#### The Political Shuffle

It has begun. Hopefuls are beginning to throw their hats into the ring to decide who will lead our great nation. In our localities, we choose leaders that will make our communities stronger and meet the needs of the citizens.

While the majority of dancers admit that they abhor the politics of clogging, it is those politics that often dictate the direction in which our dance evolves. We certainly can't agree on everything. Mark Twain said "It is not best that we all should think alike, it is differences of opinion that make horse races." While that's not a perfect analogy... we can agree that we all love the dance.

Sometimes, people get so caught up in their desire to achieve and their need to feel useful that they lose the sense of fellowship that clogging brings. Others are so driven by the lust for control or by jealousy that they have left a path of broken spirits in an activity that should be built on fun and fellowship.

Through the years, some of our dance's most talented innovators, choreographers, instructors and historians have walked away from the dance because of politics, flared tempers and opposing personalities. I, too, have walked away from conflict because it was the easier path. "This is a hobby," I've told myself. "It's not worth it."

Clogging is a dance that was born of stubborn resilience. The Irish held their head high and danced their hard-shoe dances in rebellion to a government who didn't recognize the heritage they held dear. The Russian Gypsies continued their step dances in an era when puritanical thinking all but destroyed the social dance. And the American Indians stomped and shuffled the ground with new steps to tell stories, and even to decry the efforts of missionaries to convert them and a government bent on moving them from their homeland.

This is part of our collective heritage as cloggers. When greed, jealousy or ignorance cause some to tarnish the activity, we must be a voice to bring people together in a spirit that promotes the fun of the dance over the ideology.

We do vote. By our attendance, we vote for which workshops we want to continue. By our patronage and support, we vote for which vendors, competitions, magazines and supplies we prefer. And by our silence, we deprive our fellow cloggers of the wealth of our knowledge and experience.

We can impact the way in which the clog dance moves into the next generation. If there is animosity within your local clogging scene, work to be a leveler. If you see opportunities to bring dancers together in an atmosphere of fun and fellowship, make it happen.

If there are parts of your clogging experience that you feel are being lost, take a stand to share and preserve it. It takes courage, and discipline, and motivation to make change. But the best part of clogging is that which will never change. I hope that the legacy of clogging we leave will be one of a simple, rhythmic, intricate and joyous step dance. Isn't that something we can all agree on? Happy clogging!

## **Ohio Workshop Offers Lottery That Gives 12 Lucky Teachers a Chance to Join the Staff**

I think one of the most intriguing ideas for a workshop occurred at this years World of Clogging held in Cincinnati Ohio. Jeff Driggs and Johanna Healy, hosts of the workshop, held an instructor's lottery for teaching spots. As one of the lucky winners, this is my story.

Information about the lottery was posted on the web. The thought of possibly teaching at the World of Clogging was pretty darn exciting. It sounded like fun, and I wanted


did have a few reservations. My bag of quirky steps is somewhat limited well... I am not Missy Shinoski.

My second thought was maybe this opportunity would best serve the young instructors who aspire to one day be on the instructor's circuit well... they have plenty of time to reach their goals. It took less than a minute to dismiss my reservations and add my name to the list of lottery hopefuls... because this dance addict can never walk away from a new clogging adventure!

Twelve winners were notified on April 19 and given a short list of expectations. After receiving my congratulatory email I phoned my best friend and said "GUESS WHAT?"

The workshop flyer was redone to include the winner's names and pictures. Seeing my face on the same flyer as the national instructors Jeff

to do it! I

Driggs, Scotty Bilz, Naomi Pyle, Joel Harrison, Judy Waymouth, Sheryl Baker, Trevor DeWitt and Morgan Hudson was absolutely astounding. I am sure the others felt the same way.

A week before the workshop, a class schedule was sent. I quickly scanned the page for my name. DOOM! My class would be the same time as Naomi Pyle (the queen of clogging) and Morgan Hudson (rubber legs himself.) How in the world would I get anyone to attend my teach? I briefly envisioned myself in a silly costume, with a marquee hanging from my shoulders promoting my class.

Not a foolproof way to attract dancers, but I am sure it would have created a lot of laughter!

Arriving at the workshop I felt a bit odd, was it my own anticipation, or the new location? The World of Clogging event moved this year to the Marriott, in Hebron, Kentucky. The hotel is directly across from the Cincinnati Ohio/ Northern Kentucky airport, with shops and restaurants nearby. The rooms were large, and the staff friendly and helpful. The hotel had a great lounge and comfortable seating areas throughout the lobby. Many dancers took advantage of the indoor pool and exercise area. Two large ballrooms and two

smaller ones were prepared for the cloggers.

The higher stages for the instructors this year made it really easy for everyone to see the teachers. Registration was set up in front of the main hall. The vendors had their own space nearby keeping the congestion away from the ballroom doors. The cloggers gave the new facility a thumbs up!

Friday morning I picked up my official instructors badge, and promptly placed it around my neck, I have to admit it felt good! These badges also helped the twelve winners identify each other.

For the most part we were strangers who now had a common bond. It was interesting getting to know these people, and learning why they had entered the lottery. The twelve winners were from six different states, ranging in age from teens to sixty-something. Some sported tattoos and others fine jewelry. In the other hall, Susan Daniels was busy leading the dancers through her routine to "Country Girl Shake It For Me." Next, I picked "Every Thing Good" taught by Jennifer Murton. This class was fun! The routine contained creative steps, and she had a carefree presentation. Meanwhile in the adjacent hall Jude Hager shared her routine to Shake It Off.

Third choice of the day was Jeff Driggs version of Honey I'm Good. Clogging to this song is like diving into a cool swimming pool on a ninety degree day. It just makes you feel good! There are a multitude of routines to this popular song. Jeff suggested take one, take them all, blend them together, or write your own routine. I

especially enjoy Naomi Pyle's routine to this song because it is a mixer. The process of learning a mixer is always comical. Just when you think you know what you are doing it is time to switch partners, and the fun continues!

Never pass up a chance to learn from Judy Waymouth. This pint size lady's routines always contain surprise steps. Miss Molly, a western swing, and All That's Left are prime examples of Judy's jovial music selections, that appeal to so many of the dancers.

Just prior to my teach I spotted my wild haired, hippie clogging friend Connie Huffman entering the hotel. I refer to her this way because she

She is an amazing instructor who loves a good old fashion hoedown! As we hugged, she informed me that presently she was not able to dance, but came to the workshop anyway because she did not want to miss my teach. How priceless is this friendship?

It was surreal stepping on the stage at World of Clogging and saying...
Hey I am Barb Elko and I brought a routine to the song "Redneck Woman." Those taking the class were attentive and willing to make some noise.

Overseeing my teach, Adam King, instructor for the Yellow Rose Cloggers, created a bit of laughter struggling with a step I called double rock 2 brush and point your thumbs at yourself. Joel Harrison held a class on Adding Arm Movements To Line Dances, and an Advanced Step Class. Kelly and Kenny Fithen, who are the directors of this year's Clogging Champions of America national champion challenge senior team, held a seminar on

Duo/Duets. How fortune we are to have such a talented group of experienced dancers offering us advise.

Hip Hop continues to grow in popularity. One of the lucky instructor lottery winners, Hannah Jane Bowling, taught Hip Hop Combinations.

I extended an dinner invitation to Donna Aberman of Florida, one of the lucky dozen. I thought she was a brave woman for accepting because she would be dining with fourteen rambunctious

strangers. She dreaded the possibility of an empty classroom. Her teach to House Party would be the same time as Naomi's teach to Uptown Funk. Her anxiety was justified... because let me tell you Naomi outdid herself on Uptown Funk, this routine is insane fun! Our clan had previously learned the routine. To show Naomi our appreciation for this fabulous routine, we planned on dressing a little funky and take the class again. Sympathizing with Donna's dilemma we revised our plans. Some would take Donna's

teach and leave a bit early to catch the end of Naomi's. A prime example of the camaraderie among cloggers.

Routines to the country songs "Wildfire" and "Kinda Dig The Feeling" were taught by Trevor DeWitt. He has a relaxed presentation while teaching and I could watch this man drag/slide all day. His ability to match a step perfectly to the music is exceptional!

Now days my eroding body refuses commands that require agility, and rigorous movement. Making matters worse my brain absorbs information at the same speed as ketchup flowing from a clogged bottle. Geez did I just reveal that I am the sixty something lottery winner? Due to this metamorphosis I avoid advanced classes. Three of the lucky dozen brought routines for those whose minds and bodies work in harmony. New Yorker Bekka Gunner, taught an advance routine to Dangerous. Chris Phelps, taught an intermediate plus to Run Away Baby. Naomi Zweben-King taught an intermediate plus to Geronimo. Unfortunately I did not cross paths with two of the selected instructors. Stephen Auten who taught an intermediate/Christian routine to Pushing Back the Dark and Jesse Howard who taught an intermediate routine to the song Jesse's Girl. Both I heard had very well attended classes with lots of eager dancers.

An unknown force seems to be revitalizing the

fun dances at events recently. I have noticed a larger variety of the National Dance List Songs being used. There has also been a definite increase in the amount of mixers and interactive dancing, and the dancers themselves have been more exuberant. Both Friday and Saturday night fun dances at the World of Clogging were exceptional!

As the saying goes all good things must come to an end. Thanks Jeff and Johanna for yet another wonderful World of Clogging weekend!

The teachers lottery was a superb idea! For the lucky dozen, this experience was a confidence builder. It was also a way to discover weaknesses and build on strengths. If variety is the spice of life, the addition of the lucky twelve was certainly welcomed. For everyone it may have been a peek into the future.

As always I came away from this workshop with much more than new routines. It was a totally awesome experience! Would I do it again?
Borrowing from the song I taught "Redneck Woman," Heck yeah!

# Cloggers in the SPOTLIGHT Bailey Mountain Cloggers to Tour Europe

Clogging is a full-time job for Danielle Plimpton. As managing director of the Bailey Mountain Cloggers at Mars Hill University, this is a particularly busy year. The team will head to Europe to perform at three International Folk Festivals, taking local musicians that include the Warren Wilson Bluegrass Band.

Everyone involved is focused on fundraising, performing, teaching and sharing mountain traditions around the globe.

"We've gone to Europe many times but we've never done so many (festivals) in one summer," Plimpton said. "All of them are international folk festivals, where you receive an invitation to represent your country and perform for thousands of people. We get to learn from their culture and they learn from ours."

The first trip will take 16 Bailey Mountain Cloggers to France July 2-20. The second trip, with 18 cloggers, leaves Aug. 3 for Billingham, England, where they performed two years ago and were invited to return. The second half of the trip will take them to their third festival, in Lefkas, Greece; on Aug. 24 they return to Mars Hill. The team takes live music from the region on each tour.

The group will travel with a live band for their performances.

The Bailey Mountain Cloggers are the 21-time National Champions of Mars Hill University but there was an award-winning Bailey Mountain



Square Dance Team long before them. Performing in the big circle traditional style of the region, the group included students from

the college and toured nationally.

Noted folklorist and historian Baucom Lamar Lunsford, who founded Asheville's Mountain Dance and Folk Festival in 1928, took the Bailey Mountain Square Dance Team on tour across the country in 1950. The fiddle player was a teenage Arvil Freeman, now fiddler for the Stoney Creek Boys, house band at Shindig on the Green.

The current clogging team was formed in 1974 by some of the students who had been on that earlier square dance team. The newer team is exclusively students and performs smooth dance, clogging and more.

"Each festival's purpose is similar — to share culture and represent our country," Plimpton said. It's hard work with one day off to choose wherever they want to go. "When we go to Greece, because the actual Mars Hill is there, we

are going to try and go there on our day off."

The team travels internationally every other year but logistics and costs are still a big consideration; the group must raise all the money to attend. The festivals cover food, housing and expenses within their country but don't pay for airfare. Sometimes the students must pay their own way; other times, fundraising covers costs.

During their 40-year history, the Bailey Mountain Cloggers have performed throughout the United States and internationally in Canada, Mexico,

England, Scotland, Austria, and Ireland. From the Kennedy Center in 1996 to the Austrian Alps Performing Arts Festival in 1997; from the world premier in 1998 of "Mountain Legacy" in Asheville, North Carolina to the Ulster-American Folk Park's Appalachian Festivals in 1998-2001; from the "Making A Difference" performance for the BBC from Belfast, Ireland, viewed by over 5 million throughout Europe to a performance on Broadway in 2000; Palma Mallorca Folk Festival 2007 & 2009: International Judenfestwoche Paderborn Germany 2011; Billingham International Folk Festival 2013.

"It's a once in a lifetime opportunity as a clogger,"

Plimpton said. "Cloggers don't usually have the opportunities that we can give them. It really is a big family and when people leave, they say you will never, ever have the kind of memories you have from this. It's a big honor."


