TO THE READERS

Taking the Lead

No one would argue that we are living in times that are perched for change. Regardless of your political leanings, your personal beliefs or your individual circumstances, there is no question that the world around us is rapidly changing.

Here we are -- cloggers -- dancing an olde time dance form in a new-fangled world. American Writer Eric Hoffer said, "In a time of drastic change it is the learners who inherit the future. The learned usually find themselves equipped to live in a world that no longer exists."

Realizing that, how much do we -- as today's clogging leaders and teachers -- know about the history of our dance and how much have we learned that will help us to not only inherit, but shape, our future?

I also read somewhere a Spanish writer's assessment that tradition simply means that we need to end what began well and continue what is worth continuing. Sometimes I feel like some of the newer teachers in clogging feel as though the traditional form of Appalachian style clogging is that well beginning and that the more modern and percussive-infused styles are the only ones worth continuing.

Just like the political climate, there are those who feel that change means embracing things new, while others hold fast to schools of thought that are deeply rooted in traditions that are backed by history. The more "seasoned" I become, the more I hold to the virtues of my own experience in clogging. Recreational clogging is waning in many areas and workshops that used to attract a mix of ages are getting older in demographics. The forms of clogging that are being heralded in competition and on television are an amazing example of the ever melting pot that clogging is, but I also think we can learn to pass on both the old and new with equal worth.







New York Clogger and Director Janice Agusta Passes Away

It is with great sorrow that the Black Mountain Cloggers of Fairport, New York share the news of the death of our beloved director, Janice Agusta. Jan passed away on September 10, 2008 after a courageous six year battle with cancer.

Jan is survived by her husband Dave, her daughters Tammy, Colleen, Michelle, and Tina; many grandchildren and great grandchildren; and by the past and present members of the Black Mountain Clogger family.

Jan served in many roles over the years. She was a caregiver in her own home for mentally disabled clients. She was a school bus driver. She was a dedicated wife and mother who loved her family very much. Her family was her number one priority; you seldom saw her without at least one, if not two or three, grandchildren in tow.

Her family was her number one priority, but dancing was her passion. She was a line dancer in the 1980s. About 20 years ago she and her daughter Michelle took clogging lessons from Don and Vivian Darling, of the Piney Mountain Cloggers. From then on, she was hooked. She and Michelle joined the team, and she danced with Piney Mountain for 2 seasons. After Don retired in the fall of 1990, the remaining members of the group formed the Black Mountain Cloggers, with Jan as co-director

and daughter Michelle as instructor. Jan eventually became the sole director of the team.

You could also say she was the soul director, because Janice was the heart and soul of the Black Mountain Cloggers. We all loved her, and had a deep respect for her as a person and her ability as a dancer, and an appreciation (although we didn't always show it) for everything she did for us. In the last few years during her illness, she was a great inspiration of strength and courage. She had a stubborn streak. Sick from chemo treatments? She danced. Just get out of the hospital? She danced. She kept on dancing, in spite of, or maybe because of, her illness. For Jan, dancing was like air, she needed it, and she would get very upset if anyone

suggested she should sit out a number to rest.

Jan was a superb dancer who always looked for new forms of dance for us to incorporate into our clogging, including tap, Canadian and Irish step dancing. She took ball room dance lessons and fell in love with it. She also fell in love with David Agusta, who became Jan's husband, and the group's sound man. She incorporated ballroom steps into our clogging routines, including one we performed at the Western NY Clogging convention. Jan did so well at ball room that she and Dave danced competitively.

As much as she loved ballroom, she always came back to clogging. She and her daughter Michelle made a great team. After every show, Michelle would introduce her mom as "the big cheese, the glue of the group". Jan booked all our shows, carried the equipment to shows and practices, and signed up people for lessons. She helped Michelle teach lessons, lead practice, and choreograph new routines. She kept law and order within the group. She made sure we had rides to shows, and printed maps so we did not get lost on the way. She came up with ideas for new outfits, scouring stores for material, shirts, or pants, or whatever we needed. She was an excellent seamstress who sewed many of our outfits herself, and went thru a couple of sewing machines in the process. At conventions, she would have half a dozen kids stay in her room so the kids could afford to attend, and she could keep an eye on them for the parents at home who entrusted them to her care. She loved to drive, and loved road trips. Many of us have fond memories of conventions in Tennessee and Ohio, where getting there was indeed half the fun. She cared about the well being of every member of the team, both as dancers and as people.

Yes, she was our glue. She was happiest when she was on the dance floor, and we were happiest when she was dancing with us. Janice Agusta was a great dancer, a wonderful person, our mentor, and our friend. We miss her, and she will live in our hearts forever.

Master old-time dancer receives West Virginia's highest folklife award

The Vandalia Award, West Virginia's highest folklife honor, was presented to master dancer, dance caller, judge, teacher, and founder and director of the Appalachian Country Cloggers, Lou Maiuri of Summersville, West Virginia on Saturday, May 24, as part of the 32nd annual Vandalia Gathering. The West Virginia Division of Culture and History presents the Vandalia Award annually to a West Virginian who has made outstanding contributions to the continuation of the state's folk heritage. The award recognizes lifetime achievement in the performance, creation or perpetuation of West Virginia traditional arts. The Vandalia Gathering, an annual three-day festival of traditional arts and folk heritage, is celebrated Memorial Day weekend at the West Virginia Cultural Center and the State Capitol grounds. More than 40,000 people attend the three-day festival each year.

Now in his 80th year, Lou Maiuri (pronounced "My-oo-ree") of Summersville, West Virginia has been calling square dances professionally for a little more than a quarter century. He turned a lifelong love of all kinds of dancing into a second career, one that has taken him all over the Mountain State, as well as to Ohio, Virginia, Pennsylvania, and Kentucky, and regularly as far afield as Florida and Oklahoma. Accord ing to Lou, "About everything I do revolves around dancing. 1 don't say it's my whole life right now, hut it practically is. Everything that I do, in one way or another, directly or indirectly involves dancing."

If Lou's contributions to dance in West Virginia came solely through his dance calling, they would be major. But Lou is also a world-class flatfoot dancer, keeping the old styles of mountain step dancing alive through teaching, performing, and competing. He has been involved in the Appalachian String Band Music Festival at Clifftop for years, both as an instructor and a judge. He has a self-produced instructional DVD and video called, "Let's Flatfoot!" and last year, while wintering in Florida, he took a long enough break from bass fishing to win the Florida State Clogging Championship, beating out dancers one—third his age.


According to Lou, "Flatfoot dancing is sometimes called backstep around here, and I've heard it referred to as sure-footing, backstepping, or flatfoot. Whatever you want to call it, it's a step dance. It was brought here by our immigrants, and it's been here since our earliest settlers came. Most people who have studied the history of the dance will tell you that it came from our English ancestry, and part of that is true. But the English weren't the only ones who came to this

country and brought a step dance. The Irish, the Scots, the Germans, even the African Americans, they came here and they brought a step dance you could call clogging or backstepping. The Italians brought a step dance, too."


Lou Maiuri's parents were among those Italian immigrants. They raised Lou in Montgomery.

Lou Maiuri's parents were among those Italian immigrants. They raised Lou in Montgomery, Fayette County, West Virginia where he was born in 1928.

"My dad settled in Pocahontas County back in [about] 1910," Lou says. "He came to this country to work on the Greenbrier, Cheat & Elk (Railroad) at Spruce. He had a sister that had already come and was living there." While he eventually moved to Montgomery to raise his family, Giosafitti

"Joe" Maiuri maintained many friendships in Pocahontas County, regularly going back to the Marlinton area to deer hunt, fish, or visit with old friends, often taking Lou along for company.

"[My father] was born in 1895 in Cippano, Italy. When he came to this country, he was 16 years old, and he couldn't speak a word of English. Of course, he got a private tutor, and right away he started to learn. He went to school until all of us kids were born, and I guess until we were prettywell grown. I remember when he graduated from New River State College [now West Virginia Tech], he finally got a college degree in English and economics."

Learning and culture were highly valued in the Maiuri household. Lou became keenly interested in music when he was an adolescent, string music in particular.

"I remember, at the time, my brother and my sister that were older than me were taking piano lessons," he recalls. "It was important to my dad. It was good for their cultural training and their social training, so they took piano lessons. I had a finger cut off here [at the first joint], and you know, I was kind of handicapped. I always wanted to play the guitar, but, at the time, nobody around was giving guitar lessons, and that's what I wanted to learn, a stringed instrument. Of course, this here [holds up finger] kind of hampered me from playing a guitar or playing a piano, so I just kind of lost interest in it. But I didn't lose interest in the music, 'cause I still liked to hear it and I still liked being around that type of music."

He soon turned his energies to the dance floor. "I started to dance in my early teen years, in high school," Lou says. "The modern dance then was the jitterbug, so, for a while, I kind of backed off from the string music, even though I still liked it and still listened to it. But I got into the modern

type of dance. I'd guess my sister and I probably taught half of the kids in our school to jitterbug. I could always work with the boys, because I always learned both parts. I could dance the girl's part, and I could dance the boy's part. The boys went backwards, you see, and I could teach them. I dearly love to dance."

After high school, Lou took a job with the telephone company in Glasgow, Kanawha County. It was here that he met his wife, Jessie. Soon after they were married in 1950, Lou became introduced to the older style of flatfoot dancing on one of his regular trips to Pocahontas County with his father. The trip came about because of a broken leg — not his own, but that of his younger brother.

"My brother got his leg broke playing football, and he was in the hospital at Montgomery," Lou recalls. "My dad went to work at 3:00 in the afternoon on the railroad. But everyday before he went to work, he'd go down and visit my brother. He was in the hospital a week or 10 days. Back then, they'd keep you forever with a broken leg. There was a gentleman in the same room with my brother by the name of Wayne Jackson. And Dad, he friendlied up with him, and he'd visit with him at the same time. Wayne and [my dad] got

to talking, and they found out that they had a lot of mutual friends up in Pocahontas County. At the time, Wayne was working for John Hunter McClintic, [who] was a lawyer in Charleston that owned the McClintic farm there on Swago Creek at Buckeye.

"So, anyway, they got out of the hospital, and Wayne went on home. One Sunday, my Dad came by and picked me up and said they were going to Marlinton and wanted me to ride along. So I rode up to Marlinton. I think I might have been 20 years old then. I was already interested in the banjo and the mountain-style dancing and all that. I went up there, and met Waynel. He is the same age as I am. We struck up a friendship that lasted [until] today. I'm talking over 50 years I've been friends with him. That was [also] the beginning of my love for two things: old-style flatfoot dancing and sugar-cured country ham. Of course, that sugar-cured country ham is a whole story on its own.

"It was through [Wayne] that I got acquainted with the Carpenters. Dan [Carpenter] lived back on the head of Williams River. The McClintics had land back there, and I'd go back there with [Wayne]. That's howl met Dan Carpenter, and that's how I met Hamp Carpenter. Dan played

the banjo and danced, and there was an old fellow named less Moore that lived there. Tess played the fiddle. That was the first time I'd ever heard the 'Black Mountain Rag.' I always thought that it was written about Black Mountain, back there on the head of Williams River. Hamp was [Dan's] brother, and Hamp played the fiddle. That was the first place that I had an opportunity to watch Dan, to watch him dance and pick the clawhammer banjo. Then I had an opportunity to see Hamp dance. He was a really good dancer and a really good fiddler. I was around some square dances where Hamp was playing, and [they danced] the old-time flatfoot dancing that I do today. Of course, they did their own steps, you know, just what felt good to 'em, but that was where I really got interested in the old style of dance. After that, it stuck with me ever since."

During subsequent trips to Pocahontas County, Lou attended many of the legendary dances at the Dunmore Community Center, and got to hear that particular brand of calling.

"James [Carpenter] was a good square dance caller, and Bob Dean was a good square dance caller," he recalls. "Those two stick in my mind,

because they'd call in time with the music. Now I know that most people don't need a whole lot of cueing, but if you're not dancing and just listening, it makes for better listening, and really it makes for better dancing, if you call in time to the music. My problem that I'd always have if I was dancing to someone who didn't call in time with the music, and he'd be in one time and the band would be in another, I didn't know whether to dance to his cadence or the band's cadence. The style of calling that I remember up there, James Carpenter and Bob Dean, they would call in time with the music.

"At those square dances, the community dances, they played the old-time tunes, the old vintage tunes. You'd hear 'Turkey In the Straw,' the 'Soldier's Joy.' Those were old standby square dance tunes. Then you'd hear lots of tunes that were in 2/4 time that didn't have any overriding melody, 'cause a lot of your old-time callers, they didn't sing-song any of their calls.

They just told the dancers what to do."
While Lou became interested in and you'd hear 'Cripple Creek,' and the 'Black Mountain Rag,' and the old style of dance during those trips to Pocahontas County, raising a family and working full time for the telephone company took precedence over his dancing. After a number of years, Lou began taking his young children to Jeff Driggs of St. Albans, West Virginia for clogging lessons. Lou and Jeff struck up a friendship over their mutual love of dancing.

"Jeff and I, we talked a whole lot about square dance calling and figures and this and that," Lou says. "Jeff helped me, mostly with timing and calling in the phrase of the music and things of that nature. If there is any one person in my life that impacted on my teaching ability and my calling ability, it would have been Jeff Driggs."

"Jeff is probably the best dance choreographer in the country right now, bar none. I'm talking about clogging choreography. Probably one of the best teachers, too. I think he's a genius, myself, when it comes to clogging."

Now, Lou spends the bulk of his time passing along what he has learned from Jeff Driggs, Bob Dean, and James

Carpenter. For the past dozen or so years, Lou has been on staff at the Augusta Heritage Center of Davis & Elkins College during their summer workshops. One of the most rewarding and far-reaching results of Lou's involvement with Augusta is his having been chosen to take on a pair of apprentices to learn his particular style of dance calling. "That [Augusta apprenticeship] was the first formal apprenticeship I have ever done," Lou says. "It came about through my work at Augusta. I had some exposure up there, and people had an opportunity to hear me call and observe my calling techniques. I do the old style. and they liked what they heard. [The apprentices] were the ones that initiated the thing. They were Dave Shombert and Judy Van Gundy [both of Elkins1.

"The apprenticeship was great, absolutely great. We did it in 12 lessons. When [Dave and Judy came for the program, they always brought a couple or three people with them, and I had

a couple couples from around here. My wife and I, we would join in, too, so we would actually have a little square dance where we could have some hands- on. It wasn't just sitting down and talking. It was actually some hands-on stuff. And then a little bit later on. I had the opportunity to call a couple of dances, and they came and each of them called some figures and did very well. We met once every two weeks for six months. Every time, we had at least one square where we could have some hands-on work. [That] eliminates a lot of that stage fright. You can make tapes, and you

can write figures down, [but] until you get into an actual situation where you are calling and working with a group, then it's hard for you to


"I used to go along years ago, and I still do occasionally, I'll put a tape in the tape player, and, as I'm driving, I'll call figures. If there's a certain figure that I want to work on or some patter I want to create for a certain figure, that's where I'll work on it. You can learn a certain amount that way, but it's still not like having hands-on, and having a group that you can call to - having the experience of watching them, and watching the ones that are getting behind, and the ones that are up with the figure, and making all of those little adjustments. That's something you can't learn [from a tape]."

Lou still averages two or three dances a month throughout the year, and more during the summer months. He will drive for hours to call or attend a dance in Morgantown; Athens, Ohio; or Abingdon, Virginia. While he has no illusions that square dancing will replace video games and the Internet as the pastime of choice for West Virginia's youth, he is optimistic about the future of dance.

"I like to see young people at dances." he says. "There's so much peer pressure now and so much competing for these kids' time and their energy that a lot of them just don't think it's cool to get involved in old-time dancing. Of course, after they get there, they have fun.

"I think that 75 years ago, it was the mainstay of entertainment. Everybody had square dances, and there were square dances every week. Even 50 years ago, you could find them every week,

but you had to look for them. In this day and time, you can [still] find a square dance every week, somewhere. You might not have anything right in your community, but you can always find a dance. You might have to drive a little bit.

"Something that's helping now with the square dancing is [that] we have more musicians now. People are taking an interest in the old-time music. You can see that up at Augusta. People are coming together from all over the world, from all professions, and you have more musicians that are available to play now."

As long as he is able, and as long as there are dancers to dance, Lou Maiuri will be there on the hardwood, working his patter, and moving smiling people around the floor with the sound of his voice. All he needs is a little traveling music.



Well after class Carol introduced them to the class and told us that they where going to show us a little of what they do. They got on the floor and I'm sure my jaw was on the floor when I saw what they where doing with their feet. I was guickly

embarrassed by the "showing off" I was doing earlier. After they danced we talked with them and they taught us some steps and we all had a great time getting to know each other. We didn't know it at the time but this was kind of a try out and I guess we passed because they invited us both to work privately with them for a few months at their home to get us ready for "The Clogging Premier" It was great, we practically lived at their house. to introduce us to the team. I can't explain the feeling that I had walking into the studio and seeing 13 girls my age staring at me "who do these guys think they are". Well time went by and we all became very close friends and traveled around doing shows and competitions together. One of those girls was a bubbly red head named Jessie. Well I'll just say this, she had my attention. I thought she was something special and I developed a



crush immediately. She was always front and center and seemed to never make a mistake. She was Rob and Sheryl's star dancer. Well it didn't take long for her to realize I had a crush on her and let me tell you the feeling was NOT mutual. She thought I was the biggest dork and didn't give me the time of day. Over the next year or so persistence paid off. I asked her to go on a date and to my surprise she said yes. 


down and taught our first workshop and loved every minute of it. Both of us really wanted to keep clogging so when we got home we went back to where it all started for me in the back room





Photo: Buzz gets the audience involved in a local show by pairing the team dancer's with spectators in the "Cotton-Eyed Joe."

of the old bar and grill. Carol had retired since and Betsy Hoppie was teaching the classes just to keep it going. Well when we walked in she quickly handed over the microphone to us and asked us to teach. Well needless to say our style was defiantly different from what they where used to. After a couple of weeks we ended up with only 8 of the youngest dancers left and we moved the class to the basement of my parents house. We took those 8 dancers and did shows and county fairs and grew those 8 dancers into 20 dancers over the next year. Needing more space we rented the conference room of our local hotel every Monday night to have class. Those 20 dancers turned into 40 dancers over the next year which made us realize we needed a bigger studio. We bounced around from empty for sale buildings for the next few months but knew we needed something permanent. So we decided to put our house we just built on the market to be able to move closer to town and build a new home with a dance studio. Our house sold in 9 days. We went land shopping and found a perfect place just 3 miles out of town on 20 acres. After buying the land I started building the studio. I built a 30 x 50 building and equipped it with all wood floors and a lobby. It was perfect!

We moved our classed out to the new studio and felt like we had all the space we needed until the next beginner registration when 60 new beginners walked through the door. WOW. It was crazy. We had to divide the class into two classes just to fit. After a while we realized that when this class moves into the intermediate class that we would need to split that group

as well which we did the next fall. That same fall another 30 new beginners walked through the door and we knew we needed to either add on or build something bigger. So we decided to put our house on the market again after only two years and build something we would never grow out of. We decided to build an 8800 sq foot commercial building right behind the hotel that once held our classes just 4 years earlier. With a building that big we knew we would need other sources of income from it to make it work. We decided to market it as an Event Center and host weddings and other events to make the dream possible. We called it The Grand Event Center. Jessie took over the catering and financial side off the new business and I took on the sales and marketing. We broke ground May 2005 and had our first wedding reception on the books for Oct. 1st. Oct came fast and we worked around the clock for the last week just to have it ready. We sold our house and moved into the apartment we built above the event center. We are now coming up on three years there and everything is going great. We still have plenty of room to grow. This fall we are starting a new direction with our dance classes and offering; tap, jazz, ballet, hip hop and of course CLOGGING!
