

Fontana: In Step with Cloggers

At the end of September each year, as the summer days begin to shorten, the winds start to chill, and countless motorcycles wind down the curving village roads, a familiar sound can be heard through the mountains of Western North Carolina at Fontana Village Resort... the sound of hundreds of clogging feet!

Naomi Pyle and Jeff Driggs hosted their 4th annual Fontana Clogging Jamboree in September, drawing more than 400 dancers plus spectators to this familiar clogging spot. The duo had been regulars at clogging events at Fontana in the late 1970's through the 1980's and both yearned to return to the great hall's oak floor and share the fun and fellowship of Fontana with a new generation of cloggers. Naomi and Jeff weren't alone in their love for this place. During their years of hosting the event, in addition to many of today's top instructors, they have brought back guests who have helped to shape the clogging history of Fontana, including Bill Nichols of South Carolina, Bobbie and Dewey Paul of Ohio, Boo Ruch of Tennessee, Tandy Barrett of Georgia, and Linda Carolan of Texas. year, Judy Waymouth, of Ontario, Canada, was honored for her contributions to the styling of modern clogging. Her team's first appearance at Fontana Village in the 1980's sparked the interest in step-dance styling that dramatically changed the styling and rhythms of modern clogging and opened the door for even more percussive influences.







Dancing is for Boys Too

Many generalizations can be made about the different ways boys and girls learn, and the activities that naturally attract them. Theories abound about brain function, genetic propensities, parenting styles and the influence of consumer entertainment, but the fact remains that boys and girls very guickly learn that they are different and that it is in their best interests to gravitate toward the activities "appropriate" for their gender. Nowhere is this phenomenon more exaggerated than in the dance class. By the time they are in upper elementary grades, many girls have been attending dance classes for most of their lives, usually in several different genres, and often at a very high level. Those who do not have formal training are generally comfortable with dancing and are eager to participate. At the very least dancing is an acceptable activity in a girl's life.

Boys, on the other hand, learn from an early age that dancing "is for girls" and they would be better off to play sports or Lego. The sad reality is that a study conducted in 2005 states that it is unusual to find boys in upper elementary who have had any significant exposure to dance in any form. As a result, they not only face social barriers to participating in dance, but they are also far less skilled than the girls, all of which combines to make the dancing a fearsome experience for them. "We hate dancing!"—"Dancing is for girls!"—"Why do we have to miss sports practice for this?"—"Are you really going to make us dance with the girls?" (said half hopeful, half horrified).

The good news is that at the end of a week of dancing, they sing a different tune. These are

actual quotes from intermediate-level boys:

"That was the most fun I've ever had!"—"When can we dance again?"—"I got to dance with all the girls in my class!"—"I didn't know that dancing was so much fun!"

How We Got Here

How did we get into the situation where half the population are unwilling to dance? What are the mechanisms and beliefs that cause boys to shun dancing? How do boys acquire these attitudes?

1. Role models. Boys don't see fathers, or other boys/ men, dancing. Instead, they see the whole world take a holiday for the Olympics and six months of non-stop media coverage of a sport's labor dispute. Can you imagine such a hoopla surrounding the World Square Dance convention or a whole country mourning if the Royal Winnipeg Ballet had to cancel its season?

Just think for a minute about how much TV time is devoted to sports, and how much acclaim is awarded to the players. Think about the number of police shows or other shows with macho men, and then think about how many times you see a male dancer on TV. No contest!


2. Societal changes. Dance as a form of community celebration is an endangered species, usurped by television, the Internet and consumer sports. Children have little opportunity to see adults of any kind dance, and therefore miss the opportunity of learning it in a natural setting.

3. Competitiveness, fear of failure, perfectionism. When I ask men why they are reluctant to dance, the answer is always some variation of "I don't want to

look stupid." Boys learn very early that they are supposed to "know," to be right, to be the best. They want to be noticed, to shine and don't want to be upstaged by women at any age.

4. Parental Influence and Peer Pressure. At the beginning of a dance camp recently, seven year old Max's father told me "You won't get Max to dance—he's into sports!" I'm happy to report that Dad was wrong—by the end of the week, Max was a diehard dancer, screaming at the top of his lungs for his favorite dance. He has attended every year since, and has proven to be one of the most creative kids in the camp.

Ann Green Gilbert, of the Creative
Dance Centre in Seattle, says that up to



about age four, boys and girls come to her classes in equal numbers, but when they get to kindergarten age, the boys disappear. When her performing group does a show, young boys in the audience always come up afterwards and say they want to join, but this rarely translates into registration. This can only mean that the parents discourage them. Could it be their own fears of dancing, concern that their boy will be teased for being gay, or because dancing (or any arts, for that matter) rarely lead to a high-paying job later in life?

When my son was five, he told us he'd like to learn to tap dance. Before we could find him a class, he told us he didn't want to take it, because the other boys had told him that only girls danced. He had five years of seeing me dance, of being brought to dances and seeing as many men as women at them, and yet he was ready to believe his friends instead of his own eyes!—Jacob Bloom

5. Sexual immaturity. By the time they are in school, children have figured out that dance is connected to that mysterious world of romance, dating and sex. Terms like "couple" and "holding hands" are now electrically charged. Boys are acutely aware and confused by the feelings they get when they watch girls dance, and they don't want people to watch them the same way.

6. Homophobia. There's something about dancing that threatens masculinity, and often the dance costumes chosen by teams are covered with seguins or made in a square dance or country theme. If boys are taught that "girls dance, boys do sports" (Elizabeth Burchenal, 1904), then a boy who wants to dance must be girlish. There is a fear that they will be perceived to be gay, or even that they may discover an attraction to the same gender. This image is more likely to be connected to more expressive dance categories that have a multitude of hand moves, jazz and body movement. Folk dancing and hoedown or coupled precision dancing is (somewhat) less afflicted with this attitude since the tradition is usually a man/woman couple. The stereotype most often of concern to some boys in this arena is the connection of clogging to what they perceive as uncool music and less-than-hip clothing.

Because of this, when boys do dance, they gravitate to macho, competitive dance styles and tend to shun styles that require grace, subtlety and expressiveness.

What to Do?

As dance educators and advocates, we are faced with the complex challenge of ensuring that both boys

and girls have a positive experience in the dance class. If we succeed, we increase their chances of being enthusiastic recreational dancers all their lives. Based on two decades of teaching dance in schools across my country and the United States, and the collective wisdom of many people who have been good enough to send me their tips and tricks, here are a few things to keep in your mind as you face your next group of dancers.

1. Be positive and proactive. The best thing we can do is to offer children the world of dance with our full confidence that they will love it. Many of the men I have spoken to attribute their love of dance to a skilled and charismatic teacher.

Create a class and atmosphere where it's natural and expected to see male dancers, and you open a door for boys to experience the joy that dance has to offer.—Rhee Gold

Getting all children involved in dance takes a commitment from you, the teacher. You must be or become interested in dance, you must believe in it, and you must see it as an essential part of children's growth and development.—Sam Baumgarten

When I get...a few sullen guys determined to not have a good time, I simply do not worry about them. I know that they will love to dance. And I believe that this unflappably positive attitude of mine is one of the reasons that I have been pretty successful getting boys to enjoy dancing, sometimes in spite of themselves.—Peter Amidon

When I go in assuming that we are all going to just love this, we all do—even the most avoidant boys. Often the boys who get the trouble-maker label are the ones with the best sense of rhythm and movement.— Karen Kaufman

I've found that when the boys get into the dancing, they REALLY get into it and become even more enthusiastic than the girls. I love their energy!— Laraine Miner

2. Know the potential trouble spots such as holding hands or choosing partners, and work to minimize their traumatic effect. It is important to address these issues, talk about them and defuse their power with skill, persistence and humor. I always let the children know that I understand their discomfort, because I have been there and have felt the same way. In fact I still do on occasion. However, it is worth the effort to get past it, because the rewards are so plentiful.

I never insist on any particular type of partnering. In schools, I find that boys dance willingly with boys to a much older age than I would predict.—Karen Kaufman

3. Give them role models. Wherever possible, use some male dancers or teachers to demonstrate, and show videos of boys and/or men dancing. Take them to see STOMP!, or Barrage, or a Ukrainian or African dance performance featuring strong men dancing.

The (male) teacher's participation was absolutely key to how willing the boys were to try.—Rachelle Ackerman

4. Use the sports connection to our advantage. One day as I was watching a basketball coach work on offensive plays with his team, it struck me how similar it was to what I was doing with the same students in dance class. Both are very physical, require a high level of skill with hands and feet, and each participant must be aware of the position of everyone else on the floor. If you replace the basketball with some dance music, the two become variations on a theme.


Look for every opportunity to compare dance and sports:

- The grapevine step is an important skill of the offensive linemen in football.
- Buzz step swing uses elements from skateboarding and figure skating.
- Many high-level sports teams use ballet as training for strength and flexibility.
- Have the children take their pulse before dancing, after a particularly strenuous dance and at the end of the session. When boys realize how physically demanding dance is, they gain new respect.
- If you are doing creative dance, suggest that they use the skills they already know from sports.
- 5. Be aware of different learning styles. As a rule, boys are more kinesthetic learners than girls—get them moving and worry about the fine details and expression later.

What seems to engage them is a really athletic dance or something that's like a puzzle or contest.— Laraine Miner

There's never been a problem getting fifth grade boys to dance a morris dance style —that's simply part of what fifth graders do in that school, and yes, they enjoy smashing sticks. (Stick dances are far more appealing than handkerchief dances at that age.)—David Millstone

6. Give them dances they can succeed at. One of the great things about dancing is that it can be fun and fulfilling at every level of skill, and there are many good



I saw some really good male dancers on the floor in college, noticed that the women really dug it and that was all the encouragement I needed.—Kevin McMullin

8. Keep it light. Remember that fun is a more worthy goal than precision.

Tension begets tension. As long as everyone is laughing and having a good time, it keeps the sexual anxiety down to a dull roar.—Victor Smith

I have an immense soft spot for the boys in my dancing classes. Sure, they can be rowdy, clumsy, resistant and rude. But they can also be enthusiastic, mischievous, graceful and creative. And their conversion is so much more dramatic for their initial reluctance. As they relax and gain skill, they fairly explode with the joy of it all.

There is enough room in the spectrum of dance activities for boys and men to find a place of comfort and belonging. It takes persistence, dedication and skill on the part of those of us teaching them, but most of all it requires a firm belief in the value of dance, and its potential to promote cooperation, civility and community.

And a bunch of rice for folks to throw as you drive away


Now what's that expression on your face





Cloggers Mourn Passing of Inspirational New Mexico Dancer and Friend by Ann McCoy, Bear Canyon Cloggers Albuquerque, New Mexico

Ruth Whitney, Albuquerque, New Mexico, passed away on October 3, 2006 after 84 years meeting life head on, embracing challenges, and clogging for over 20 years. She was a total fanatic. In addition she was a strong, independent woman, a wife, mother, grandma, great grandma, friend, and dancer. I knew her as a dancer, mentor, and friend.

She had to fight to take dance lessons. Her Mother wanted her to play the piano, because she could play piano into her old age. It turned out Ruth danced until the age of 84. Even as a small child she enjoyed tap dancing and was excited about performing on stage. Being on stage is where she shined. She flirted with the audience her cute-little smile endeared her to those for whom she performed. Dancing gave her a way of expressing herself.

In the early 1980's, she belonged to a square dance class. Her square dance caller and teacher, Cheryl Wilkins, came back from a trip to Texas with a few basic clogging steps which she shared with her square dance. Ruth and a few dance friends began practicing those steps. Fortunately, they met Dennis Huffman, a Clogger, from California who visited periodically and taught them new steps. Eventually he moved to Albuquerque and became a clogging instructor and the rest is history. The very first clogging group in Albuquerque was born.

In 2000, I called Ruth and asked for her help to start Bear Canyon Cloggers. She came in with bells on, pulling her oxygen tank. Within three months, she was clogging for an hour and a half without oxygen. She was simply amazing.

In 2002, six of the Bear Canyon Cloggers and their spouses went to Washington DC to participate in the International Clogging Expo 2002 Fourth of July 4 parade. There were about 1,000 Cloggers and parade

walkers who participated in the parade in the 106 degree heat. Many people, especially young ones, collapsed, but guess who made it all the way? Ruth and Ted (her husband, parade walker)! In addition, the six of us danced to "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy" in front of the Lincoln Memorial which she helped me choreograph. There were over 50 clogging groups from around the country who clogged that hot afternoon.

In closing, I would like to say that over the years Ruth taught many people to clog. She infused spark and enthusiasm into all three groups she clogged with. She established a real clogging family in Albuquerque. Ruth's humor was a big part of her life. She made us laugh and kept us on our toes, and she kept us in line (that is, the dance line). Ruth loved people, especially babies and children. She was interested in everyone she met and wanted to know about their lives and what made them happy. She loved her friends and family and defined herself, in her heart and soul, as a Dancer.

I said to her lately that I would meet her at the gate wearing my clogging shoes. She replied: "I am going to clog for St. Peter and dance my way into heaven." I think she already has.

Ruth has truly brought great joy and to her friends and family.

But who cares, I'm sure they'll go for it, I just know it! And you start calling poor Jessica on a daily basis to confirm that the group will be dancing, right? Jessica's worst nightmare begins...oh, and by the way, we need Ellen's shoe size! There's a long period of silence on the phone...and the conversation starts all over again tomorrow...

But wait, there's more.

And So Our Journey Begins...Time for Take Off! This is How it Went...

Everyone meets at the Redmond Airport, with our old lady walkers in hand ready to be checked in because that's the big part of our routine, right? at 4:00am...the only "group" wide awake...worrying that our precious old lady hats don't get crushed inside our neatly packed luggage bags. Question? We are dancing on stage right? Oh, I'm sure of it! (no real confirmation yet) (with our enthusiasm & excitement still in tack) We arrive in Burbank, CA on Sunday October 29th in plenty of time for playing and having fun before our big day. Better head out and find NBC Studio 11 so we'll know where to be the next day. We'll be the only group ahead of the game! The show doesn't even air until 4:00pm, plenty of time...no problem right? ... (with our enthusiasm & excitement still in tack) After much wandering around and doing some site seeing, we finally ask for directions. We split up in different directions and meet back up. Status, we now know where we need to be the next morning. It's a fairly big area, high black wrought iron gates, fenced in area, (reminds us of a cattle corral, oh well put that right out of our minds). It's also on a pretty busy street. We must be on site no later than 4:00am. That's right, 4:00am. But Jessica doesn't distribute tickets until 8:30am. So you mean we have 4.5 hours of just waiting in the cattle corral at 4:00am, in the dark, (Continued on page 24)

in the cold. Question? Will they be serving coffee and donuts? Oh, I'm sure of it! Did I mention tickets do not guarantee our seats? It's on a first come, first serve basis. Did I leave that part out? I'm sure I didn't. Did I see some raised eyebrows? I did'nt think so. It's ok we can do it! I know we can... (with our enthusiasm & excitement still in tack)

First night in Burbank, CA, bedtime 9:00pm, wide awake, alarm set for 3:00am, closer and closer to our big day... (with our enthusiasm & excitement still in tack)...lights out! Question? We are dancing on stage, right?...Oh, I'm sure of it! (no real confirmation, yet) The Day of the Ellen Halloween Show Taping

Our big day has finally arrived. Our excitement is building, we're about ready to burst...even at 3:00am, we must hurry and get ready. Outside NBC Studio 11 in the Dark, in the Cold...

No Coffee & Donuts Being Served. We arrive and lineup along with people that are already there! They have been there since 3am. But at least we are the next group in what becomes a very, very long line. Waiting, waiting, and more waiting. Restlessness sets in...the bones are freezing up...Maryl starts dancing, it becomes contagious...we line up (it's called line dancing) and we go for it. We start having fun with the people already there, they sing for us while we dance, we chat, we get to know them, some of them have come a long way. They seem to be very surprised we got tickets as quickly as we did. Some people had been waiting to be selected for a year, maybe even more, and only got as far as the "Riff Raff Room" on the show which was amazing to us... we must be very lucky. Question? We are dancing on stage right? Oh, I'm sure of it! (no real confirmation yet)

Finally, 8:30am arrives. We meet Jessica for the first time, she remembers all those daily conversations we had. She's so overwhelmed with her duties there is absolutely no time to chat. She passes out numbers to everyone (our number starts with 45) then says we need to be back by 12:30pm, dressed in costume and ready to go. Ok, great, it's now only 9:30am...lots of time for breakfast and relaxing, right?

12:30 pm ARRIVES

Approximately 300+ people all dressed in Halloween costumes are anxiously waiting outside in the fenced area. Silence occurs...someone sees a white limousine approaching...somebody else yells out... be quiet look, it might be a celebrity arriving for the Ellen show...all 300+ people dressed in some of the most creative and totally outrageous costumes you've ever seen turn all of their attention to the street and wait...not moving a muscle. The white limo slowly comes to a stop...limo driver slowly gets out...approaches the door, waits for a moment...(the crowd becomes restless with anticipation) he opens it...sets one walker on the sidewalk...and

guess who

gets out? Loy Sampels and her group "The Clogged Arteries"! Each old lady gets out of the limo very carefully and slowly sets her walker on the sidewalk and we all parade in a perfect line into the fenced area. We were called over almost immediately. Finally, they know who we are and what we do... WE ARE CLOGGERS! YEEHA! During this time we are very fortunate and actually perform our entire "Clogged Artery" routine, walkers and all for 300+ people. It was absolutely wonderful. We did the routine with no music. We definitely had the support of the crowd on our side.

NOW A WHOLE 4 HOURS HAS PASSED...We enter the studio... OK, HERE WE GO!

It's our first glimpse of the set. It is totally awesome and Ellen's people are so friendly. After seating all 8 of us, Tom Riles, Ellen's warm up guy comes and gets us. We all parade single file onto Ellen's stage, which was totally incredible. Halloween decorations everywhere. Camera's, Lights, Action! The music is cranked up as loud as it will go, everyone starts dancing and you just go for it! This is it, free style clogging, a dream come true. The audience goes wild with excitement. And so our 2 seconds of fame on National TV was ours, and ours alone!


Question? We are dancing on stage? Right? YOU BET WE ARE!! YOU BET WE DID!! (confirmation finally recognized)

Also upstairs a trio of young girls from over near Twin Lake showed off a routine they choreographed themselves and some of the dancers freestyled. Freestyling is dancing to music and the steps come out of you as to how the music feels to you while you dance. It is just such a blessing to see families, fathers and daughters, grandpas and grandmas dancing with their grandchildren to wholesome music.

The Hog came to an end for 2007 at 5 PM with the closing ceremonies of singing God Bless America lead by Lois, David, and Bonnie. As usual no one seemed to want to go home. The 2008 8th Annual Mid-Winter Hog Dog Clog Hog will be held January 19th at the grange. The Thunder Floor Cloggers, under the direction of Bob and Lynda Warner perform for audiences at fairs, music festivals, banquets, nursing homes, churches, barn dances and other venues.




All's Fair...



Notes to the Dancers:

From 1961 through 1966, there was a TV show called "Sing Along with Mitch." As a kid, I remember sitting with our family in front of our old black and white TV watching the show and singing along as the lyrics of the songs appeared on the screen. I remember one episode in which the songs were chosen around a theme of Dixieland music. There was a Dixieland band whose musicians were wearing the candy-striped shirts and white pants while playing songs of the South. I don't remember any song in particular from that episode, but I remember the sense of happiness that permeated the show and the music. The songs produced images of riding a steamship down the Mississippi River, walking along the wharf in New Orleans, taking a buggy ride thru the countryside with the Spanish moss hanging from the trees and standing on a high ledge in the Smokey Mountains. While I'm sure the songs romanticized the reality of life in Dixieland, the feeling of happiness and the care-free life that I associated with the Dixie-style music still lingers and makes me smile when I hear it.

I happened upon this song by Rodney Dillard which re-kindled that feeling I once had watching "Sing Along with Mitch." Except now, instead of just singing to the lyrics as we once did around the TV, I find myself wanting to dance to them as well. When I heard this song, I knew I had to try to choreograph something to fit it, so I could re-live that carefree time in my life. At the time, I had just written choreography for a shortened version of "Dixie" that was performed as an introductory olio in a staged melodrama about the Old South by members of the Happy Feet Cloggers at Sun City in Georgetown, Texas. Since I really liked some of the steps that I choreographed for the olio presentation, I knew that I wanted to do a full-length dance using steps like "Look-2-Dixie", the "Double Fan Kick" and "The Wish." Again when I heard this song about riding on the Dixie Queen, I knew I had heard the right song to carry my thoughts.

There are three steps in this choreography that I would call signature steps for the dance. The step called "Look-2-Dixie" is composed of two "Rock Across" steps, one that looks out to the left and one that looks out to the right, followed by a "Joey" that again moves left and right and brings the dancers back to the same place from which they started. It represents this looking for something that we long for and then eventually returning to the same place from which we came. In "Dixieland" the author is being called to return to a place and a person he has known before after some period of separation. And he is riding that "Dixie Queen" to get there.

Another step called "Shovelin' Steam" represents the locomotion for those old paddle-wheel steamboats that traveled the Mississippi River at one point in our country's history. In the early 1800's, the "speed" of the steamboat appealed to travelers. In 1817 it took approximately 25 days to go upriver by steamboat, but by 1827 the technology had progressed where it only took approximately 10 days. The steamboats could carry up to 1600 passengers. With their roaring engines, belching smokestacks, paddlewheels turning and splashing the water and their distinctive whistles, the boats were an awesome display of power on the river. The "Shovelin' Steam" step comes from the lyric in the song describing the work to supply the boilers on the steamship with wood or coal for creating the power and the combination of smoke and steam being released thru the smokestacks. The "Shovelin' Steam" step begins with the shoveling action followed by the swiveling of the knees and lower leg during the toe touch and lift to represent the flow of smoke and steam thru the smokestack until it is finally released.

And finally the third signature step is called "The Wish." The step begins with the heel click action incorporated in one of the most famous scenes from "The Wizard of Oz" where the "Good Witch of the West" tells Dorothy that the way to get back home begins with clicking her heels and saying "there's no place like home; there's no place like home." The step ends with the toe touch and hooray arms that celebrate the author's hope in returning to his girl and to Dixie where everyone will "shout and sing" when he gets there.

In my mind, the music and the dance speak about the hope of all human beings to experience the fullness of life and the strong pull that family and friends have on us. It lends itself to my memories of "singing along with Mitch" as a child and now "dancing along with Mitch" as an adult. So kick back and have a rip-roaring, Jubilee dance as we ride on the steam-powered, paddlewheel Dixie Queen to return to our love.
