP

How to add Clogging Madness to your workshop program!


1. Make arrangements with the workshop board to put Clogging Madness on the schedule and print

it in the syllabus. Ours was scheduled after the last workshop and before the diehard dance (nothing else was going on so everyone could attend). Also schedule one hour at the beginning of the day, prior to the workshop, to get the teams together for instructions and practice. Make sure you have a sound system available and someone who can run it.

- 2. Twist a few arms to get instructors to be team captains. Let them select their team members. Make sure they all know when everyone is to report for the initial hour and what time the actual event happens. It is helpful if the instructor is comfortable writing dances and cueing.
- 3. Make sure each team has the same number of dancers. You don't want

to run out of prizes!

4. Start the practice hour on time. Discuss what will happen, pass out the dance sheets and pencils. Tell them to listen to the music, write down steps they would be comfortable dancing and that they think would fit the music. Each team will write their own dance. Also, pass out a sheet of paper with the instructor/team captain's name at the top. Ask them to print each team member's name on the sheet and pass it back. You will use this information later to fill out

the certificates, so be sure to read it during this hour to make sure it is legible.

- **5.** Let them know they will be judged. Use the "audience applause" panel of judges who will be looking for: variety of steps, danceability, originality and presentation, with creativity a plus.
- **6.** Play the music over and over again. We did not give the music to any of the teams, so each only had one hour with the music.
- **7. Answer any questions** over the sound system so that everyone may hear the answer.
- 8. Make sure to repeat the TIME OF THE EVENT so all will be present... and that there will be prizes, but don't tell them what the prizes are unless you are giving away big bucks! Practice is over.

9. During the regular workshop, announce the time and location of Clogging Madness so you'll have your panel of judges and an audience.

10. HOUR OF CLOGGING MAD- NESS! Play the music so that everyone can hear the lyrics. This will allow them to hear the theme of the music and be better able to judge how creative the dancers are. Have your photographer take pictures.

11. Have each team dance their routine. The instructor has the option of

dancing while cueing (wireless mic needed) or cueing from the stage.

- **12.** Line all teams up for judging. Most applause wins. Team members may not applaud for themselves.
- 13. Use the sign-in sheets to write in the names of the winners on the award certificates. (We filled in the certificates while we were conduction the yodeling contest... this was open to anyone in the room team dancers or audience.)
- 14. Have the award ceremony and tell the

losing teachers to report to the stage where you can quietly give them instructions about what is to follow.

15. Bring the winning instructor on stage to cue the winning dance to all the dancers in the room. While they are cueing, have the losing instructors dress them in a lovely suit of toilet paper and anything else that you can devise! Start the music and let the fun begin!

After the event, you may want to print extra pictures and send them to the participants as a thank you.



The Big Circle Dance

Small Circle Figures to Keep You Dancing Appalachian Style

by Lou Maiuri Glascow, WV

In the December, 1998 issue of *The Double Toe Times*, I shared with you some Big Circle Appalachian figures. Once every other couples has led to the right to face the next couple in line, you can perform the following small circle figures.

Note: Phrases in ALL CAPS denote the words the caller will say. The following notes in upper and lower case explain the motions associated with the call.

RIGHT HANDS ACROSS

RIGHT HANDS ACROSS AND HOW DO YOU DO

Do a right handshake with the person opposite you turning clockwise as you go.

LEFT HAND BACK AND HOW ARE YOU

Put your left hand in and circle counterclockwise and wait for the next call

BIRD IN THE CAGE

BIRD IN THE CAGE WITH SIX HANDS AROUND

Odd lady steps into the center and the remaining three people join hands and make a ring around her and circle clockwise.

BIRDIE OUT AND THE OLD CROW IN

Lady out and the gent hops in OLD CROW OUT AND JOIN THE

RING

Gent takes his place in the circle and waits for the next call.

ELBOW SWING

GENTS TO THE CENTER WITH AN ELBOW SWING

All drop hands and the two gents step into the center and do a right elbow swing.

OPPOSITE LADY SAME OLD THING

Gents move to opposite lady and do a left elbow swing.

GENTS TO THE CENTER WITH AN ELBOW SWING

Gents do a right elbow swing.

BACK TO YOUR PARTNER WITH A LEFT ELBOW SWING

Gents give their partner a left elbow swing, then wait for the next call.

TAKE A LITTLE PEEK

ODD COUPLE OUT AND TAKE A LITTLE PEEK

Odd couple separates and moves outside and just beyond the opposite couple and peeks at each other.

BACK TO THE CENTER AND SWING THAT SWEET

Odd Couple moves back home and swings.

AROUND THAT COUPLE AND PEEK ONCE MORE

Odd couple repeats action.

BACK TO THE CENTER AND CIRCLE UP FOUR

Back out and circle, waiting for the next call

CHASE THE RABBIT

CHASE THE RABBIT, CHASE THE SQUIRREL

CHASE THAT PRETTY GIRL AROUND THE WORLD

Both couples drop hands and odd gent chases his partner between the even couple and around the even lady and back to place.

CHASE THE 'POSSUM, CHASE THAT COON, CHASE THAT CRITTER OVER THE MOON

Odd lady chases her partner between the even couple and around the even gent and back to place.

Wait for the next call.

DIVE FOR THE OYSTER

DIVE FOR THE OYSTER

With all hands joined, the Odd couple dances under an arch made by the opposite couple and backs up to place. NOW DIG FOR THE CLAM

Motion repeat by the opposite couple.

DUCK FOR THE HOLE IN THE OLD TIN CAN

Active couple ducks under and arch made by the opposites, they drop hands and the lady dances around the opposite gent while the gent dances around the opposite lady and back to place. Opposites must turn under their own arch.
