Bill Nichols played the dulcimer, Boo Ruch was there, as well as Bobbie and Dewey Paul (super-nice people), who gave Jeff his first opportunity to teach. They, plus all the instructors, filled us in on the beginnings of clogging, which came from square dancing. When people didn't have partners, they started to line and big circle dance. Chip told us he was the first person to do a competition with rock music and the first to NOT wear costumes to perform.

In our pajamas we did big circle dances called by Bill Nichols, some old-time squares by Jeff, plus lots of clogging. There was a hilarious skit, exhibitions, lots of dancing, and NO competitions - just dancing! The Grass Stains – a super bluegrass band with Jeff Driggs' brother on banjo - played, accompanied by Jeff on guitar and Tandy on her washtub. We finished off the evening being entertained by Naomi and Jeff doing a "routine" to "Yankee Doodle". The time went WAY too fast, and before we knew it we were heading home to chilly Minnesota. Luckily the hurricane that invaded the east coast didn't hit us, in fact, we had perfect weather.





Sitting in a restaurant at the Aladdin Resort in Las Vegas with the most talked about act in clogging can be a humbling experience. Trying to have a conversation among the ringing cell phones and passers-by asking for autographs, posing for pictures or just chatting about the show and clogging can get almost comical. Who'd have thought just a few years ago that cloggers would be able to gain this kind of recognition?

Called ALL THAT, this percussive foursome developed an act and a persona that has garnered them a slew of young admirers, a series of instructional videos and a website, plus appearances on television's 30 Seconds to Fame, Dance Fever and this month a shot at the network's hit Star Search. To top it off, three of the group are appearing in the Vegas Show Ovation at the Aladdin Resort and Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada.

I have known all of these guys since they were nearly beginner cloggers. Both Brian Staggs and Delohn Collins came from the Middletown, Ohio clogging scene and were greatly influenced by the styles of Brent Montgomery and Burton Edwards. Mike Curtis started clogging in his early teens with Steve Smith around Lexington, Kentucky. All three have impressive competition resumes both with a team and as solo champions, and Mike Curtis has been making a name for himself in the workshop circuit the last few years. Together, along with colleague Mark Clifford of South Carolina, they have formed the alliance that has given the modern style of competition clogging tremendous exposure.

While Mark Clifford continues his highly successful studio-teaching in the Carolinas, Mike, Delohn and Brian are heating up the Vegas stage with their energetic and rhythmic clogging and percussive dance show. I took time to talk to the trio in Las Vegas in December. The competition clogging community tends to place it's champions on pretty high pedestals, and there is no shortage of stories about talented young men and women whose winning ways onstage were overshadowed by their egotistical and destructive paths offstage. The one thing that you walk away with after spending time with these guys is that they genuinely sense the role they are playing as spokesmen for the art of clogging and they take it very seriously. Sure, they are three young men thrust into the play capital of America. But, they know how they got there and are working hard to please their audiences and







performing on Dance Fever – liked us – and got in tough with Laura ???? from the show who found someone who had worked on Dance Fever. From there they contacted us and asked us to come and try the show out for a while, then made us an offer. We did and we loved it, and they loved us and here we are!

DTT: Tell us about your segment in the Ovation show. Delohn Collins: We have about a seven minute segment in the show where we perform one of the routines from Dance Fever, the Justin Timberlake routine "Rock Your Body." Then we do an A Capella routine for 3 minutes or more. There is a drummer in the show who does a percussive challenge with us, and then we do a new routine to a song called "This is How We Do It," by the Big Timers.

DTT: How do you like the Las Vegas audiences and how do they respond to your portion on the show?

Mike: The crowds here have been awesome and everyone receives us incredibly well. We were a little nervous having been on television and then being here and seeing how people might react to a live show. It's amazing to see the stereotype that people have of clogging and then see their reaction to us from the television show and now seeing clogging live on stage. I think people are generally misinformed about the sport of clogging and it's great to see people's reactions and have their perceptions changed. It's great to us if we are able to help the sport of clogging in any way.

DTT: CLOG's National Convention was just here in Vegas over Thanksgiving weekend and I know a lot of cloggers came to see the show. Could you tell a difference dancing to a clogging crowd and did it pump you up to see all those clogging faces out there in the audience?


Brian: The announcer mentions Dance Fever in our introduction and we usually get good applause based on that, but when the cloggers were here and they first said our name, the place just went crazy. Most of the audiences are really good to us, but the cloggers were on their feet and really having fun. It's just great to dance for people that know what we are doing and are supportive like that.

DTT: I know that each of you as individuals comes from a strong competition background and have been solo champions. How did you go from that to the group we know as ALL THAT?

Delohn: We just got tired of beating each other up (group laughs) is the best way we explain it. For the couple of years, Mike would win one overall then I would and then Brian or Mark would and it went back and forth between us and a few others and finally we four sit down and said "Why are we dancing solo against each other all the time, why not join together in a group and bring each of our styles together and be ALL THAT we can be?" That's how the group came about and how we got the name. We wanted to take clogging for us to the next level, and as a group break stereotypes to show people that clogging can be done to all kinds of music, and it's not all about wooden shoes and big frilly skirts for the girls. You can be decent-looking guys and dance to cool music and have a cool style and not be thought of as less than a man for dancing. We hope people see (Continued on page 14)

that there are cool people in clogging and it's just a big family out there.

DTT: You mentioned Mark Clifford as part of the original group ALL THAT. Why is he not a part of the act here in Las Vegas?

Mike: Mark is still very much a part of ALL THAT. He had a decision to make – just like the rest of us – when the offer was made to move out here. Mark had obligations that tied him down and he decided not to make the trip and we decided we could. It was simply timing and Mark didn't choose to be a part of this opportunity but he is still very much a part of ALL THAT. He is the fourth member and there no plans to change that any time in the near future.

DTT: What is it like for three Midwestern guys to find themselves living in the big city of Las Vegas? Brian: It's totally different than what any of us were use to, but we like it. It can be easy to let the nightlife overtake you. Every here moves so fast. You have to watch who you deal with because in a show business town, everyone is pretty much out for themselves. We love it out here, though and are having a great time. DTT: All of you have been active in the competition

and workshop worlds. Now that you are here full time, will the members of ALL THAT still be making appearances at competitions and workshops?

Mike: Yeah, definitely. Like Brian said, we are having a ball out here, but the one thing that we all agree on is how much we miss our homes back East and how much we miss seeing our clogging friends on a regular basis. There is no way we can cut those ties. I still have workshops planned next year and I will honor those and we will still plan to make competitions with our teams. We may not be at as many as we would like, but we can't walk away from it. It's what got us here.

DTT: One last question... A lot of cloggers have seen your success throughout the years in clogging, last year on television, and now here in Las Vegas. Is there anything you would like to say to the readers of the Double Toe Times who have followed your journey or may be just finding out about ALL THAT?

Brian: I would just like to say that I think in this past year the door has been kicked open for clogging in a big way for a lot of people and anything is possible. If you have a dream, follow it. It is possible. This is a dream for us that came true. Your dreams can come true, just keep on dancing.

Delohn: I want to say thanks to all of the friends and cloggers who have supported us through this year. We got so many phone calls and emails and messages from cloggers saying "Good luck" and "Tear it up" and "We know you can do it." After the show we saw so many people at events that said thanks for showing clogging in this way and in such a positive way. To this day we get people that thank us for what we are doing and really,

we should be thanking you. You supported us the whole time and we love you for it and thank you so much.


Mike: Basically, we can say thank you again and again, but we can't express enough how much it means to us that people are behind us in what we do. When we got together to do this, it was to further the sport of clogging and not any of us individually or the group ALL THAT. It was your opinions that mattered most when we started and we continue to look to our friends in clogging for support. 



Clogging

Historically, clogging in America began in Appalachia and evolved into a highly complex cultural dance involving specific equipment, competitions and organizations that have scholarship programs and professional dance teams. Clogging is an American folk dance that began in the United States around the 1900's. It has strong connections to the step dance of the British Isles brought to the region by white settlers, and the solo "buck and wing" dance of the African American culture. In Appalachia, this form of percussive dancing is often only known as "buck dancing," "flat" or simply dancing. In the United States, clogging is divided into two major forms: Traditional Appalachian flatfoot dance and Precision (or modern) clogging. Appalachian clogging still can be found in western North Carolina, West Virginia, southwestern Virginia, and other places in the southern Appalachian Mountain region. Interest in the Appalachian style of dance was extensively revived in the late 1970's and early 1980's by the Green Grass cloggers. Precision (or modern) clogging was created around World War II, and is danced to a variety of music which includes rock, pop, rap, and country—western. Teams of such cloggers tend to wear elaborate costumes and shoes which have the jingle taps that create the distinctive sound associated with the dance style. Precision clogging applies emphasis on unity of movement and sound be requiring everyone to clog the same step at the same time on the same beat. This fact allows some comparison between clogging and tap dancing, although in

clogging, the emphasis is on the rhythm of the heels rather the toes.

There are some materials that are required for proper clogging. Without these specific materials it would not be possible for a person to advance in the world of clogging. Traditional attire is usually worn in square dance and hoedown routines. In the beginning, traditional attire consisted of mostly checkered material. The ladies would wear dresses with skirts and petticoats, the gentlemen would wear dress pants and a checkered shirt with a tie to coordinate their outfits with those of the women. Sometimes a apron on the ladies dress and a bib on the gentlemen's shirt was added for final touch. Now that tradition attire has changed. Outfits now are made with sequins, fringe, and shiny material that is intended to catch the eye of the audience. The traditional music of clogging has not changed much over time. Square dancers still dance to traditional faster tempo bluegrass breakdowns that are played by a string band typically featuring a fiddle, banjo, and guitar. The music is played by a live band, Compact Disc, or tape. Clogging taps are very different from traditional tap shoe taps. Tap shoe taps are completely flat, while clogging taps are slightly different. There were many different taps that have been used in the past. The first clogging tap was the Marbol Tap. It was a solid metal tap that was held on by screws. The second tap was the Continental Jingle tap. It was a solid tap that was screwed on with a round cut out and had a hole that one could place a penny into to make the jingle sound. The third type of tap made was called the Staccato Tap. The fourth taps were the Steven's Stomper. It consisted of two metal pieces that were held on by rivets and then tacked onto the sole of the shoe. The tap was tacked on and the two metal pieces were held on the shoe with a single rivet. The fifth taps used were called the Bell Tap. It was two metal pieces that were placed together and tacked on the shoe. Each of these different taps gives out a unique sound. Cloggers wear special shoes and taps that make the art of clogging stand out from other types of dancing. Years ago, European

cloggers wore wooden shoes called "Clogs". Now they wear Jazz style oxford shoes that are made of soft leather with a wooden heel. Most standard clogging shoes appear in the colors white and black. Other colors may be special ordered to the dancer's individual preference. One of the most popular clogging shoe brand is Stevens. Quite a number of years ago, Walt and Marti Stevens formed the Burlington County 4-H Cloggers in Mount Holly, New Jersey. Walt was an engineer and his wife, Marti, was a teacher. The couple had been leaders in the 4-H program for many years before they decided to devote their time to clogging. Walt had always loved the dance and was taking lessons to improve his dancing technique while teaching other dancers what he had learned. The couple decided that it would be great to create a 4-H Clogging show team. The club grew quickly and has performed all over the world in places such as: France, Germany, and the Netherlands. At the time the club began, clogging taps were made from cast aluminum. This posed a problem for cloggers because they would frequently crack. Walt had the idea to make the taps from steel. This was an absolute revolutionary idea. The taps would be stronger and have a better sound. The strength of steel also allowed them to be thinner and have a better tap action. Dancers like to call them "fine musical instruments for your feet." The new taps caught on quickly and cloggers began to ask for additional supplies.

Competitions are very important to a clogger's growth. For a dancer to advance to the next level, they must enter and succeed against other artists. These opportunities give someone a chance to meet other dancers and teams. Also it gives them the confidence they need to be a winner. The Middle Tennessee competitions are very different from the East Coast's way of competing. Middle Tennessee clogging competitions are usually held at Bluegrass Festivals. Most of these competition categories only have clogging solos and traditional square dancing in which to compete in. Three dance judges are chosen to judge these

events. Solo clogging judges judge on the following: expression, execution, clarity of your "lick," showmanship, creativity, rhythm, timing, and authenticity. In this type of clogging competition dancers are enter by age brackets. Cloggers dance to a live bluegrass band and get to choose a breakdown song and tempo. All dancers must dance for a total of forty-five seconds in solo competition. The three dancers with the highest points given by the judging staff are rewarded with first, second, and third place. They will receive either prize money, a Trophy, ribbon, plaque or a combination. In square dancing, judges judge on traditional dance sets performed by four couples. The judges grade dancers on costume, mannerisms on and off stage, and perfection of lines, circles, and figures. Square dancing is also judged on expression, execution, clarity of your "lick," showmanship, creativity, rhythm, timing, and authenticity. These dancers must perform sets such as ocean wave, bridle o' john, lady round lady, and cowboy loop. Competitions generally require a four to five minute routine. The three dancers with the highest points received are rewarded with first, second, and third place. All teams placing will either get either prize money, a Trophy, ribbon, plaque or a combination. In the East Coast solo competitions three or more judges are chosen to judge the dance competitions. They judge on expression, execution, clarity, showmanship, creativity, rhythm, timing, and authenticity. Dancers are broken up by sex and ages. They will dance to traditional bluegrass breakdowns played by compact disc or tape. Songs and tempo are not optional. Dancers are called into the stage according to their sex and age to perform for the panel of judges. These dancers will perform a "rise and shine" consisting of the dancers all dancing at one time in a line then circling around together and dancing out solo when your number is called by the judges. Each solo dancer will dance out for approximately fortyfive seconds and then they go back to there place in line. When everyone's number has been called they let everyone dance at once until the judges give the OK for the next group of competitors. The three finalists with the highest scores based on by the judging staff are called up for first, second, and third

place. These dancers will all receive a trophy, ribbon, or plaque.

The East Coast's square dance competitions are broken down into different types of square dance routines. There are rules for each type the specifies such requirements as different sets one can and can not do, and how many times one can circle up. Some of the categories are country hoedown, four or more couple hoedown, and Kentucky running set hoedown.

There are many clogging organizations. Some are ACHF (America's Clogging Hall of Fame), CCA (Clogging Champions of America), and the South Carolina Clogging Council just to name a few. These groups are dedicated to the preservation and heritage of clogging and are very well know in the

clogging world.

ACHF (America's Clogging Hall of Fame) is located in Maggie Valley, North Carolina. Competitions and workshops are held in Maggie Valley at the Stompin' Grounds annually. ACHF was founded in 1981 by Dan and Sandy Angel for the main principle of honoring the dance's past leaders and providing a location for dancers to come together and dance. ACHF is an organization that sanctions a system of dance competitions where teams and dancers can qualify to compete in a grand champion dance-off each October at the Stompin' Grounds. A team placing first of second in one of these sanctioned competitions qualifies to compete at this dance-off which consists of two days filled with dancing and competing. The first dance off was held in 1984.

In ACHF events, there are 19 sanctioned categories which are composed of nine traditional couple categories, five open couple categories and five other categories. A panel of five judges and a rules official manage at the dance—off. In addition to team competitions, ACHF features male and female solo competitions in which grand champion winners compete against each other for the Sloan Family Award. The first place over-all male and female winners are featured in one performance with the Opry Square Dancers at the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, Tennessee.

ACHF also chooses an All-American team each year. The All American team is selected thorough a nominating and selection process in which twenty—four of our best dancers are chosen. They show the most dedication, teamwork, and talent. They are nominated by there directors and chosen by committee. These dancers are showcased at the annual grand championship dance-

off in October. A unique Millennium Team was also selected to represent ACHF and its commitment to preservation and competition in year 2000.

Each year 3 dancers are inducted into America's Clogging Hall of Fame. These inductees have been clogging for at least 25 years and have been a positive influence on the preservation of

Clogging.

Scholarships are also given to at least three worthy Students entering college. CCA (Clogging Champions of America) is another well known and respected organization. In 1998 CCA was created to generate more activity and interest in clogging and competition. The goal of CCA is to create an atmosphere of spirited and sportsmanlike competition, and to provide more opportunities for cloggers within the competitive and entertainment realms. CCA knows how hard it can be for the beginning competitor facing dancers who have been clogging competitively for years. This can be a humbling experience. CCA has created a system to give the amateur dancers a chance to gain their self-esteem and prepare them to finally compete against more experienced teams and cloggers. At any CCA affiliated event, a team qualifying as an Amateur (having never won first in a clogging competition) may compete in an amateur status for two years. CCA feels that after two years teams and cloggers will have the experience needed to move to the Challenge level. At each CCA event, the top scoring teams in each category and division of Challenge (including the Junior and Senior divisions) will qualify to dance at the Showdown of Champions which is held at the beginning of the following year. The top four scoring teams in each category of amateur will also qualify for the next year's Showdown of Champions. You only need to succeed once per category, but you may dance at any or all affiliated competitions and you will receive "Star" points for doing

On the challenge level of clogging, C.C.A. truly loves to see the best of the best. This is truly an experience to participate in, or just watch. To recognize clogging's brightest, CCA devised the Showdown of Champions, which brings together the winners from the best competitions in the country to compete. We also recognize the first place solo winners in each age division from each competition. They will qualify for the Showdown of Champions.

tion is The South Carolina Clogging Council (SCCC). In 1985 the South Carolina Clogging Council was formed by Simone Pace. It originally began as a workshop being held in March by host teams in South Carolina. The first workshop was held in Anderson, SC. The South Carolina Clogging Council is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to support clogging, to improve traditional and contemporary styles of clogging, and to upgrade the level of clogging in South Carolina. In March of 1991 solo competition was added to the annual Stampede competition and in 1992 team categories were added. Our annual Stampede now holds the workshop on Saturday and competition on Saturday night & Sunday. Our competition consists of duo, duet, show duo/duet, 4 or more couple open hoedown, 4 or more couple open precision, line, traditional line, exhibition, line formation, show, solo & flat foot competition. Our annual competition is sanctioned by America's Clogging Hall of Fame.

Our Palmetto's Finest Team was added to our Stampede in March 1996. It consists of 8 dancers from South Carolina who have attained special recognition for leadership, enthusiasm, clogging skills, team spirit & team dedication. Every year a new

team is selected.

Mars Hill College in Mars Hill, North Carolina is one of a few college-based performing clogging teams in the nation, with art performance grants and college credit courses, the Bailey Mountain Cloggers serve as ambassador of goodwill for the college and the folkdance traditions of the Southern Mountains. The Bailey Mountain Cloggers were organized in 1974 by students at Mars Hill College in the mountains of North Carolina, near Asheville. The Bailey Mountain name is derived from the mountain adjacent to the college campus.

This college clogging team carries influence from an older championship team in Mars Hill called Bailey Mountain "Square" Dance Team. Comprised of young adults from the college and town, these dancers in the spring of 1950 toured the Southwest with Bascom Lamar Lunsford, who is credited for giving the name Bailey Mountain to the team. By the late 50's, precision clogging entered the Mountain Dance and Folk Festival in Asheville with James Kesterson and

the Blue Ridge Mountain Dancers. Until then, only smooth big circle Dance called Mountain "Square" Dance, and freestyle clog dancing were part of the folk festival. One such precision clog team influenced the Bailey Mountain Cloggers in their early years; the Green Grass Cloggers.

by then-president Ronald Reagon to perform at the John F. Kennedy Cen for the Performing Arts in Washingto D.C., during a tribute to the "King of Country Music" Roy Acuff. In 1997, Ralph and Melvin Sloan were inducted into America's Clogging Hall of Fame The Country Music Foundation recognitions.

During the 1980's Bailey Mountain began competition clogging and expanded its clog repertoire to include more than precision clog routines such as, Big Circle Smooth, Freestyle, Country Hoedown, Kentucky Running Set, Line Dance, Show, and Percussive dance routines. Today, the students who comprise the dance company, 45+ from 12 different states, come from various dance traditions, representing a number of ethnic and religious backgrounds. Each student clogger becomes a unique part of the Bailey Mountain tradition, blending the old with the new into a larger mixture for the future. Each year this long championship tradition recreates itself anew, and showcases its traditional and contemporary dance routines in an annual clogging concert each spring. During their 29-year history, the Bailey Mountain Cloggers have performed throughout the United States and internationally in Canada, Mexico, England, Scotland, Austria, and Ireland. From the Kennedy Center in 1996 to the Austrian Alps Performing Arts Festival in 1997; from the world premier in 1998 of "Mountain Legacy" in Asheville, North Carolina to the Ulster-American Folk Park's Appalachian Festivals in 1998-2001; from the "Making A Difference" performance for the BBC from Belfast, Ireland, viewed by over 5 million throughout Europe to a performance on Broadway in 2000; the Bailey Mountain Cloggers Folk Dance Company has established a national and international reputation for American clog dance excellence.

There are many professional Clogging teams. One of them is the Melvin Sloan Dancers, now known as the Opry Square Dancers. They perform regularly at the Grand Ole Opry every Saturday night. Ralph Sloan (Melvin's older brother) started dancing on the Grand Ole Opry with his team The Tennessee Travelers in 1952. After Ralph's death in 1980, his brother Melvin took over on the following Saturday of his death and the team was later renamed the Melvin Sloan Dancers. Through the span of six decades, the Sloan Brothers' dedication has been such that the dancers have never missed a scheduled Opry performance. The Melvin Sloan Dancers were invited

perform at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington D.C., during a tribute to the "King of Country Music" Roy Acuff. In 1997, Ralph and Melvin Sloan were inducted into America's Clogging Hall of Fame. The Country Music Foundation recognized Ralph's contribution to the Country Music industry by inducting him in the Walkway of Stars at the Country Music Hall of Fame in Nashville. Melvin presented his brother's dancing shoes and costume along with a copy of the book, an overview of Square dancing at the Grand Ole Opry in a special ceremony conducted at the Hall of Fame. The prestigious award recognized their contributions in promoting and preserving the art of Southern Appalachian Style Square dancing. The Sloan Dancers have been a member of the Grand Ole Opry for 50 years until July of 2002. Melvin Sloan who headed up the group retired and the team was then renamed the Opry Square Dancers. This team is a unique Appalachian-style square dance team. This group of dancers performs the unique style that is a part of Middle Tennessee's heritage. The group has performed at such events as Country Music Hall of Fame grand Opening, Country Music Television, The Nashville Network, The Porter Wagner Show, HEE HAW, and much more. Each dancer interprets the music with her or his own style and steps. All the dancers have grown up clogging from a very young age and have worked hard to be a clogger for the world's longest running radio show. To be asked to be a member of this special group of dancers is truly and honor. Although the Square Dancers continues, now, as in the past, these unequaled dancers eagerly await the music to begin, the curtain to rise and the bright lights to flood the stage so that once again they can demonstrate to the world their love of square dancing.






